Warren elevated to 3A, joins Woodville's district -UIL district re-alignment moves Colmesneil basketball program north-

AUSTIN -- While most Tyler County schools will play in district different from Tuesday's University Interscholastic League district re-alignment, the Warren Independent School District is an exception as it once again was elevated from Class 2A to 3A. Under the football and basketball district alignment plans issued Tuesday morning in Austin, Warren will compete in District 21-3A beginning with the 1994-95 school year.

Head-on collision hurts 2

WARREN -- A 25-year-old Woodville man remained hospitalized early this week following a head-on traffic mishap reported 4.5 miles south of Warren Saturday morning. Stephen Thomas Melton was in stable condition in Tyler County Hospital Monday undergoing treatment for injuries sustained in the mishap. He was expected to be released either Tuesday or Wednesday.

County jobless rate moves downward

WOODVILLE -- Tyler County's jobless rate fell by almost a full percentage point during December, dropping from November's 9.3 percent mark all the way down to 8.4 percent, according to figures released by the Texas Employment Commission. The December report - the latest currently available - indicates that the local jobless rate declined by 9 percentage points. The new rate is below the 8.9 percent unemployment recorded for October but is slightly higher than September's 8.3 percent level.

Former county man dies in crash

SEGUIN -- A former Tyler County reserve deputy sheriff was killed last week in a head-on collision on Interstate 10 in Seguin. Daniel Allen Ross, 45, of Seguin, an officer with the 25th Judicial District Narcotics Task Force, was one of two drivers killed in an accident reported at 10:59 p.m. Thursday, Jan. 27. The name of the second driver killed was not immediately available because police had been unable to contact any relatives to notify them of the death.

WOODVILLE—Wheat Elementary School recognized students during the Mid-Year Awards Program on Wednesday, Jan. 12, 1994.

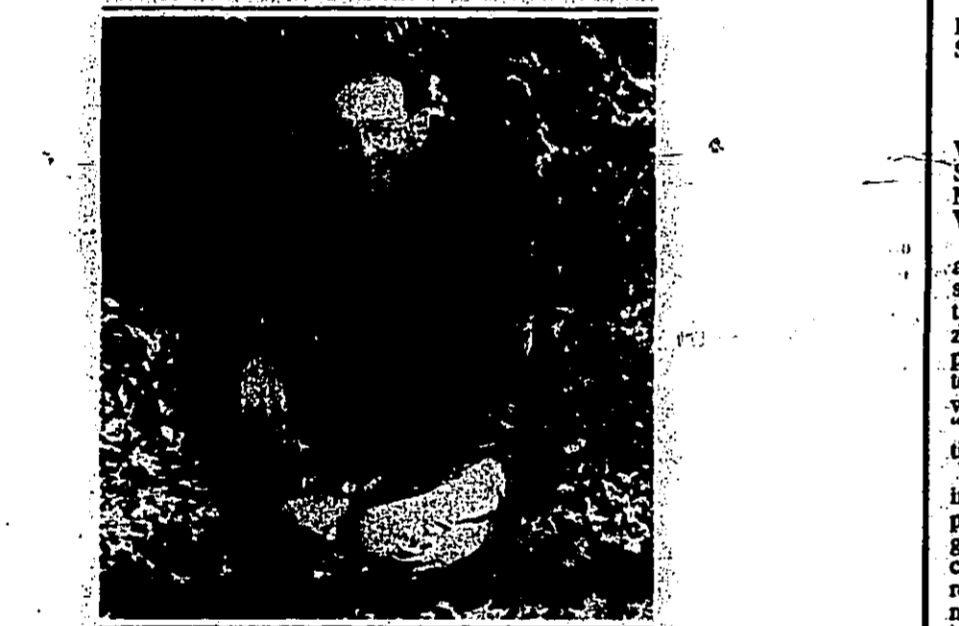

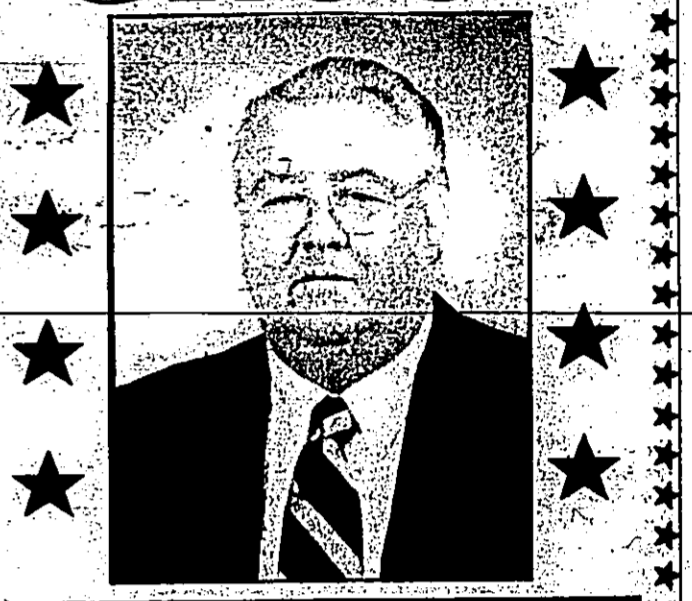

County jobless rate moves downward

WOODVILLE—Tyler County's jobless rate fell by almost a full percentage point during December, dropping from November's 9.3 percent mark all the way down to 8.4 percent, according to figures released by the Texas Employment Commission. The December report - the latest currently available - indicates that the local jobless rate declined by .9 percentage points. The new rate is below the 8.9 percent unemployment recorded for October but is slightly higher than September's 8.3 percent level. September's figure was the lowest local unemployment rate recorded since November 1992 when an identical 8.3 percent rate was posted.

Former county man dies in crash

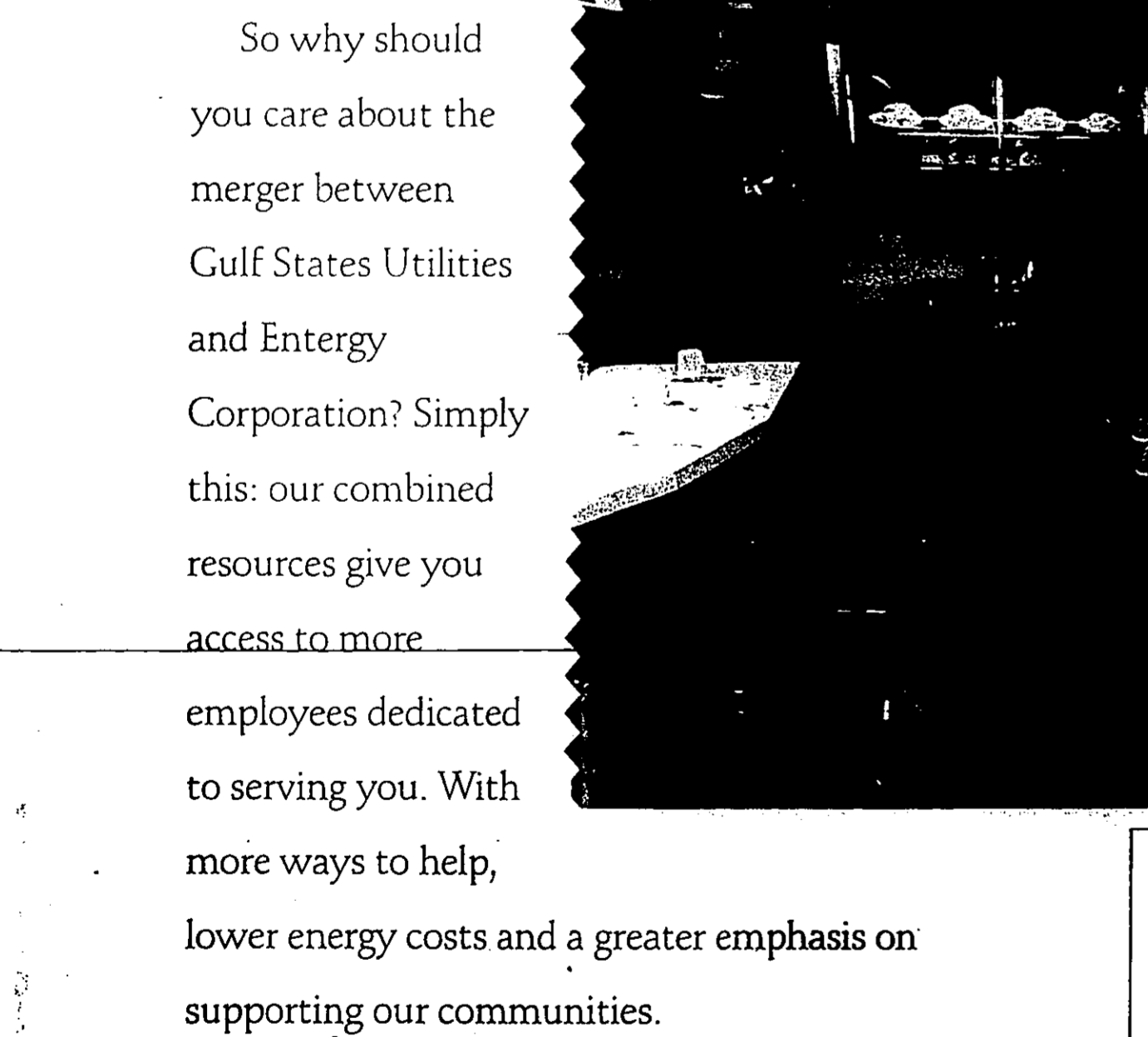

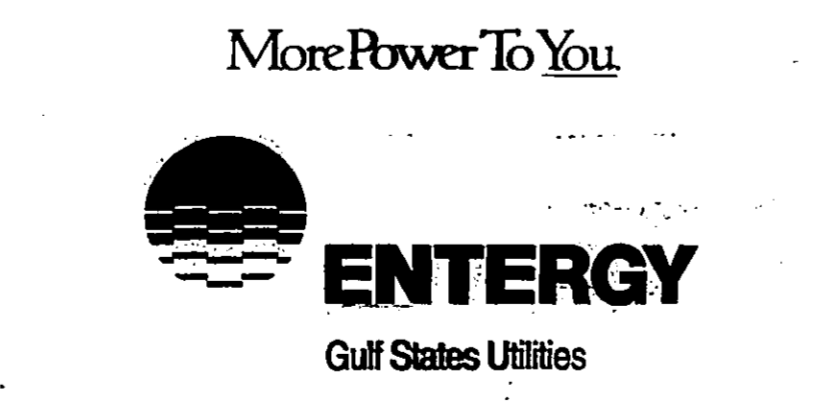

At the Village

Once again, Heritage Society Board member Mayme Brown has put together a fine exhibit at the Village to salute Black History Month in Tyler County.

Subject of the exhibit and the program Mrs. Brown has planned for Sunday, Feb. 13, at the Kirby High School Auditorium, is one of her former students, Velma Foster Burrs, whose Tyler County roots go back to the 1860's.

The daughter of Frank and Gerlene Arline Foster, she was the granddaughter of George and great granddaughter of Joseph Arline. Assisted by Miss Helen Gilder, Mrs. Brown's Village exhibit highlights the events of this remarkable woman's life as student, teacher, administrator, wife and mother, a life that is now coming full circle from her birthplace in Hillister and back.

Hillister native honored during Black History Month exhibit at Village

This young woman completed her elementary and junior high schooling at Warren before transferring to Woodville, where she entered Scott High School in 1959. Being very determined, Velma Foster excelled in many school activities. It seemed as if she was saying, "I am happy carrying on the family tradition."

It is recalled that Velma is a fourth generation Arline and has followed the path of growth and development of those ancestors years past. Some of these have been mentioned in an earlier exhibit and articles about Jacob, Turner and Polly Arline Gilt.

Historically, Velma's ancestors came to Tyler County about 1867, settling at Town Bluff and Spurger. These pioneers made a place for themselves and their families in their new environment, leading the way for other family members to succeed in their efforts to attain their goals.

Velma was an active member in the Interscholastic League - speech, debate, one-act plays - these activities being recognized by the school and community throughout the state. She was valedictorian of her high school class, later graduating magna cum laude from Prairie View A&M. Velma is married to Lieutenant Colonel A.T. Burrs Sr., whom she first met when he taught science at Scott prior to entering the service as a commissioned officer. They have three children, who are following in their family's footsteps, each achieving in his own field of interest.

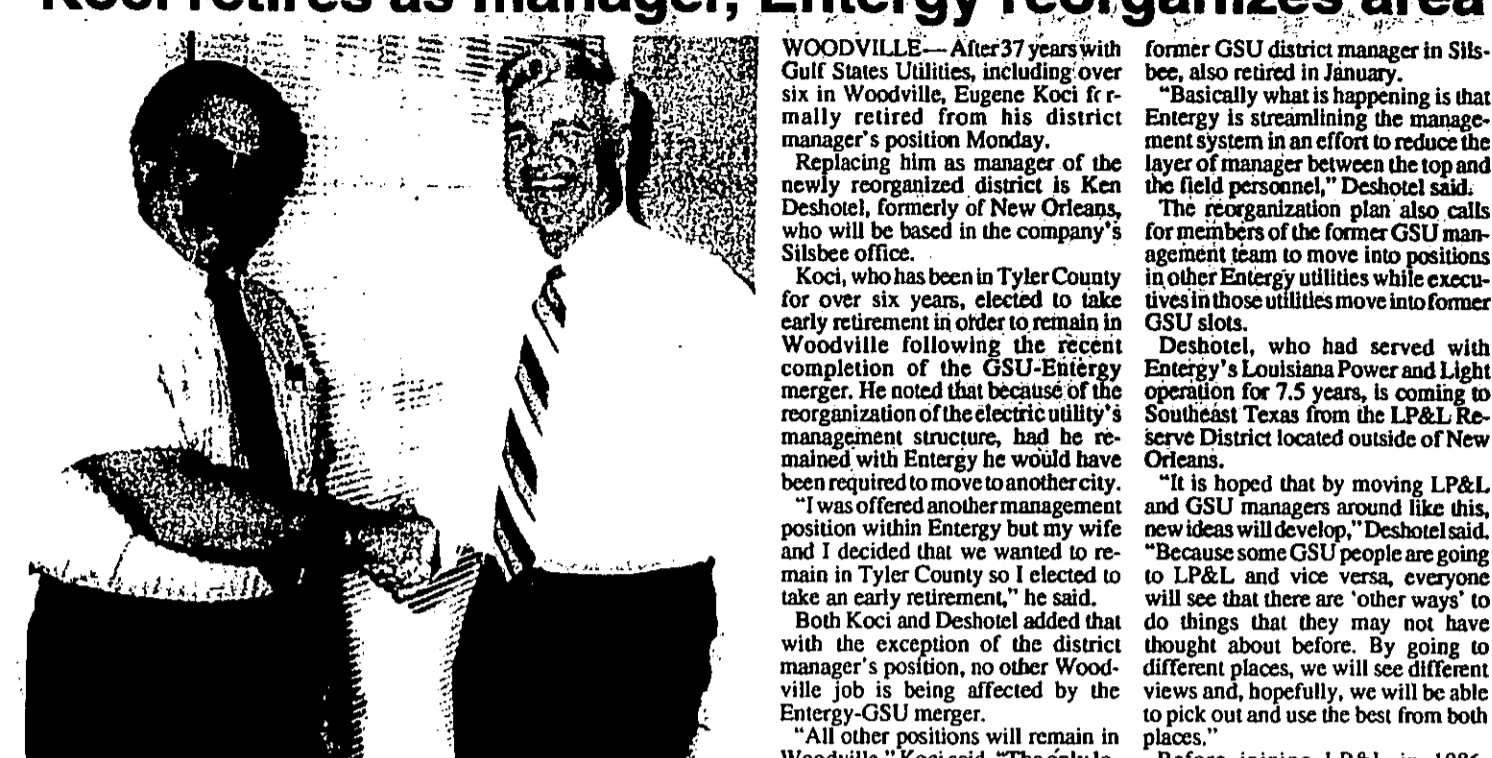

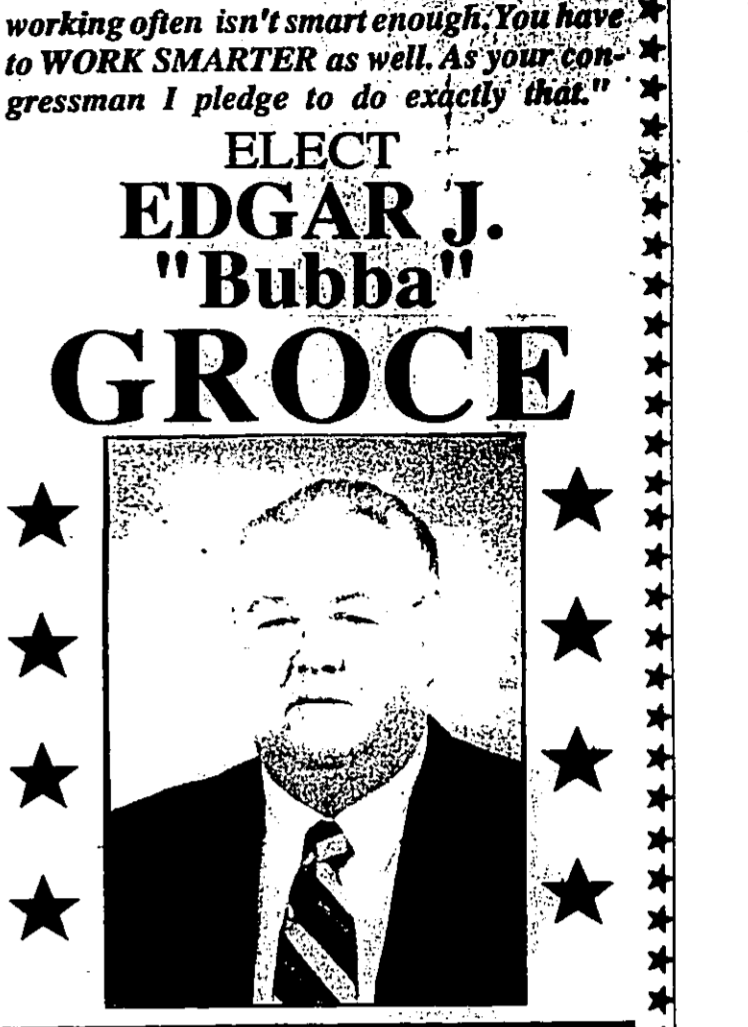


