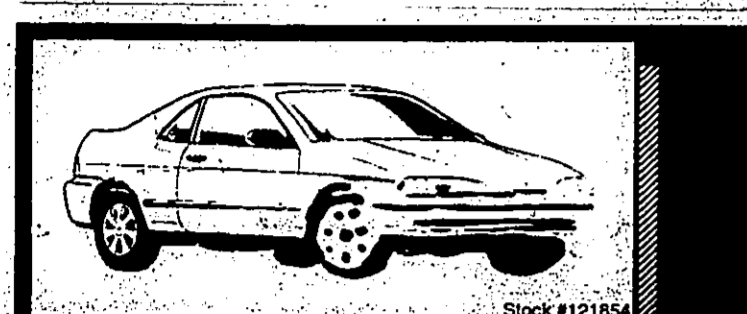
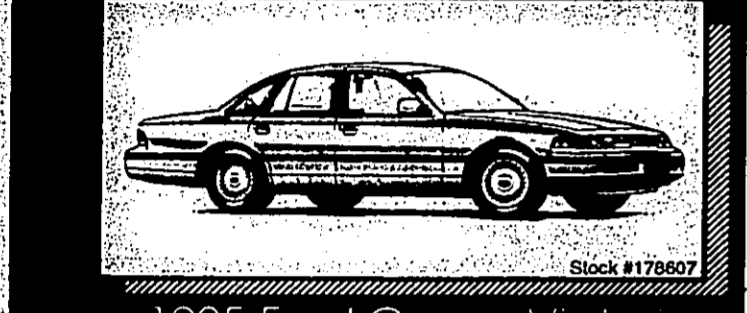

Food, exercise can recharge battery

HOUSTON—When your energy level seems stuck at zero, changes in eating and exercise habits may be all it takes to recharge your battery. According to researchers at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, most people experiencing chronic fatigue who are not clinically ill are suffering from unhealthy behaviors. Only about one percent of people experiencing overwhelming tiredness actually suffer from Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. The culprits are usually poor nutrition and lack of exercise, said Dr. Ken Goodrick, Baylor assistant professor of medicine and a behavioral psychologist. "Caffeine abuse may also cause fatigue rather than overcome it, and alcohol/drug abuse, stress and depression, or irregular sleep patterns can play a role." Not eating enough, eating too much fat or not drinking enough water can cause a person to feel fatigued, Goodrick said. To help increase energy, poor nutrition habits should be replaced by a well-balanced diet that provides no more than 30 percent of total calories from fat. A healthy eating plan also includes five or more servings of fruits and vegetables and at least eight glasses of water a day. Regular, vigorous (but not necessarily strenuous) exercise also increases energy and helps with sleep as well, Goodrick said. Experts from Baylor's DeBakey Heart Center Nutrition Research Clinic recommend 45 minutes of brisk walking three to five times a week as part of a healthy life-style routine.

Two men returning from the White's Cafe in Warren and heading east at around 2 a.m. Sunday, Nov. 27, reportedly slid off FM 1013 at the Turkey Creek Bridge and submerged their truck in water deep enough to cover their vehicle by one foot.

Found dead at the scene at around 7:30 p.m. Friday, Dec. 3, (one week later) were Robert Earl Penson, 46, of Hillister and McKinley Barclay, 61, also of Hillister, said Tyler County Sheriff Gary Hennigan.

The two men were discovered by Sheriff's Deputy Ty Nowlin when he was asked by Sheriff Gary Hennigan to retrace the roads "And be sure and check the bridges." According to Hennigan the deputy checked one side of the bridge then came back "on a hunch" to check the other side and with the help of a bright spotlight was able to see the roof of the muddy colored vehicle still underneath one foot of Turkey Creek water.

Authorities said one man was found in the vehicle and one had been ejected and was found several feet away.

Authorities theorize that Saturday morning when the accident is believed to have happened, "Was the coldest day we've had yet, and the bridge was probably iced."

Relatives reported the two missing on the Monday following the wreck. Authorities had been trying to reach relatives in Lufkin and Louisiana to locate the duo but with no success.

Hennigan said a Helicopter search was undertaken but to no avail.

Dogwood Hike Bike Trail to cost \$435,000

The City of Woodville will be getting soon a \$435,000 Hike Bike Trail that will run for 1.2 miles along Turkey Creek from "Dairy Queen to Dairy Queen."

The projects approved for South-east Texas will not only strengthen transportation in our area, but augment the quality of life as well, Bensen added, with a mix of historic preservation and transportation enhancements, our area really came out a winner.

The project consists of constructing a 1.2 mile hike and bike trail. Some landscaping will be included to provide alternate pathways and access for pedestrians and cyclists from the southwest neighborhood of Woodville to businesses on either side of Hwy 190 and Hwy 69 and 287.

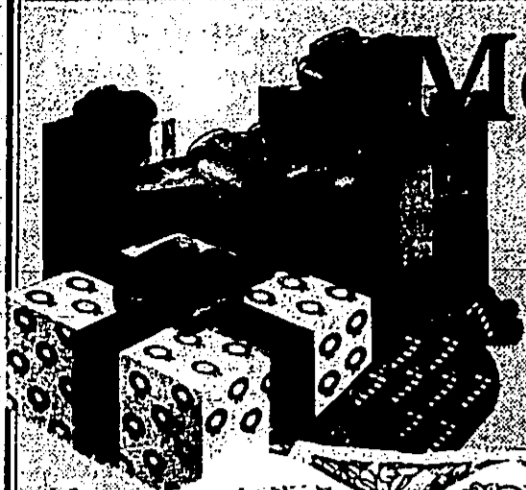

Check out charities before giving

WOODVILLE - At the holiday season and year-end tax decisions approach, giving to charities may be higher on your list of things to do. Giving, like any other money use, can have different uses of return. Three national resources can help you know which ones are worthy of your donation.

The American Institute of Philanthropy (AIP) publishes the Give's Charity Rating Guide (\$3). To get a copy, write to AIP, 4579 Laclede Ave., Suite E17, St. Louis, MO 63108. They judge solely on financial information reported annually to the IRS and audited financial statements. Rating of charities A to F are based on:

- The percentage of total expenses spent on the group's charitable purposes. AIP believes 60 percent or more of their total expenses for the year should be for charitable purposes.
- The cost to raise \$100. AIP says up to \$35 would be the maximum cost for raising \$100.
- Reserve budget. How long could a charity continue to operate at current levels without raising any more money? If a group has more than three years of operating funds available, AIP gives it a lower grade. Groups with funds to last five years get an F.

Other sources you could check for similar information are: National Charities Information Bureau (NCIB), The Wise Giving Guide (single copies free), 19 Union Square West, Dept. 326 New York, NY 10003; Council of Better Business Bureaus' Philanthropic Advisory Service - Give. But Give Wisely, (\$2 plus self-addressed, stamped envelope) 4200 Wilson Blvd., Suite 800 Arlington, VA 22203.

When a charity approaches you or even when you plan to write a check to a charity you have given to for years, their clothing sizes. This helps avoid returns.

- Have a place to keep all receipts for gift purchases, in case you need to return items.
- Consider giving gift certificates or money. This works especially well for children other than your own whose sizes, interests and other gifts you may not know when you're shopping. They can take advantage of year-end sales and avoid being stuck with items they already own or can't use.
- Look at unusual places. Grocery stores, museums, book stores, craft shows, and mail-order catalogs for a wide range of price and types of gifts that meet the wide range of needs on your list.
- Take a list with everyone's name you plan to buy gifts for, including

Food, exercise can recharge 'battery'

HOUSTON — When your energy level seems stuck at zero, changes in eating and exercise habits may be all it takes to recharge your battery. According to researchers at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, most people experiencing chronic fatigue who are not clinically ill are suffering from unhealthy behaviors. Only about one percent of people experiencing overwhelming tiredness actually suffer from Chronic Fatigue Syndrome. "The culprits are usually poor nutrition and lack of exercise," said Dr. Ken Goodnick, Baylor assistant professor of medicine and a behavioral psychologist. "Caffeine abuse may also cause fatigue rather than overcome it, and alcohol/drug abuse, stress and depression, or irregular sleep patterns can play a role." Not eating enough, eating too much fat or not drinking enough water can cause a person to feel fatigued, Goodnick said. To help increase energy, poor nutrition habits should be replaced by a well-balanced diet that provides no more than 30 percent of total calories from fat. A healthy eating plan also includes five or more servings of fruits and vegetables and at least eight glasses of water a day. Regular, vigorous (but not necessarily strenuous) exercise also increases energy and helps with sleep as well, Goodnick said. Experts from Baylor's DeBakey Heart Center Nutrition Research Clinic recommend 45 minutes of brisk walking three to five times a week as part of a healthy life-style routine.

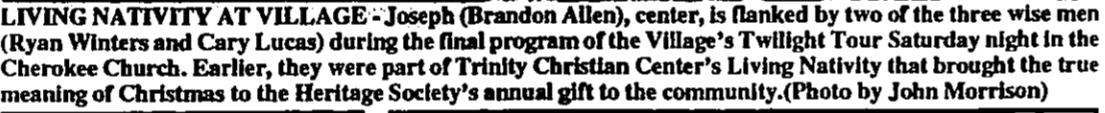

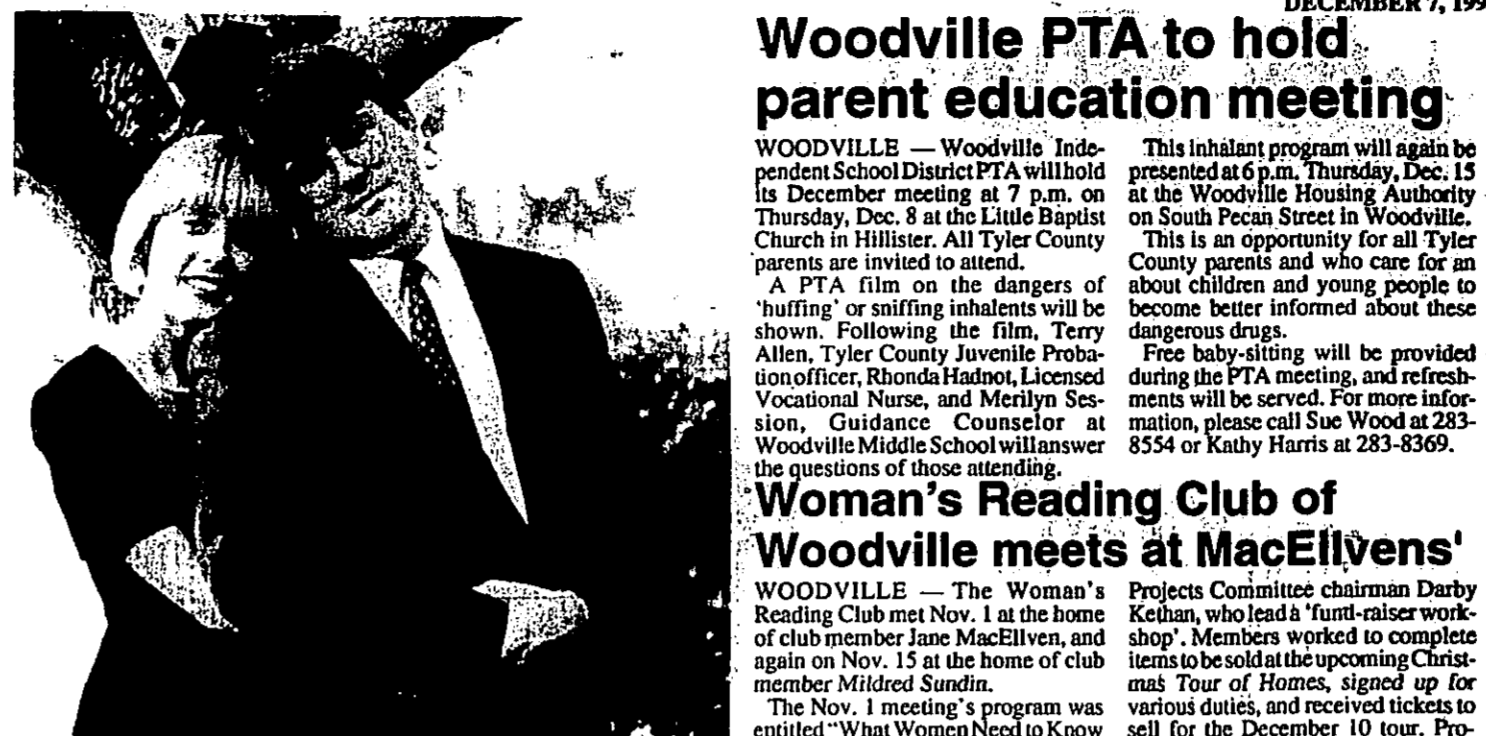

PROfessions

World War II marked a lot of changes to a lot of people. Among the most radical was the way things were done on farms. Should we start calling it Texas M & A?

On our place in northwest Louisiana, the contrast was downright dramatic. Raising cattle and cotton before the war, it was all done by men and mules. Oh, we had a tractor and a molar. The truck, a 1929 International, enabled us to haul cattle to market instead of driving them. It also served as my mount when I learned to drive.

The tractor was a 1920 Farmall with steel-cleated wheels, much like those in Henry's Village. It was at its best as a stationary engine, pulling various machinery via a power takeoff pulley and a long belt. But the plowing, seeding, cultivating and harvesting was done by mule-drawn equipment.

Plowing a mule was no casual undertaking, but I was once allowed to have a go at it. This came about purely through Roosevelt's New Deal. In 1933 or 34 the government convinced most farmers worst fears that bureaucracy was out of control. Washington started paying farmers to plow up their growing cotton. I was alone. My black friend Tom Coley, several years older, was turning over the vigorous young cotton with a mule and a midside buster. He let me guide the plow for a while, though he kept the reins. I guess he figured it didn't matter much how straight was my furrow.

Baling hay took a crew of eight men, or more accurately six men mule-drawn. Not to mention eight mules. Two mowers would be working a couple days ahead of the baler crew, using a team apiece. The hay was cut and raked, then two dump rakes would windrow the hay. Then the baler would drive under the windrows, picking up stems and leaving windrows and sliding it to the stationary baler. He had to have the best mules, because they needed to back the rakes from under the hay by voice command alone.

The old baler was pulled to its working location by the Farmall, which then swapped ends and rigged up the power takeoff drive

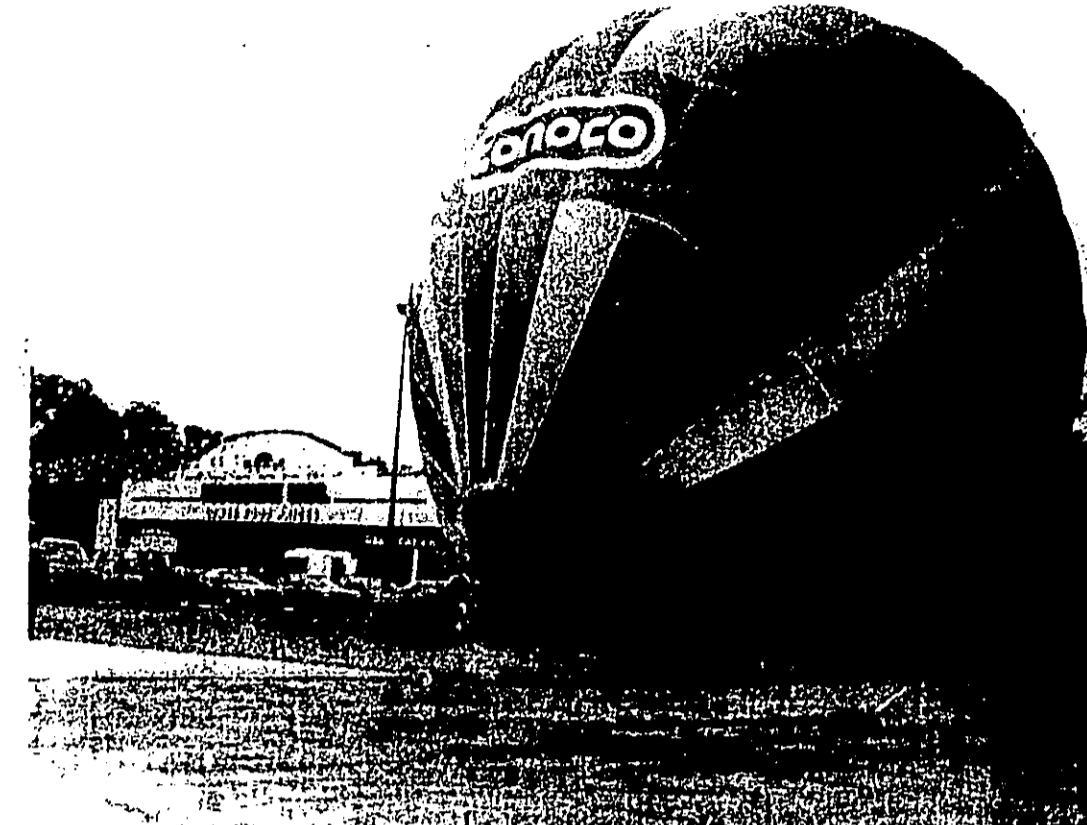

Check out charities before giving

WOODVILLE — As the holiday season and year-end tax decisions approach, giving to charities may be higher on your list of things to do. Giving, like any other money use, can have different rates of return. These national resources can help you know which ones are worthy of your donation.

The American Institute of Philanthropy (AIP) publishes the Giver's Charity Rating Guide (\$3). To get a copy, write to AIP, 4579 Laclede Ave., Suite E17, St. Louis, MO 63108. They judge solely on financial information reported annually to the IRS and audited financial statements. Rating of charities A to F are based on:

- The percentage of total expenses spent on the group's charitable purposes. AIP believes 60 percent or more of their total expenses for the year should be for charitable purposes.
- The cost to raise \$100. AIP says up to \$35 would be the maximum cost for raising \$100.
- Reserve budget. How long could a charity continue to operate at current levels without raising any more money? If a group has more than three years of operating funds available, AIP gives it a lower grade. Groups with funds to last five years get an F.

Other sources you could check for similar information are: National Charities Information Bureau (NCIB), The Wise Giving Guide (single copies free), 19 Union Square West, Dept. 326 New York, NY 10003; Council of Better Business Bureaus' Philanthropic Advisory Service; Give But Give Wisely, (\$2 plus self-addressed, stamped envelope) 4300 Wilson Blvd., Suite 800 Arlington, VA 22203.

When a charity approaches you or even when you plan to write a check to a charity you have given to for years, their clothing sizes. This helps avoid returns.

- Have a place to keep all receipts for gift purchases, in case you need to return items.
- Consider giving gift certificates or money. This works especially well for children other than your own whose sizes, interests and other gifts you may not know when you're shopping. They can take advantage of year-end sales and avoid being stuck with items they already own or can't use.
- Look at unusual places. Grocery stores, museums, book stores, craft shows, and mail-order catalogs for a wide range of price and types of gifts that meet the wide range of needs on your list.
- Allow at least three weeks for mail.
