injury, the first step may be physical therapy if there is no evidence of a severe tear. If the tendon is badly lamaged surgery may be required. The tendon that forms that rotator cuff is brought back into place, reattached to the bone and any tears in the tendon are repaired," Gabel said. In some cases, the procedure can be performed as day surgery, using an rthroscope. For more severe injuries, open surgery with a longer recovery

Gabel says some older athletes may dismiss stiffness in the shoulder as just part of aging when, in fact, their otator cuff may have a slight injury. "A baseball pitcher may severely njure the rotator cuff and right away said. "But, it may take a while for the average 40 or 50 year old with some stiffness in the shoulder to report the

condition to a doctor." Gabel says the earlier an age-related rotator cuff injury is diagnosed, the better the chance that it can be corrected with a simple physical therapy

Don't let bacteria gobble up your turkey

HOUSTON --- Don't go for the "quick thaw" and let bacteria gobble up your turkey this Thanksgiving, says an infectious diseases expert at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

Turkey and other poultry defrosted outside the refrigerator too long are prone to contamination with salmonella bacteria," said Dr. A. Clinton White Jr., an assistant professor of medicine at Baylor, "Once the turkey has thawed, it's important to cook it thoroughly to kill bacteria and avoid serious illness."

Salmonella poisoning is caused by bacteria that develop in raw or undercooked meats and other foods stored in a warm environment. When eaten bacteria grow in the intestines, causing stomach pain, nausea, vomiting, diarrhea and dehydration.

Over-the-counter anti-diarrheal medications can help soothe your stomach pain, but drink plenty of fluids to treat dehydration," White said. "If the symptoms worsen, see your doctor.

Other foods like eggs and shellfish can also pose a health risk.

If your holiday recipes call for eggs, be sure to purchase clean, uncracked eggs, and keep them refrigerated. Avoid serving raw or under-cooked egg yolks, which increase the risk of infection.

People who enjoy eating raw shell-fish, like oysters, over the holidays should be cautious, says White.

"Eating raw oysters is not a good idea, especially for people with liver disease, because it harbors choleralike organisms called vibreos which cause life-threatening infections," he said.

White advises washing your hands before preparing foods to reduce bacteria transmission.

"You can contaminate the turkey with common bacteria that you carry on your skin," White said. Here are more safe holiday cooking

tips:
- Don't use the same knife you cut raw poultry with on other foods. Wash cutting boards, counter tops and cook-

-Check the temperature of your turkey with a cooking thermometer to make sure that turkey has been cooked thoroughly.

For people who suffer a rotator cuff injury, the first step may be physical therapy if there is no evidence of a severe tear. If the tendon is badly damaged surgery may be required.

The tendon that forms that rotator cuff is brought back into place, reattached to the bone and any tears in the endon are repaired," Gabel said. In some cases, the procedure can be performed as day surgery, using an rthroscope. For more severe injuries, open surgery with a longer recovery time is required.

Gabel says some older athletes may

dismiss stiffness in the shoulder as just part of aging when, in fact, their rotator cuff may have a slight injury "A baseball pitcher may severely injure the rotator cuff and right away the condition can be assessed," Gabel said. "But, it may take a while for the average 40 or 50 year old with some stiffness in the shoulder to report the condition to a doctor.'

Gabel says the earlier an age-related rotator cuff injury is diagnosed, the better the chance that it can be corrected with a simple physical therapy
