TYLER COUNTY — While residents in the Chester telephone exchange will be joining much of the rest of Tyler County telephone customers in voting on Expanded Toll-Free Local Calling (ELC), residents in the Village Mills exchange have been put on hold regarding the issue.

Eastex Telephone Cooperative, Inc., which serves the Chester area, is set to mail out ballots to their customers on Sept. 9.

The Chester telephone customers recently filed a petition for ELC services with both Woodville and Corrigan.

If approved, customers in the Chester which serves the Chester area who return their ballots must vote "yes" in order for expanded toll-free the ELC service between Chester and Woodville is that the two cities are located in different Local Access Transport Areas (LATAs). Because of this, if voters approve ELC between the two cities, a petition would have to be filed in U.S. District Court to win federal approval to establish the ELC service.


