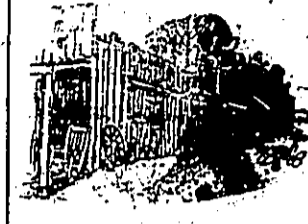

The Woodville JV knocked off Chester, 6-5, in the title game, after knocking off Colmesneil, 4-3, in the opener. They also defeated the Burkeville varsity, 19-5, in second round action.

Dan Bantise led the way at the plate for Woodville in the Chester win. Bantise went three for four, while teammate Pat Coff went the distance on the mound for the victory.

Chester and Woodville pounded out a total of 22 hits in the game, three coming from Bryan Daniels of the Yellowjackets. Sam Fuller also had a

pair of hits for Chester.

Both teams played even through the first two innings of play, but Woodville opened up the game with a pair of runs in the third and a solo run in the sixth.

The Woodville JV scored three times in the first inning against Colmesneil. After the Bulldogs tied the game in the top of the fifth, Woodville scored the decisive run in the bottom of the inning on an error.

Colmesneil to run in Lumberjack relays

COLMESNEIL — The Colmesneil Bulldogs boys track team will compete in the first annual Lumberjack Relays in Diboll Saturday.

Colmesneil did not fare too well last week at Barbers Hill. The Bulldogs scored only six points, but had several team members missing due to UIL competition.

The Bulldog 1600 meter relay team placed fifth at the meet with a time of 3:38. Members included Les Stinson, Leovan Brewer, Greg Bean, and Kevin McQueen.

Stinson, Bean, and McQueen were joined by Keith Byrty for a sixth place finish in the 400 meter relay. Their time was 45.6.

In the junior varsity division Ronnie Douglas took first place in the 200 meter dash and finished second in both the long and high jump. Kevin Harris placed third in the discus, while Daniel Stinson took fifth in the 400 meter dash.

Liberty won the varsity meet with 181 points.

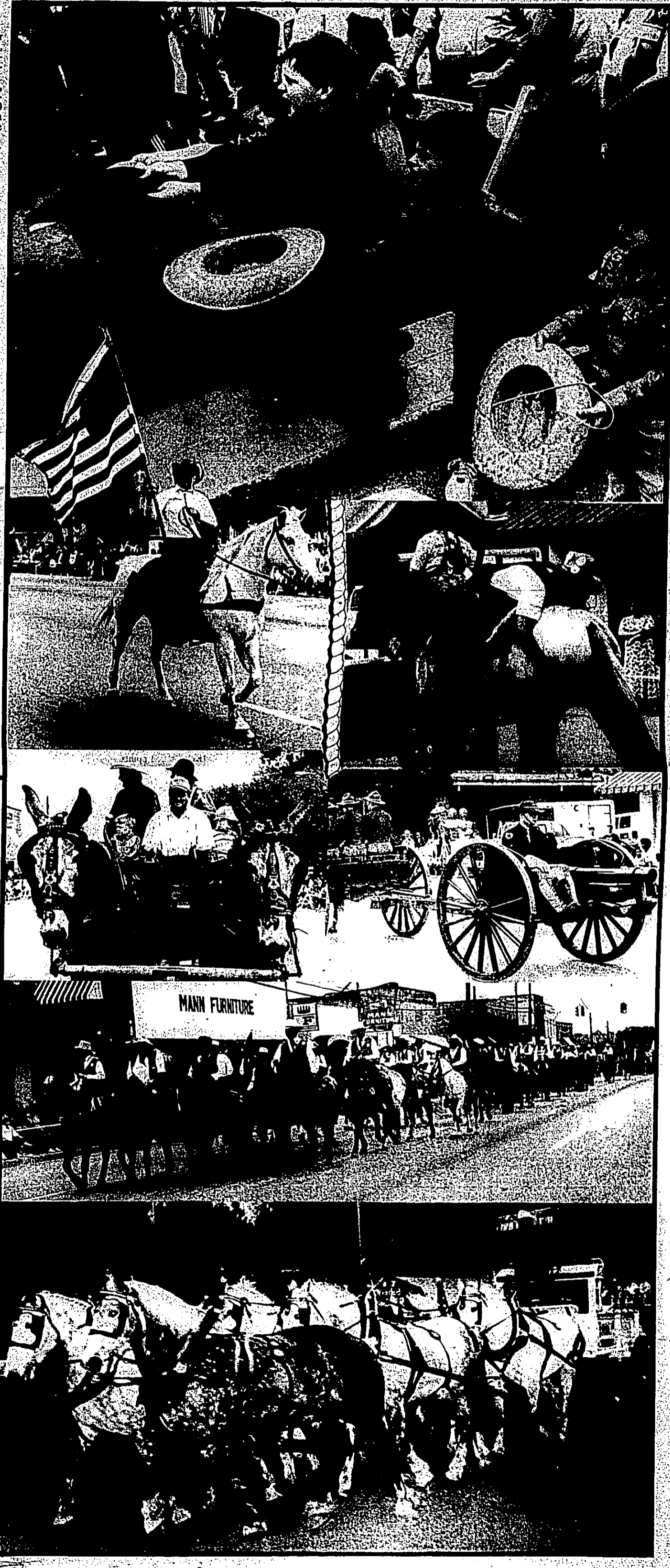

Candidate lists set for May 7 school, city elections

TYLER COUNTY — A total of 31 candidates have filed for the 20 positions up for grabs in the May 7 Tyler County school board and city council elections.

Of those who have filed, 19 are running for school board seats in the Woodville, Warren, Spurger, Colmesneil and Chester school districts while 12 are seeking city council positions in Woodville, Colmesneil and Chester.

Absentee voting in all school and city elections will get underway on Monday, April 18, with election day balloting set for Saturday, May 7.

Following is the list of candidates who filed prior to the March 23 deadline.

Woodville ISD
Only the three incumbents up for

election this year have filed to run for seats on the Woodville Independent School District's board of trustees: Those seeking re-election to three-year terms include Position 3 Trustee Glinda McKinley, Position 4 Trustee Dr. Jim M. Brown and Position 5 Trustee Charles F. Sparlock.

Warren ISD
In the Warren Independent School District, two board seats will be up for grabs. In the race for Position 6, incumbent board member Roy Moore is being challenged by Jim Dennis.

The Position 7 seat, now held by Kenneth Gregory, is being sought by four contenders. Gregory has announced he will not seek re-election. Candidates running for the position now include Peggy Chance, John Holman, Wayne Pratt and Jim Moore.

Spurger ISD
Two board seats also are up for grabs in the Spurger Independent School District this year. Two candidates, incumbent Dennis Smith and challenger Henry Joe Jordan, are running for the Position 6 seat while incumbent Rusty Roberts was the only candidate to file for the Position 7 post.

Colmesneil ISD
In the Colmesneil Independent School District, three candidates have filed for the three at-large city council seats on this year's ballot. Candidates for the two positions include incumbent board member Doyle Cowart Sr., Jimmy Chew, Charles Hanks, Jamie Pittman and Danny Worthey. Incumbent board member John Pittman has not filed for re-election.

City of Woodville
Only the incumbent office holders have filed to run for city council positions up for grabs this year. Mayor Billy Ross is seeking re-election as are council members W.S. Nichols and J.M. Radford.

City of Chester
In Chester, three candidates have filed for the three at-large city council seats on this year's ballot. They were incumbent B.E. Williams, Todd Poppo and Nubian Shoemaker. The two other incumbent council members, Donna Parks and Ronnie Bradley, are not seeking re-election.

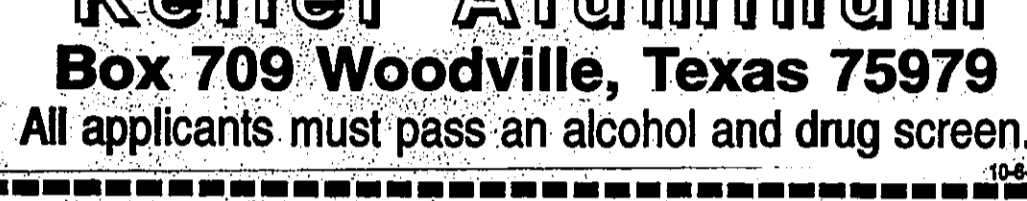

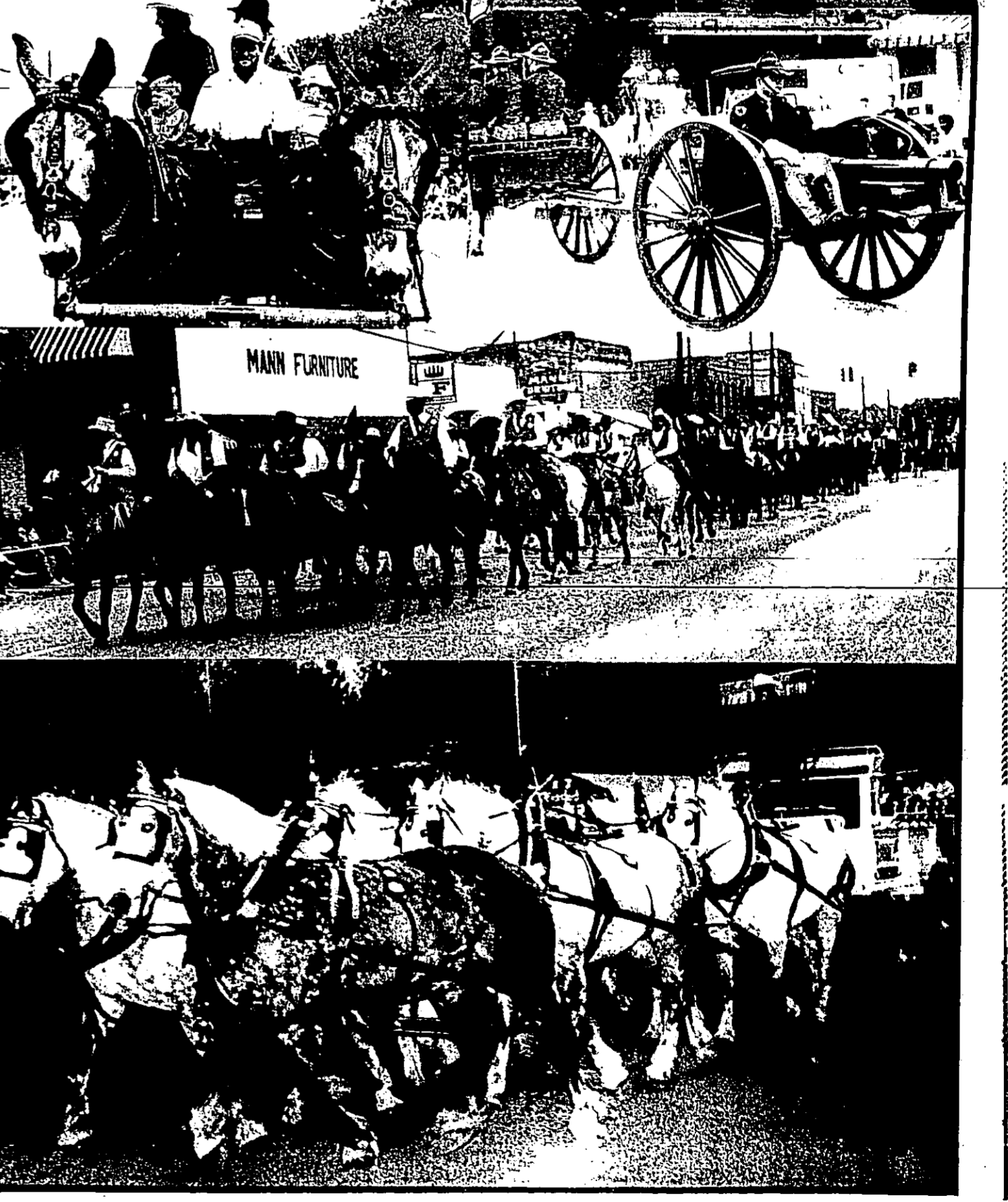
