Traffic-stop ends in arrest
WOODVILLE — A 24-year-old Woodville man was charged with possession of a controlled substance and misdemeanor possession of marijuana late last week following a routine traffic stop in Woodville.

Clifton Dwight Barkin was stopped by Woodville police on South Beach Street about 9:40 p.m. on Friday, Sept. 2.

Upon subsequent investigation, officers discovered eight rocks of crack cocaine and four marijuana cigarettes. In other police activity, Thomas Lear, 73, of Ivanhoe was charged with criminal trespassing on Friday, following an incident reported at the Woodville Wal-Mart store on Thursday, Sept. 1.

According to Police Chief Scott Yosko, Lear was arrested several months ago on a shoplifting complaint filed by the Wal-Mart.

At that time, Lear was warned not to come back to the store. Yosko said, "On Thursday, Lear was once again issued a misdemeanor citation for theft in connection with another shoplifting incident at Wal-Mart. Store officials filed the criminal trespassing complaint the following day and Lear was arrested on that charge when he came to the police department in connection with the theft citation issued the day before."

County native raises funds for crippled children's camp

LONGVIEW — After learning firsthand how it feels to be handicapped, Tyler County native Ken Best has been working to help the agency that gave him a helping hand over 30 years ago.

Best, who now resides in Longview, joined with other members of the Fraternal Order of Eagles Longview Area No. 4125 to help raise money to fund improvements for the Texas Lions Camp for Crippled Children, a facility which helped Best develop life skills back in the 1960s.

On May 7, 1990, Best, his date and two other couples were driving down a Woodville road enroute to a drive-in movie. The sudden flash of on-coming headlights were among the last things that Best was to see.

A head-on collision left the couple in the front seat as well as the driver of the other vehicle dead. The rest of those with Best were injured in varying degrees and a woman and child in the other car were mangled.

Best awoke after the collision in a Beaumont hospital to the devastating fact that he was almost totally blind. Following three months in the Hospital, the Texas Rehabilitation Commission was brought into Best's case and began sending him benefits of a maximum \$72 per month.

To care for himself, Best began his rehabilitation at the Texas Lions Camp for Crippled Children in Kerrville, a camp where the blind literally lead the blind.

At the camp, all but one of the counselors were either partially or totally blind, except the home economics instructor, Steve recalled. They taught him to read and understand the Braille language, travel using a cane and how to wash and iron his own laundry.

Carter will be assisted with the boys by Coach Bill Sullivan and assisted with the girls by Coach Donna Rainey.

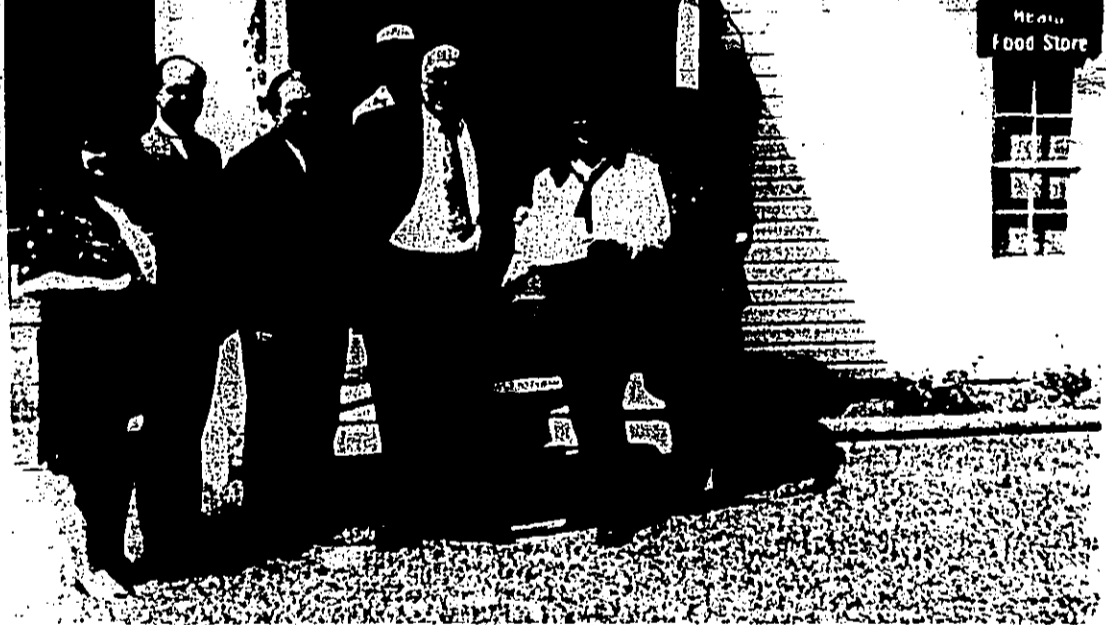

Next up was senior Herman Allen who ran a counter play 14 yards for yet another Colmesneil TD, making the score 34-0 at the end of the third quarter.

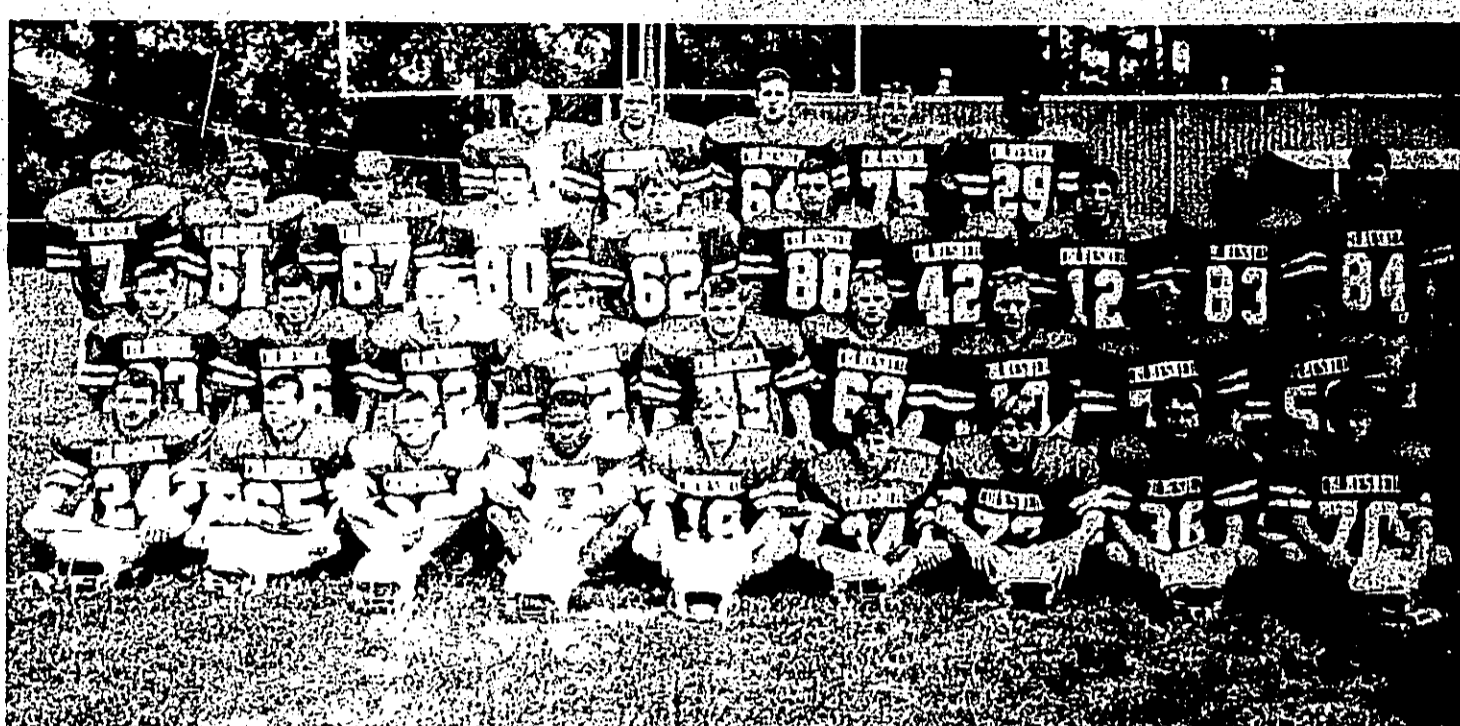

Ten tips offered to prevent drownings, injuries

AUSTIN — More than 400 drownings were reported in Texas in 1992, the latest year for which statistics are final.

The number of injuries from near-drownings may be five times that many, according to the Texas Department of Health (TDH) Injury Prevention Program and Control, David Zane, director of the program said. "In past years, we have only been able to estimate the number of injuries, some of which include brain damage and other permanent disabilities, caused by near-drownings. This year, though, state law requires that injuries attributed to near-drownings be reported to TDH so that we can recommend ways to reduce the number of these tragedies."

Champion to protect red-cockaded woodpecker

TRINITY — Champion International Corporation has signed a Memorandum of Agreement with the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, and the U.S. Forest Service to manage a 2,000-acre tract of property in Trinity County, Texas, to protect the red-cockaded woodpecker and other federal and state-listed wildlife.

Under the agreement, Champion will protect and manage a mature longleaf pine stand - a declining ecosystem type favored by the woodpecker - while selectively harvesting trees in the area, thus benefiting the woodpecker, the ecosystem and the company.

An agreement signing ceremony took place today at Champion's Kickapoo Campground in Trinity County with Dr. John G. Rogers, director of the Fish and Wildlife Service's Southwest Region; William Krick, regional general manager for Champion; and Dr. Robert D. Lutz, Texas Parks and Wildlife Department, and Alan G. Newman, Supervisor for the National Forests and Grasslands.

Ten tips offered to prevent drownings, injuries

1. Use - and check for - extra pool barriers or fences, safety covers, alarms and other devices to discourage trespassing or falling into a pool.
2. Never leave a child alone, for any reason, near a pool or other water.
3. Regardless of whether they know how to swim, require all children younger than 5 to wear Coast Guard-approved life vests while on water.
4. Avoid young children's use of "floaties" and other devices which the child can easily remove.
5. See that children learn to swim, taught by a qualified instructor, such as the Red Cross or YMCA, but never consider a child "water safe."
6. Teach youngsters about water safety at your home, and remove ladders, lawn furniture or other means of climbing over pool fences. Also, keep a clear view of the pool area from your house.
7. Learn CPR and first aid; that other family members, baby-sitters and other caretakers for children also learn it. Especially during social events, designate an adult to supervise children near water.
8. Keep emergency and 9-1-1 numbers on all phones and install a phone near the pool.
9. Equip your pool for lifesaving with a shepherd's hook or lightweight pole, and a ring buoy or other float with an attached line.
10. Ban alcoholic drinks from your pool area.

Champion to protect red-cockaded woodpecker

Champion, which owns a million acres of East Texas forestland, is the first corporate landowner in Texas to enter an agreement with state and federal agencies to manage an ecosystem to benefit rare and endangered species, and the first forest products company to sign an agreement to aid in the recovery of the species.

"This agreement represents a win-win situation for the forest products industry, threatened red-cockaded woodpecker, and the longleaf pine ecosystem," said Rogers. "Champion will continue to harvest timber within its management area while eventually supporting as many as 20 woodpecker clusters (breeding groups)."

"Champion International is committed to following both the letter and the spirit of environmental legislation and policies," said Krick. "We entered this agreement because it represents a practical solution for meeting the needs of endangered species while allowing us to continue managing our resources for the raw materials we need for paper and other products."

And dominate they did.

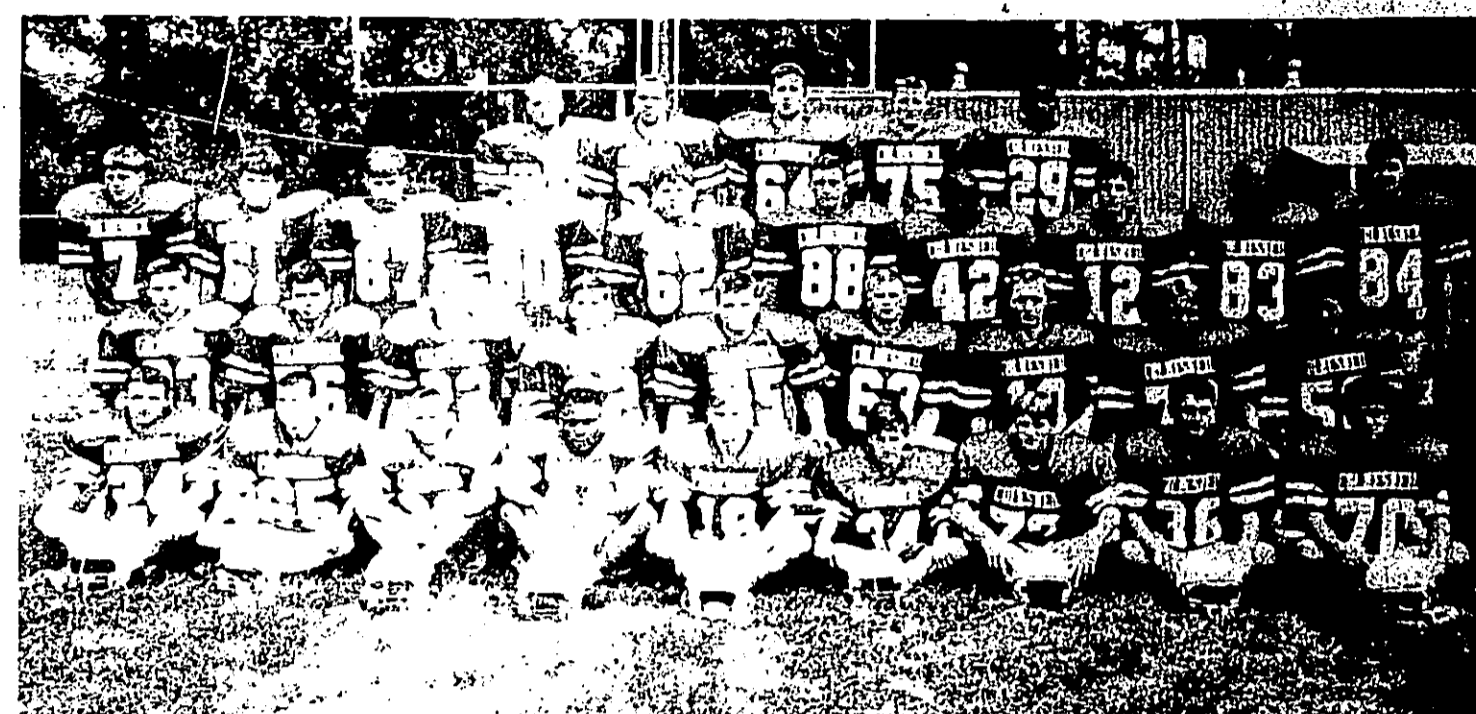

Ten tips offered to prevent drownings, injuries

AUSTIN — More than 400 drownings were reported in Texas in 1992, the latest year for which statistics are final.

The number of injuries from near-drownings may be even greater, according to the Texas Department of Health (TDH) Injury Prevention Program and Control. David Zane, director of the program said, "In past years we have only been able to estimate the number of injuries, some of which include brain damage and other permanent disabilities, caused by near-drownings. This year, though, state law requires that injuries attributed to near-drownings be reported to TDH so that we can recommend ways to reduce the numbers of these tragedies."

Champion to protect red-cockaded woodpecker



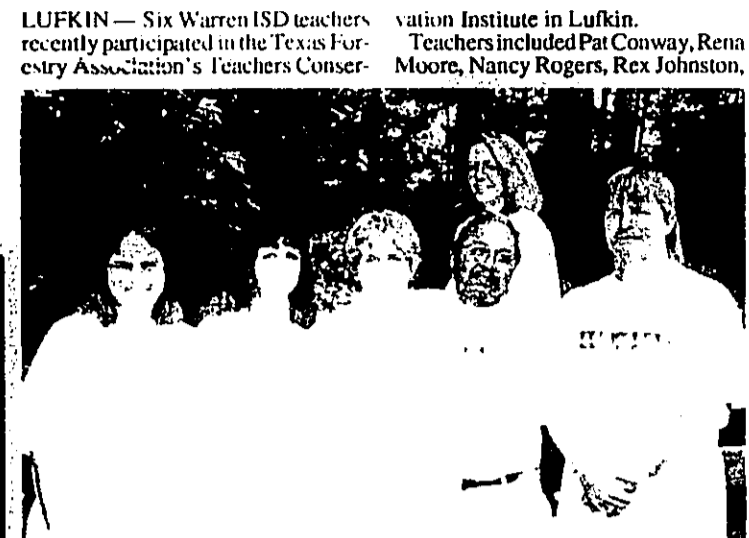
