




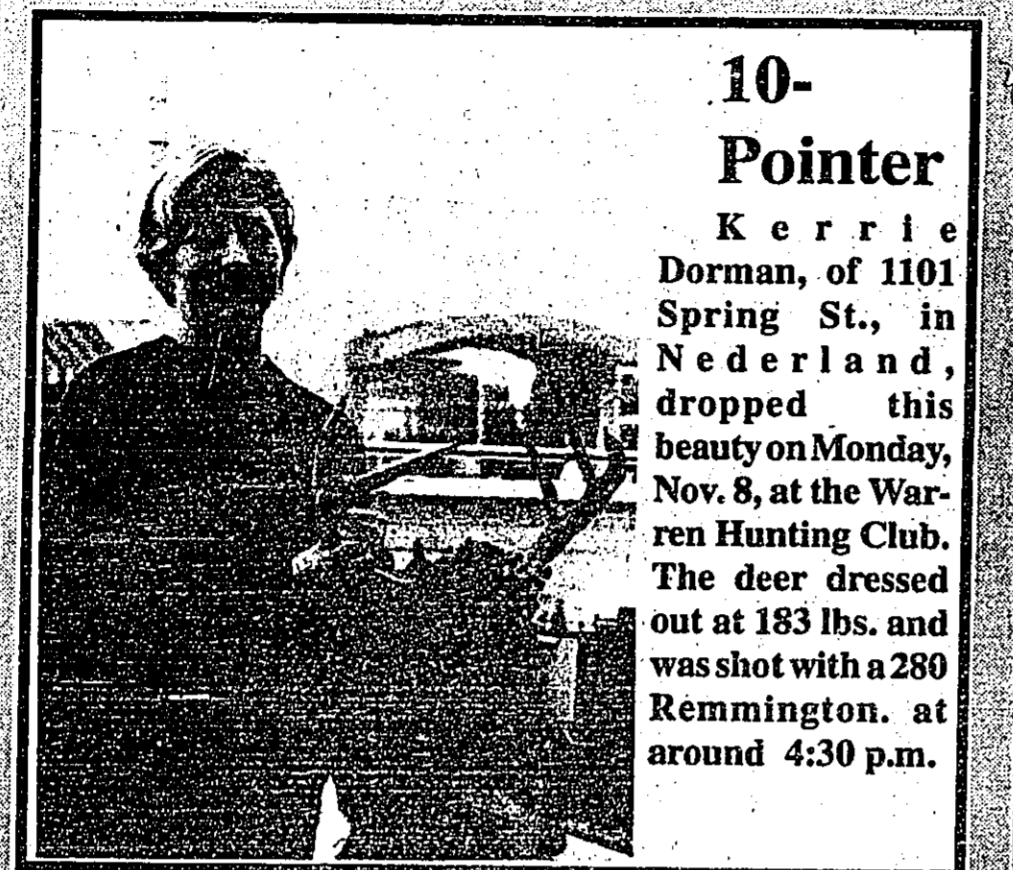

## Drug charges filed - Arrests end 18-month undercover probe-

WOODVILLE — An 18-month-long undercover investigation by the Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force ended last week with the arrest of 17 suspects on charges ranging from felony delivery of controlled substances to evading arrest.

According to Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan, a small army of law enforcement officers armed with search and arrest warrants swept through the Woodville, Warren, Ivanhoe and Colmesnell areas on Wednesday, Dec. 15.

In addition to the arrests, the officers seized three vehicles, a quantity of drug paraphernalia and two guns, one of which had previously been reported as stolen.

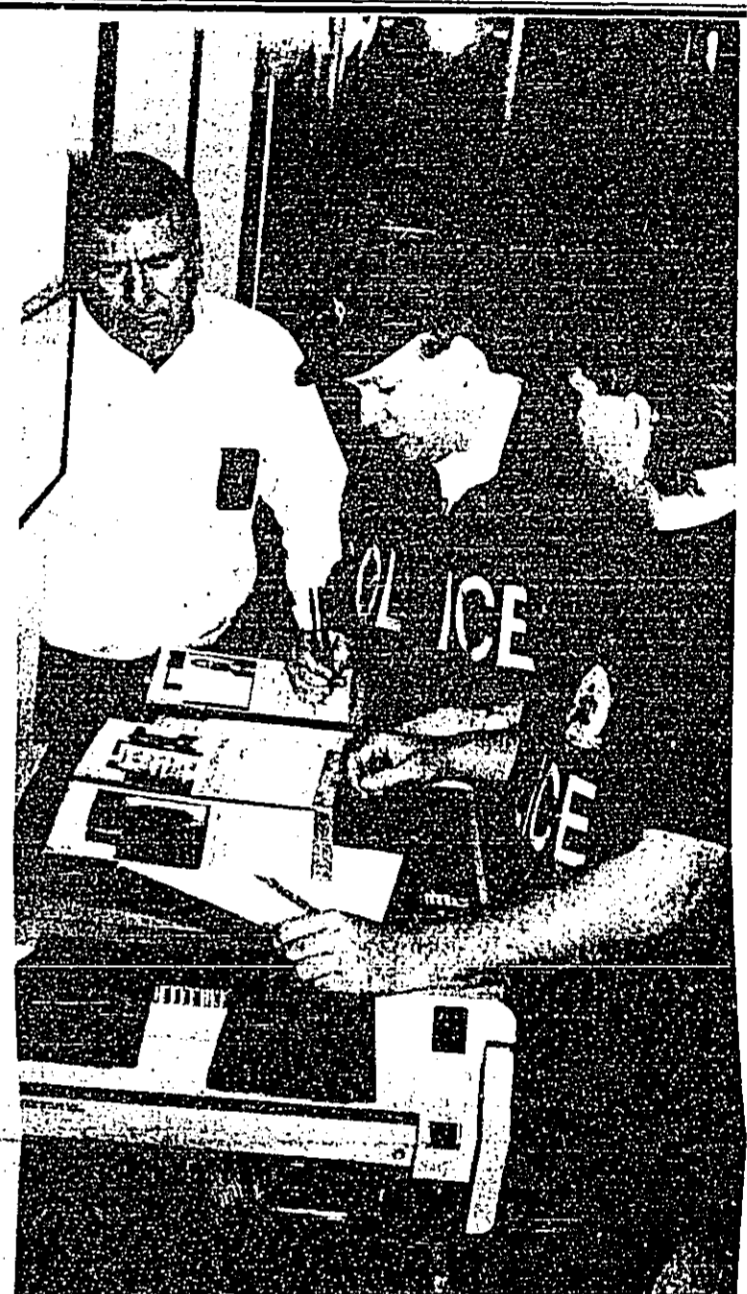
Arrested in the roundup of suspects were:

- Johnny Ray Wooten, 22, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance.
- Dwight C. Barkin, 23, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance.
- Stephen Wayne Mitchell, 23, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine).
- David Dean Mayeux, 34, of Woodville, a misdemeanor charge of delivery of marijuana (less than 1/4 ounce).
- Roy Milton Haynes, 46, delivery of a controlled substance.
- Shannon Foster, 22, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine).
- Rocky Ramshur, 23, delivery of a dangerous drug.
- Michael D. Adams, 18, of Doucette, possession of a controlled substance (cocaine).
- Edward Lynn Lewis, 26, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance.
- Luther David Conner, 35, of Warren, felony possession of marijuana.
- Dennis Ray Sparkman, 31, of Ivanhoe, felony delivery of marijuana.
- Leonard Harkness, 34, Texas Department of Public Safety warrant.
- Randy Smith Foster, 35, of Colmesnell, evading arrest.
- Kenneth Mason, 34, of Colmesnell, delivery of a controlled substance and delivery of a dangerous drug.
- David Ferrel, 38, of Warren, delivery of a controlled substance and delivery of marijuana.
- Robert Lynn Morse, 32, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine) and
- Johnny Bass of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance.

Hennigan said that officers involved in the suspect roundup last week included those from the task force as well as Tyler County sheriff's deputies, Woodville police officers, agents with the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms' Beaumont office, the Tyler County constables and the Texas Highway Patrol officers.

"We feel that the people are demanding action on drugs and we plan to do everything we can to try and keep on top of the situation," Hennigan said following the arrests.

## Police car damaged in chase

WOODVILLE — A 25-year-old Dodge man was charged with drunk driving and evading arrest last week following a high speed chase that stretched from Woodville south along Highway 69 into Hardin County.

James Aaron Weaver also was charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle following the pursuit that sometimes exceeded 100 miles per hour along the busy highway.

According to Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan, the incident began about 10:45 p.m. Friday, Dec. 17, when Deputy Jesse Wolf was called to the Wal-Mart parking lot on Highway 69 South in response to a call regarding and intoxicated man creating a disturbance.

Upon arrival, Wolf spotted a car speeding through and away from the parking lot at an unsafe speed.

Wolf and a Woodville Police Department patrol car began pursuing the suspect. During the chase, the suspect was described as driving in a reckless manner, crossing the center highway strip a number of times and colliding head-on with a number of northbound vehicles.

Hennigan said the car was chased into Hardin County where it finally pulled off of Highway 69 onto a side road and came to a stop.

"The Woodville police unit pulled up on the side road behind the suspect vehicle and the officers were alerted to get out when the suspect did a donut in his car and came back around and deliberately rammed the police car," Hennigan said.

Neither of the Woodville PD officers, Bryan Weatherford and Ralph Fuller, were injured.

After the collision, the driver of the vehicle abandoned the car and attempted to run into some nearby woods but was apprehended by the officers.

Following his arrest, Weaver was arraigned before a Hardin County justice of the peace and then returned to the Tyler County Justice Center.

Woodville Police Chief Scott York said that while neither of his officers were injured in the collision, extensive damage was inflicted on their patrol car. Additional charges of aggravated assault on a peace officer.

## Two JP candidates enter races

WOODVILLE — After getting off to a fast start earlier this month, the pace of candidates filing to run in the March 8 primary election slowed down this past week with only two justices of the peace contenders adding their names to the ballot.

Gordon McCabe filed as a candidate for the Precinct 4 JP spot and Frankie Rogers entered his name in the Precinct 3 JP race.

McCabe will be challenging incumbent JP Roy Drake in the Democratic Party primary while Rogers will be competing with Jimmy Wayne Davis and Clara Tolar for the Precinct 3 JP seat now held by John Ed Hanks.

Hanks has not yet filed for re-election.

Thus far, a total of 17 candidates have filed for the 11 local positions that will be featured on the 1994 election ballot.

As of press time Tuesday, the only countywide contested races were for the Tyler County criminal district attorney's post, in which incumbent James A. "Jim" Clark was being challenged by former DA Pat Hardy, and the county treasurer's office, in which incumbent Tim Bump and former banker Webb W. Ashworth were seeking the post being vacated by the retirement of Jean Phillips.

On the precinct level, contested races included the Precinct 3 and 4 JP contests as well as the Precinct 2 county commission seat in which incumbent Commissioner A.M. "Peter" Barnes was being challenged by Chester Mayor Bryan Davis.

Other county positions on the March primary ballot have thus far attracted only the incumbents. Those who are unopposed thus far include County Judge Jerome Owens, District Clerk Patricia (Pat) Brown, County Clerk Woodville Hospital in Woodville following a lengthy illness.

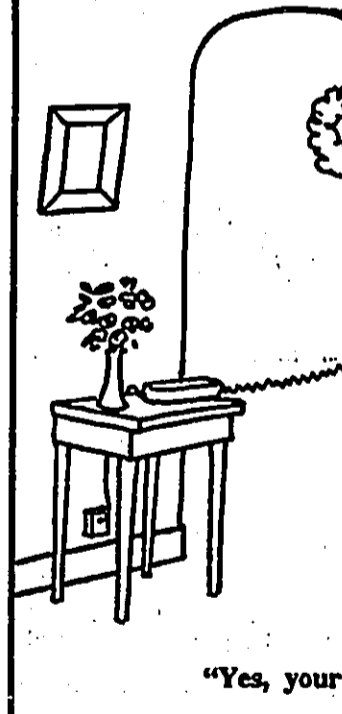

"We still have a few more arrests to make in connection with this undercover investigation. The warrants have been issued and we will be taking additional suspects into custody as we locate them."  
"We will continue to use all means available to us to control the drug traffic in and around Tyler County, including undercover operations," the sheriff said.  
Most of the suspects arrested last week were free on bond early this week, however, as of Monday afternoon, Foster, Lewis and Ferrel remained in custody at the Tyler County Justice Center.  
Although not initially sought by officers when the roundup began, two suspects were placed into custody by officers after the drug arrests got underway. Harkness reportedly was with one of the drug suspects when officers executed the warrants and it was learned during the on-scene investigation that he was wanted on charges filed by the Texas Department of Public Safety. A second man, Fowler, reportedly was at the residence of another sus-

pect and attempted to run from the scene when officers arrived. He was subsequently charged with evading arrest.  
In rounding up the suspects on the drug-related charges, officers had a fairly easy time in locating one man on their list. Bass was already in the county jail, where he was served with the delivery of controlled substance warrant.  
According to Woodville Police Chief Scott Yosko, Bass was arrested earlier this month following a "snatch and grab" robbery at a convenience store on South Magnolia Street.  
Bass was accused of going into the store and asking for change. When the clerk opened the cash register, the suspect reportedly reached over, grabbed about \$200 in cash and ran from the store.  
Bass was subsequently arrested after an officer spotted the store manager chasing the suspect down the street. In addition, Bass also reportedly left his wallet containing his identification behind in the store following the robbery.

and felony criminal mischief were pending in Hardin County in connection with the incident.  
In a separate incident that also resulted in charges of evading arrest, two men were placed in custody Friday afternoon following a routine traffic stop by Woodville police.  
Yosko said a car driven by James Melvin Hoyt, 29, of Buna was stopped on Hyde Street in Woodville about 3:45 p.m. While approaching the car, the patrol officer reported smelling marijuana. During questioning, the driver was unable to produce a driver's license or proof of insurance and was placed under arrest.  
The suspect then reportedly ran into some nearby woods.  
Because the officer had a second

suspect at the scene, a passenger in the vehicle, he was unable to pursue the driver into the woods and instead radioed for assistance.  
Yosko said Tyler County sheriff's deputies, game wardens, Texas Highway Patrol officers and officers with the National Park Service joined the Woodville Police Department in the search for the suspect, who was located in a wooded area off South Pecan Street following a 20-minute hunt.  
A small amount of marijuana was subsequently found inside the suspect's vehicle.  
Hoyt was charged with evading arrest and the passenger in the car, William Lester Sizem, 23, of Trent, was charged with possession of drug paraphernalia.

**Commissioners split over Friday holiday**

WOODVILLE—After unanimously approving an 11-day holiday schedule for 1994, Tyler County Commissioners were divided last week over authorizing a final day off in 1993.  
In a 3-2 vote with County Judge Jerome Owens breaking the tie, commissioners voted to close the courthouse on Friday, Dec. 31, in observance of the New Year's Day Holiday.  
During the special meeting held Friday, Dec. 17, Owens said the county normally closed on Jan. 1 for the holiday but recommended the Friday closing because New Year's Day falls on a Saturday this year.  
While all courthouse offices will be closed Friday for the holiday, the vote also called for the Tyler County Tax Assessor-Collector's office located in the Courthouse Annex on West Bluff Street to remain open on West Bluff Street to remain open on Friday, Jan. 3, as that office will take Monday, Jan. 3, as their New Year's holiday.  
In voting to close the remainder of the county's offices on Friday, Precinct 1 Commissioner Maxie Riley and Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerry Mahan voiced their opposition.  
"A lot of people need to do business on the last day of the year with a

number of offices," Mahan said. "This same thing came up six or seven years ago and we got burned for closing the courthouse on the last day of the year."  
Both Mahan and Riley told the other commissioners that many of their constituents became very upset when the courthouse shut down while most other area businesses remained open.  
"We're all trying to hold the line on taxes," Mahan added. "We had to raise taxes this year. We asked for support from the people and we almost got unanimous support. I don't feel it's too much to ask for them (the employees) to be here on Dec. 31. Our business is to serve the people."  
Both Precinct 2 Commissioner Pete Barnes and Precinct 4 Commissioner Henry Earl Sawyer each voiced their support for granting a Dec. 31 holiday.  
Sawyer noted that county employees have always been granted a day off for the New Year's holiday and said he did not feel the commissioners "should take anything away" from them.  
In breaking the 2-2 tie vote among the commissioners, Owens agreed with Sawyer that a holiday for New Year's is traditional and should continue.

School prayer supported  
In other business during the meeting Friday, the commissioners unanimously approved a resolution asking that prayer be returned to public schools.  
"I think the people of the county and families of the county are ready to take back our schools and see that God is part of our schools," Owens said in presenting the resolution for the commissioners' consideration.  
Noting the problems facing children and schools today, Owens said he felt an essential ingredient in solving the situation is religion. He noted that today many families are splintered and that children "have no anchor" and thus need religion to help guide them.  
"I believe it takes more than taking guns away from kids at school to re-establish what is needed in our schools," Owens said. "It will take prayer."  
Nick Novak, vicar of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Woodville, was present for the passing of the resolution and voiced his support for the measure.  
"It is interesting to me that the public school system is looking for a system

of morals to teach to kids but they have disenfranchised themselves from the most obvious and best system available," Novak said.  
In the measure, the commissioners court urged all cities and counties across the state to join an effort to reinstate prayer in schools by passing similar resolutions and united in a "grass root" movement for that purpose.

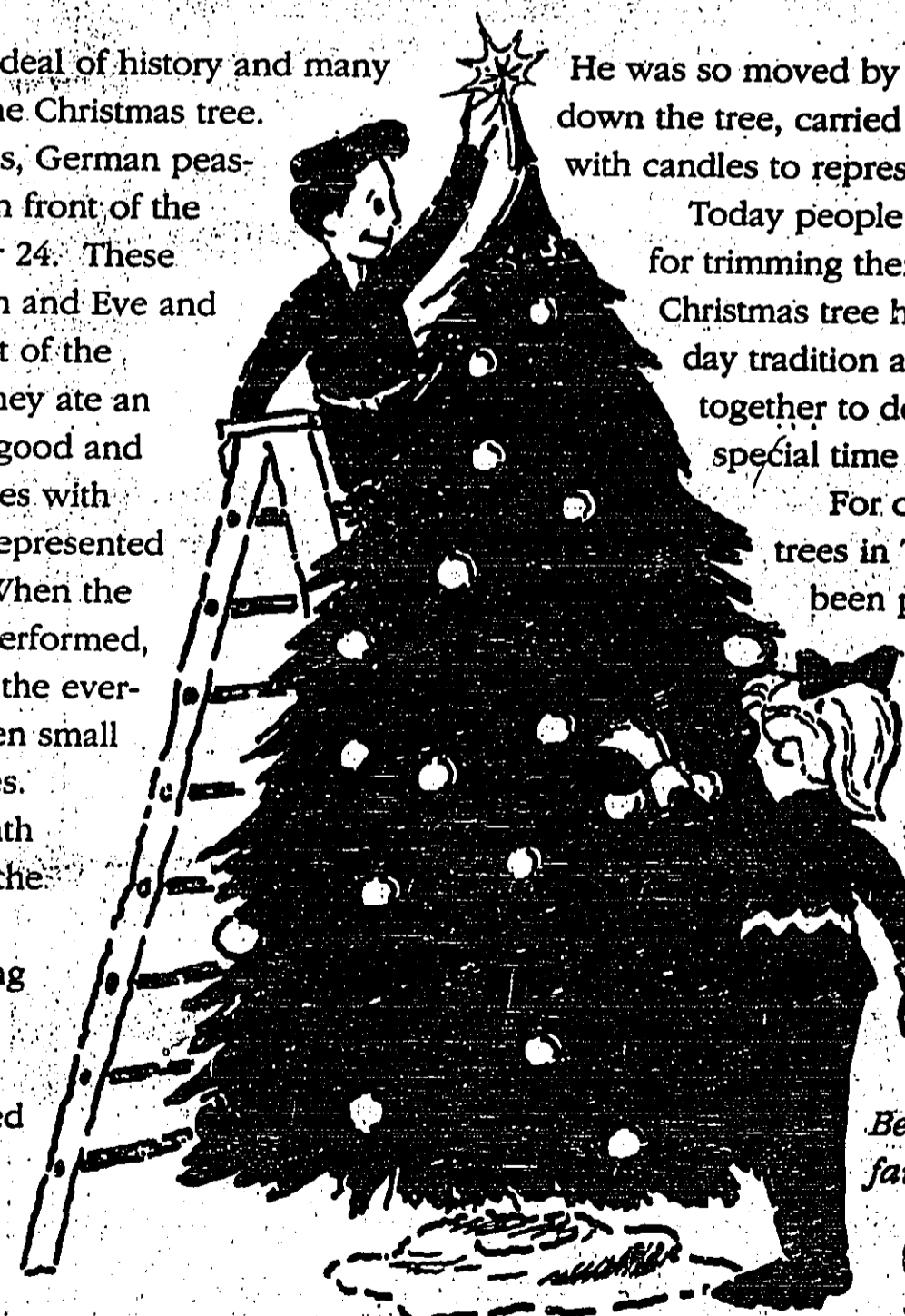

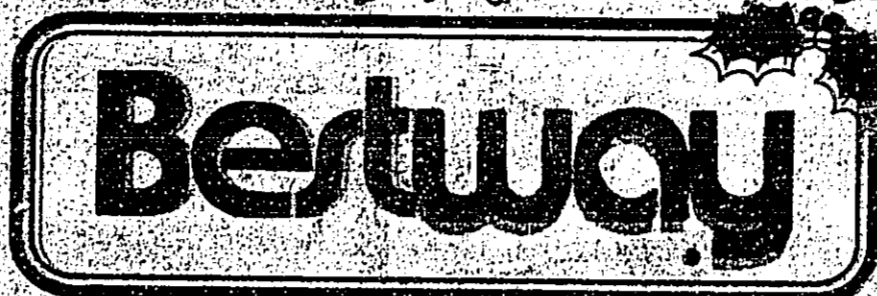

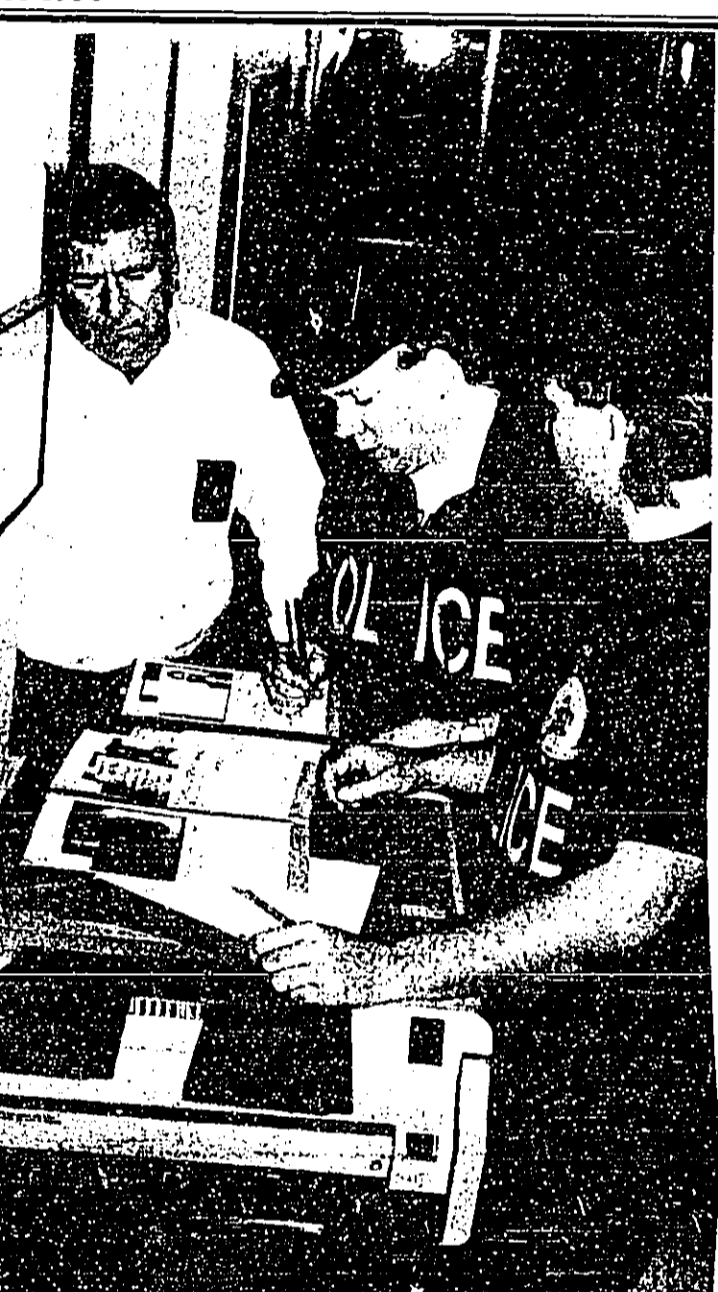

**Drug charges filed**  
 -Arrests end 18-month undercover probe-

WOODVILLE — An 18-month-long undercover investigation by the Southeast Texas Narcotics and Intelligence Task Force ended last week with the arrest of 17 suspects on charges ranging from felony delivery of controlled substances to evading arrest.  
 According to Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan, a small army of law enforcement officers armed with search and arrest warrants swept through the Woodville, Warren, Ivanhoe and Colmesnell areas on Wednesday, Dec. 15.  
 In addition to the arrests, the officers seized three vehicles, a quantity of drug paraphernalia and two guns, one of which had previously been reported as stolen.  
 Arrested in the roundup of suspects were:  
 • Johnny Ray Wooten, 22, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance;  
 • Dwight C. Barkin, 23, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance;  
 • Stephen Wayne Mitchell, 23, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine);  
 • David Dean Mayeux, 34, of Woodville, a misdemeanor charge of delivery of marijuana (less than 1/4 ounce);  
 • Roy Milton Haynes, 46, delivery of a controlled substance;  
 • Shannon Foster, 22, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine);  
 • Michael D. Adams, 18, of Doucette, possession of a controlled substance (cocaine);  
 • Edward Lynn Lewis, 26, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance;  
 • Luther David Conner, 35, of Warren, felony possession of marijuana;  
 • Dennis Ray Sparkman, 31, of Ivanhoe, felony delivery of marijuana;  
 • Leonard Harkness, 34, Texas Department of Public Safety Warrant;  
 • Randy Smith Fowler, 35, of Colmesnell, evading arrest.  
 • Kenneth Mason, 34, of Colmesnell, delivery of a controlled substance and delivery of a dangerous drug;  
 • David Ferrel, 38, of Warren, delivery of a controlled substance and delivery of marijuana;  
 • Robert Lynn Morse, 32, of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance (cocaine);  
 • Johnny Bass of Woodville, delivery of a controlled substance.  
 Hennigan said that officers involved in the suspect roundup last week included those from the task force as well as Tyler County sheriff's deputies, Woodville police officers, agents with the federal Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms' Beaumont office, the Tyler County constables and the Texas Highway Patrol officers.  
 "We feel that the people are demanding action on drugs and we plan to do everything we can to try and keep on top of the situation," Hennigan said following the arrests.

**Police car damaged in chase**

WOODVILLE — A 25-year-old Doucette man was charged with drunk driving and evading arrest last week following a high speed chase that stretched from Woodville south along Highway 69 into Hardin County.  
 James Aaron Weaver also was charged with unauthorized use of a motor vehicle following the pursuit, that sometimes exceeded 100 miles per hour along the busy highway.  
 According to Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan, the incident began about 10:45 p.m. Friday, Dec. 17, when Deputy Jessie Wolf was called to the Wal-Mart parking lot on Highway 69 South in response to a call regarding and intoxicated man creating a disturbance.  
 Upon arrival, Wolf spotted a car speeding through and away from the parking lot at an unsafe speed.  
 Wolf and a Woodville Police Department patrol car began pursuing the suspect. During the chase, the suspect was described as driving in a reckless manner, crossing the center highway stripe a number of times and nearly colliding head-on with a number of northbound vehicles.  
 Hennigan said the car was chased into Hardin County where it finally pulled off of Highway 69 onto a side road and came to a stop.  
 "The Woodville police unit pulled up on the side road behind the suspect vehicle and the officers were getting ready to get out when the suspect did a donut in his car and came back around and deliberately rammed the police car," Hennigan said.  
 Neither of the Woodville PD officers, Bryan Weaberford and Ralph Fuller, were injured.  
 After the collision, the driver of the vehicle abandoned the car and attempted to run into some nearby woods but was apprehended by the officers.  
 Following his arrest, Weaver was arraigned before a Hardin County justice of the peace and then returned to the Tyler County Justice Center.  
 Woodville Police Chief Scout Parks said that while neither of his officers were injured in the collision, extensive damage was inflicted on their patrol car. Additional charges of aggravated assault on a peace officer were filed against the suspect.

**Two JP candidates enter races**

WOODVILLE — After getting off to a fast start earlier this month, the pace of candidates filing to run in the March 8 primary election slowed down this past week with only two justice of the peace contenders adding their names to the ballot.  
 Gordon McCabe filed as a candidate for the Precinct 4 JP spot and Frankie Rogers entered his name in the Precinct 3 JP race.  
 McCabe will be challenging incumbent JP Roy Drake in the Democratic Party primary while Rogers will be competing with Jimmy Wayne Davis and Clara Tolar for the Precinct 3 JP seat now held by John Ed Hanks.  
 Thus far, a total of 17 candidates have filed for the 11 local positions that will be featured on the 1994 election ballot.  
 As of press time Tuesday, the only countywide contested races were for the Tyler County criminal district attorney's post, in which incumbent James A. Jimmie Clark was being challenged by former DA Pat Harbuck and the county treasurer's office, in which Assistant Treasurer Tim Bump and former banker Webb V. Ashworth were seeking the post being vacated by the retirement of Jean Phillips.  
 On the precinct level, contested races included the Precinct 3 and 4 JP contests as well as the Precinct 2 county commissioner seat in which incumbent Commissioner A.M. "Pete" Barnes was being challenged by Chester Mayor Bryan Davis.  
 Other county positions on the March primary ballot have thus far attracted only a few candidates. Those who are unopposed thus far include County Judge Jerome Owens, District Clerk Patricia (Pat) Brown, County Clerk by the retirement of Jean Phillips.

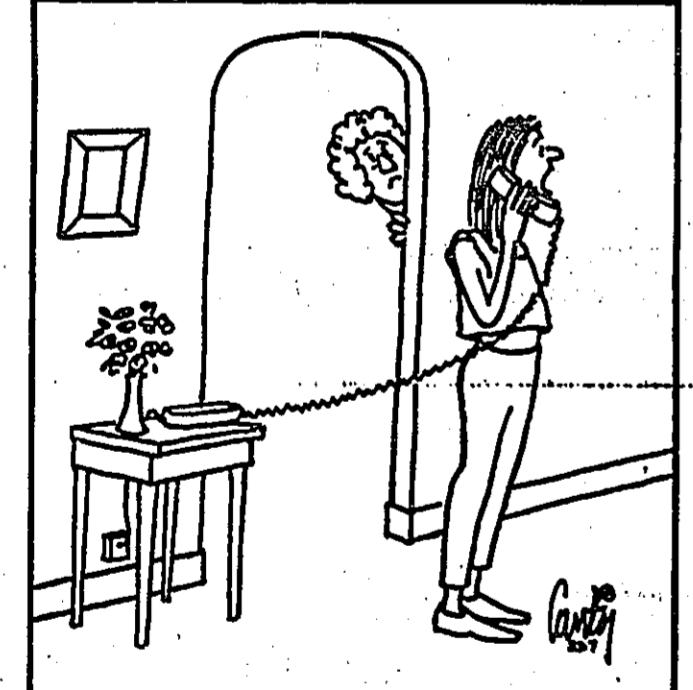

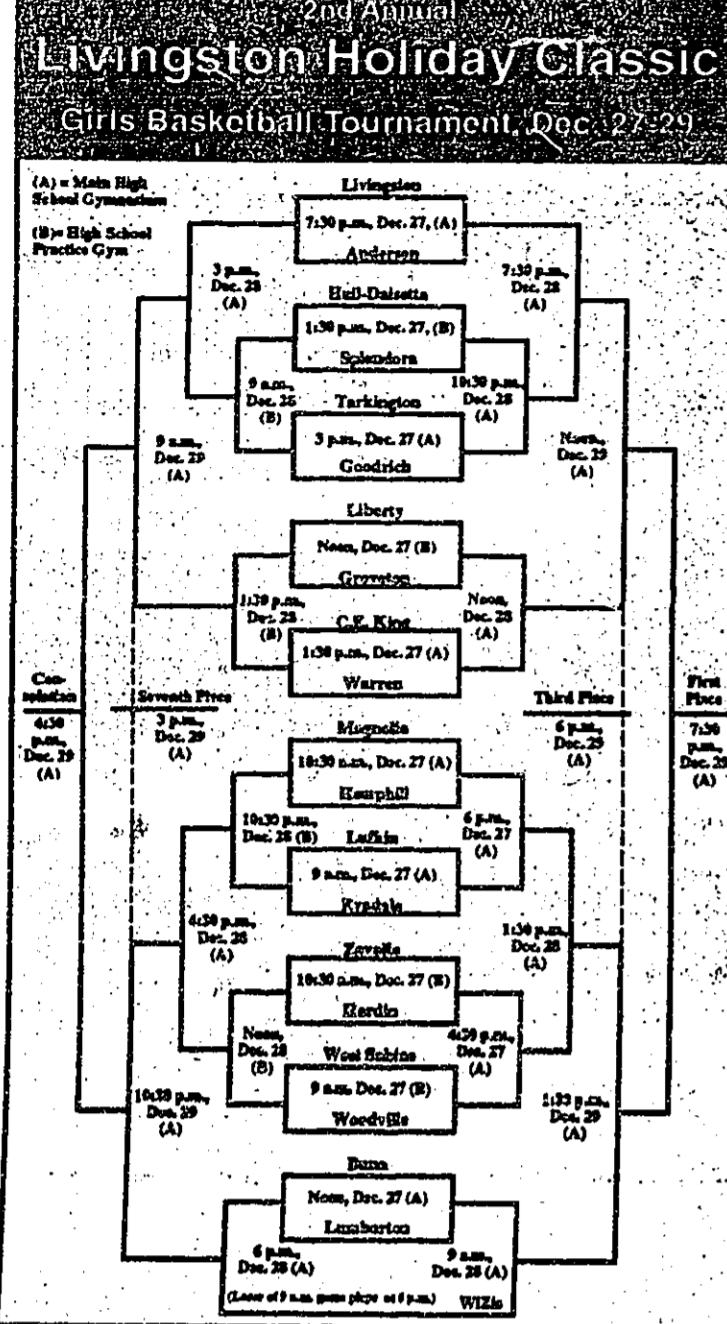

"We still have a few more arrests to make in connection with this undercover investigation. The warrants have been issued and we will be taking additional suspects into custody as we locate them. We will continue to use all means available to us to control the drug traffic in and around Tyler County, including undercover operations," the sheriff said. Most of the suspects arrested last week were free on bond early this week, however, as of Monday afternoon, Foster, Lewis and Ferrel remained in custody at the Tyler County Justice Center. Although not initially sought by officers when the roundup began, two suspects were placed into custody by officers after the drug arrests got underway. Harkness reportedly was with one of the drug suspects when officers executed the warrants and it was learned during the on-scene investigation that he was wanted on charges filed by the Texas Department of Public Safety. Commissioners split over Friday holiday

WOODVILLE—After unanimously approving an 11-day holiday schedule for 1994, Tyler County Commissioners were divided last week over authorizing a final day off in 1993. In a 3-2 vote with County Judge Jerome Owens breaking the tie, commissioners voted to close the courthouse on Friday, Dec. 31, in observance of the New Year's Day Holiday. During the special meeting held Friday, Dec. 17, Owens said the county normally closed on Jan. 1 for the holiday but recommended the Friday closing because New Year's Day falls on a Saturday this year. While all courthouses offices will be closed Friday for the holiday, the vote also called for the Tyler County Tax Assessor-Collector's office located in the Courthouse Annex on West Bluff Street to remain open. Employees in that office will take Monday, Jan. 3, as their New Year's holiday. In voting to close the remainder of the county's offices on Friday, Precinct 1 Commissioner Maxie Riley and Precinct 3 Commissioner Jerry Mahan voiced their opposition. "A lot of people need to do business on the last day of the year with a number of offices," Mahan said. "This same thing came up six or seven years ago and we got burned for closing the courthouse on the last day of the year." Both Mahan and Riley told the other commissioners that many of their constituents became very upset when the courthouses shut down while most other area businesses remained open. "We're all trying to hold the line on taxes," Mahan added. "We had to raise taxes this year. We asked for support from the people and we almost got unanimous support. I don't feel too much to ask for them (the employees) to be here on Dec. 31. Our business is to serve the people." Both Precinct 2 Commissioner Pete Barnes and Precinct 4 Commissioner Henry Earl Sawyer each voiced their support for granting a Dec. 31 holiday. Sawyer noted that county employees have always been granted a day off for the New Year's holiday and said he did not feel the commissioners "should take anything away" from them. In breaking the 2-2 tie vote among the commissioners, Owens agreed with Sawyer that a holiday for New Year's is traditional and should continue. School prayer supporters. In other business during the meeting Friday, the commissioners unanimously approved a resolution asking that prayer be returned to public schools. "I think the people of the county and families of the county are ready to take back our schools and see that God is part of our schools," Owens said in presenting the resolution for the commissioners' consideration. Noting the problems facing children and schools today, Owens said he felt an essential ingredient in solving the situation is religion. He noted that today many families are splintered and that children "have no anchor" and thus need religion to help guide them. "I believe it takes more than taking guns away from kids at school to re-establish what is needed in our schools," Owens said. "It will take prayer." Nick Novak, vicar of St. Paul's Episcopal Church in Woodville, was present for the passing of the resolution and voiced his support for the measure. "It is interesting to me that the public school system is looking for a system
