## Robbery launches three-hour manhunt - Stolen van wrecked in get-away

**TOWN BLUFF** — A 31-year-old Spurger man wanted in connection with a robbery of a Town Bluff area grocery store was arrested Saturday night following about a 3-hour manhunt in western Tyler County. James Claude Baxter Jr. was arrested shortly after 9:30 p.m. Saturday and charged with aggravated robbery with a deadly weapon in connection with a hold-up that occurred about 6:30 p.m. at the Gunter Grocery Store.

He was taken before Justice of the Peace Wanda Brister who set bond at \$25,000.

According to Tyler County Chief Deputy Sheriff Sam Bible, the incident began when a man entered the Gunter Grocery Store on Town Bluff, pulled a large-bladed, folding knife and demanded money.

The bandit took a large sum of cash as well as a 1994 Chevrolet Astro van belonging to James R. Gunter, the owner of the grocery store.

Bible said the man fled south on FM 92 toward Spurger and then turned off on a county road which runs from FM 92 just north of Spurger west to FM 292.

At the road's crossing at Beech Creek, the driver of the stolen van lost control of the vehicle and ran off the bridge into the creek embankment. According to Department of Public Safety accident report, the van was wrecked on the county road, traveling at a high rate of speed, when it

crossed a left curve. The driver is believed to have locked the van's brakes, causing the vehicle to slide through the curve and off the north side of the bridge.

Following the accident, the driver fled on foot, Bible said. "When we discovered the wrecked van about 20 to 30 minutes later, we set up a perimeter with officer on highways 292, 92 and 1013."

In addition to Tyler County sheriff's deputies, other agencies that were involved in the search included DPS units from Tyler, Jasper and Hardin counties, as well as the Woodville Police Department and Tyler County constables David Davis, Wade Skinner and Stu Fountain.

In addition, the Texas Department of Criminal Justice's dog unit also was called to the area to help with the search.

"The dogs began running about 9:30 p.m. and about 10 minutes later the suspect popped out on 292 and was spotted walking down the highway. He was then apprehended without any problem," Bible said.

The chief deputy said the knife as the missing money were recovered.

Bible noted that Baxter told investigators that he had been previously convicted of armed robbery and had only been released on parole from the Texas Department of Criminal Justice five months ago.

## Woodville seeks funds for \$685,000 in improvements

**WOODVILLE** — The City of Woodville voted Monday to authorize approving resolutions which call for a Community Development Block Grant application for \$250,000 in sewer improvements and a possible expansion of Statewide Transportation Enhancement Funds to build a hike and bike trail along Little Turkey Creek (from Dairy Queen to Deer Queen) at a cost of \$435,000.

Actual cost to the city for the sewer work would be \$91,950 and the hike and bike trail would cost \$37,000 bringing the total cost to city taxpayers \$178,950.

Woodville Volunteer Fire Chief Chuck Betteg also recommended the city spend "from \$100,000 to \$150,000 for a new needed pumper truck," saying the current unit, "is a piece of junk and the city is in jeopardy of losing it's present key insurance rate of .18 cents."

"You come at the right time," said Mayor Billy Rose, who told the chief further, "We are just now beginning our budget planning."

## Expanded calling vote scheduled

**TYLER COUNTY** — Ballots for telephone customers in the Warren-Village Mills and the Colmesneil telephone exchanges are scheduled to be mailed out this month to determine if Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling (ELC) services are desired.

If approved, customers in the Warren-Village Mills exchange would be able to dial toll-free to the Warren-Village Mills exchange without long distance toll charges and telephone subscribers in the Colmesneil exchange would be able to dial toll-free to the Woodville, Spurger and Warren exchanges.

Instead of the long-distance toll charges, telephone customers in the Warren-Village Mills and Colmesneil exchanges would pay a monthly fee of \$3.50 per residential line and \$7 for each business line.

Ballots for customers in the Warren-Village Mills exchange were scheduled to be mailed out with their Southwestern Bell Telephone Co. bills on Wednesday, Aug. 10, while customers in the Colmesneil exchange are set to receive ballots in General Telephone Co. bills mailed out on Wednesday, Aug. 17.

The Warren-Village Mills ballots must be returned by Aug. 25 while the deadline for the Colmesneil ballots is Sept. 1.

"If the customers in both the Colmesneil and the Warren-Village Mills exchanges approve this service, it would mean that almost everyone in Tyler County would be able to call one another toll-free," said Gene Koci, who has been coordinating the ELC service vote for the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce.

The only area of Tyler County which would be excluded from the toll-free calling services with the remainder of the county would be the Chester telephone exchange.

Items were smashed into walls, ceiling fans were pulled down and paint was poured over kitchen cabinets, appliances and carpeting. In addition, the curtains were plugged and faucets were left running, causing the home to flood.

Yosko said that during the night of July 29, someone broke into the store's glass window and stole \$393.82 in clothing and a mannequin valued at \$50.

The investigation into that incident was continuing and Yosko said additional arrests are expected.

Eric Coleman, 22, of Woodville also was charged with forgery last week in connection with two checks stolen and forged from Coleman's Tyler County Funeral Home in Woodville. According to police reports, the checks, totaling \$75 and \$50, were forged back in January 1993 but the reporting Coleman was not notified with police until Wednesday, Aug. 3.

## Courthouse renovation grant sought

**WOODVILLE** — Plans to seek \$790,000 in grant funds to renovate the Tyler County Courthouse in Woodville were given the green light Monday by county commissioners.

Meeting with the county's grant consultant, Randy Blanks, the commissioners authorized the filing of an application for a Texas Department of Transportation grant by the Aug. 16 deadline.

The grant, which would fund 80 percent of the cost of the almost \$1 million renovation project, would come out of a \$30 million fund which TxDOT is making available for beautification and related projects statewide.

Under the plan, the county would have to put up \$144,000 in matching funds to cover the estimated total cost of the project.

"Basically the grant will cover exterior work on the courthouse, plus provide a central air and heating system," Blanks told the commissioners.

He said that \$230,000 in grant funds would be sought to restore the courthouse's clock tower to its original appearance. \$250,000 would be needed to replace the flat roof with the original high gabled roof. \$60,000 would be required for cornice detail and \$250,000 would be needed to the air conditioning and heating work.

Blanks noted that the TxDOT grants do not normally cover interior work such as air conditioning and heating, but because the courthouse currently uses window cooling units, it is eligible to apply for the funds.

"The exterior window units have an effect on the appearance of the outside of the courthouse, so we can apply for funds to replace them with a central air and heat system," he explained.

Blanks indicated that the county should know by October or November if it will receive the funds and that it would take about two years to complete the work.

County Judge Jerome Owens noted that while the county would have to come up with \$144,000 in local money for the project, local taxpayers would receive a much greater benefit. In addition to the beautification work and the replacement of a troublesome flat roof, the air conditioning work would relieve much of the strain on the courthouse's overstressed electrical system.

"We need to do something with the wiring in the courthouse," Owens said.

toners in the Warren-Village Mills and Colmesnell exchanges would pay the monthly fee, regardless of telephone use.

"We want to let the telephone customers in Colmesnell and Warren-Village Mills know that they should be on the look-out for their ballots," Kocid said. "It will come with their telephone bill and we don't want them to throw it away thinking it's a routine bill stubber."

The balloting is the result of Senate Bill 632 and Public Utility Commission Rule 23.49 which allow communities to petition for expanded toll-free calling to nearby exchanges.

Kocid explained that the law is designed to allow primarily rural telephone exchanges to obtain toll-free access to long-range, nearby communities where medical, governmental and other needed services are located.

Ballots will be mailed to the customer's billing address. Only one vote per customer's account is allowed. After marking the ballot, customers should sign their name and return the ballot to the Public Utility Commission of Texas, P.O. Box 10900, Austin, Texas 78766-9976.

"If you could place yourself side by side with the other counties, you'd see just how good a job you're doing, often with fewer people. A lot of counties don't do as good a job with more staff," he told the commissioners.





## Bulldogs ready for another bite of the playoffs

(First of a four part series)

COLMESNEIL — Last year the Colmesneil Bulldogs defeated arch rival Chester in what turned out as the second place title game in District 24-A football. Burkville, with all-star running back Jeff Spikes, took care of the district title with an unblemished league mark.

Coaches and sports scribes are excited about the Bulldogs' season. Burkville is a preseason pick to sweep through the district with the return of Spikes, while Colmesneil and Chester figure to battle it out again for second place.

But talk with Colmesneil head football coach Mike Jacobs gives the listener another perspective. The Bulldogs are not conceding anything to Burkville or anybody else.

To start with, Colmesneil has replaced Beaumont Christian, a team that the Bulldogs led 40-0 at the half last year, with class 2A West Hardin. They have also replaced Cushing, now in class 1A, with class 2A Shelbyville. Why? As Jacobs puts it, "Burkville plays 2A clubs, so we should too."

While Burkville has the state leading ground gainer in Spikes, the Bulldogs have a kennel full of talent returning. Admittedly, gone are all-district quarterback Les Stinson, receiver Scott Eddins, and lineman Joey Harris, but the Bulldogs return eight offensive and seven defensive starters. Included in the returning is Greg Bean (165), who despite sitting out for five quarters last year, rushed for 1,604 yards.

Says his coach, "Greg makes things happen. He has good moves, has good balance, and is slippery. While Bean runs from the tailback position, a key to a lot of Bean's yardage comes in the form of fullback Lee Van Brewer (165) who rushed for over 900 yards last year. Herman Hillen (145), a senior, returns at flex back.

The biggest question mark for the Bulldogs is the quarterback position where Jeff Allen takes over the helm after playing behind Stinson for the past three years. While lack of experience might take its toll somewhere down the line, Allen has already impressed coaches in practice sessions last week with his agility. Not only that, but the 175 pound senior also comes into the season off the heels of being named all-state catcher in June. "He definitely has a good arm," notes Jacobs.

Standing in the wings should Allen

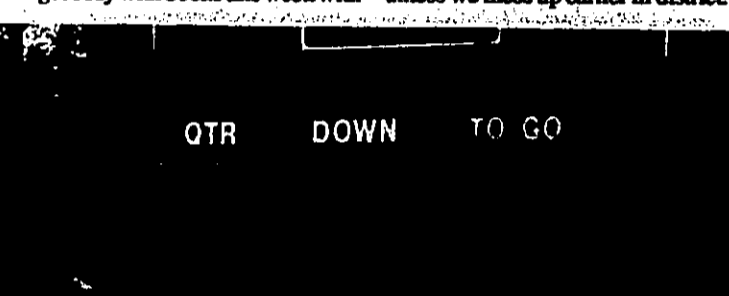
the starting of classes Thursday. Coaches include Jacobs, Johnson, Rodney Haught, Gene Allen and Matt Materson.

## Looking at sports The juice runs through it
