 Stringer and Griffin Funeral Home of Woodville directed the local arrangements.



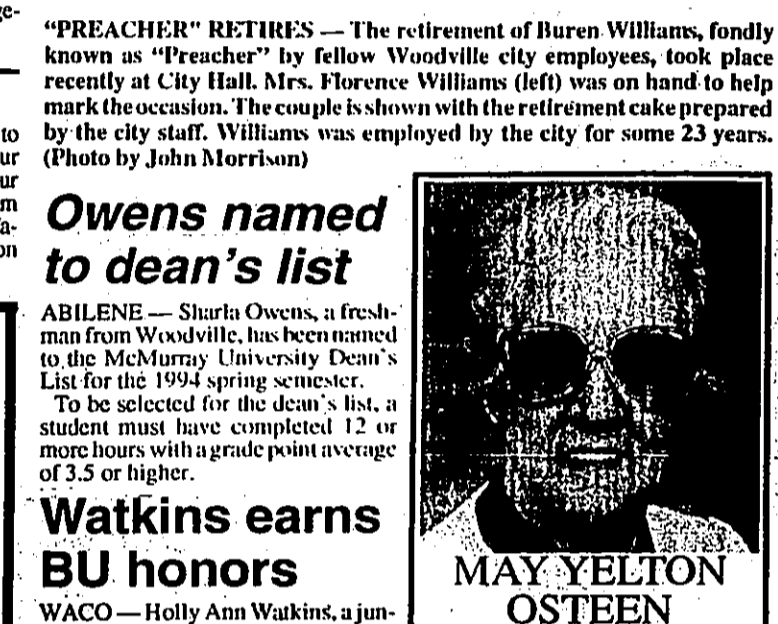

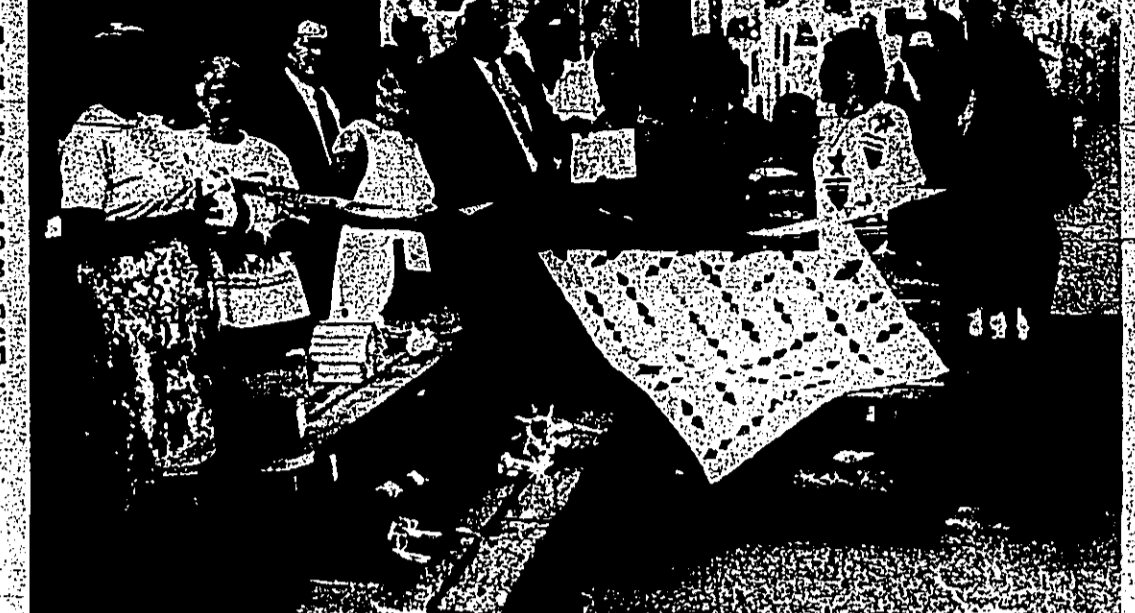


MAY YELTON OSTEEN

 Last year when I rented a four room cottage in Tlanhco, the woods that bordered my back and side yards appealed to my poetic nature as did the weeds across the dirt road in front of my house. It was February and many leafless trees stood sentry in the yard. Former tenants had planted trees in abundance and every imaginable shrub and bulb. Most of the ground cover consisted of patches of centipede grass which sends out fingerlike runners along the ground from clumps that never grow taller than an inch or two.
 During the two months of being thrilled by leafing trees, blooming azaleas, roses etc., another miracle took place - weeds!
 Shortly after I moved into my place, my son, Louis, his wife, Jani and their daughters, Crystal and Jennifer, ages 13 and nine, stayed in their new home in Warren four miles south of me. This delighted me to have my family near.
 Louis said he would mow my grass but his job as manager of a Beekeeper Cattle Ranch near Warren, takes much of his time and with the added work of 13 and nine, landscaping their own yard, I didn't press the issue.
 As I mentioned earlier, God gave me creativity to see many things poeti-

cally. Early each morning God placed a flower atop each weed. By noon, however, many of these blossoms closed leaving only the stalks, and my flower garden became nothing more than a weedy yard.
 One evening at the dinner table at their home, Louis and Jani were discussing my yard. "Have you mowed your Mother's grass?" Jani asked.
 "Her yard is a disaster!" Louis boomed. "It would take four hours to mow it!"
 I bit my lip to keep from saying, "It is not a disaster! You haven't seen it early in the morning!"
 I went home and thought about his words. Louis was right. The next morning I looked at my yard. It would take four hours of work to rid the yard of unwanted vegetation. Living on Social Security leaves little money to spend for hiring work done. So I decided to pull the weeds that had gone to seed and leave the rest to blossom. Four hours of yard work at one time was more than I could manage so I decided to work those four hours five minutes at a time!
 With only the flowering weeds standing against the backdrop of the woods, my yard became a showpiece - a "Meadow" yard!

Spec. Andrus ends course

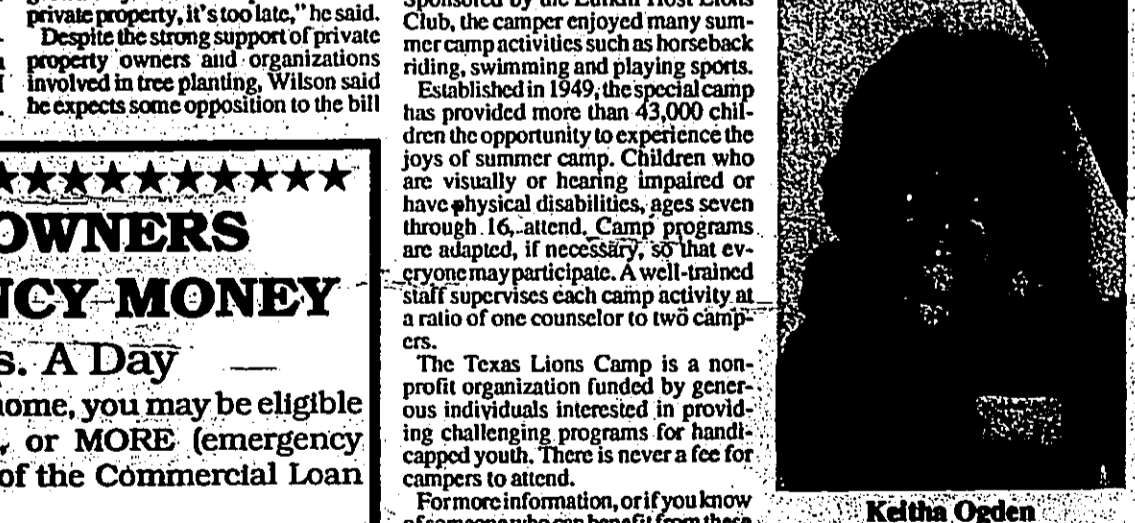

 Opponents and supporters of the proposed legislation will have a chance to voice their opinions on June 17 at the Pitzer Garrison Civic Center in Lufkin when Wilson will be joined by U.S. Rep. Charlie Rose, of North Carolina, chairman of the Agriculture Subcommittee on Specialty Crops and Natural Resources for a congressional hearing on the Southern Pine Beetle. The hearing is expected to draw experts from across Texas to discuss the merits and hazards of the proposed legislation.
 The southern pine beetle is a native insect that attacks only pine trees, especially loblolly and short-leaf pines. The bark attack trees by boring into the bark and can kill a 30-year-old pine in less than a week.
 Most of the beetle activity in 1993 occurred in and around two Texas wilderness areas: Indian Mounds Wilderness in Sabine County and Turkey Hill Wilderness in San Augustine County.

HOUSTON — Anyone who has studied in a library knows that distracting noises can affect learning.

An audiologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston believes the ability to ignore "distractions" may explain why hearing-impaired children process speech less efficiently.

"They are more likely to 'ignore' a very important distraction — what the speaker is saying," said Dr. Susan Jerger, associate professor of otolaryngology and communication sciences at Baylor.

"The reason may have to do with the 'weight' of the information they are receiving," Jerger said. "We have discovered that hearing-impaired children find it easier to pay attention to the speaker's voice than to the actual words. The 'weight' of the voice is greater than the 'weight' of the words."

Hearing-impaired children may be focusing on who is talking and where they're located, rather than on what is being said.

With colleagues at Rice University, Jerger used a standard psychological test and a newly developed test to

For international trips, an insulin injector pack, available at pharmacies, is particularly hot climate, an insulated cold pack is also advisable.

People with heart disease should guard against infectious diseases by getting appropriate vaccinations and preventive medicine, and they should be prepared to fight traveler's diarrhea, Rumsack said.

U.S. 69 named evacuation route

-TxDOT hurricane plan targets road construction funds- By Greg Peak Editor BEAUMONT - U.S. Highway 69 from Beaumont north to Lufkin would be designated as the main hurricane evacuation route for Beaumont and Jefferson County under a plan now being considered by the Texas Department of Transportation.

The north-south highway, which also passes through Tyler and Hardin counties, already was considered as a primary evacuation route for the region, but under the plan now being pushed by Transportation Commission Chairman David Berrisen, the new designation could eventually mean additional highway construction dollars.

"We dodged a bullet with Hurricane Andrew," Berrisen said during a special public hearing Thursday, July 14, in Beaumont. "Fortunately for us, Andrew did not hit the Texas Gulf Coast because if it had, there is no telling how many would have been killed or injured."

"When we tried to evacuate the coast, traffic was unbelievable. Highway 69 was almost a parking lot with traffic backed up from Woodville back to Beaumont."

"Just think what would have happened if the hurricane would have rolled up the Neches River, spawning tornadoes as it went. Just think of what would have happened to all of those people stranded in the cars with their children."

Berrisen said the 1992 storm, which left massive trails of damage in both Florida and Louisiana, was a warning to Texas to take steps now to plan for hurricane evacuation.

"It is not a question of if a hurricane is going to hit here, it is a question of when it is going to hit," he added.

Early each morning God placed a flower atop each weed. By noon, however, many of these blossoms closed leaving only the stalks, and my flower garden became nothing more than a weedy yard.
One evening at the dinner table at their home, Louis and Jani were discussing my yard. "Have you mowed your Mother's grass?" Jani asked.
"Her yard is a disaster!" Louis boomed. "It would take four hours to mow it!"
I hit my lip to keep from saying, "It is not a disaster! You haven't seen it early in the morning!"
I went home and thought about his words. Louis was right. The next morning I looked at my yard. It would take four hours of work to rid the yard of unwanted vegetation. Living on Social Security leaves little money to spend for hiring work done so I decided to pull the weeds that had gone to seed and leave the rest to blossom. Four hours of yard work at one time was more than I could manage so I decided to work those four hours five minutes at a time!

With only the flowering weeds standing, against the backdrop of the woods, my yard became a showplace - a "Meadow" yard.
The day following the removal of the last weedy weed, Louis mowed and edged my yard.

Wilson promoting pine beetle bill
LUFKIN — U.S. Rep. Charles Wilson, in a meeting with Texas Farm Bureau leaders recently, said a bill he has introduced in Congress will help put a stop to the devastation of East Texas pine trees by the Southern Pine Beetle.
The bill, HR 3233, authorizes the U.S. Forest Service to control the spread of the pine beetle in the four wilderness areas of Texas. Under the wilderness protection bill passed in 1984, little or no control is done in wilderness areas until it threatens private land or the endangered red-cockaded woodpecker. By then, efforts to control the beetles are often futile.
The practice now is a hands-off policy in the wilderness areas that gives the pine beetle uncontrolled growth. By the time it spills over into private property, it's too late," he said.
Despite the strong support of private property owners and organizations involved in tree planting, Wilson said he expects some opposition to the bill.

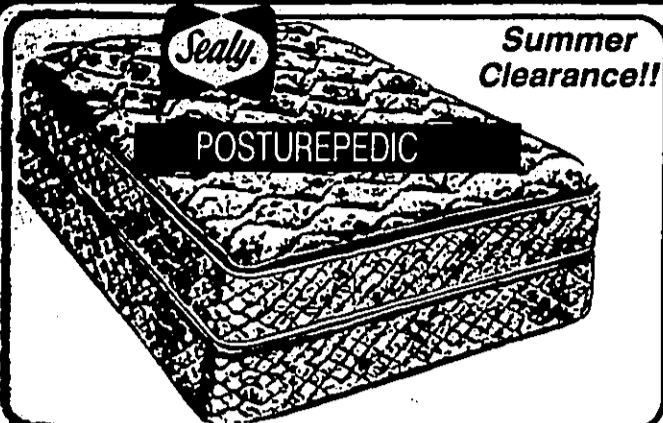
