# Tyler County Fruit and Vegetable Show planned on June 16

WOODVILLE — The Tyler County Fruit and Vegetable show has been set for Thursday, June 16, starting at 10 a.m. at the Woodville Wal-Mart Garden Center. This show is open to any youth or adult interested in entering. Marty Baker, Extension Horticulturist will be on hand to judge the show. Awards will be given to all exhibitors. A grand and reserve champion will be selected in the youth and adult divisions.

All entries will be free to exhibitors. However, entries will be limited to one entry per variety per person for each class. All fruit and vegetables should be uniform, washed, and free of insects and trash.

Classifications of vegetables and fruit are listed below:

- 1. Wax beans, 12 pods, 1/4 - 1/2 inch stem shown on each pod.
  - 2. Green snap beans, 12 pods, 1/4 - 1/2 inch of stem on each pod.
  - 3. Beans, one standard bunch of rows with tops (4-5 per bunch), bulbs 1 1/2 - 2 1/2 inches in diameter - tied two inches above the root.
  - 4. Broccoli, one bunch of 3-4 clusters, cut stem of each head straight across to give overall length of 6-7 inches.
  - 5. Cabbage, one head, with 3-4 wrapper leaves, stem cut cleanly at base.
  - 6. Cantaloupe, one fruit, stem scar dry and free from decay.
  - 7. Carrots, fresh, one standard bunch with tops (6-8 roots, 3/4 - 1 1/2 inches in diameter).
  - 8. Cauliflower, one marketable head, 4-6 inches in diameter, free of protruding leaves, base trimmed cleanly.
  - 9. Corn (field) three marketable ears with husks in place, but slightly trimmed, tip (silks) end intact.
  - 10. Corn (sweet) three marketable ears with husks in place, but slightly trimmed, tip (silks) end intact.
  - 11. Collards, one standard bunch, oval leaves eight to 10 inches in span or desirable. Each bunch should be about 1 1/2 to 2 inches in diameter.
  - 12. Cucumbers, three marketable fruit 6-9 inches long, cut stem 1/4 inch from shoulder.
  - 13. Eggplant, three marketable fruit, trim stem 1/4 inch behind calyx base.
  - 14. Lettuce, one marketable head, two intact wrapper leaves, trim bulb to within 1/8 to 1/4 inch of bottom leaf, roots removed.
  - 15. Lettuce, leafy, three plants, roots removed.
  - 16. Mustard Greens, one standard bunch, 1 1/2 to 2 inches at point of tie with roots removed, stems 1/2 to 1 inch from pod shoulder.
  - 17. Okra, 2 pods, cut stems 1/2 inch from pod shoulder.
  - 18. Onions, green, one standard bunch (5-7 bulbs, 1/2 - 3/4 inch in diameter) with full tops, roots clipped within 1/2 inch of bulb.
  - 19. Onions, dry, three marketable bulbs 2-4 inches in diameter, leave one dry highly colored leaf scale.
  - 20. Peas, southern, 12 pods, 1/4 stem left on each pod.
  - 21. Pepper, bell, three marketable fruits, each fruit with the same number of lobes (three or four). Stems cut cleanly and level with shoulder.
  - 22. Peppers, hot, six marketable fruits, cut stems 1/2 to one inch from shoulder of fruit.
  - 23. Potatoes, Irish, three marketable tubers, 6-12 ounces, minimum tuber diameter 1 7/8 inches.
  - 24. Potatoes, sweet, three marketable tubers, size 8-16 ounces and 2-3 inches in diameter.
  - 25. Radish, two standard bunches, bulbs 5/8 - 1 inch in diameter, tops on 6-8 radish bunch.
  - 26. Spinach, three whole plants, roots trimmed.
  - 27. Squash, summer, yellow, three marketable fruit, 4-7 inches long, stem trimmed to 1/4 inch.
  - 28. Squash, winter, white, three marketable fruit 3-4 inches in diameter, stem trimmed to 1/4 inch.
  - 29. Squash, green, three marketable fruit, stem trimmed to 1/4 inch.
  - 30. Tomatoes, ripe, globe type, three marketable fruit, three inches minimum diameter, all with calyx or all without calyx.
  - 31. Tomatoes, ripe, cherry, 12 marketable fruit, 1 1/4 inch or less in diameter, all with calyx or all without calyx.
  - 32. Tomatoes, ripe, pear, 12 marketable fruit, all with calyx or all without calyx.
  - 33. Turnip Greens, three standard bunches, 1 1/2 - 2 inches at point of tie.

## Colmesneil edges Carlisle for area title

**NACOGDOCHES** — Like all good teams, the Colmesneil Bulldogs will take a gift-wrapped win any time of the week, especially if it's in the playoffs.

Last week the Bulldogs gladly accepted some unexpected help by last year's area baseball champions, the Carlisle Indians, and eased to a 6-3 area title championship at Dragon Field.

The win set up a regional showdown against the Normanjee Panthers Tuesday evening at Crockett. The winner of that game will go on to meet either Evadale (18-4) or Trinidad (23-4) in a quarter-final game later this week. The winner of that contest earns a berth to the state baseball championships, June 9-10.

Normangee went into the Colmesneil game Tuesday night with a 9-8 bi-district win over Centerville and a 10-6 area win over Dawson.

Colmesneil, which defeated High Island 11-0 in bi-district before knocking off Carlisle, is a four time state champion and has been to the state baseball tournament six times. Evadale was a state semifinalist last year in its first outing to Austin. The Rebels lost to Fondren.

Although all but one of the nine runs in the game came by way of errors, there were plenty of superb defensive plays, especially in the Colmesneil infield.

Said McQueen following the victory, "I was fortunate to get to the balls. I've had leg problems."

"It was hard," said Pittman of the victory. "There was a lot of pressure."

It was a ball hit by Pittman in the fourth inning that virtually broke the game open for Colmesneil. The freshman third sacker, batting in the sixth spot, ripped a hard liner to left field on a 2-2 pitch that brought in Colmesneil's fourth and fifth runs. Indian left fielder Cody Kinney got a jump on Pittman's liner and caught it, but the ball popped out of his glove.

This came on the heels of another two run error, this time by Indian center fielder Dasty McCasland, on a routine fly ball hit by Greg Beam.

All four runs came in after two were out and Carlisle was holding a 2-1 lead. The rally began when Indian hurler Joey Smitherman walked three consecutive Colmesneil batters with two outs.

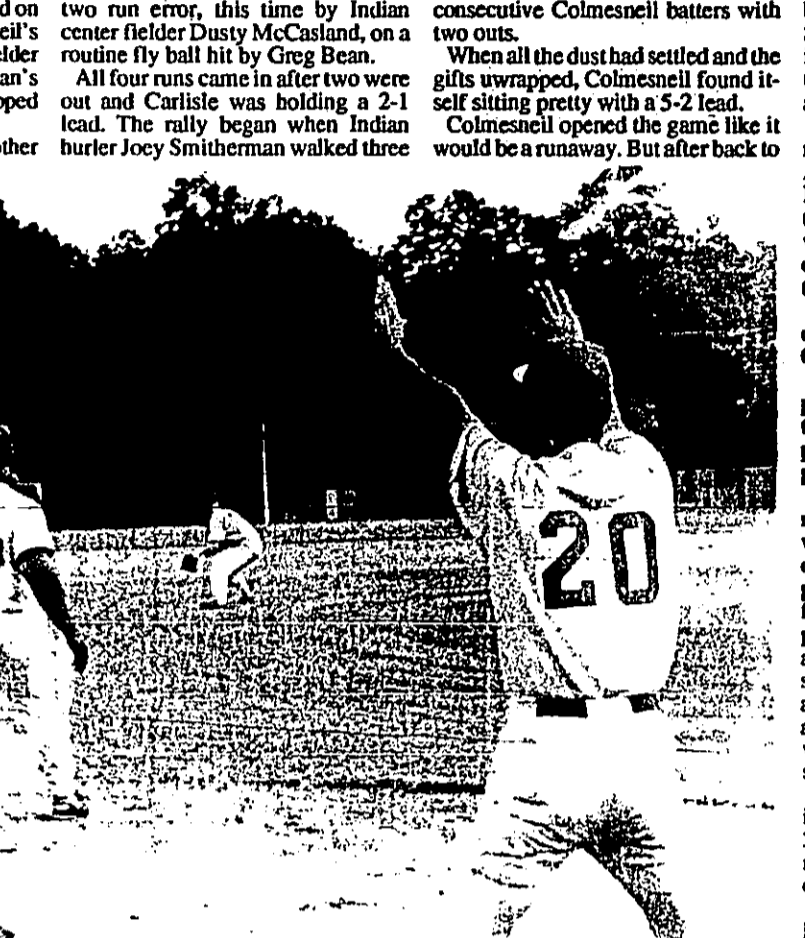
When all the dust had settled and the gifts unwrapped, Colmesneil found itself sitting pretty with a 5-2 lead.
