## Braves edge Cardinals for Major League title

WOODVILLE — The Colmesneil Braves, winners of the National League title Saturday night, edged the Colmesneil Cardinals to take the championship of the American League last week. The Braves, under the direction of Mark Martin, lost to the Cardinals, headed by Max Fowler, 10-4 in the opening game, but rallied back with a 3-1 win and a 2-0 win to take the title. The Braves easily won the National League championship with a perfect

14-0 mark. The Cardinals locked up the American League title with a 13-2 record, two games ahead of the second place Rockies with an 11-4 record, and three games ahead of the third place White Sox with a 10-5 mark. Both the Braves and Cardinals dominated the all-star teams named this week. Both teams placed six players on the all-star teams.

The National League All-Stars will begin tournament play July 2 when they host Anaheim at Hennisan Park. The American League All-Stars will

begin on July 7 when they travel to Beaumont to play South Park. The double elimination tournament continues through July 19, and includes 15 teams from throughout the Southeast Texas area. The winner of the tournament will advance to the regional tournament that will be held in Houston.

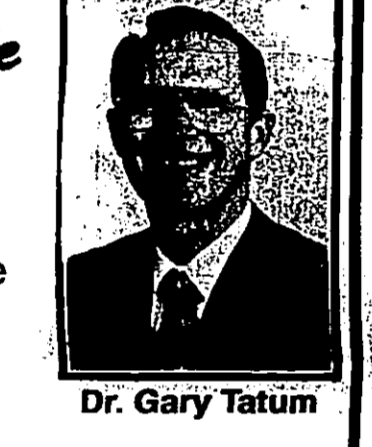
The all-stars knocked off South Jasper County 12-2, between 13-12 and 20-19 losses to Kountze.

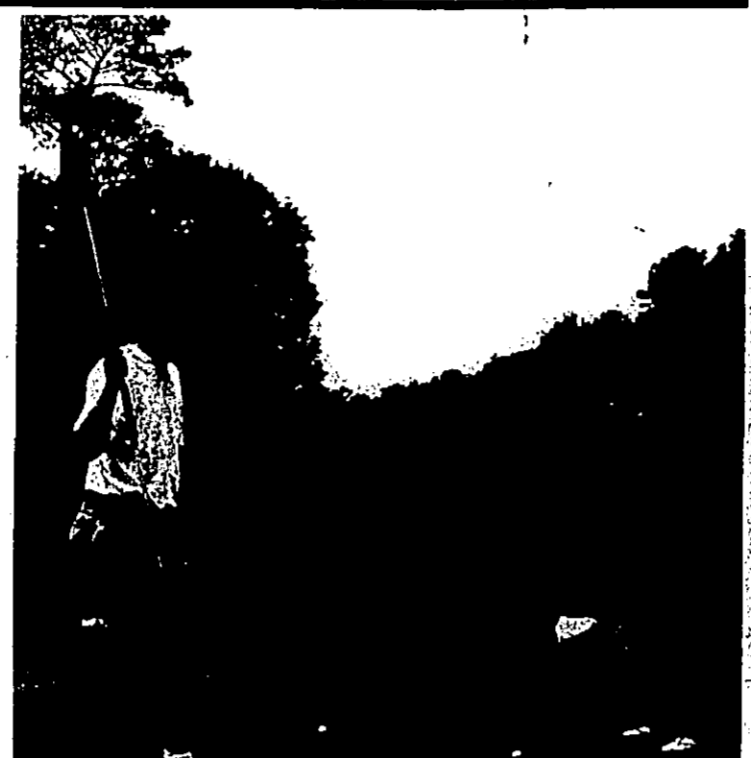
