HUD approves \$275,497 for new 30-unit complex

County courthouse hit by weekend burglars

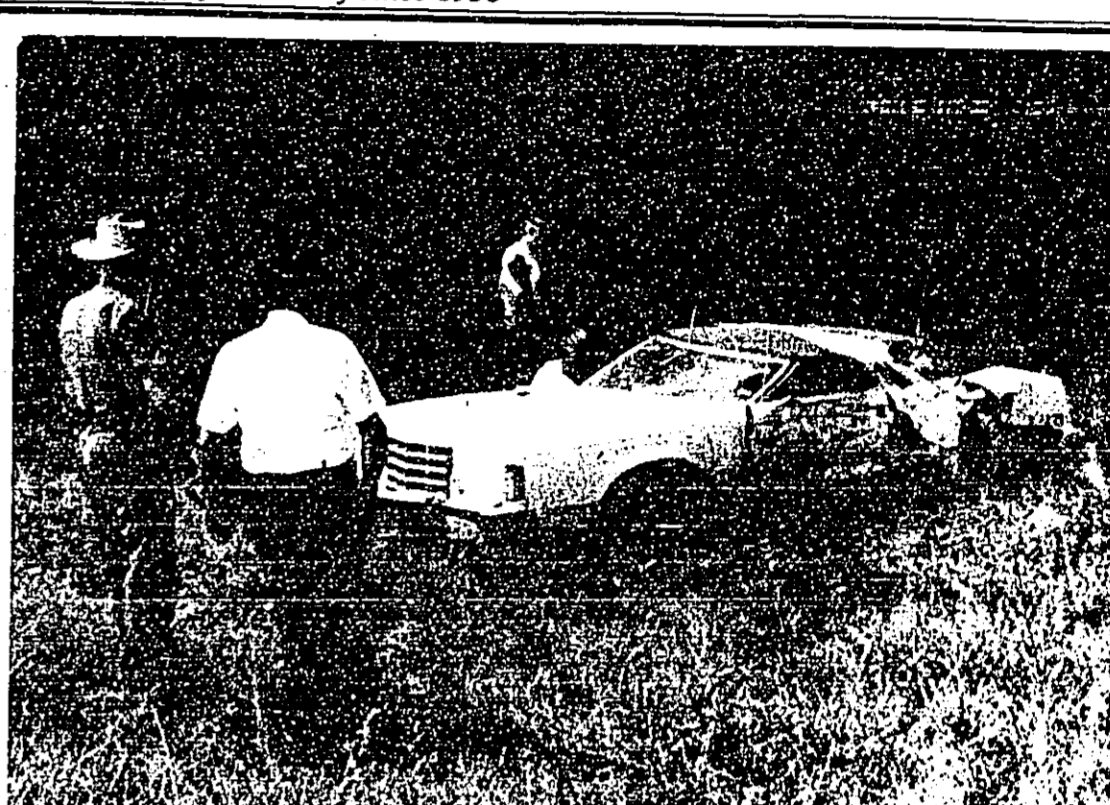

Dump fees waived on 'white goods'

-County to accept appliances, metal free through Nov. 10-

WOODVILLE — Hoping to encourage county residents to dispose of old refrigerators, stoves and other large appliances and other metal items and dispose of them, a small fee would be paid to the county.

County Judge Jerome Owens noted that the contract with Cumbea Enterprises, Inc. of Blountstown, Fla. The company has agreed to take the large appliances and other metal items and dispose of them. A small fee would be paid to the county.

"This is a good idea," Precinct 4 Commissioner Henry Earl Sawyer said. "This will allow people to get rid of their old stoves, ice boxes, wire and tin that may be laying around."

Sawyer, who oversees the county's landfill operation, said that a special disposal area will be set up at the dump, located east of Woodville off Highway 190 and FM 1746.

"The white goods and other metal items will have to be separated from household garbage and no cast iron items will be taken," Sawyer said of the special disposal plan.

Early voting opens on amendments

WOODVILLE — Early voting for the Nov. 2 constitutional amendments election gets underway today (Wednesday) and continues through Friday, Oct. 29, at the Dominion Hotel located on the west side of the Tyler County Courthouse in Woodville.

The early voting will be conducted from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on weekdays. Applications for mail ballots may be mailed to Donces Gregory, Tyler County, 1101 Courthouse, Woodville, Texas 75979 and must be received no later than the close of business on Oct. 26.

Regular voting will be held at 18 polling places located throughout the county between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Nov. 2.

In this election, voters are being asked to decide on 16 amendments to the Texas Constitution. They include:

- Authorization to issue up to \$50 million in general obligation bonds for state financing of start-up costs for historically underutilized businesses.
- Including the Texas State Technical College System (TSTC) and its campuses but not TSTC extension centers or programs) on the list of schools that may receive funds constitutionally dedicated for institutions of higher education.
- Allowing the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of the office of county sheriff.
- Shortening from two years to six months the time within which the former owners may redeem real property (not restricted to residential or agricultural purposes) sold for unpaid taxes.
- Establishing fiduciary responsibilities and duties of boards of trustees of local public pension systems.
- Authorizing the Veterans Land Board to issue up to \$750 million in general obligation bonds to augment the veterans' housing assistance and land program.
- Increasing the total principal amount of bonds and notes that may be issued to support the Texas agricultural fund.
- Authorizing the issuance of up to \$1 billion in general obligation bonds

'Special Places' program expanded by Champion

CORRIGAN — What began decades ago as an attempt by individual foresters to preserve areas of special beauty or significance was expanded last week into a first-of-its-kind, national preservation effort to set aside "Special Places in the Forest."
 During ceremonies held Friday, Oct. 8, in East Texas, eastern Main and northwestern Alabama, Champion International Corporation officially expanded its Special Places program into a national effort to preserve forest lands with historical, archeological, biological, geological or scenic significance for future generations.
 The East Texas part of the dedication took place at the company's Longleaf Pine Trail located in Polk County just off Highway 287 between Corrigan and Chester.

By Champion as a woodland nature trail since the 1960s, is a 317-acre stand of old-growth longleaf pine where a colony of five endangered red-cockaded woodpeckers makes its home.
 The old-growth longleaf pine stand, one of the few remaining in East Texas, contains trees with an average age of over 120 years. The oldest in the preserve has been standing for over 200 years.
 Mark Childers, Champion's senior vice president for human relations, told the crowd gathered at the Longleaf Pine Trail that the Special Places in the Forest program demonstrates the timber company's desire to be good stewards of the land.
 "The forest is a community of living things - trees, plants, birds, animals, fish, insects - whose lives are firmly linked together by nature," Childers said. "And this web of life is tightly linked with the water that flows in the rivers and streams, and the soils that support plant growth."
 "Every forester recognizes this as a fundamental principal of his life and work," he added.
 However, Childers noted that too often business does not see this interdependency and instead look only to profits margins.
 "Champion, however, has a very good grasp of these interrelations and is working to preserve the forests, land and wildlife for the future."
 Today, Champion International Corporation honors that principle in a special way by establishing a unique national program, called "Special Places in the Forest." Childers said, "It is a program to protect, for the public good, a growing number of places that have environmental, historical, geological, recreational or scenic importance."
 To formalize the company's initiative, Champion representatives met with Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt in Washington, D.C. recently to present a certificate signifying the company's commitment to the protection of its "Special Places."
 "Special Places" was created in Texas by foresters who spotted special places and preserved them, keeping people and equipment out," he said. "Sometimes they wouldn't even tell other people in the company about these places to insure their protection."

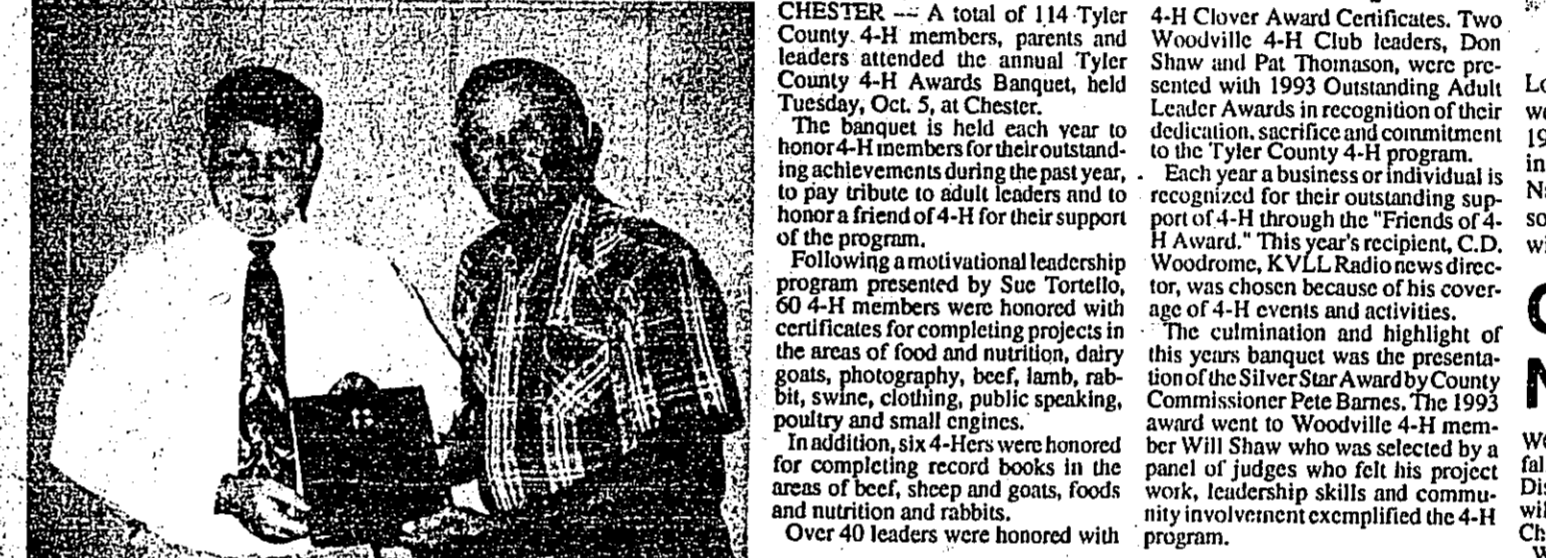


Couple united

Owens noted after the meeting that the landfill will remain open until the collection center operation begins operation. Although the county had initially hoped to have the collection center in operation at this time, a six month delay in the implementation of new state and federal landfill rules has given local officials more breathing room.

Under the change, the county now has until April, 1994, to shut down the local landfill before the new regulations take effect. Any landfill still in operation under the new rules will be required to meet more stringent and more expensive levels of pollution and disposal controls.

Although construction is now underway at the collection center site, located on Old Livingston Road west of the Hennigan Park baseball complex, Owens said it would not be completed until at least January.

"A lot will depend on the weather. If we get a lot of rain, it could take longer to complete the collection center," he added.

Once completed, the household garbage brought to the center will be compacted and hauled to the regional landfill in Polk County. Special, large metal containers will be set up at the collection center site for area residents to dispose of metal and wood items that cannot be compacted.

In other business during Monday's meeting, the commissioners:

- Cast their vote in the election of members to the Tyler County Appraisal District's seven-member board.
- Council eyes vendor ordinance

WOODVILLE — City Attorney Harry Stafford proposed Monday, "that all vendors, no matter who, should have a permit from the City of Woodville before being allowed to sell goods here."

Council agreed, but elected to study further the ramifications of a much needed and yet enforceable vendor ordinance.

Stafford's proposal was that "permits be required for all...and that a fee structure be based on profit or non-profit. The business should be able to provide a Tax ID number."

Many residents and merchants have complained about transient nuisance vendors who walk in selling their wares.

It hurts our local businesses," said one councillor.

Police Chief Scott Yostko agreed with Stafford as he was making his proposal for council to consider.




County courthouse hit by weekend burglars

WOODVILLE — Although forcing entry into several county courthouse offices, burglars apparently made off with only one television and a video cassette recorder located in the basement office of the Tyler County Extension Service.

Woodville Police Chief Scott Yosko said the break-ins are believed to have occurred sometime Saturday night with offices on three floors of the Tyler County Courthouse being forced open.

"Doors to the extension office, the county clerk's office and the rear of the district courtroom were all forced open and attempts were made to force doors to other offices," Yosko said.

As of Monday afternoon, the only items listed as missing during the break-ins were a Sharp 19-inch television and a Gold Star VCR, both taken from the extension service office.

It was apparent that the burglars searched through a number of desks in the offices they entered but that thus far, nothing else has been reported as stolen.

The break-in was discovered Sunday about 9:30 a.m. by District Attorney Jim Clark who called police to the scene.

In other action last week, police arrested William Leslie Castle, 32, of Vidor on drug charges following a routine traffic stop on South Magnolia. Police stopped Castle's vehicle about 1 a.m. on Thursday, Oct. 7 and subsequently discovered less than an ounce of a substance believed to be cocaine and a quantity of what is believed to be marijuana.

Charges of possession of marijuana and possession of a controlled substance with intent to deliver were filed in connection with the arrest.

HUD approves \$275,549 for new 30-unit complex

WOODVILLE — Woodville Housing Authority Executive Director Billie Polk was all smiles at city council Monday as he reported that her agency had been approved by the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the necessary additional \$275,549 in funding needed to build a new 30-unit housing complex here.

Those funds are being provided in addition to \$2,269,500 already approved in bids awarded in September to the Weather's Construction Company of Dallas.

Polk also reported that the office of Republican Sen. Paul Gramm had formed her office of an additional grant of \$600,000 for modernization of existing facilities.

During her report, Polk complimented Woodville Police Chief Scott

Dump fees waived on 'white goods' - County to accept appliances, metal free through Nov. 10

WOODVILLE — Hoping to encourage county residents to dispose of old refrigerators, stoves and other large metal items, Tyler County Commissioners voted Monday to waive dump fees for "white goods" new through Nov. 10.

"This is a good idea," Precinct 4 Commissioner Henry Earl Sawyer told the commissioners during their meeting. "This will allow people to get rid of their old stoves, ice boxes, wire and tin that may be laying around."

Sawyer, who oversees the county's landfill operations, said the special disposal area will be set up at the dump, located east of Woodville off between Highway 190 and FM 1746.

"The white goods and other metal items will have to be separated from household garbage and no cast iron items will be taken," Sawyer said of the special disposal plan.

The decision to call a moratorium on the white good fees came Friday shortly after the commissioners approved a contract with Cumbea Enterprises, Inc. of Bloomington, Fla. The company has agreed to take the large appliances and other metal items and dispose of them. A small fee would be paid to the county.

County Judge Jerome Owens noted that the contract with Cumbea would save the county the expense and the trouble of disposing of the appliances.

"They will come and get the white goods and, more important to the county, they would remove all of the refrigerator from the freezers and refrigerators as required to meet EPA regulations," Owens said.

He noted that without the contract, the county would be responsible for removing the chemicals from the appliances, a process that would cost the county "a lot of money." Once the county's new collection center goes into operation, the county also would have to have the white goods hauled off and pay a premium price to dispose of them.

Under the Cumbea contract, the company will accept and haul off stoves, refrigerators, freezers, washers, dryers, water heaters, mattress springs, fence wire, bath tubs, culvers, tin, bicycles, lawn mowers and "anything metal except cast iron." Sawyer said.

Normally, dumping an item such as a refrigerator at the county landfill would cost \$10 but through Nov. 10 the county will waive the fee to encourage area residents to properly dispose of the old appliances.

"People have complained about the cost of dumping these items at the landfill but we've had to charge these fees because the county has had costs in disposing of them," Owens said.

"Now we have a rare opportunity for people to come down and clean up their places at no cost."

"It will never be cheaper than this,"

Early voting opens on amendments

WOODVILLE — Early voting for the Nov. 2 constitutional amendment election gets underway today (Wednesday) and continues through Friday, Oct. 29, at the Domino Hall located on the west side of the Tyler County Courthouse in Woodville.

The early voting will be conducted from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on weekdays. Applications for mail ballots may be mailed to Donace Gregory, Tyler County Clerk, 100 Courthouse, Woodville, Texas 75799 and must be received no later than the close of business on Oct. 26.

Regular voting will be held at 18 polling places located throughout the county between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. on Nov. 2.

In this election, voters are being asked to decide on 16 amendments to the Texas Constitution. They include:

- Authorizing to issue up to \$50 million in general obligation bonds for state financing of start-up costs for historically underutilized businesses.
- Including the Texas State Technical College System (TSTC) and its campuses (but not TSTC extension centers or programs) on the list of schools that may receive funds constitutionally dedicated for institutions of higher education.
- Allowing the legislature to prescribe the qualifications of the office of county sheriff.
- Shortening from two years to six months the time within which the former owner may redeem real property (not residence homestead or used for agricultural purposes) sold for unpaid taxes.
- Establishing fiduciary responsibilities and duties of board trustees of local public pension systems.
- Authorizing the Veterans Land Board to issue up to \$750 million in general obligation bonds to supplement the veterans' housing assistance and land programs.
- Authorizing the total principal amount of bonds and notes that may be issued to support the Texas agricultural fund.
- Authorizing the issuance of up to \$1 billion in general obligation bonds

'Special Places' program expanded by Champion

CORRIGAN—What began decades ago as an attempt by individual foresters to preserve areas of special beauty or significance was expanded last week into a first-of-its-kind, national preservation effort to set aside "Special Places in the Forest."

During ceremonies held Friday, Oct. 8, in East Texas, eastern Main and northwestern Alabama, Champion International Corporation officials expanded its Special Places program into a national effort to preserve five lands with historical, archeological, biological, geological or scenic significance for future generations.

The East Texas part of the dedication took place at the company's Longleaf Pine Trail located in Polk County just off Highway 287 between Corrigan and Chester.

The site, which has been maintained

by Champion as a woodland nature trail since the 1960s, is a 317-acre stand of old growth longleaf pine where a colony of five endangered red-cockaded woodpeckers makes its home.

The old-growth longleaf pine stand, one of the last remaining in East Texas, contains trees with an average age of over 120 years. The oldest in the preserve has been standing for over 200 years.

Mike Childers, Champion's senior vice president for human relations, told the crowd gathered at the Longleaf Pine Trail that the Special Places in the Forest program demonstrates the timber company's desire to be good stewards of the land.

"The forest is a community of living things - trees, plants, birds, animals, fish, insects - whose lives are firmly tied together by nature," Childers said. "And this web of life is tightly linked

with the water that flows in the rivers and streams, and the soils that support plant growth.

"Every forester recognizes this as a fundamental principle of his life and work," he added.

However, Childers noted that too often business does not see this interdependency and instead look only to profits margins.

"Champion, however, has a very good grasp of these interactions and is working to preserve the forests, land and wildlife for the future."

Today, Champion International Corporation honors that principal in a special way by establishing a unique national program called "Special Places in the Forest," Childers said.

"It is a program to protect, for the benefit of future generations, special places that have environmental, historical, geological, recreational or scenic importance."

To formalize the company's initiative, Champion representatives met with Secretary of the Interior Bruce Babbitt in Washington, D.C. recently to present a certificate signifying the company's commitment to the protection of the "Special Places."

"Special Places" was created in Texas by foresters who spotted special places and preserved them, keeping people and equipment out," he said. "Someone they wouldn't even tell other people in the company about these places to insure their protection."

The effort in Texas was formalized in 1989 when Champion established the local "Special Places" effort and set aside six areas. Since that time, additional sites have been added until, with the inclusion of the Longleaf Pine Trail last week, there are 13 East Texas areas encompassing over 2,300 acres being preserved.

Among those sites is the Beech-Magnolia Canyons, a 79-acre woodland corridor on Vincent Creek in Tyler County. Other sites are located in Polk, Trinity, Liberty, Grimes, Nacogoches, Walker and Houston counties.

Bill Krick, general manager of Champion's Texas Timberlands Region, explained that the Longleaf Pine Trail in northeastern Polk County has been preserved over the years by a series of fortunate occurrences.

"This site was acquired by W.T. Carter and Brother Lumber Co. about the turn of the century but its ownership remained in litigation for years. This no-train road was built to the area. Without a train road, no logging was conducted," he said.

With the advent of logging trucks, the timber on the site could have been easily harvested but the W.T. Carter company decided to hold the area "in reserve," Krick explained that because the timber stand was relatively close to the Carter mill, the company decided to wait until weather or other conditions prevented them from removing timber from other, more remote areas.

"Fortunately for us, that never happened," Krick said.

Later, the state forester began a timber growth study and the Longleaf site was included, thus it continued to be held in reserve by W.T. Carter and Bro.

"Tom Carter, the mill owner then became attached to this site. He liked to look at this trees so no logging was allowed," Krick said.

In the early 1960s, when Champion purchased the W.T. Carter holdings, it was with two others, into woodland trails. The McWhorter, the East Texas land

steward for the Nature Conservancy, also was on hand to discuss the importance of the longleaf pine stand. He noted that at one time, a vast longleaf forest stretched from Virginia to East Texas.

"Hardwoods shared part of the forest with the longleaf, but most were found only along river bottoms," he said. "And it was only in that area of East Texas where you found the longleaf mixed among the shortleaf or the loblolly pines."

McWhorter explained that the longleaf pine is unique among trees because not only is it able to withstand forest fires, it actually needs fire to survive and has evolved to help promote the spread of flames.

Its thick bark protects the tree from the heat and flames while the long pine needles, which give the tree its name, serve to protect the seed cones from fire damage. It uses fire to clear out other trees and underbrush that might compete with it for sunlight and soil minerals.

"The longleaf also promotes fire to keep other plants out. As dry needles lay on the forest floor help wild-fires spread and when a longleaf dies and its sap dries, it becomes very flammable, easily converting a lightning strike into a forest fire," he explained.

Also appearing on the platform during the dedication ceremonies were State Rep. Bill Halye, State Rep. Allen Hightower and the Rev. Bobbie Weber of the Woodville United Methodist Church.

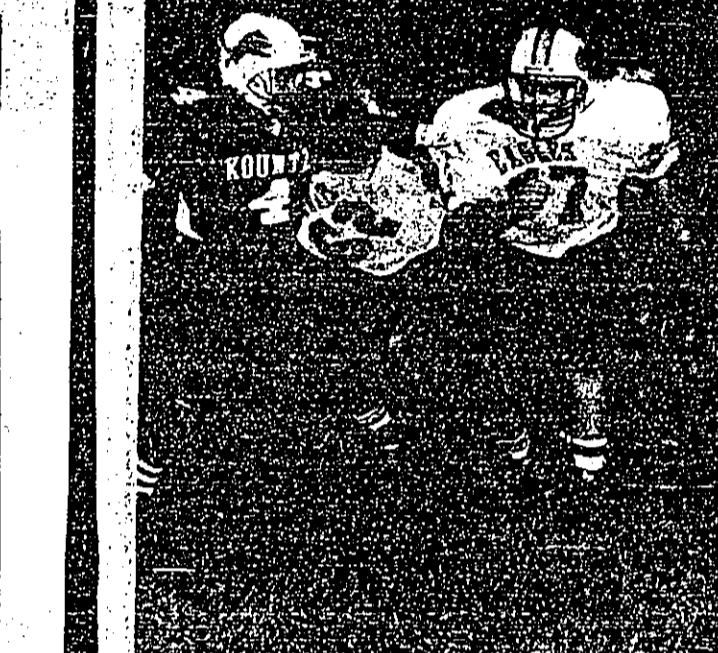

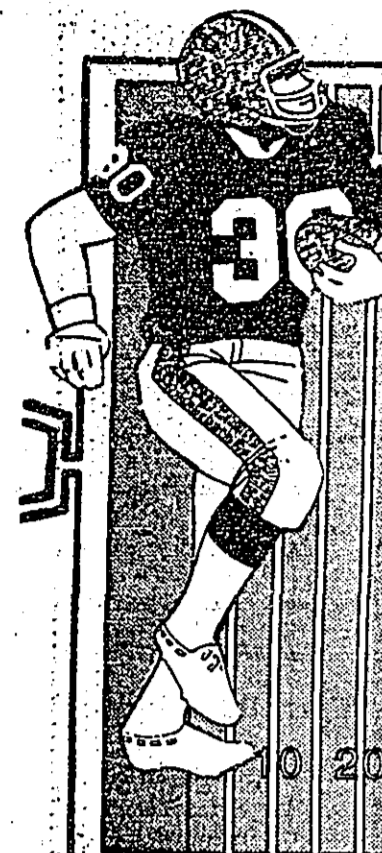

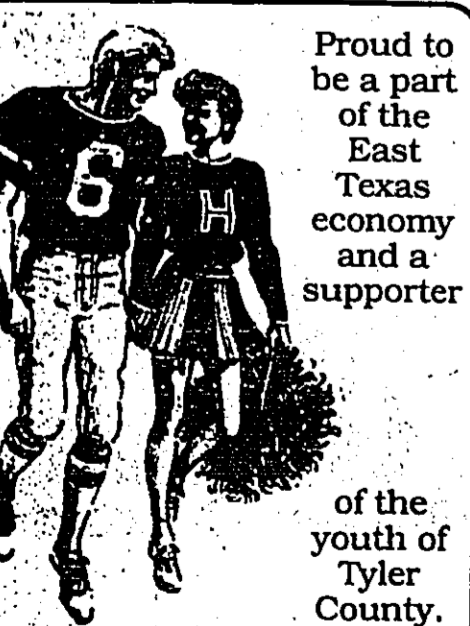

Owens noted after the meeting that the landfill will remain open until the collection center operation begins operation. Although the county had initially hoped to have the collection center in operation at this time, a six-month delay in the implementation of new state and federal landfill rules has given local officials more breathing room.

Under the change, the county now has until April, 1994, to shut down the local landfill before the new regulations take effect. Any landfill still in operation under the new rules will be required to meet more stringent and more expensive levels of pollution and disposal controls.

Although construction is now underway at the collection center site, located on Old Livingston Road west of the Henning Park baseball complex, Owens said it would not be completed until at least January.

"A lot will depend on the weather. If we get a lot of rain, it could take longer to complete the collection center," he added.

Once completed, the household garbage brought to the center will be compacted and hauled to the regional landfill in Polk County. Special, large metal containers will be set up at the collection center site for area residents to dispose of metal and wood items that cannot be compacted.

In other business during Monday's meeting, the commissioner:

- Cast their vote in the election of new state and federal landfill rules as members to the Tyler County Appraisal District's seven-member board.
- Authorized the county to advertise for bids on a Dodge van formerly used by the Tyler County Aging Services, Inc. Precinct 1 Commissioner Maxie Riley explained that the aging services group recently replaced the old van with a bus.

WOODVILLE — City Attorney Harry Stafford proposed Monday, "that all vendors, no matter who, should have a permit from the City of Woodville before being allowed to sell goods here."

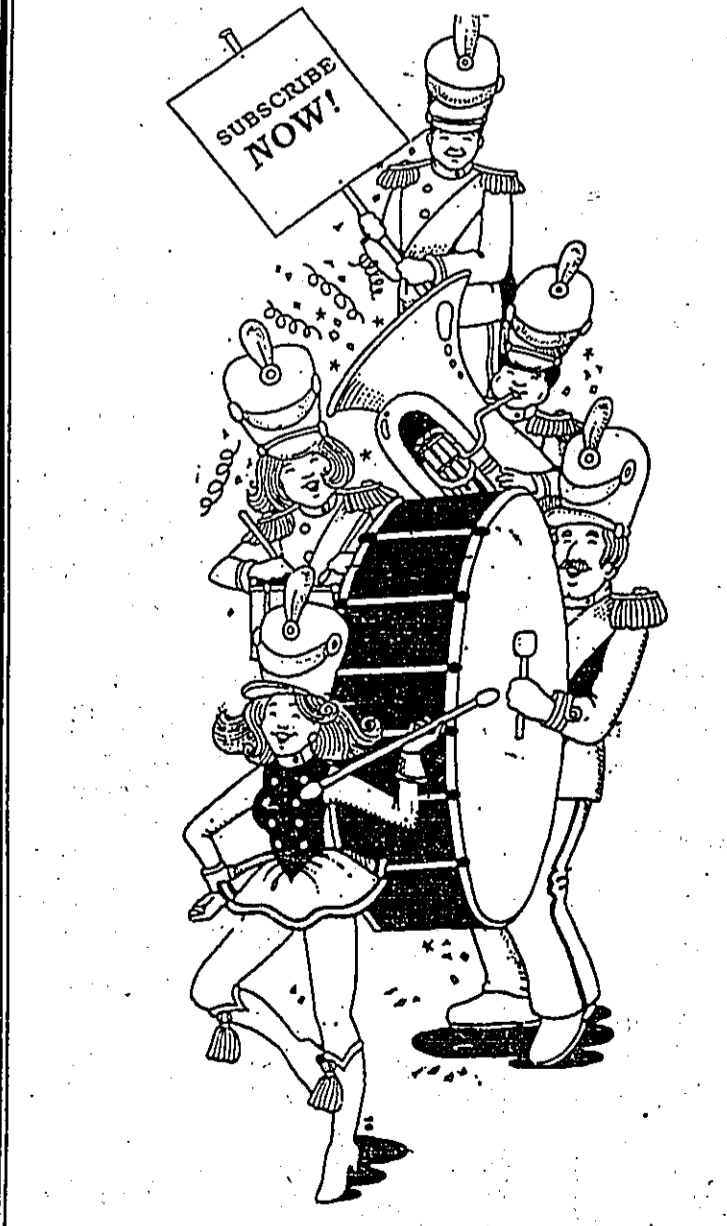
