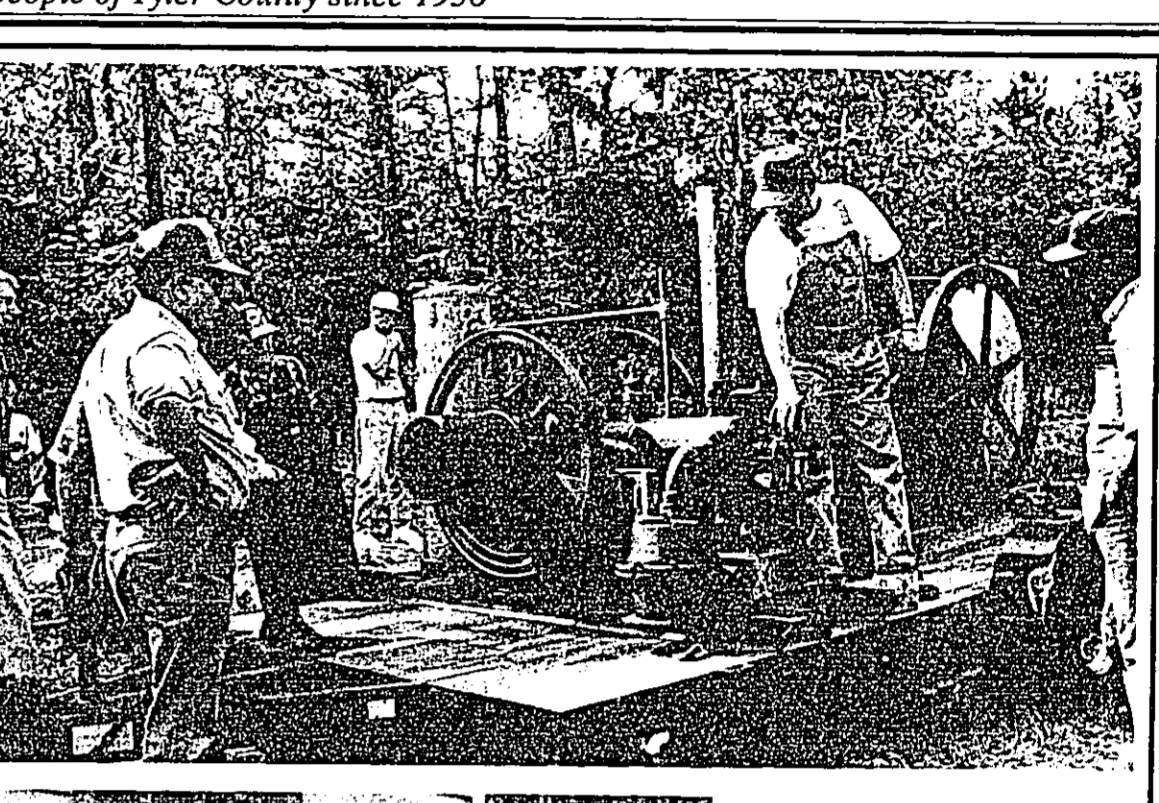

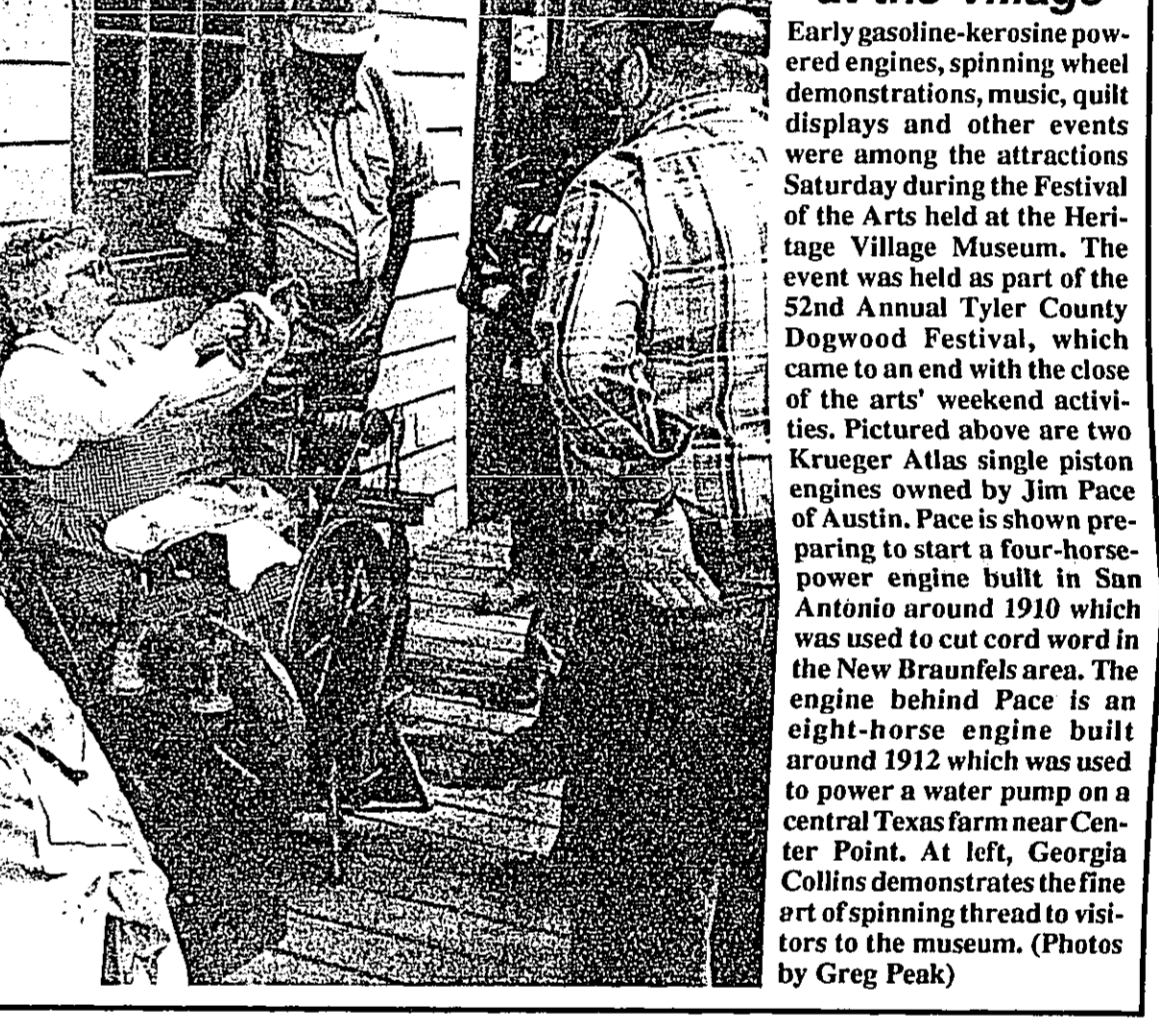

Tyler County sales tax income inches upward

AUSTIN — Revenue generated by the sales tax for Tyler County continued to climb steadily last year, rising by more than 1 percent over the amount generated one year earlier. According to a report issued by State Comptroller John Sharp, the county government's payment from its 5 percent sales tax during March totaled \$1,729,78, which represented only a \$22,653 increase from the \$1,707,13 check issued in March 1994.

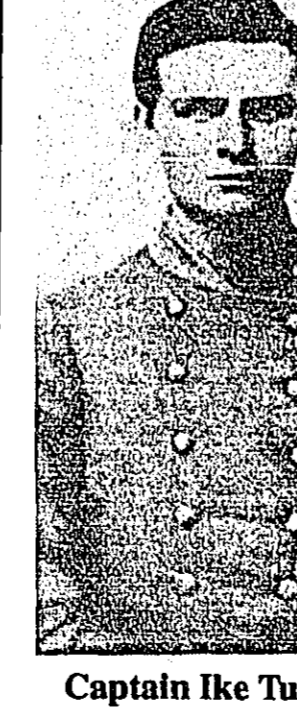
Blakeney to defend 'liars' title

Re-burial of Civil War veteran planned April 15

LIVINGSTON — On Saturday, April 15, exactly 132 years after a Union sniper's bullet claimed his life, Capt. Ike Newton Moreland Turner will return "home" to be buried with other members of his family at the I.A.S. Turner cemetery in Polk County.

Turner was initially laid to rest in a family cemetery on the Georgia plantation where he was born on April 3, 1839, but efforts by the newly organized Ike Turner Camp of the Sons of Confederate Veterans have resulted in the fulfillment of his dying wish, that he be buried near his mother.

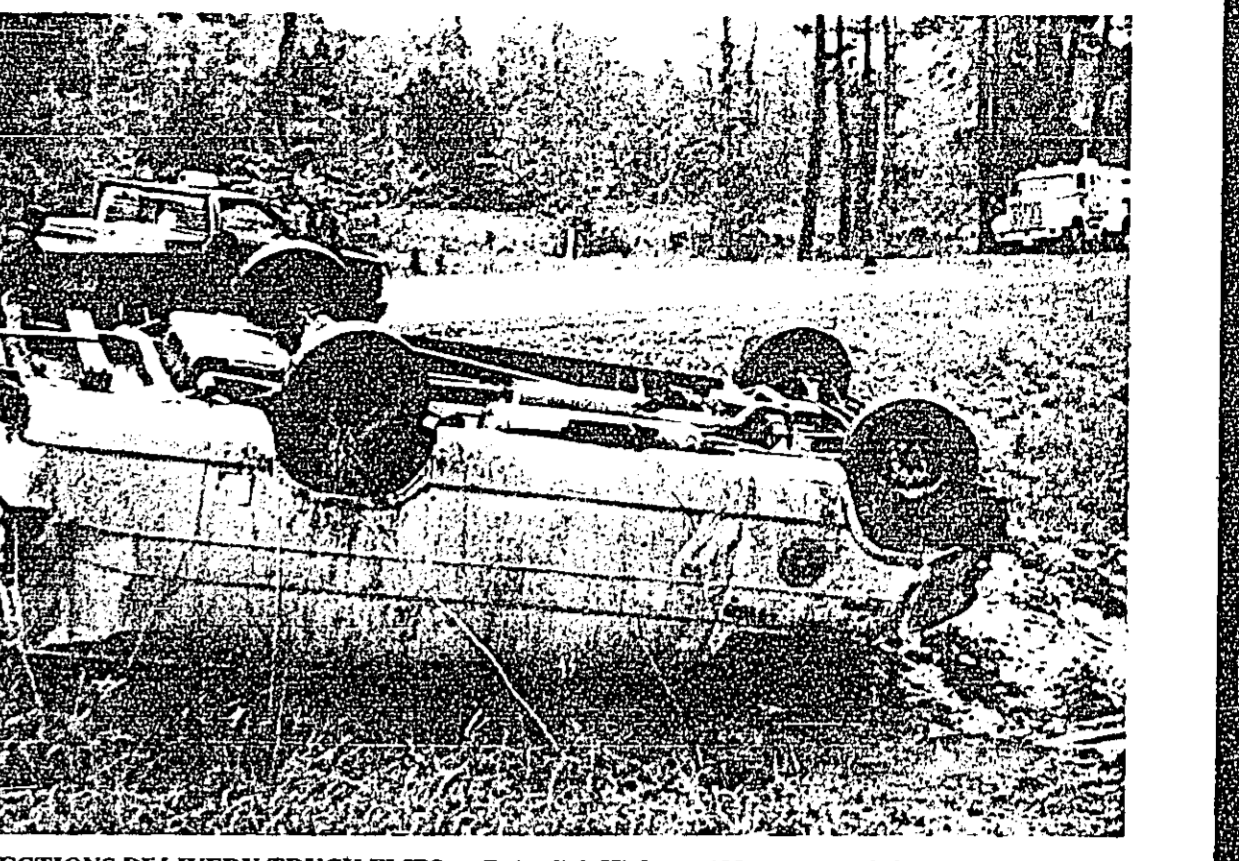

The stories he told of Texas and Mexico as well as the war must have left an impression on young Ike. After he had completed his studies in the schools of America, he entered the Georgia Military Institute at Marietta. Just before his senior year, his father sent the 19-year-old to Texas to oversee his land there. A year or so earlier, Joseph had bought out his partner's interest in the Polk County property, clearing the way for development and settlement.

Company organized Shortly after the family moved to Texas, the country was at war with itself and Texas joined those states which had succeeded from the Union. In late spring 1861, men of Texas began to organize themselves for the inevitable fight that they were sure would be over in time to make it home for Christmas.

Like almost every able-bodied man in Polk County, Ike and his uncle, Robert W. Hubert, applied to the state authorities for permission to form a group of mounted artillery for service in Virginia.

Joseph Turner went to Galveston and procured two six-pound cannons for Polk County's artillery, in which Ike had been elected captain.

"The program is set to get underway at the reservation at about 11 a.m. Friday and anyone who needs transportation to and from the reservation is welcome to ride with us," Sumner said.

"We are pleased that these educational innovations will benefit not only children from the reservations but all of the children in these school districts," said Frances Battise, Tribal Council treasurer.

The project was also endorsed by Larry Morning Star, acting executive director of the Intertribal Council of Houston, whose clinic serves 16,000 patients in an eight-county district including Galveston and Harris counties.

"This fiber optic connection will be of great assistance to us," said Richard McInnis, director of University Relations and Development at the university, said that while the fiber optic network is being installed, which will take an estimated 18 months, funding is also being sought for educational and cultural elements of the project.

One such element is a plan to preserve and archive the Alabama and Coushatta languages using audio and video tapes and multi-media including CD-ROM technology.

The men in the outfit trained for artillery through the summer of 1861, but in August they were informed that the Army of Northern Virginia had an overabundance of artillery. Rather than wait, Ike gave up the cannons and reformed his senior year, his father sent the 19-year-old to Texas to oversee his land there.

Under his guidance, the company became polished soldiers, notorious for their perfect drill order under fire, whether advancing or retreating. Turner participated in every march and battle of the brigade up to his death. He never missed an engagement, even after he was wounded in battle twice, first on May 31, 1862 at Seven Pines, Va., and then on Aug. 30, 1862 at the Second Manassas (Second Bull Run) in Virginia.

In the spring of 1862, the Texans were given a new commander, John Bell Hood, and from that point they were a part of "Hood's Texas Brigade."

At the Battle of Malvern Hill, he successfully planned and led a rear assault on an artillery battery that was severely damaging Confederate lines. Another tribute to his leadership came on the nighttime march to Manassas. Company K was ordered to advance along the railroad tracks.

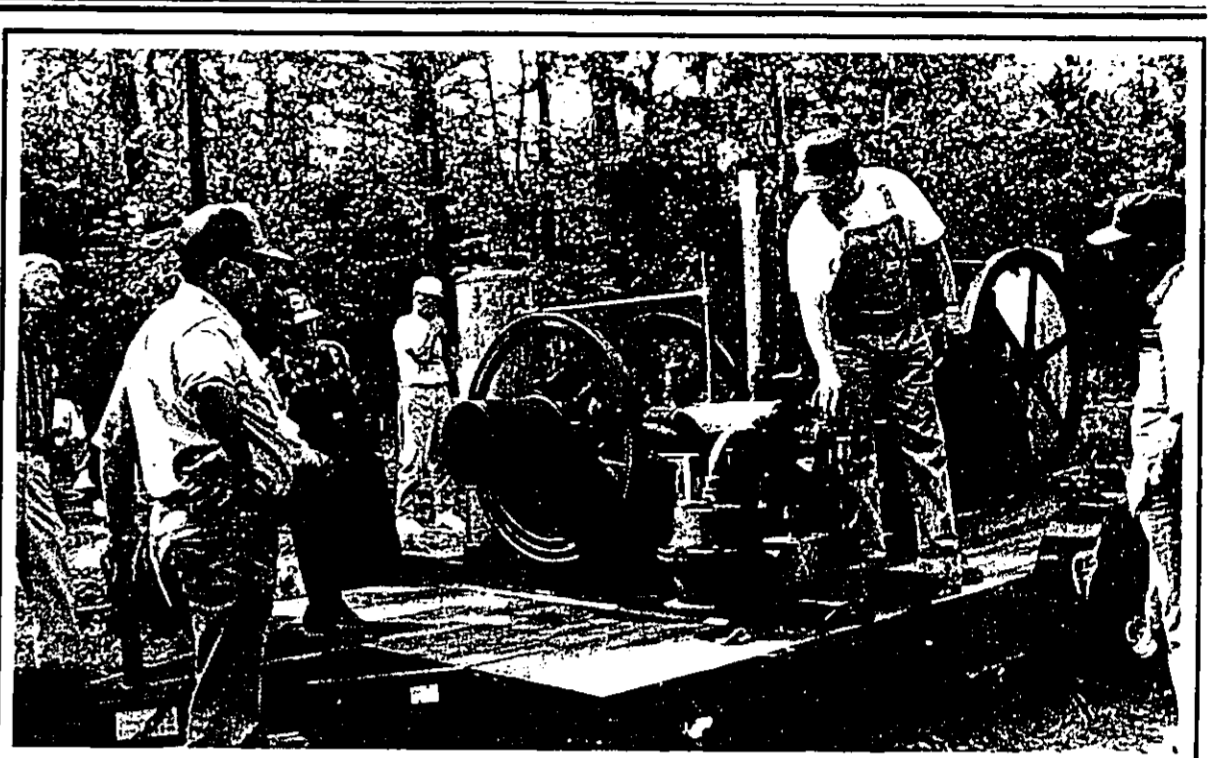

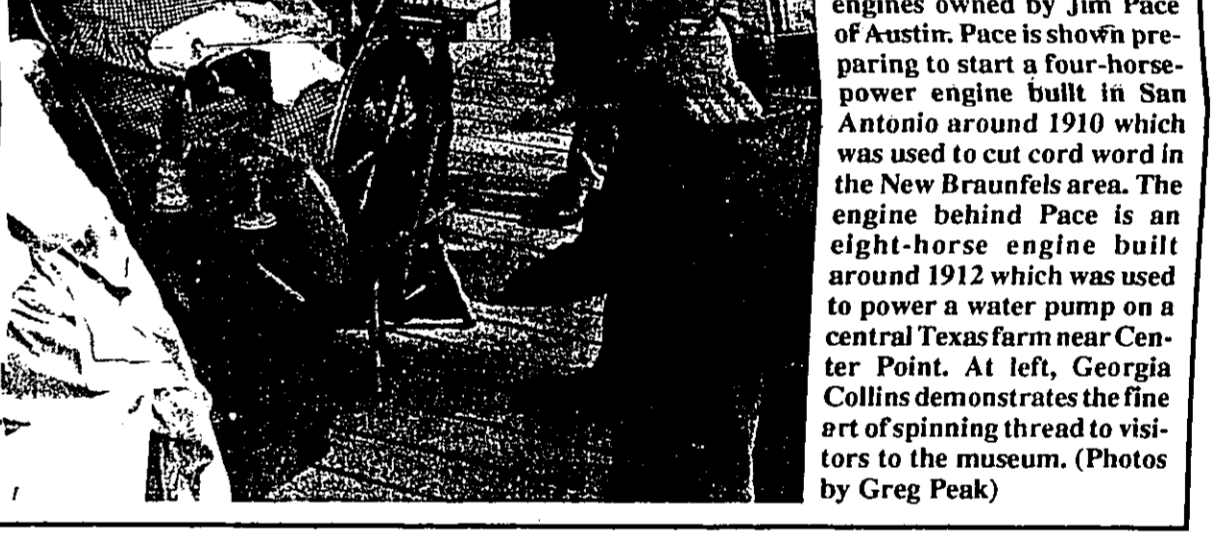

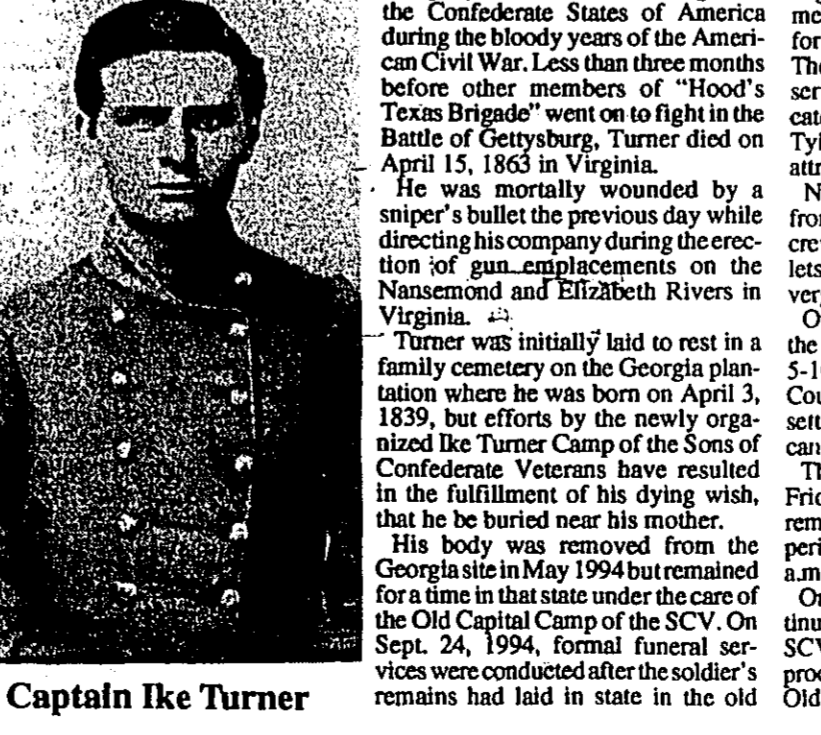

Less than three months before other members of "Hood's Texas Brigade" went on to fight in the Battle of Gettysburg, Turner died on April 15, 1863 in Virginia... He was mortally wounded by a sniper's bullet the previous day while directing his company during the execution of gun emplacements on the Nansmond and Elizabeth Rivers in Virginia.

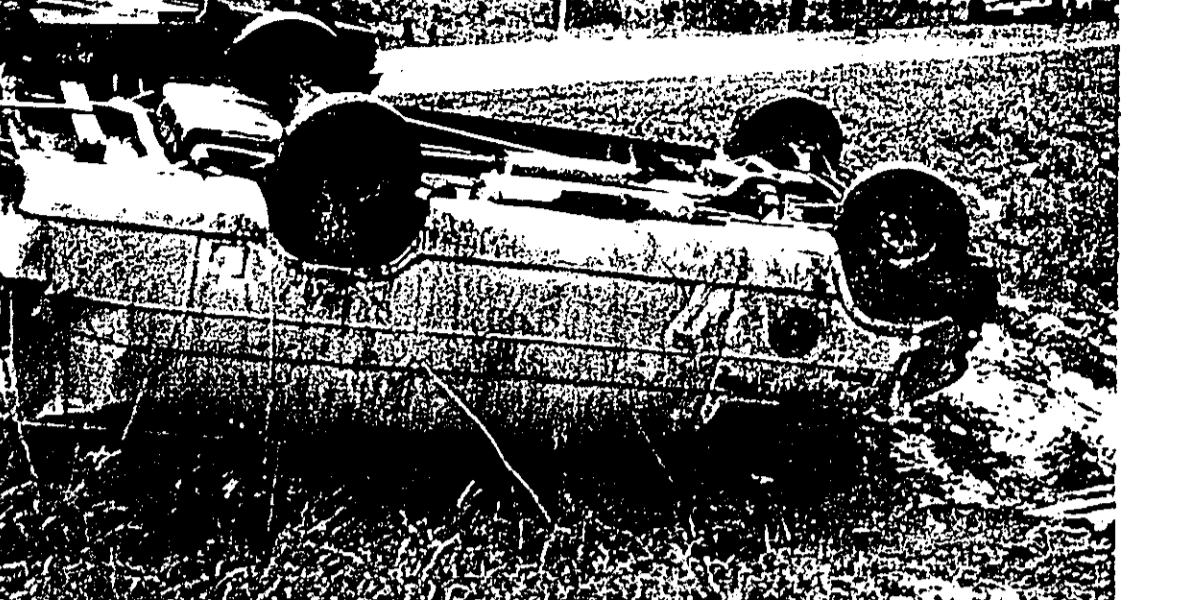
