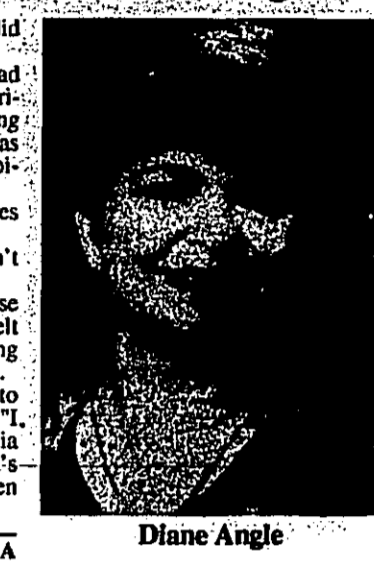

California earthquake 'hits close to home'
-Woodville woman updates her California sister on quake damage-

WOODVILLE — Gigi Angle, who now lives in Woodville, said Monday, following the California earthquake, "It was like living through it all over again," said Woodville resident Gigi Angle following Monday's California earthquake.
Even though she now resides some 1,000 miles from the site of the killer quake, the home of her older sister, Diane, was only about five miles from the disaster's epicenter in Oxnard, Calif.
"it was as if I was right there with her," Gigi said.
"for some reason I got up early Monday about 4 a.m., turned on the TV, and saw what was happening. I waited till 5 a.m. before I called.
"Are you awake?" Gigi asked her sister, calling from Woodville.
"Am I awake?" Diane answered.
"We have no power, no lights and

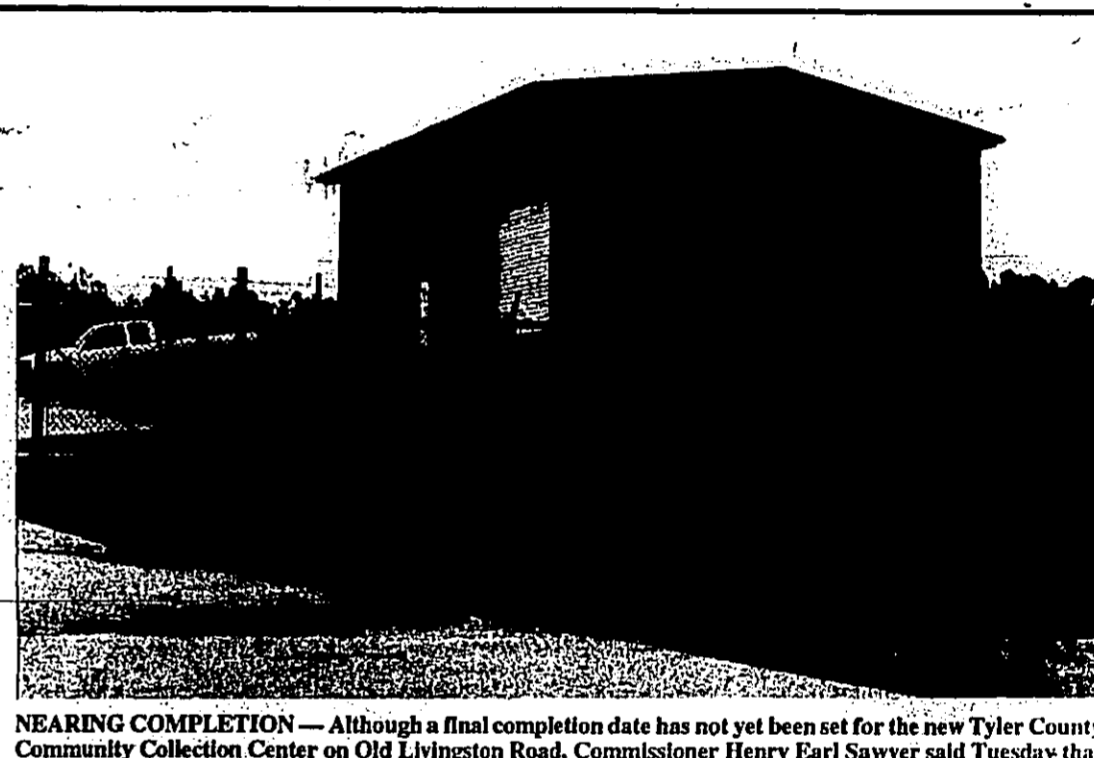
everything upstairs is ruined. We're not even going to look upstairs until daylight."
Before moving to Woodville, Gigi experienced the '89 San Francisco quake that registered a 7.1 on the Richter scale. The quake Monday measured 6.6.
"This one was bad, but not as bad as ours," she said.
Diane works in the records department as a deputy clerk for the City of Ventura which is located about one hour north of Los Angeles. She is also an emergency center volunteer.
She lives in a two-story house that now has 1/4-inch cracks throughout the walls.
"I'm getting out of Dodge' as soon as I can," Diane told her sister in Texas.
Gigi said, "She couldn't call out because the electricity was out. So, I called her and gave her two telephone

WOODVILLE — Former Tyler County Constable Harley Crews has announced that he is a candidate for the Precinct 3 justice of the peace position in the March 8 Democratic Party primary election.
He is seeking the post now held by John Ed Hanks who is not seeking re-election this year.
Crews, 71, is a retired building and trades teacher with 14 years of service at Spryng High School.
"Most of you already know me, but some are new to the area. I am seeking the position of justice of the peace of Tyler County Precinct 3 and I believe that my 30 years of service as constable of Precinct 3 gives me some of the knowledge needed for this job," he said.
Crews added that he has been a certified peace officer of the State of Texas for over 20 years, which he said gives him additional qualifications for the position.

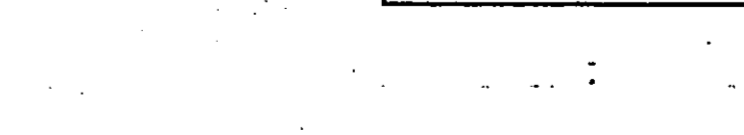

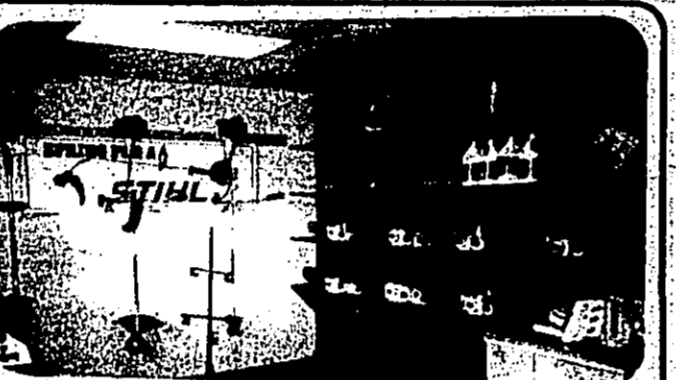

California earthquake 'hits close to home'
 -Woodville woman updates her California sister on quake damage-

WOODVILLE — Gigi Angle, who now lives in Woodville, said Monday, following the California earthquake, "It was like living through it all over again," said Woodville resident Gigi Angle following Monday's California earthquake.
 Even though she now resides some 1,000 miles from the site of the killer quake, the home of her older sister, Diane, was only about five miles from the disaster's epicenter in Oxnard, Calif.
 "It was as if I was right there with her," Gigi said.
 Before moving to Woodville, Gigi experienced the '89 San Francisco quake that registered a 7.1 on the Richter scale. The quake Monday measured 6.6.
 "This one was bad, but not as bad as ours," she said.
 Diane works in the records department as a deputy clerk for the City of Ventura which is located about one hour north of Los Angeles. She is also an emergency center volunteer.
 She lives in a two-story house that now has 1 1/2 inch cracks throughout the walls.
 "I'm getting out of Dodge" as soon as I can," Diane said her sister in Texas.
 Gigi said, "She couldn't call out because the electricity was out. I called her and gave her two telephone

updates. I knew more than she did about the quake damage."
 The seismic event brought back memories of the quake Gigi experienced first hand in 1989 while living in Bolter Creek, Calif., which was located about 20 miles from the epicenter at Santa Cruz.
 "I have lots of friends that lost homes that day."
 "It's very frightening if you haven't been through one."
 "Our home just rolled...the house just shook, shook, shook. Kind of felt like the Jolly Green Giant was shaking the house. It knocked us out of bed."
 "Most people in Texas can't relate to an earthquake," Gigi said, adding, "I would never go back to California because you never know when it's going to hit. You can hear it, but then it's too late."

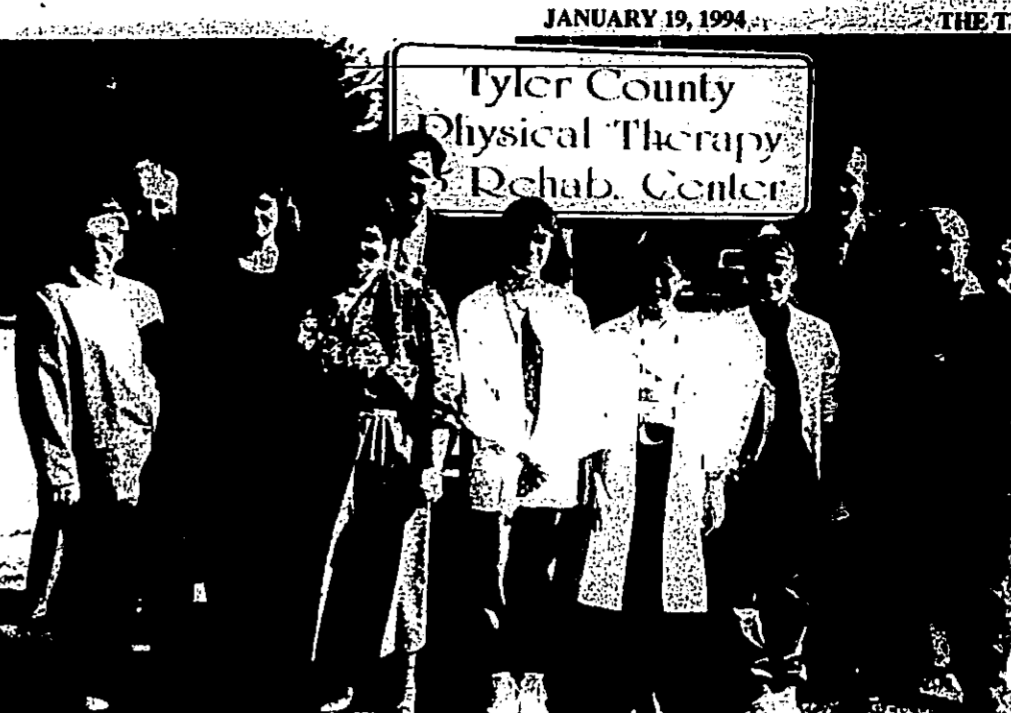

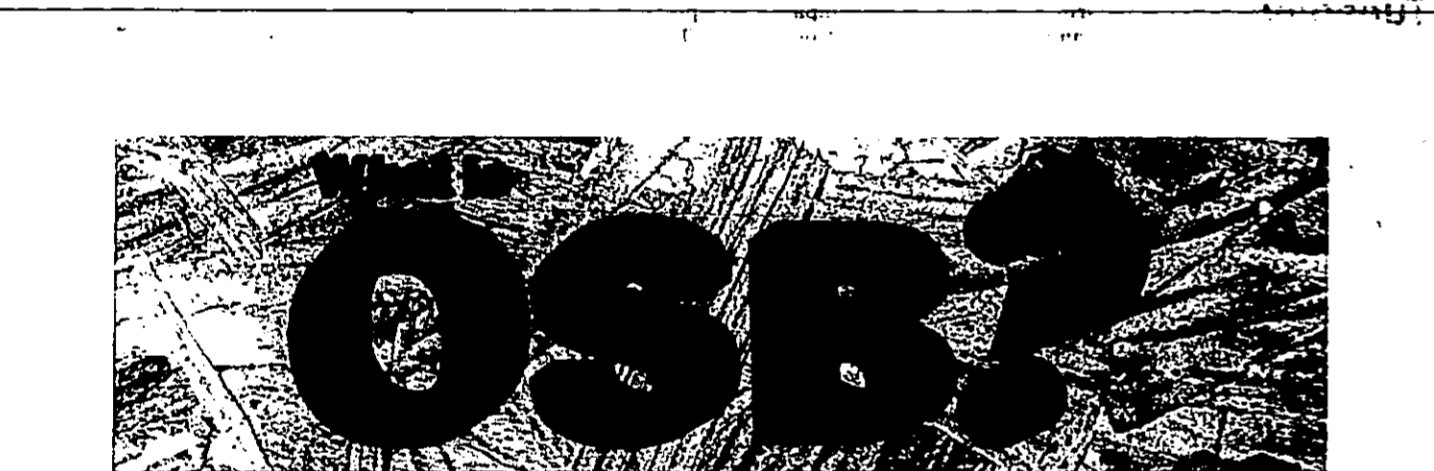

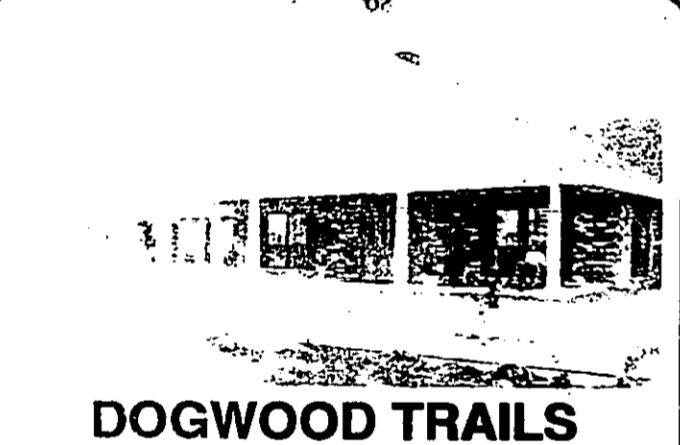
