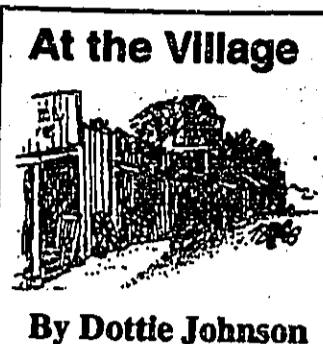

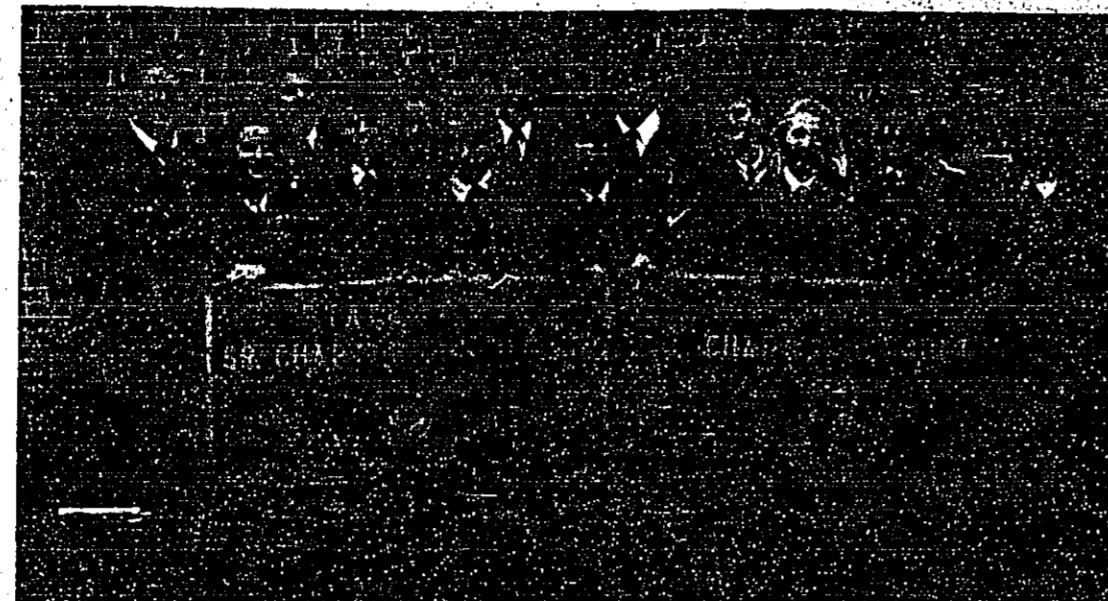

## Bulldogs fall to state ranked Tenaha in area playoff

LUFKIN — After getting bush-whacked 49-0 Friday night in the championship, Colmesneil coach Mike Jacobs and his Bulldogs still figure that it is better to have played and lost than not to have played at all. "The thing about the playoffs is that you've got to have played experience," says the Colmesneil coach. "I don't think you get to the playoffs the very first year and set the world on fire."

And while the Bulldogs didn't set the world on fire, they did have a couple of lousy nights. They didn't fold up camp as they should have in the state either. "After the Tigers took a 36-0 halftime lead, it would have been easy for the Bulldogs to catch it in. But instead, Colmesneil held its own in the third quarter, not allowing the Tigers to score, and finally gave up two fourth quarter scores on a 25 yard pass play and a five yard run just over a minute to go in the game. Jacobs said that at the halftime he told his players, "It would be easy to pull it out, but they have to realize that they are a playoff team and they represent our district. They need to score and play their best."

Tenaha, who will now go on to play Colmesneil in the regional playoffs this week, opened the scoring parade midway in the first period on a four yard run by quarterback Scotty Gray to make it 7-0. The caper came on an 18 yard pass from Latham to Anthony Robertson. Not satisfied, the Tigers added two more points on a pass from Latham to Stacy Thompson, who pleased the Tenaha fans with an acrobatic catch. Another Colmesneil turnover, the fifth of the quarter, opened the door for the Tigers fifth touchdown of the half moments later.

Down 7-0 and after an exchange of possession, Colmesneil set up deep at their own 33 yard line with three minutes remaining in the first quarter. Bulldog running back Les Van Brewer then took an inside handoff, and while struggling to make more yardage, he had the ball stripped out of his hands by Tenaha defensive back Robert Gray. The Tiger apocryph, with no one in front of him, set sail on a 37 yard touchdown romp. Again, Colmesneil did the honors and Tenaha jumped to a 14-0 lead.

This was one of several times during the game that Tenaha ripped or took the ball away from Colmesneil. On three other occasions the Tigers ripped the ball away from Colmesneil, and in each case, points were at stake. "I think they're catching," said Jacobs about Tenaha's aggressive defense. "They catch it. That's what we've seen on film on them (Tenaha) and talked with some other coaches and no one ever mentioning it, Cushing did that to us. I just figure that Tenaha practiced it."

Moments later Tenaha was on the scoreboard again, this time with a return of a blocked punt. Colmesneil had put themselves in a hole when Greg Bean tried to run Tenaha's block out of the endzone and was brought down at the five yard line. After three plays netted seven yards, the Bulldogs got set to punt on a fourth down from their own 12 yard line. Making the most of the situation, Tenaha came with a full charge. Greg Henderson, a 200 pound junior defensive end, stormed in to block the punt, while Evans, who had been doing all of the Tiger's kicking, fell on the ball in the endzone to make it 20-0 Tenaha lead.

A high snap from center on the point after kick ballooned any more damage to the quarter with one minute remaining. Although down, Colmesneil refused to fold. The Bulldogs put together a nine play, 40 yard drive on its next possession before another turnover put an end to it. With Les Van Brewer and Bean working the inside and outside, the Bulldogs moved from their own 20 to the Tiger 40 yard line. But at that point Colmesneil's second fumble gave the ball back to the Tigers. Waiting little time, the Tigers used a center in the running back Robert Bowden and the passing of Latham to roll 58 yards on six plays to make it 28-0. The caper came on an 18 yard pass from Latham to Anthony Robertson.

Not satisfied, the Tigers added two more points on a pass from Latham to Stacy Thompson, who pleased the Tenaha fans with an acrobatic catch. Another Colmesneil turnover, the fifth of the quarter, opened the door for the Tigers fifth touchdown of the half moments later. An interception by the Tigers at the Bulldog 33 yard line set up a four play Tenaha touchdown drive capped by a 20 yard pass from Latham to Thompson.

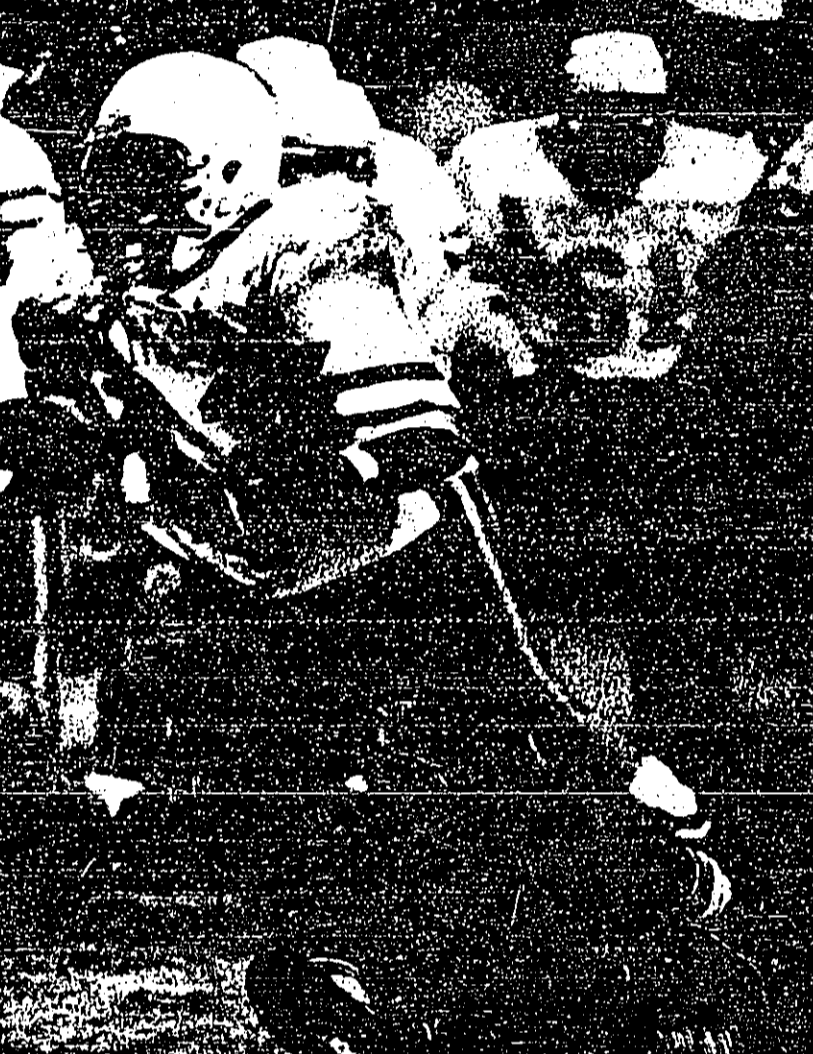

INDIAN VILLAGE — The Texas lottery bill in the senate, said proceeds for the lottery are now expected to be more than double what was originally projected.

In his address, he noted the legislature has approved a budget of \$70.1 billion for 1994-95, up \$7.2 billion from the \$62.9 billion which was allocated for 1992-93.

Montford also noted that \$1 billion has been budgeted for prison construction in the coming biennium.

## WISD can expect 15 Sinclair students

### —Children's center reports to Woodville school board—

WOODVILLE — The Woodville ISD should have as many as 15 students from the Kathryn Stanley Sinclair Children's Center by the end of December, Mary Lee Foundation Executive Director Charlene Crump told the board of trustees at their Nov. 16 meeting. The center's estimated maximum is 30 residents, the limit their license will allow them. The only agency for which their eligibility is still pending is the Department of Protective and Regulatory Services (DPRS) Institutional Placement Coordinator, which conducted its inspection on Nov. 16. This is only one of three state entities from which they have had to seek approval; the other two are DPRS Licensing and Youth For Tomorrow (a private organization which is contracted to Child Protective Services (CPS)). There is already one child in residence at the center, and at this date three others are waiting and should be admitted by the end of November. "We anticipate 12 to 15 children by the end of the year," Crump said, adding that they should all be under 12 years of age. There could, however, be exceptions. "If there is a family with siblings, one of which is 13 years old, we would be hesitant to break those children apart. But most of the children will be ages five to 12." Regarding problems their students could have in school, Crump seemed confident that they would be able to handle them. "Our local staff and administrator would work with Mrs. Moffett (Carol Moffett, WISD Superintendent) or other school administrators. Discipline

## County awarded grant for radio equipment

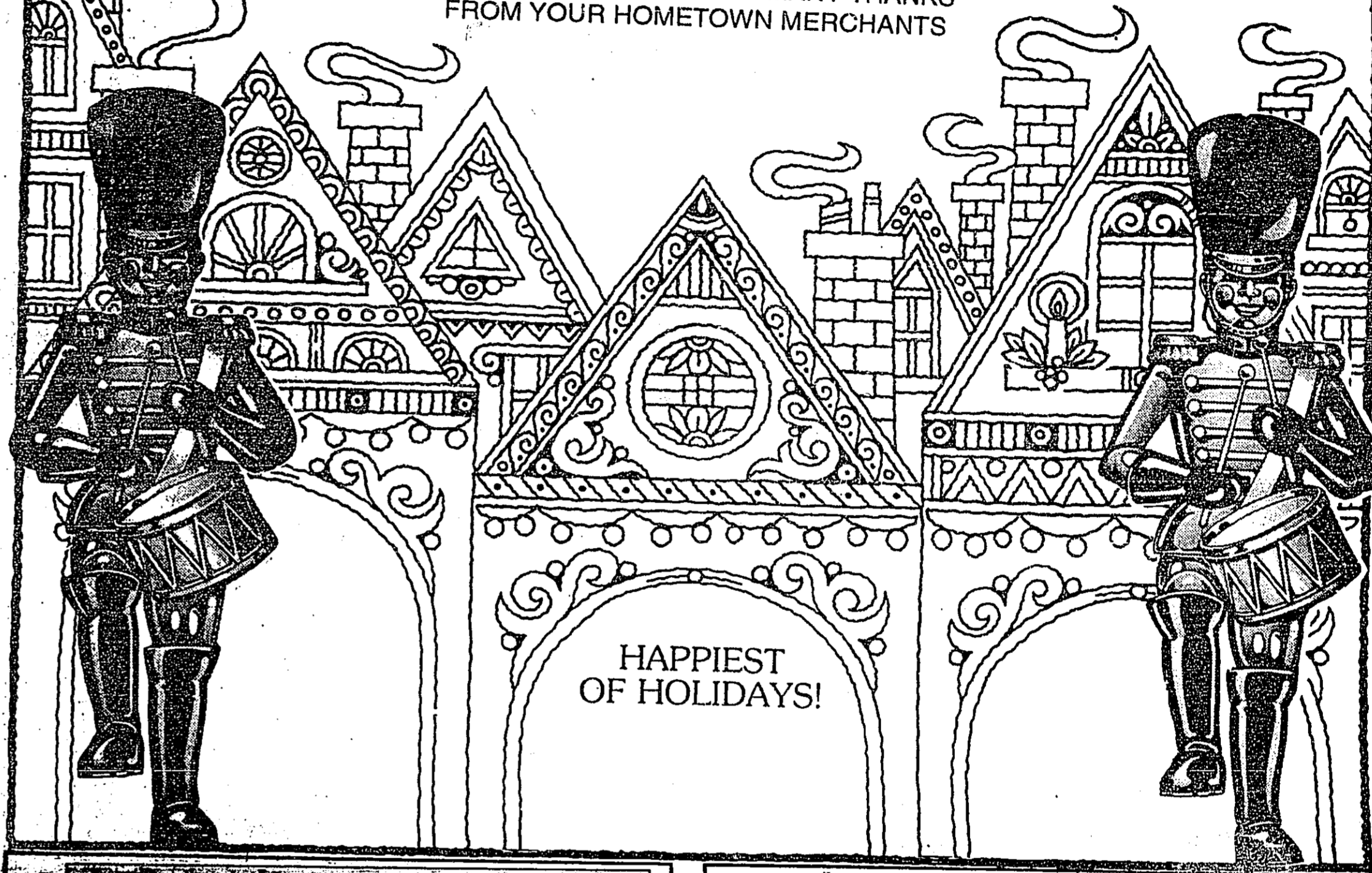
