### Eagles, Panthers ready for round two in playoffs

WOODVILLE — When the Woodville Eagles and Liberty Panthers line up against each other Friday night in their bi-district football clash a lot of things will be different from the first time they met. "We've made some personnel changes and we have come a long way since the first game, I promise you that," emphasizes McGillion. "We did not have our whole offense in, and we are adding bits and pieces of that throughout the year and we have improved... without a doubt, we have improved defensively, I know that for a fact."

Since that time the Eagles, with quarterback Larry Thomas, have gone on to register six wins, all when counted in district play. All three of the Eagles' losses have been to quality teams, Woodville lost to state ranked Coldspring and state ranked Stephen F. Austin, along with Liberty, who won the District 23-3A title.

The Panthers, with a new fullback, have rolled right along and registered seven wins while losing two. One of the losses was a one point loss to

While the loss had no real effect on Liberty's playoff plans, it did unite the team more. "That's been the key to our success," says Hacker. "We graduated 26 last year, and we have improved every week. The youngsters have just played well together."

The winner of the Woodville-Liberty contest will play the winner of the Giddings-Columbus bi-district game next week.

Woodville got the benefit of the home field advantage due to a coin flip between McGillion and Hacker. The Liberty coach did not want to play at Lumberton and a Silsbee site would have taken several days to confirm.

"I pressed for the home and home flip," admitted Hacker. "We've got a nice field that will seat 6,000 and Woodville has a good field."

### Eagles sweep past Wildcats 23-20

WOODVILLE — The Woodville Eagles lined up for their bi-district playoff contest with a methodical, 23-20 win over the Kirbyville Wildcats Friday night.

The victory pushed the Eagles' season record to 6-3-1 and a 6-1 district record, good for second place.

"It was one of those games, as a coach, you like to get it over with because it had no bearing on the district race," said Woodville coach Craig McGillion after the game.

"What you don't want to happen... that was we lost a few players to injury, it's going to be tough on us this Friday."

Already limited with the absence of defensive tackle Robert Russell, out for the season with an injured knee, the Eagles also were hit with injuries to two other defensive tackles: Author Hadnot (broken hand) and Frank Foster (knee).

Besides Hadnot and Foster getting injured against Kirbyville, the Eagles did not use their top running back, Aubrey Jackson, nor their top receiver, Delondon Spielgts, against the Wildcats.

Jackson had been nursing a twisted ankle and was in for only two plays against Kirbyville, but Spielgts with a shoulder separation, did not suit up Friday.

Regardless, the Eagles still had enough muscle and punch to outpace the Wildcats, easing to a 16-6 lead going into the fourth period.

The bright spot in the injury dilemma for the Eagles was the play of junior running back Kevin Adams who rushed for 194 yards on 22 carries and scored Woodville's first touchdown.

The Eagles kicked off the scoring with a 15 yard field goal by Stephen Ramos. The kick came on the heels of

a six play, 63 yard drive, and gave the Eagles a temporary, 3-0 lead.

Kirbyville rolled right back to take a 6-3 lead on a nine yard pass from Jerome Allen to Dusty Stanley.

Adams later put the Eagles back into the lead for good on a five yard run that concluded a 30 yard, six play drive. The series was set up by a nifty 39 yard interception return by Randy Bowen. Ramos' point after gave Woodville a 10-6 halftime lead.

The Eagles quickly halted any Kirbyville thoughts of an upset the first time they touched the ball in the second half.

After second half kickoff return that gave Woodville possession at the Wildcat 49 yard line, quarterback Larry Thomas bombed a touchdown pass to Jerrod Woodson that extended the Eagles' lead to 16-6. The point after try was blocked.

In the fourth period the Wildcats sandwiched two scores around a Woodville touchdown.

The first Wildcat rally was a 15 yard pass from Allen to Kevin Nation, and the second was an eight yard run from Allen to Damon Bluit. A two point conversion pass from Allen to Dusty Stanley concluded Kirbyville's scoring.

Woodville's final touchdown came on a two yard Ricky Sells run that capped a five play, 58 yard drive midway in the fourth period.

Kirbyville did manage to out-gain the Eagles in total offense for the evening. Thanks to Wildcat running back Sincy Dennis, Kirbyville rushed for 221 yards, 157 coming from Dennis.

Kirbyville also had 116 yards in the air for a total of 337 yards offense.

The Eagles, with Adam's 194 yards, rushed for a total of 252, and added another 73 passing.

Defensively the Eagles were led by the play of James Ivy who registered 14 tackles and had two sacks. Lynn Hadnot also had two sacks in the contest.

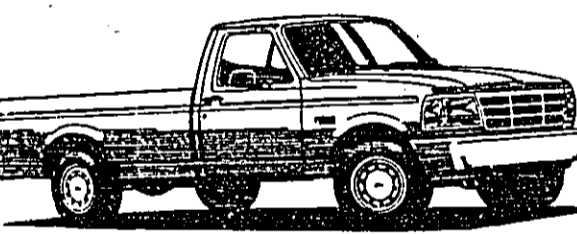

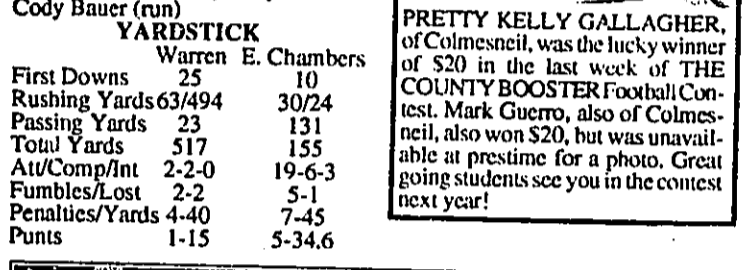

PROPOSITION 2 The constitutional amendment to promote the reduction of pollution and to encourage the preservation of jobs by authorizing the exemption from state income tax of real and personal property used for the control of air, water or land pollution.

PROPOSITION 3 The constitutional amendment providing for the clearing of land titles by the release of a state claim in a fractional interest, arising out of the voiding of an interest under a Mexican land grant, to the owners of certain property in Fort Bend and Austin counties.

PROPOSITION 4 The constitutional amendment prohibiting a personal income tax without voter approval and an income tax to be enacted, dedicating the revenue to education and limiting the rate of local school taxes.

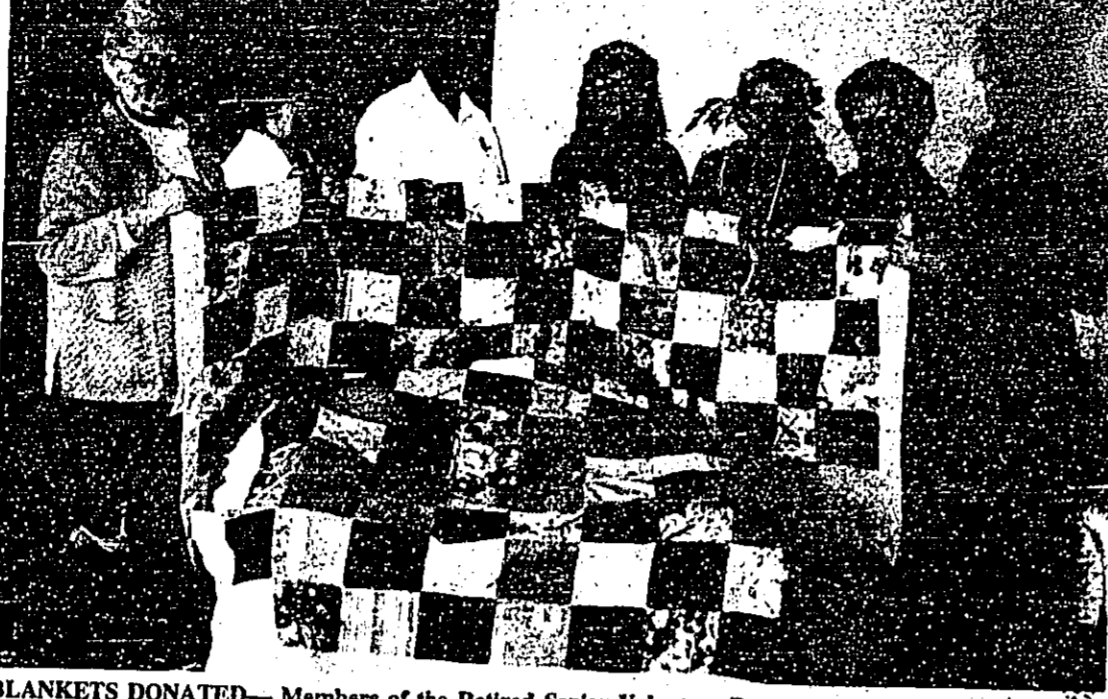

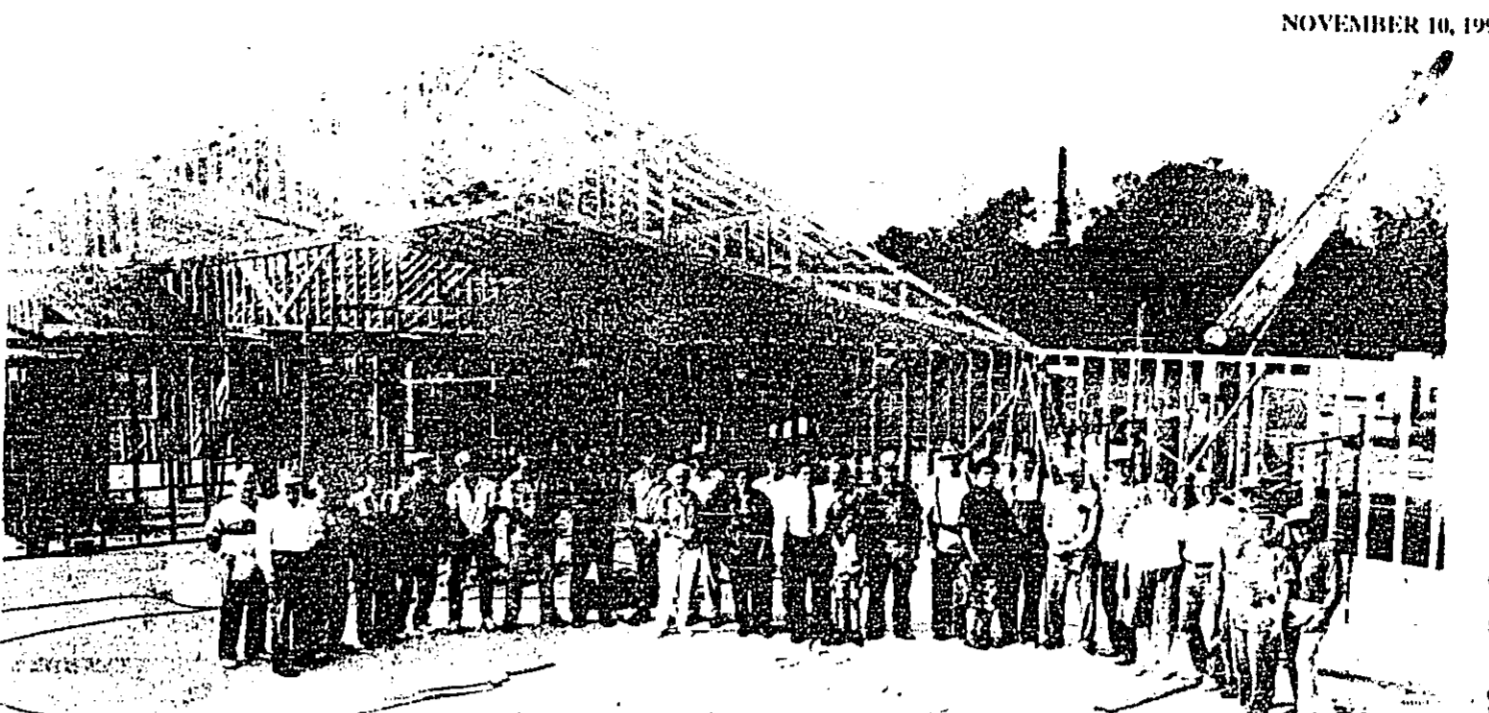

## Help now available for medicare beneficiaries

LUFKIN — As of Jan. 1, the federal government expanded a program that pays the monthly Medical Insurance (Part B) premium for low-income Medicare beneficiaries. They are called the specified low-income Medicare beneficiaries (SLMB) and pay the Part B premium for people whose income is slightly more than the national poverty level. It augments an existing program called the qualified Medicare beneficiary (QMB) program in which the States pay the Part A (Hospital Insurance) and Part B (Medical Insurance) amounts for beneficiaries whose income is below the national poverty level and who have very limited resources.

To qualify for the QMB program in 1993, an individual's monthly income cannot exceed \$601; for a couple the limit is \$906 per month. To qualify for Medicare Part B premium help under the SLMB program, an individual must have a net annual income that is less than 150 percent of the annual limit in 1993 and 1994 and more than 120 percent in 1995 and 1996. An individual's income cannot exceed the following amounts for a calendar year: \$8,584 for an individual with no other income, \$11,243 for an individual with other income, and \$14,215 for a couple.

Only the State can decide eligibility for QMB or SLMB. So, if your income is low and you're a Medicare beneficiary, contact the Department of Human Services. For more information about either program, call the Health Care Financing Administration's toll-free telephone number, 1-800-638-6833.

### Raising catfish can be like shooting fish in a barrel

**OVERTON** — Raising catfish in a tank can be as easy as shooting them in a barrel - as long as you have plenty of water.

"Catfish are social animals. They don't mind being crowded. Even being extremely crowded doesn't bother them," says Joe Lock, an Extension Wildlife and Fisheries Specialist based at Overton.

In the first year of a trial aquaculture project, Lock crowded more than 1,000 catfish into a 1,500-gallon-circular tank eight feet in diameter and four feet deep. Overflow from a spring-fed lake constantly renewed the tank water. The fish thrived. During one grow-

The technology is proven. As long as we have plenty of water, and the right feed, the economics work as well," Lock says.

Catfish producers get from 55 to 80 cents a pound for their fish. One pound of 56 percent protein catfish food costs about 15 percent when bought in quantity.

In 1992, U.S. processors sold 457 million pounds of catfish, mostly as whole fish, fillets or nuggets. A good portion of U.S. production is exported, mainly to the United Kingdom and Germany. Lock says there remains plenty of room for market expansion, not only in the United States but in Japan.

Catfish tank farming is not without its pitfalls. In one of Lock's earlier years, an errant cow knocked down the PVC pipe feeding the tank. Without flowing water, the fish suffocated. In another incident, algae clogged the drain from the lake, causing another fish kill.

"It's a good idea to test out aquaculture systems on a small scale to work out problems. That's what we designed this system to do," Lock says.
