## Youth revived by CPR after falling into creek

WOODVILLE — Quick action on the part of two Woodville city employees and three youngsters resulted in the revival of a 15-year-old Woodville youth who nearly drowned Monday after falling into Turkey Creek.

William Jefferson, 15, of Woodville was reportedly improving and all though he had regained consciousness following the ordeal, he was being sedated as part of his treatment.

According to witnesses, Jefferson and three other youths were fishing Monday afternoon in Turkey Creek near the Railroad Street bridge in Woodville.

When Jefferson fell into the deep water and was unable to climb back out, one of his friends, Larry Gilder, 13, and Nathan Walker, 13, remained at the scene and attempted to pull Jefferson out of the water.

Two city employees at the warehouse, Lester Mitchell and Keith Barnes said, "We got there, he Jefferson was floating face down in the water. I don't know how long he had been like that but we had to do something right away," Mitchell said.

Both Mitchell and Barnes jumped into the creek with Mitchell reaching Jefferson first.

"The water was deep out there. It was over my head and I went under before I could pull him back to the bank," Mitchell added.

### Bi-district showdown for Eagles in Huntsville

WOODVILLE — The way Woodville coach John Lambert figures it, the Woodville Eagles are finally back on track... just in time for the playoffs.  
The Eagles, with an impressive 27-4 record and a second place finish in district 24-3A, meet the Tarkington Longhorns, with a 22-11 and a first place finish in district 23-3A, Saturday evening at Sam Houston State Coliseum in Huntsville for the bi-district title.  
The winner will move on to the area championship against either Columbus or Hearne Tuesday evening, most likely at Sam-Houston or Oakridge High School in Conroe.  
Woodville goes into the bi-district battle off impressive wins over Orangefield and Buna last week. Lambert says that his Eagles have picked up the intensity.  
"We're at the point that we want to be," says the Woodville coach. "We're just playing better."  
Last year the Eagles won the district title and swept through the bi-district and area championship games before winning the regional title in Brenham. Believe it or not, Woodville's worst record is better this season than last. The Eagles last year had one less victory going into bi-district play along with the same four losses.  
Like last year the Eagles lost two district games this season and a non-district contest to Pt. Arthur Lincoln. White Woodville dropped a non-district encounter to Coldspring last season, this year one of their four losses was to Beaumont Westbrook. Last season the Eagles faced Liberty, the second place team in district 23-3A, and had little trouble with the Panthers in a game played at Pt. Neches.  
Tarkington, on the other hand, is a stronger team than Liberty and is on a 12 game winning streak. In fact the last time the Longhorns lost was to Woodville on New Year's Eve in Woodville when the Eagles won a 73-70 battle. The Longhorns rolled through district play with a 10-0 record.  
Tarkington coach Jim Dixon, who has been at the Cleveland area school for nine years, admits that "this is the best ball club that we've had."  
"We can have good night shooting," admits Dixon. "All of my starters have scored 20 points or more at one time or another."  
The Longhorns started slowly this season, but faced stiff competition right off the bat. Tarkington traveled to Arkansas and lost to the top ranked team in the state, Blytheville, along with Gosnell which sports a 22-1 record.  
Tarkington also lost to number two ranked Troup in class 2A.  
Dixon says that his team will "have to play a great ball game" to defeat Woodville, noting that the Eagles have the benefit of being in the playoffs last season.  
All of the Longhorn starters are over

six feet, including 6'6" forward Clint Clark and 6'4" post Issac Bynghins. The best shooter on the team is 6'3" forward Chris Wilson, while 6'3" Brad Long and 6' Christ Cain take care of the guard positions.  
"We've (sub) much," admits Dixon. The Eagles will counter with all-state post Ardis Beatty who is averaging over 25 points per game. The 6-5 senior scored 34 points against the Longhorns the first time the two teams played this season.  
Delondon Speights at 6'2" and averaging over 12 points per game is Woodville's mainstay on defense. After struggling throughout district play with stomach problems, the Woodville forward seems to be back in form just in time for the playoffs.  
Ryan Ferguson (6'1") and Josh Lambert (6'7") are two more Eagles that have double figure averages. Both can be deadly from the three-point range.  
Ashbey Jackson (5'9") is Woodville's point guard who feeds

### Colmesneil to face rematch in bi-district

COLMESNEIL — The Colmesneil Bulldogs figure they will be more effective the second time around against the Apple Springs Eagles.  
The Bulldogs and the Eagles meet Friday in Diboll for the bi-district title. Colmesneil sports a 15-10 record and grabbed the district 24-A title with an 8-2 mark, while Apple Springs was 17-11 for the season and won a playoff against Centerville for second place in district 23-A. The Eagles finished with a 5-3 district mark.  
The bi-district encounter will mark the second time the teams have met this year. The first contest left the Bulldogs on the short side by 10 points in a game played during the Thanksgiving holidays. "Tox in 6-2 sophomore Jezz Mark and another 10 points per game, and it is easy to see how the Eagles reached the playoffs for the second consecutive year. The Eagles' point guard is Senior Desmond Lee with a 14 point per game average. Greg Spivey, another first year coach, says that his Eagles hope to capitalize on their size against Colmesneil.

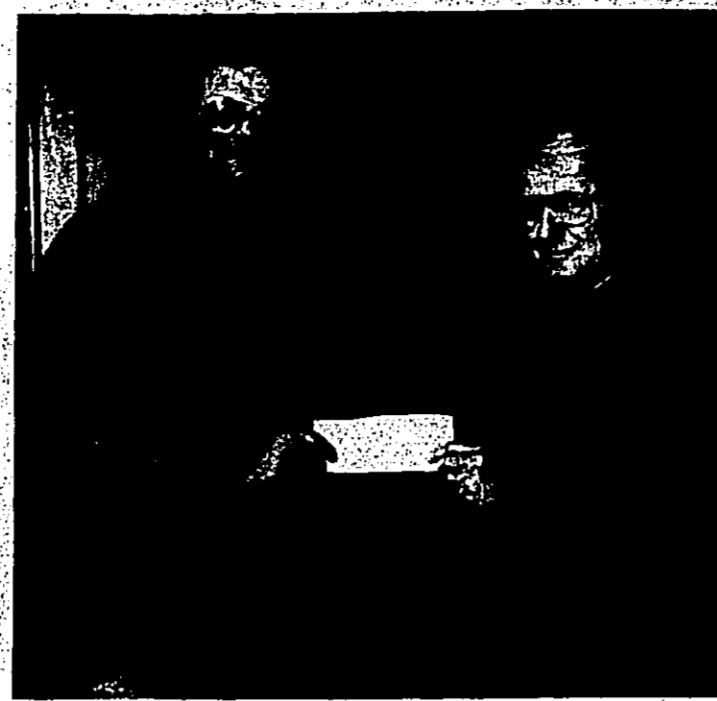

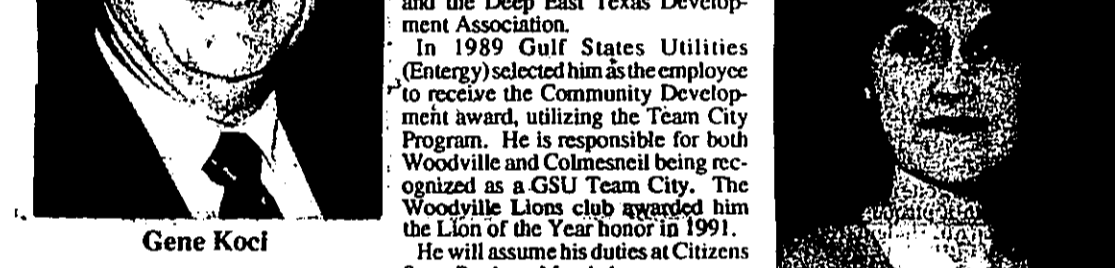

The Eagles, with an impressive 27-4 record and a second place finish in district 24-3A, meet the Tarkington Longhorns, with a 22-11 and a first place finish in district 23-A, Saturday evening at Sam Houston State College in Huntsville for the bi-district title.

The winner will move on to the area championship against either Columbus or Hearne Tuesday evening, most likely at Sam Houston or Oakridge High School in Conroe.

Woodville goes into the bi-district battle off impressive wins over Orangefield and Buna last week. Lamberth says that his Eagles have picked up the intensity.

"We're at the point that we want to be," says the Woodville coach. "We're just going to play hard and win."

Last year the Eagles won the district title and swept through the bi-district and area championship games before losing to the regional title in Brenham.

Believe it or not, Woodville's worst record is better this season than last. The Eagles last year had one less victory going into the bi-district play-along with the same four losses.

Like last year the Eagles lost two district games this season and a non-district contest to Pi. Arthur Lincoln.

While Woodville dropped a non-district encounter to Clipping last season, this year one of their four losses was to Beaumont Westbrook.

Last season the Eagles faced Liberty, the second place team in district 23-3A, and had little trouble with the Panthers in a game played at Pi. Neches.

Tarkington, on the other hand, is a stronger team than Liberty and is on a 12 game winning streak. In fact the last time the Longhorns lost was to Woodville on New Year's Eve in Woodville when the Eagles won a 73-70 battle. The Longhorns rolled through district play with a 10-0 record.

Tarkington coach Jim Dixon, who has been at the Cleveland area school for nine years, admits that "this is the best ball club that we've had."

"We'll have a good night shooting," admits Dixon. "All of my starters have scored 20 points or more at one time or another."

The Longhorns started slowly this season, but faced stiff competition right off the bat. Tarkington traveled to Arkansas and lost to the top ranked team in the state, Blytheville, along with Gosnell which sports a 22-1 record.

Ryan Ferguson (6'1") and Josh Lamberth (6'4") are two more Eagles that have double figure averages. Both can be deadly from the three point range.

Aubrey Jackson (5'9") is Woodville's point guard who feeds the likes of Beay and Speights.

The senior Lamberth says that his Eagles will press Tarkington. "Hopefully we'll get something," he says.

Two key points to a Woodville victory says Lamberth is the Eagles must be able to play good defense and get the ball inside on offense.

"We'll just have to play hard," admits the Woodville coach.
