Lewis steps down as chief appraiser

Following conflict with TCAD board-By Greg Peak Editor

WOODVILLE - Pollowing lengthy rounds involving public complaints and a closed, executive session last week, the Tyler County Appraisal District's chief appraiser, Linda Lewis, resigned her post effective June 30.

The move came after more than two dozen people showed up at the TCAD board meeting Thursday, June 2, to complain about the way timber land property values have been assessed in the past. (See related story on page

During the public part of that meet-ing, Lewis also drew criticism from TCAD board member Jerry Mahan for the handling of the appraisal notices which had to be redone last month. after major errors were discovered in the calculation of home values and homestead exemptions.;

Mahan also said he had other concerns involving Lewis and her handling of TCAD employees but agreed to withhold his comments until a closed session during which the board was to take up personnel matters.

It was during that closed meeting of the board that Lewis resigned and left

the meeting in an emotional state. She later indicated that her decision to step down was due to a conflict with the board and because "the chief appraiser

is very, very tired."

Lewis added that during the executive acsaion last week, "a lot of pressure" was placed on her. "I felt it was in the best interest for me to resign."

Following Lewis' verbal resignation, the board voted to accept her decision with Dr. J.M. Radford of Woodville and Dennis Smith of Spurger abstaining. Board member J.W. Willson of Chester had left the meeting early due to a scheduling conflict and was not present during the executive session. The board met again on Monday, June 6, to continue their discussions about the matter, again mostly in closed

## Group protests timber tax values

WOODVILLE - Although taking no formal action last week, the Tyler County Appraisal District's board agreed to re-examine the manner in which timberland values are assessed after more than two dozen taxpayers appeared to protest what they considered low tax values assigned to timber

During last week's regular TCAD board meeting, local forestry consultant Lloyd Fortenbry appeared to voice complaints about the way Chief Ap-praiser Linda Lewis and the district were assigning values to timber prop-

erty, timberland values are based on

productivity rather than market value. The discussion begun by Fortenberry ended up including a number of other audience members and at one point

The meeting ended last week with the resignation of Lewis (See related

story on page 1A). During the meeting, Fortenberry and many of the more than two dozen people in attendance indicated they felt that Tyler County's timberland values had been set too low compared to those used by surrounding counties and asked the TCAD board to consider increasing them.

Fortenberry also said he felt that much of the property owned by the timber companies in the county has not been correctly classified. He noted that the current values assigned to timberlands are \$260 per acre for pine, \$160 for mixed and \$80 for hard-

Under state law, an timber acre is classified as pine if at least two-thirds of the trees growing on it are pine. If less than two-thirds are pine, then the land is classified as mixed. Very few acres outside the tax-exempt Big

Thicket National Forest are classified as hardwood.

Timber prices have probably tripled in the last five years and we've made no changes that I am aware of.

Fortenberry said. Regarding the classification of tim-ber acres, Fortenberry charged that Lewis had allowed the timber companies and individuals to render the land and then accepted their word without
