The new building will expand the local prison's capacity from the current 1,000-man level up to 1,300 and is scheduled to open in July. The expansion of the prison also will mean an additional 50 corrections officers and 100 support personnel will have to be added to the staff, adding about \$1.5 million to the annual payroll. Davis wins runoff
WOODVILLE — Former Justice of the Peace Jimmy Wayne Davis of Colmesneil was the winner of Tuesday's runoff election for the Democratic Party's nomination as Precinct 3 Justice of the Peace. Davis defeated building contractor Walter R. Cowart of Dam B in the race by a margin of 388 (57.5%) to 287. The two contenders were thrown into a runoff after no one candidate gained a majority of votes during the March 8 primary. In the five-candidate race, Davis led the field with 387 votes (44.4% of the total) while Cowart garnered 161 votes (18.5%). Other candidates in the race included former Constable Harley Crews, who finished third with 152 votes (17.5%); bookkeeper Clara Tolar of Woodville, who received 129 votes (14.8%); and Woodville city health inspector Frankie E. Local women killed in traffic accident
LUFKIN — Two Woodville women and a passenger were pronounced dead at the scene of a two-car accident that occurred last week about three miles north of Zavalla in Angelina County. Joyce Best, 58, and Dorothy B. Wright, 79, both of Woodville as well as Gilbert Dwan Brown Jr., 19, of Woodville, were killed during a collision on Highway 69 that occurred during a heavy rainstorm on Tuesday, April 5. According to a Department of Public Safety accident report, the mishap occurred about 1:20 p.m. when northbound 1976 Ford Granada driven by Brown went out of control and began to spin around on the wet highway. The spinning Ford crossed the center line into the southbound lane and was struck on the driver's side by a 1981 Buick Century driven by Best. Wright was a passenger in the Buick. Funeral services for the two Woodville women were held on Saturday, April 9. Best's services were at 3 p.m. at the Woodville First Baptist Church with burial following in the Antioch Cemetery near Woodville. 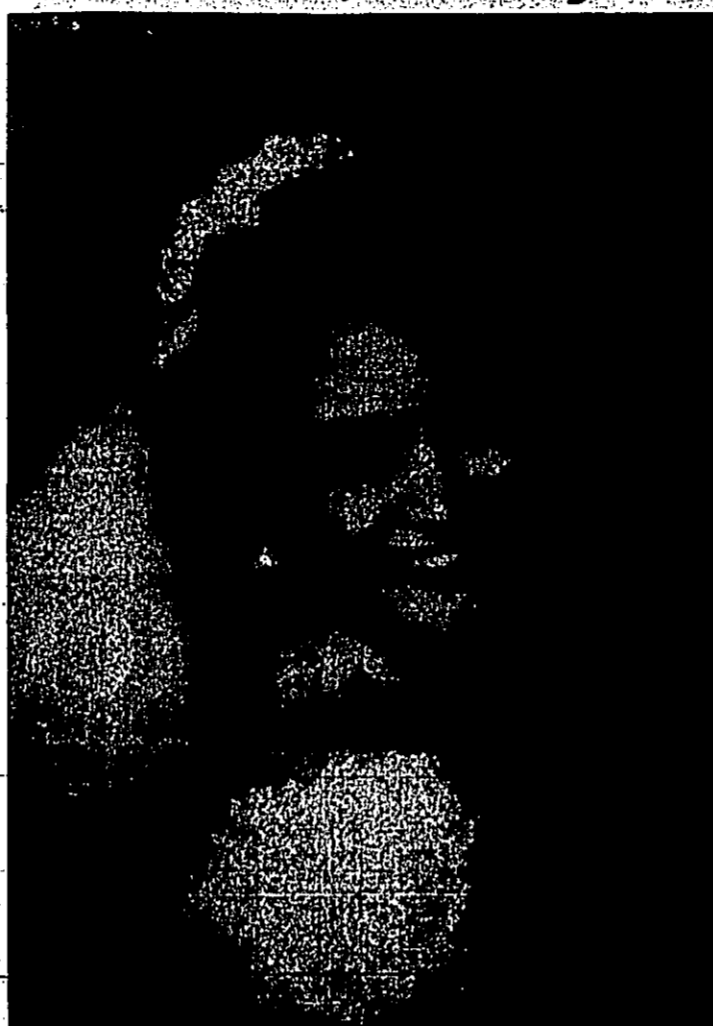

LUFKIN — Persons who have a federal, state or local government job not covered under Social Security should be aware that the affect their government pension will have on any future entitlement to Social Security benefits on the record of another and also the effect of the pension on Social Security benefits on their own work record under Social Security. Davis wins runoff

WOODVILLE — Former Justice of the Peace Jimmy Wayne Davis of Colmesneil was the winner of Tuesday's runoff election for the Democratic Party's nomination as Precinct 3 Justice of the Peace.

Davis defeated building contractor Walter R. Cowart of Dam B in the race by a margin of 388 (57.5%) to 287. The two contenders were thrown into a runoff after no one candidate gained a majority of votes during the March 8 primary. In that five-poll date race, Davis led the field with 387 votes (44.4% of the total) while Cowart garnered 161 votes (18.5%).

Other candidates in the race included former Constable Harley Crews, who finished third with 152 votes (17.5%); bookkeeper Clara Tolof of Woodville, who received 129 votes (14.8%); and Woodville city health inspector Frankie E. Rogers, who received 42 votes (4.8%).

Davis will be unopposed for the post during the November general election.

Local women killed in traffic accident

LUFKIN — Two Woodville women and a Jasper teenager were pronounced dead at the scene of a two-car accident that occurred last week about three miles north of Zavalla in Angelina County.

Joyce Best, 58, and Dorothy B. Wright, 79, both of Woodville as well as Gilbert Dwan Brown Jr., 19, of Jasper were killed during a collision on Highway 69 that occurred during a heavy rainstorm on Tuesday, April 5.

According to a Department of Public Safety accident report, the mishap occurred about 1:20 p.m. when a northbound 1976 Ford Granada driven by Brown went out of control and began to spin around on the wet highway.

The spinning Ford crossed the center line into the southbound lane and was struck on the driver's side by a 1981 Buick Century driven by Best. Wright was a passenger in the Buick.

Funeral services for the two Woodville women were held on Saturday, April 9.

Best's services were at 3 p.m. at the Woodville First Baptist Church near Woodville.

She was survived by two sons, Robert Best of Woodville and Richard Best of Colmesneil; two daughters, Mary Simmons and Penny Graham, both of Woodville; two brothers, Robert Carl of Woodville and James Carl of Nederland; three sisters, Eunice Vanslow of Chester, Ann Woodrome of Chester and Reda Chaudry of Lufkin and nine grandchildren.

Wright's funeral was at 11 a.m. in the Woodville United Methodist Church. Burial followed in the Magnolia Cemetery in Woodville.

She is survived by two daughters, Donna Germain of Greenville, S.C. and Carla Brown of Tyler; and two grandchildren.

Septic system applications sought
 —\$250,000 grant program kicks off on April 20—

WOODVILLE — Town owners wishing to take part in an on-site sewer system project being carried out by Tyler County may begin submitting applications for assistance beginning April 20.

During their meeting Monday, Tyler County commissioners gave their stamp of approval to a rating system and policies proposed by the special advisory committee established to help oversee and operate the sewer system project.

The Housing, Public Health and Environmental Citizens Advisory Committee will begin accepting applications from qualified low to moderate income home owners on Wednesday, April 20, from 9 a.m. to noon at the commissioners courtroom on the first floor of the Tyler County Courthouse in Woodville.

Applications also will be taken on Thursday, April 21 from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.; on Friday, April 22 from 1-3:30 p.m. on Wednesday, April 27, from 9 a.m. to noon; and on Thursday, April 28, from 5:30 to 7:30 p.m.

Under the \$250,000 grant awarded to the county by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, the county will install individual sewer facilities on up to 70 home sites in the Dam B, Doucette and Warren areas.

While the grant specifically targets these three communities, commissioners indicated that persons living near these areas also could be considered for assistance.

Under the grant, most of the sewer systems to be installed probably will be septic tank systems but other types will be considered depending on soil and space limitations.

Persons seeking assistance under this grant must own and live in the home in question and must meet income limits established by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD). Those applying should bring a copy of their property deed to include in the application in order to help the engineer determine the sewer facility requirements of their property size.

In discussing the grant program, Precinct 1 Commissioner Mike Riley praised the work of the advisory committee and told its chairman, Guy Phillips, "I'm very impressed with the way you've handled this."

Hearing set on closing spring turkey season

 WOODVILLE — Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) officials will hold a public hearing Monday, April 18, to discuss the closing of the spring turkey season in Tyler County.

According to TPWD officials in Austin, concern has developed following surveys of the adult Eastern Turkey population growth in East Texas. There has been an ongoing study and stocking program in East Texas for the past several years, and in an effort to increase the turkey flock in Tyler County, there are plans to close the spring hunting season beginning in 1995.

"We expect good local support from the citizens of Tyler County, landowners and hunters for the closing of the season in order to enhance the growth of the turkey population," said Bob Cook, TPWD chief of wildlife.

The plans are to close the season beginning with the 1995 spring hunt, and during the next two or three years, depending on the survey results. This is in order to get two to three good batches on the ground without hunting.

Some pensions may affect social security benefits

LUFKIN — Persons who have a federal, state or local government job not covered under Social Security should be aware that the affect their government pension will have on any future entitlement to Social Security benefits on the record of another and also the effect of the pension on Social Security benefits on their own work record. This knowledge will be very helpful in retirement planning.

In general, pensions earned from government work that is covered by Social Security will not affect Social Security benefits. On the other hand, pensions from work not under Social Security system, will usually affect Social Security benefits. It can affect benefits on both the workers own record and benefits payable on another's record.

The government pension offset (GPO) is an offset applied to a Social Security benefit received on the work record of another - usually a spouse. The offset is dollar for dollar - pension against Social Security benefit - up to two-thirds of the pension. Example: Mary is retired from the State of Texas with a pension of \$150 per month. She is eligible for \$200 per month Social Security as a wife on her husband's Social Security. Two-thirds of her state pension - \$100 - will be offset against the wife's benefit, leaving \$100 per month Social Security wife's benefit. Some government workers have worked enough under Social Security before entering civil service to eventually become eligible for Social Security. Others work part-time outside their government job on jobs under Social Security at some future date.

Those who receive a government pension and also qualify for Social Security in their own work record will usually suffer a reduction in their Social Security. This provision of the law is known as the windfall elimination provision (WEP). Whereas the GPO offsets a percent of the government pension against spouses benefit, the WEP offset is effected by use of a different formula to compute benefits.

The GPO applies to benefits received on a worker's record as a wife or worker. The WEP rules apply to the worker for retirement benefits but do not apply to widow(er)'s benefits.

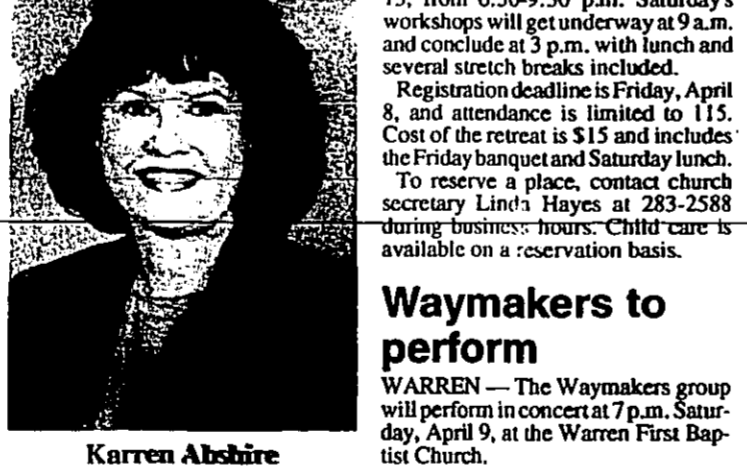
