Natural gas cloud forces evacuations

WOODVILLE - A cloud of natural gas that escaped from a Tyler County well last week forced the evacuation of about 10 families in the Moss Hill area for over seven hours. The well, located 2.3 miles north of Highway 190 East, was discovered at about 11:45 a.m. Tuesday, Feb. 1. It is believed to be a mixture of natural gas and natural gas. "We received a call about 11:30 that morning from a man who heard a loud, rushing noise in the area and when the officer, Mike McCulley, arrived on the scene, he found the well spewing out the mixture under high pressure," said Lt. Tracy Ferguson of the Tyler County Sheriff's Department. Ferguson said the well itself consisted of a "Christmas tree," which is basically a metal well head with various pipe stems and valves to allow access to the well. One of the valves appeared to be fully open allowing the well's contents to escape. "Because natural gas coming directly from a well has no odor, Ferguson said officers were advised to obtain a gas detection meter from the City of Woodville to check the area. "Natural gas was detected and we began evacuating the nearby homes," Ferguson said. "Everyone within a half-mile radius of the well were instructed to leave because of the fear of a possible explosion." About 2 p.m., Clay Kennedy of Beaumont, the regional liaison officer for the Division of Emergency Management, arrived at the scene with additional equipment to detect natural gas. "The detector we borrowed from Woodville could tell us that there was natural gas present, but it was not able to tell us if it was concentrated enough to be explosive," Ferguson said. Traffic stop ends with drug arrest

WOODVILLE - A routine traffic stop on Highway 190 just west of Woodville resulted in the confiscation of about 30 pounds of marijuana and the arrest of a Louisiana man last week. Roger Gordon Pennington of Independence, La., was being held in the Tyler County Justice Center this week under bonds totaling \$110,000 after being charged with possession of marijuana over five pounds and failing to have a state drug tax stamp for the illegal weed. According to Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan, Pennington was out on bond for similar offenses prior to his arrest in Tyler County. Department of Public Safety Trooper Bobby Risch, the arresting officer in the case, said a conservative estimate of the street value of the marijuana seized was \$38,000. "That's probably on the low side but the actual value would depend on the quality of the marijuana and where it was being taken to be sold," Risch said. According to a report filed by Risch, the arrest occurred Thursday, Feb. 3, after the DPS officer spotted a grey Ford automobile traveling east on Highway 190 at about 12:20 p.m. The trooper, who was westbound on the highway, clocked the Ford traveling at 61 miles per hour in a 55 zone and turned around to pursue. According to the report, Risch was not able to turn immediately due to other traffic on the highway but when he finally did cross over to the eastbound lanes, he saw the car brake suddenly, turn on its right hand turn signal and pull into the Dogwood Hills Baptist Church parking lot. 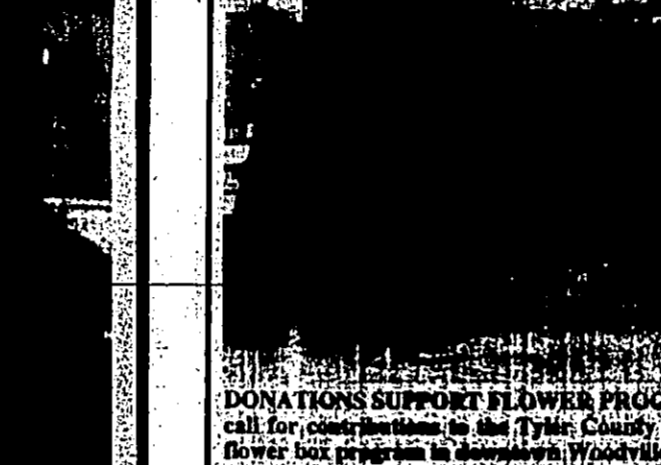

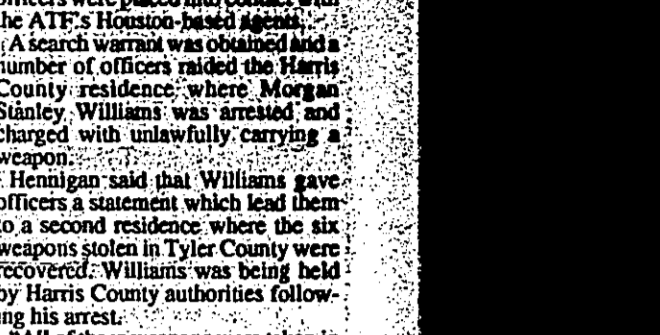

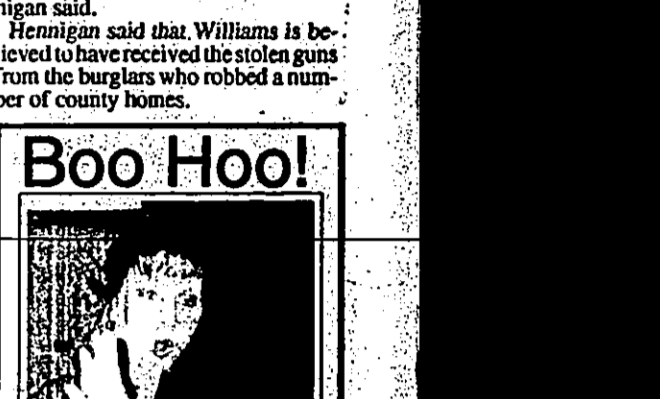

Shop at a store that gives you the best price and quality for products you typically buy. Make sure the cost savings from shopping at several stores justifies the extra time and transportation cost.

Try to avoid shopping when you're tired, hungry, or rushed. Use pre-printed receipts from computer-assisted checkout systems to help track food costs. This is especially helpful when prices aren't marked on items.

Opponents making it hard on Eagles

WOODVILLE — Nothing is coming easy for the Woodville Eagles these days.

Although sporting a 24-3 season record and sitting atop the district 24-3A standings alongside Hardin-Jefferson, the Eagles are finding themselves in a struggle with every game.

Last week the Eagles traveled to Port Arthur to take on the Stephen F. Austin Eagles. After leading SFA 50-35 after three quarters, Woodville needed a last second lay up by Aubrey Jackson to pull out the victory, 59-57.

Against Kirbyville the Eagles wonched a 10-0 first quarter lead fade away. By halftime the Wildcats trailed 28-27 and tied the game by the end of the third period.

The Eagles responded with a wake up call, out scoring Kirbyville 26-17 in the final period.

Both Speights and Beatty were ill in the Kirbyville contest, but played anyway. Speights has struggled with a bleeding ulcer throughout the year, and Friday the junior forward refused to sit out despite severe pain. Beatty also had an upset stomach, but played the entire game.

Beatty finished with 22 points and eight rebounds, while Speights had 13 points and state rebounds. Ryan Ferguson hit for 12 points. He had eight assists.

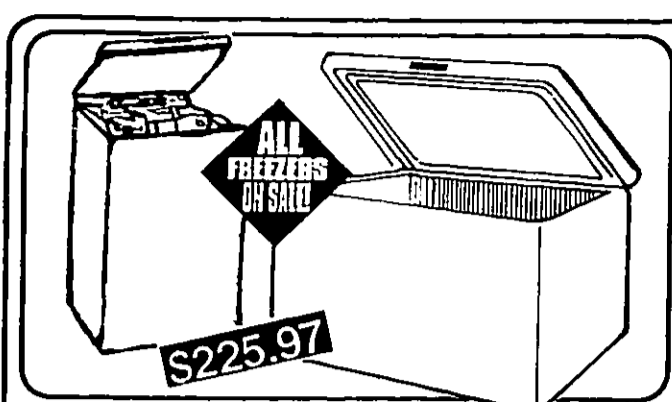
