'Village Vidette': the name says it all

In the early 1970's members of the Gardner family in Beaumont, not wanting to see the press and its many accoutrements destroyed along with the building in which they were housed, contacted Clyde Gray and arrangements were made for a long term loan on the equipment.

And that's where Clytus Caskey came in, hired as he was to bring the precious cargo to the Village. Caskey's interest in the paper was primarily from the fact that his mother, a talented writer and poet, often had her pieces printed in the Vidette. It was the same Mr. Caskey and his brother, who later delivered the old windmill that still stands outside the Tolar Cabin.

And so it is the Village Vidette, to be dedicated on Saturday, October 15, during the Village's 7th Annual Harvest Festival. And we have lots of surprises to go with it.

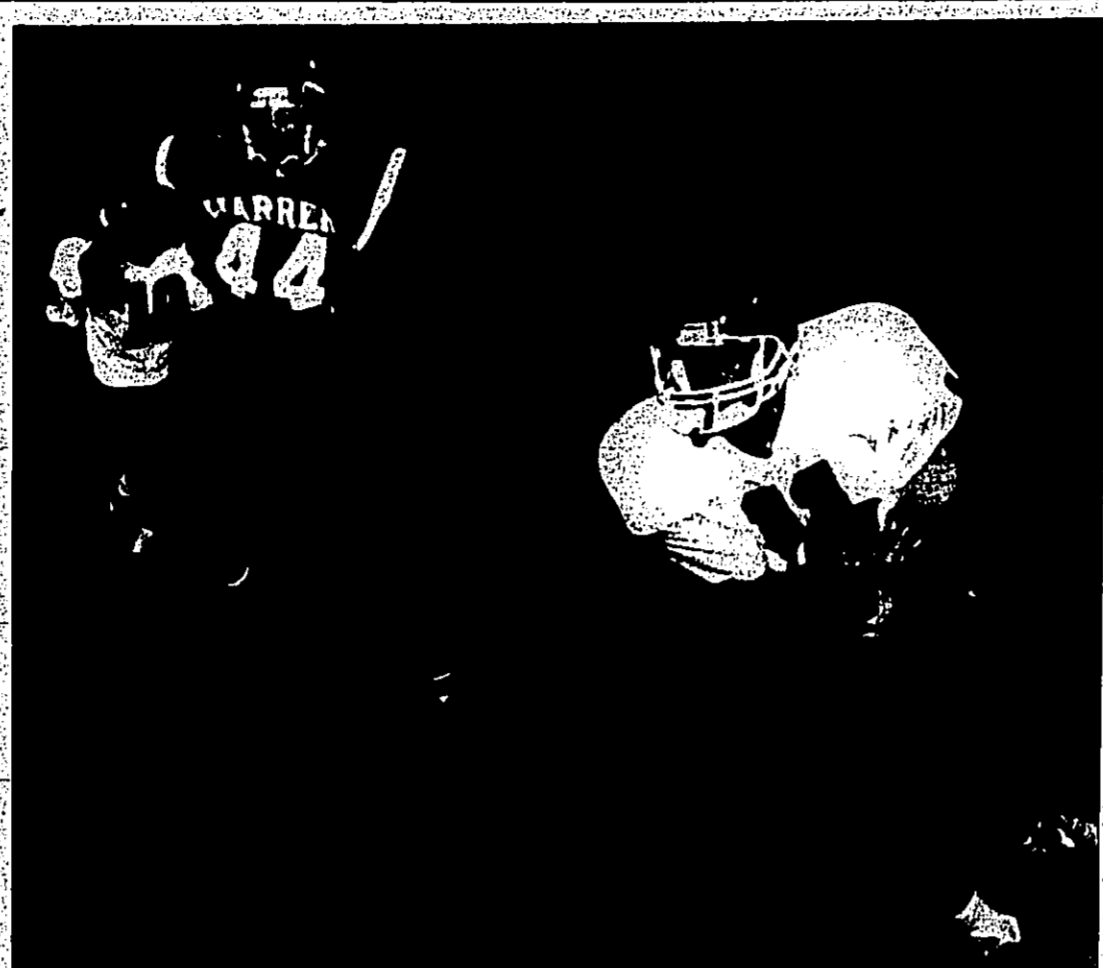
Greg Bean of the Colmesneil Bulldogs had a truly outstanding night of play, carrying the ball 32 times for 243 yards, with one touchdown.

Sheriff's Report

Officers answer 12 calls
WOODVILLE — Tyler County Sheriff's Department deputies responded to 12 calls in Tyler County during the week ending Monday, Sept. 12.

Attendance rates up at Woodville High

WOODVILLE — The official school year of the 1994-95 school year found attendance rates at Woodville High School at an all-time high. School administrators report that "classes were full and students were on task."

"Attendance strategies from the high school staff and an increased emphasis on the importance of safety and discipline from the community created this successful story," commented Dr. Tom Harvey, principal of Woodville High School.

The end of the 93-94 school year's average daily attendance rate was 94.5%, a significant gain over previous years. This year, the attendance rate at Woodville High School was 96%.

One successful strategy finds the school's attendance clerk, Susan Boler, attempting to call the homes of each student's absence. This allows the school to assist with make-up work as well as verifying acceptable excuses for absences. Boler says that "she enjoys the opportunity to contact the homes of students and offer assistance."

The downside to her position rests with the responsibility of reporting those students who are skipping school. In the first 20 days of school, four students were caught skipping school, all of whom received strong disciplinary consequences.

Letters are also sent to all students missing more than four days of school. The letter informs parents and students about the state law requiring students to attend school 90% of the time to receive credit. Students with extenuating circumstances may appear their absences to an attendance committee. Those absences which are considered extenuating by the committee must be made up after school or on Saturdays. Students who lose their appeals also lose their credits.
