# "I will make the nations your inheritance of the earth." -Psalm 2: 8 Kathy Weber shares Gospel in Siberia

Proud parents Patsy and Bobbie Weber of the Woodville United Methodist Church got a treat April 17 along with other church members, guests and friends, as the couple got to hear their Missionary daughter, Kathy, give a recount of her trip last summer to Ulan Ude, Russia, in the region of the former Soviet Union in Northern Asia called Siberia.

The Webers, who have pastored the Methodist church since June 1991, say they are "Very proud of her and the direction she is allowing the Lord to lead her."

She is leaving May 2 and come back.

Kathy says, "So much is happening, I want to tell everybody

about it."

As part of the Master's Commission which is a church training program which operates out of the Highland Baptist Church in Waco, Kathy headed to Russia with a mission to "start from scratch" in planting churches and especially "connecting with teenagers who have a hunger to learn more about Jesus."

The pictures she shared with the group as part of her discussion made that point easily. The expressions on the young people faces told the story.

Basically the plan, she said, was to generate small sharing groups during the week led by Russian Christians or American Christians...teaching

them how to pray and sing...then gather back at a larger location once a week for more formal training and sharing.

Kathy said she understood her call to do this work when she understood Jesus to ask... "Who will go?" She said her understanding, "It's not some fire burning with the name Russia under it. Just simply, 'Who will go?' Her answer was 'Yes!' She gave her name and address to a group within the Waco Church and she was contacted shortly, and invited to be a part of a prayer group which was praying specifically for Russia and its people.

Psalm 2: 8, "Ask of me and I will make the nations your inheritance of the earth." was an example of one motivating scripture Kathy read from the Bible to the Woodville audience, and it was a key one in her decision to go.

Kathy said she'll be going to "Lakes a lot like East Texas with mountains."

The city of about 250,000 is located on the huge Lake Bicol. The weather, she said, ranged from minus 58 degrees to 100 degrees Fahrenheit. She said that when the lake freezes that they lay train tracks over it.

She said she found out in Russia that you don't talk or laugh aloud...the people are still holding onto communism.

"This is Russia...and nothing is ever the same" is a common phrase used by the locals.

Kathy said one of her "moments closest to Christ" while in Russia last year was when her group was on the shore of Lake Bicol and they were praying and singing, and how all the people in a small lakeside village came to be with them. "They closed their shops, stopped what they were doing, and came and joined with us. It was very moving," she said. "There were other times too."

When asked, Kathy indicated there was still a financial need of about \$400 connected with the expenses of her upcoming trip.

"God will provide...that's what he loves to do!"





# "I will make the nations your inheritance of the earth." - Psalm 2: 8 Kathy Weber shares Gospel in Siberia

Profoundly Patsy and Bobbie Weber of the Woodville United Methodist Church got a treat April 17 along with other church members, friends and family as they gathered at their Missionary daughter, Kathy, gave a recount of her trip last summer to Ulan Ude, Russia, in the region of the former Soviet Union in Northern Asia called Siberia.

The Webers, who have pastored the Methodist church since 1981, say they are "Very proud of her and the direction she is allowing the Lord to lead her."

She is leaving May 2 and some back.

Kathy says, "So much is happening. I want to tell everybody about it."

As part of the Master's Commission which is a church training program which operates out of the Highland Baptist Church in Waco, Kathy headed to Russia with a mission to "start from scratch" in planting churches and especially "connecting with teenagers who have a hunger to learn more about Jesus."

The pictures she shared with the group as part of her discussion made that point easily. The expressions on the young people faces told the story.

Basically the plan, she said, was to generate small sharing groups during the week led by Russian Christians or American Christians...teaching

Kathy said she'll be going to "Look a lot like East Texas with mountains."

The city of about 250,000 is located on the huge Lake Bikoil. The weather, she said, ranged from minus 38 degrees to 100 degrees Fahrenheit. She said that when the lake freezes that they lay train tracks over it.

She said she found out in Russia that you don't talk or laugh aloud...the people are still holding out communism.

"This is Russia...and nothing is ever the same," is a common phrase used by the locals.

Kathy said one of her "moments closest to Christ" while in Russia last year was when her group was on the shore of Lake Bikoil and they were praying and singing, and how all the people in a small lakeside village came to be with them. "They closed their shops, stopped what they were doing, and came and joined in with us. It was very moving," she said. "There were other times too."

When asked, Kathy indicated there was still a financial need of about \$400 connected with the expenses of her upcoming trip.
