## Support sought to fund new state jail program

-Hightower, county officials urge approval of Proposition 14 on Nov. 2 ballot-

WOODVILLE — Citing a need to keep violent felons in prison longer, State Rep. Allen Hightower urged local voters last week to give their support to Proposition 14 on the Nov. 2 election ballot.

Speaking before the Woodville Lions Club on Thursday, Oct. 14, Hightower said the measure would allow the state to issue up to \$1 billion in general obligation bonds to fund the construction of correctional and mental health facilities.

"Much of the money will be used to build state jails," he noted. Tyler County Commissioners on the following day approved a resolution of support for Proposition 14 and Tyler County District Attorney Jim Clark, who made the presentation to the commissioners, also is asking local voters to approve the measure.

In his talk to the Woodville Lions, Hightower noted the legislature has adopted a new penal code - most of which goes into effect on Sept. 1, 1994 - which will radically change the way criminals are handled in Texas.

While the state now has three classes of felonies - ranging from first to third degree, beginning next year a fourth type will go on the books. Known as state jail felonies, those convicted of this lower class of felony - which includes only non-violent offenses - could serve their time in state jails rather than the state prisons.

The state jails would use a dormitory-style construction and rather than individual cells and would be closer in appearance and operation to county jails than a traditional prison. They also would not have to meet the costlier rules and regulations which govern the state prisons system.

The only problems is that as of now, state jails do not exist and would have to be constructed from scratch. Money left over from the last set of prison bonds approved by Texas voters is now being used to get the program started, but Hightower noted that without additional money, the system cannot be put in place.

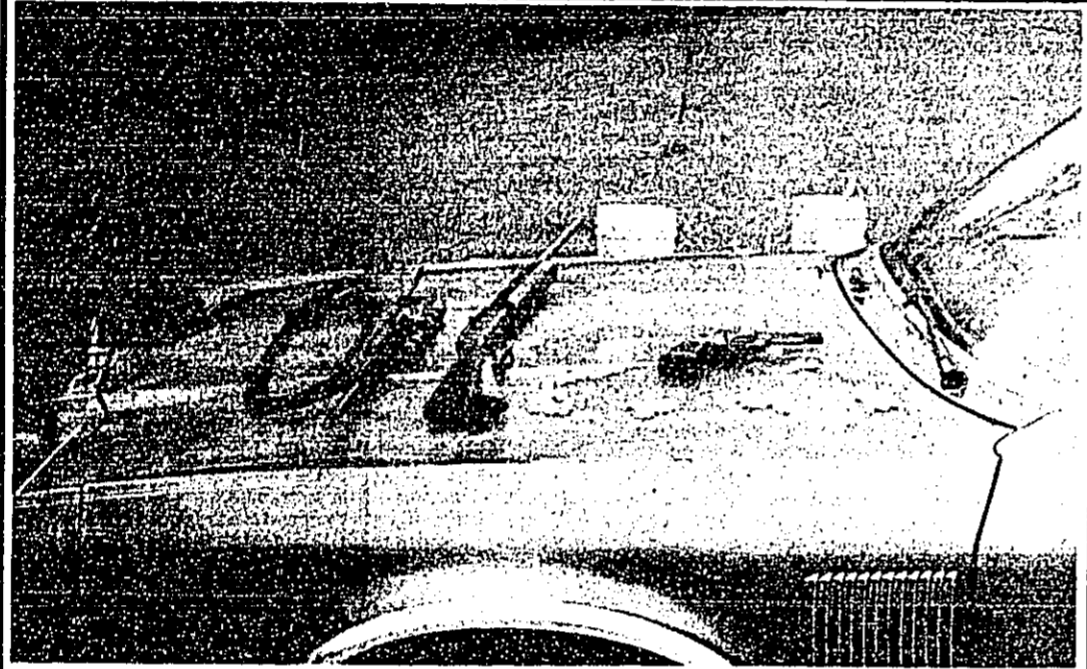
"There is a saying that no man's life, liberty or property is safe as long as the legislature is in session," Hightower told the Lions. "If you don't want me to go back to Austin this next session and vote for a tax increase, you will need to vote 'yes' on Proposition 14."

In discussing the state jail system with the Lions, Hightower said the idea was developed when it was decided that the state needed to better utilize its financial resources to insure that violent criminals remain in prison for longer periods.

Hightower explained that under the Ruiz Decision, the federal courts were setting the rules on how Texas prisons operated. Among those rules was an arbitrary limit on the number of pris-

## Cocaine seized by sheriff's department



Cocaine valued at \$6,000 together with a 1985 Chrysler automobile were seized by the Tyler County Sheriff's Department last week following a two-month undercover investigation into drug trafficking in Jasper, Newton and Tyler counties. Darryl A. Byerly, who gave a Newton address, was arrested at 1 p.m. Wednesday, Oct. 13 in the Tyler County portion of the Martin Dies Jr. State Park near the community of Dam B. According to Sheriff Gary Hennigan, the arrest came during an attempt to trade firearms for 53 bags of cocaine. The guns and cocaine involved are picture above laying on the hood of the suspect's vehicle. In addition to the Tyler County Sheriff's Department, agencies involved in the investigation included the Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force and the U.S. Treasury Department's Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms. Following his arrest, Byerly was transported to the Jefferson County jail where he was being held on federal charges as well as a state delivery of a controlled substance complaint.

## Education summit meeting planned

TYLER COUNTY — County school districts and local citizens may soon be joining to clear a path for their students' entrance into the 21st century job market.

In a recent meeting of the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce Education Committee, which includes educators from all county school districts, plans were discussed for a county business and education summit meeting which, pending approval of the Chamber of Commerce, should be held in November.

The summit was described as a "town hall meeting on education" which would serve to form a partnership between the local community, businesses and schools. Together, they would share information and discuss goals, issues and projects which would help students, both college bound and non-college bound, to prepare for the future.

Woodville Superintendent Carol Moffett outlined the dual purpose for the county meeting, which would highlight two educational programs - the Texas Scholars Program designed for eighth graders and older, and the Real-World Forum for high school students.

The Texas Scholars Program is a statewide program designed to encourage students to select and complete high school courses which provide a sound foundation for career and college. Already in operation in both the Woodville and Spurger schools, the program has not yet involved community members.

Real-World Forum is a Texas Education Agency (TEA) project designed to involve citizens in determining which skills and abilities high school students will need, to enter the workplace. According to the TEA, these forums are scheduled to take place across the state in October and November of this year.

Moffett stressed the importance of using outside resources such as Region V and the Texas Business and Education Coalition (TBEC) for the summit meeting. "If we really want to give our kids a broad view of what it's like in the real world we'll have to get someone from Beaumont or Houston."

She explained that they need 40 or 50 business and community people for the meeting. "Plans are to gather representatives from county educators, business persons, parents, and community members to come together for the summit. We want to involve the whole county."

Moffett will go to the Chamber of Commerce on October 25 to seek approval for the summit meeting. The parade will leave the police station and wind its way through town, passing by Wheat Elementary and Woodville Intermediate School before traveling to the junior and senior high school campuses.

"After we travel past the schools, we'll come back into town with sirens going and horns honking. The parade will come right down Bluff Street, turn south on Magnolia (Highway 69) and end at the Wal-Mart parking lot," Yosko said.

Refreshments will be served to those participating in the parade at Wal-Mart.

In addition, Yosko is asking area merchants to cooperate with local students who will be contacting them about placing anti-drug messages in their stores.

"As part of the local Red Ribbon campaign, the students will turn out to help decorate the city," Yosko said. "We are asking local businesses to let the students decorate their windows."

Activities involving local students will be held on Woodville school campuses throughout Red Ribbon Week, Oct. 23-31. This year's theme is "Be Drug Free '93."

Yosko added that the police department will be giving away special red ribbons next week. Area residents are being asked to wear them throughout the special week to show their support for the anti-drug program.

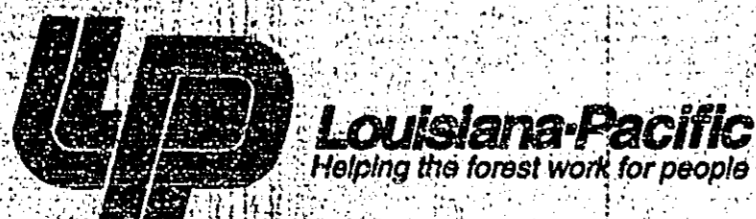

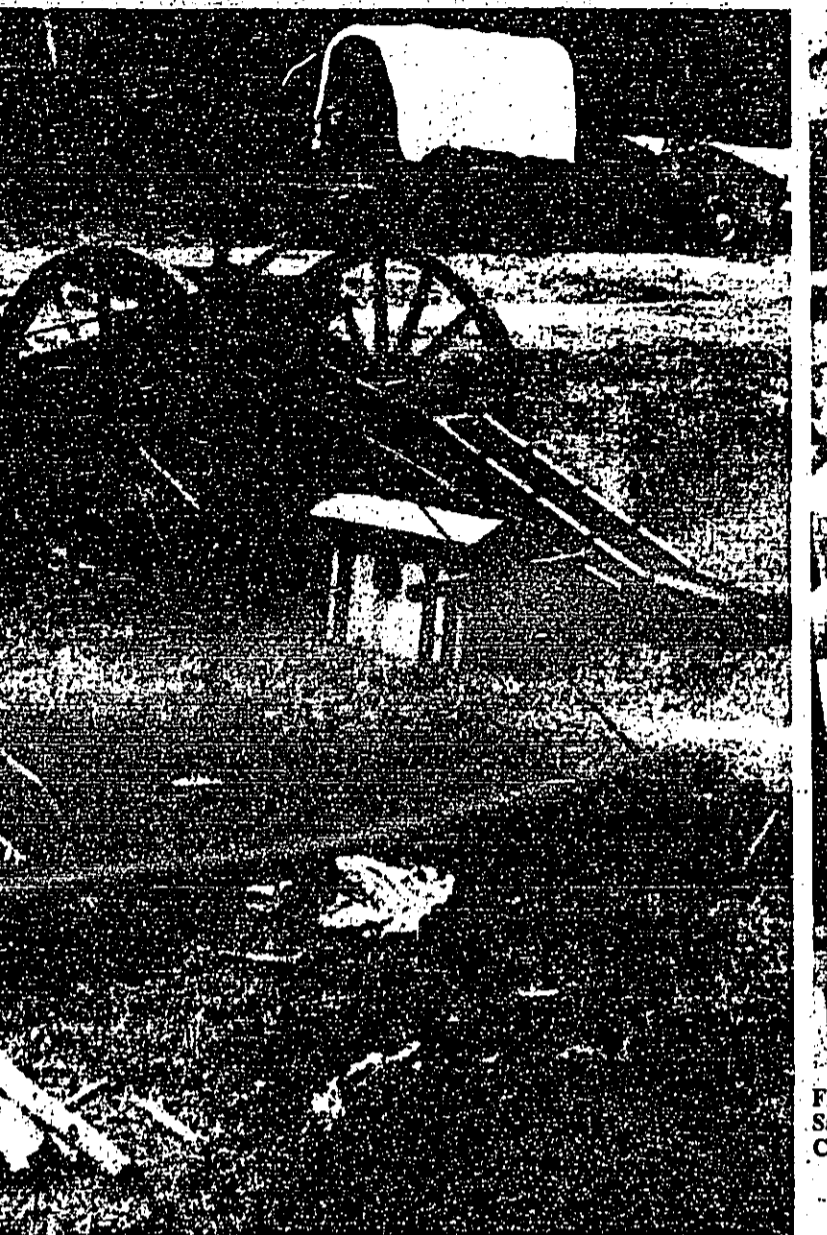

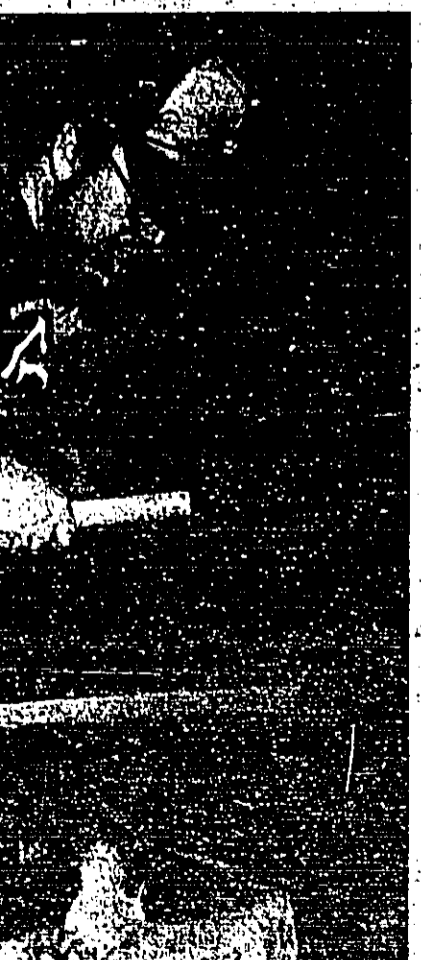

"With the drought conditions we experienced this summer, it's good to see the quality of forage production in East Texas remains high," said Matt Bohart, Tyler County Extension Service agent. "Because of the dry summer, most Texas will experience a very serious shortage of hay."

This was the first year that Tyler and Hardin Counties had a joint hay show. A grand total of 49 entries were received from both counties. The cost of this year's event was jointly sponsored by Community Bank - Woodville Branch and the Long Leaf Soil and Water Conservation District for Tyler County protein analysis.

Quality forage production continues to be a necessity for winter supplementation of beef cattle and horses. Without the benefit of sending a sample to a lab for forage testing, producers have no idea what type of hay quality they are producing.

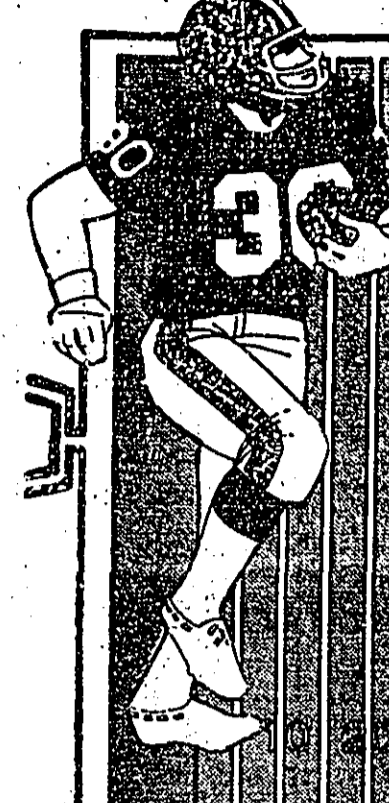

**SSI childhood disability rules revised**

LUFKIN — Recent regulations make substantial changes in the way the Social Security Administration evaluates disabilities in children applying for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) benefits. One of the regulations significantly changes the process and standards used to evaluate children's cases.

Two other regulations make specific revisions to the medical criteria used to evaluate disability in children with Down syndrome, mental impairments and other serious hereditary, congenital, and acquired conditions.

In the Zehley decision, the Supreme Court found that Social Security used a narrower test for evaluating the disabilities of children under 18 than it used for evaluating the disabilities of adult workers. The determination of disability for children with Down syndrome, mental impairments and other serious hereditary, congenital, and acquired conditions was based solely on evaluation criteria contained in Social Security's "Listing of Impairments." However, when evaluating adults, Social Security provided additional steps which considered work-related functional capacities and vocational factors such as age, education, and work experience.

Under the court's decision, the new childhood regulation outlined a dis-



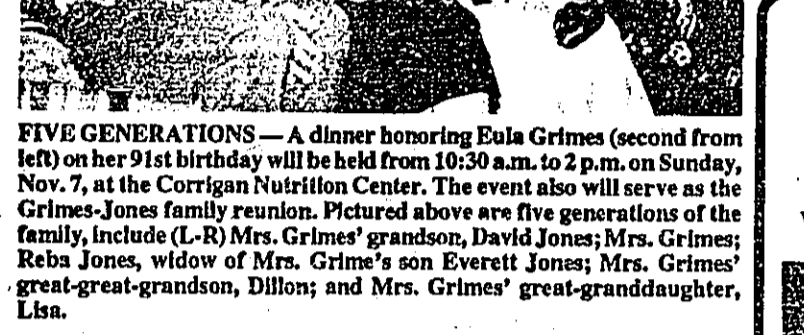

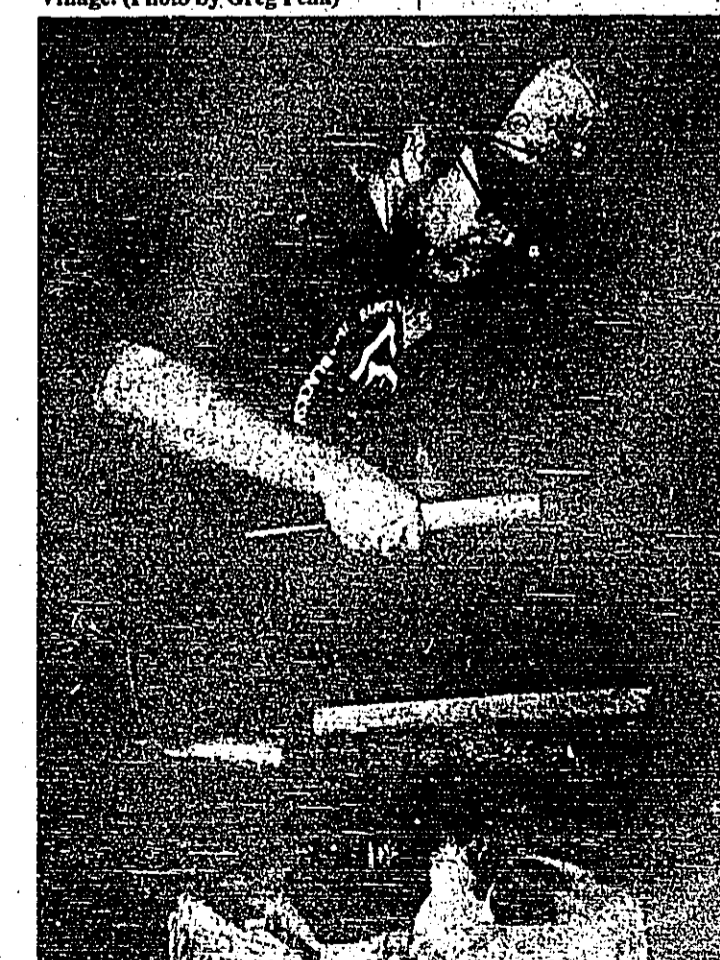

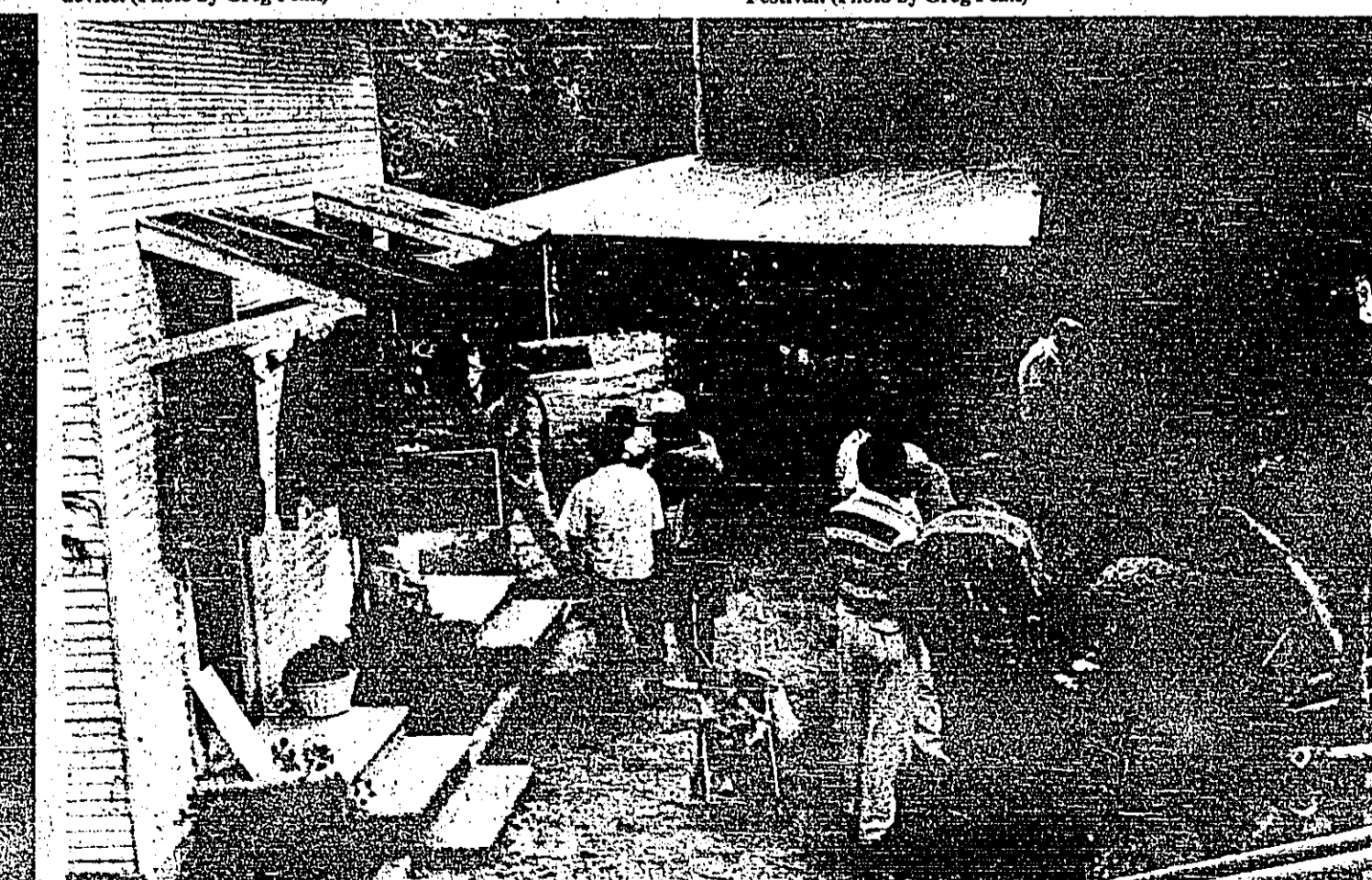
