

Management agreement partnership formed by Champion, TPWD

AUSTIN—A precedent-setting partnership between the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) and Champion International Corporation will pave the way for a unique study designed to enhance wildlife and environmental diversity on 50,000 acres of bottomland hardwood forests owned by Champion in East Texas. The agreement was announced in April at a signing ceremony in Lufkin by TPWD Executive Director Andrew Sanson and William P. Krick, general manager of Champion's Texas Forest Resources Division. Sanson said because a vast majority of land in Texas is privately owned,

Champion's partnership with TPWD addresses the utilization of our state's natural resources in a high priority for the Department. The partnership is designed to produce a management plan to create and maintain optimum biodiversity, species richness, and benefits to wildlife while providing a source of fiber for the production of paper and other forest products. "Under this partnership, we will jointly implement management strategies which strike a balance between fiber production and maintaining the high level of biodiversity and species richness associated with bottomland

ecosystems," said Krick. The agreement will remain in force as long as Champion owns the lands, said Krick. It will not affect current leases with hunting clubs and other landowners. "We are excited and enthusiastic about the opportunity to develop new management guidelines for these essential lands," said Sanson. "And, we hope the partnership with Champion will lead to additional partnerships with other hardwood ecosystem owners in Texas." He said expanding human populations have increased the demand for products, space, water and recreational areas, leading to a strain on hardwood bottomland resources. For example, more than 600,000 acres formerly in bottomland hardwood habitat now live under water in Texas as permanent reservoirs. The demand for hardwood timber, both for domestic use and foreign export, is also at an all-time high. The 50,000 acres - part of Champion's ownership of a million acres of forestland in East Texas - represent the company's total ownership of bottomland hardwood areas. The 50,000 acres are in Angelina, Houston, Cherokee, Panola, Nacogoches, Polk, Tyler and Hardin counties. Most of the lands are along the Neches River. The 50,000-acre project represents the largest block of bottomland land involved in a joint state/private agreement. For some time, we have felt there was a need to structure the forest management of our hardwood bottomlands in a special manner to serve a greater diversity of interests," said Krick. He said Champion first approached TPWD about a cooperative agreement in 1994.



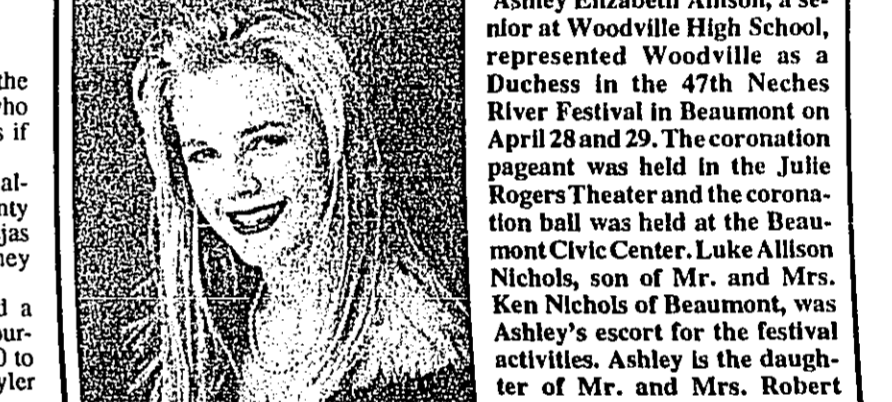

DETCOG to consider grants

JASPER — Directors of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments have given their support to four grant applications to be considered for approval by federal and state funding agencies. The applications were approved by the DETCOG board at Center following a favorable review by the Grants Application Review Committee. The four requests totaled \$1,380,800. The largest grant, \$517,800, will be sought by the Nacogoches Treatment Center for a three-year program to expand vocational services for 195 to 225 persons with severe disabilities in Nacogoches, Angelina and Houston counties. The application is being submitted to the U. S. Department of Education. A second grant of \$490,000 will be sought by the Five Way Water Supply Corporation to build a new water plant consisting of a 50,000 gallon ground storage tank and a 5,000 gallon pressure tank with booster pumps. The system will serve the Sarda community. The grant is being sought from Rural Economic and Community Development. A grant for \$300,000 is being sought from the Health Resources and Services Administration by the San Augustine County/City Hospital District for a demonstration project to improve the elder health status in a poor, medically underserved rural area where 35 percent of the population is over 54 years of age. A grant for \$73,000 will be sought by Nacogoches County for a program for delinquent and at-risk youth. The project will offer academics and/or GED preparation for those who have been expelled from schools for disciplinary reasons and for those who have stopped attending any type of educational program. The application is being submitted to the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's office.



When the Tyler County Heritage Society bought Heritage Village, Clara and Gene became active members. 

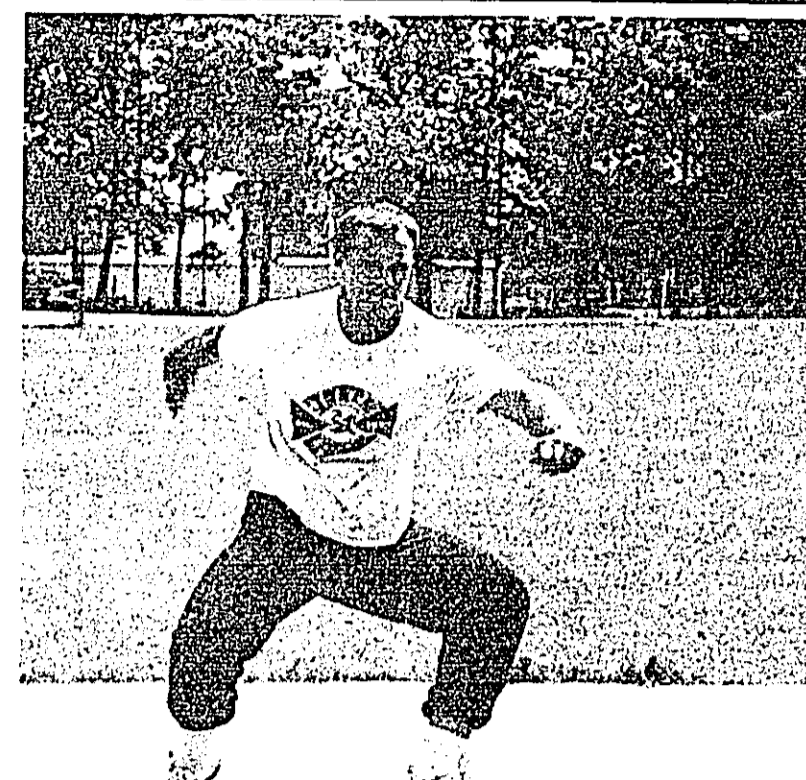

Texas Parks & Wildlife to search for rare bats in East Texas

JASPER — For about two weeks, beginning April 26, Biologist Peggy Homer and her volunteer assistants will be setting nets across the roads and trails of Martin Dies Jr. State Park west of Jasper.

The team is looking for two rare bats, the Southeastern myotis bat and Rafinesque's big-eared bat, which are thought to live in hollow trees of East Texas bottomland hardwood forests.

"These bats live in caves in other parts of their range, but because there are no caves in this part of Texas, we believe they are using old trees for roosts," said Homer, a mammal specialist with the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department.

The two bat species are among the 32 different kinds of bats that call Texas home, and are among the predators of night-flying insects. Bats like these are known to consume more than 2,000 insects each night.

These small bats, each of which weigh less than a half ounce, will be caught with mist nets, which look like giant hair nets. Each bat will be weighed, measured and examined to determine if females are pregnant or nursing young before being released.

Children feel guilt during parents' divorce

HOUSTON — "It's all my fault," "I'm sorry," and "I love you" are common phrases that children hear during their parents' divorce. A family psychologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston says parents can take away the guilt.

"Children tend to blame themselves for their parents' divorce," said Dr. James Bray, an associate professor of family medicine at Baylor. "Many parents don't want to discuss the changes that divorce brings because they're afraid of hurting the children."

In some cases, the stress of divorce causes some younger children to revert back to infancy, Bray says. "It's not uncommon for an older toddler who is being potty trained for months to suddenly wet the bed," he said.

Although many children eventually endure the stress of divorce, Bray says parents should not expect their children to "come around" overnight. "It takes one to two years for children to adjust to divorce," he said. "Family transition is the problem for children and not the divorce."

Bray offers the following advice for divorced parents:

- Strive for stability in your child's life. If possible, avoid changing schools or moving to another city.
- Allow the non-residential parent to stay active in the child's life.
- The fewer changes, the better. Younger children gain strength from maintain-
- The predictability of their old schedules.
- Avoid arguing in front of your child. Try writing notes to each other. Do not use your child to communicate with each other.
- Expect to repeat information about the divorce. Younger children tend to ask the same questions.
- Let your child know that divorce is an adult problem. Be sensitive to your child's anger. Children do not want to see their parents separate.
- Divorce can affect a child's performance in school and friendships. If the child's grades and conduct score drop significantly, seek professional counseling.
- Parents and children fare better when they get support," Bray said.
- Go to other family members or get involved in a support group at a church or other community group.

Bray says the older the child, the more important it is for parents to discuss the situation with them. The "Kids ages six to 11 often blame themselves. But older children can discern what's going on," he said. "Four and five year olds need lots of reassurance since they can't understand the details."

Management agreement partnership formed by Champion, TPWD

AUSTIN—A precedent-setting partnership between the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) and Champion International Corporation will pave the way for a unique study designed to enhance wildlife and environmental diversity on 30,000 acres of bottomland hardwood forests owned by Champion in East Texas.

The agreement was announced in April at a signing ceremony in Lufkin by TPWD executive director Andrew Sansom and William P. Krack, general manager of Champion's Texas Forest Resources Division.

Sansom said because a vast majority of land in Texas is privately owned,

partnerships such as the one with Champion addressing wise utilization of our state's natural resources are a high priority for the department.

The partnership is designed to produce a management plan to create and maintain optimum biodiversity, species richness, and beauty to the wetlands while providing a source of fiber for the production of paper and other forest products.

"Under this partnership, we will jointly implement management strategies which strike a balance between fiber production and maintaining the high level of biodiversity and species richness associated with bottomland ecosystems," said Krack.

The agreement will remain in force as long as Champion owns the lands, said Krack. It will not affect current leases with hunting clubs and other leaseholders.

"We are excited and enthusiastic about the opportunity to develop new management guidelines for these essential lands," said Sansom. "And, we hope the partnership with Champion will lead to additional partnerships with other hardwood ecosystem owners in Texas."

He said expanding human populations have increased the demand for products, space, water and recreational areas, leading to a strain on hardwood bottomland resources. For example, more than 600,000 acres formerly in bottomland hardwood habitat are now under water in Texas as permanent reservoirs.

The demand for hardwood timber, both for domestic use and foreign export, is also at an all-time high.

The 50,000 acres - part of Champion's ownership of a million acres of forestland in East Texas - represent the company's total ownership of bottomland hardwood areas.

The 50,000 acres are in Angelina, Houston, Cherokee, Panola, Nacogdoches, Polk, Tyler and Hardin counties.

Most of the lands are along the Neches River.

The 50,000 acres represent the largest block of bottomland land involved in a joint state/private agreement.

"For some time, we have felt there was a need to structure the forest management of our hardwood bottomlands in a special manner to have a greater diversity of interests," said Krack. He said Champion first approached TPWD about a cooperative agreement in 1994.

A breast exam and mammogram can help find cancer early.

When cancer is found early, a woman has a better chance of successful treatment.

The Texas Department of Health offers free breast exams, including a breast exam and mammogram, for women who meet age and income requirements. To receive services at no cost, a woman must be age 50 or older and meet income guidelines. For example, a single woman can make up to \$14,646 a year and receive the free service. If a woman in a family of two can make up to \$19,582 a year and receive free services.

DETCOG to consider grants

JASPER—Directors of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments have given their support to four grant applications to be considered for approval by federal and state funding agencies.

The applications were approved by the DETCOG board at Center following a favorable review by the Grants Application Review Committee. The four requests totaled \$1,380,800.

The largest grant, \$517,800, will be sought by the Nacogdoches Treatment Center for a three-year program to expand vocational services for 195 to 225 persons with severe disabilities in Nacogdoches, Angelina and Houston counties. The application is being submitted to the U. S. Department of Education.

A grant for \$490,000 will be sought by the Five Way Water Supply Corporation to build a new water plant consisting of a 50,000 gallon ground storage tank and a 5,000 gallon pressure tank with booster pumps. The system will serve the Sardin community. The grant is being sought from Rural Economic and Community Development. A grant for \$300,000 is being sought from the Health Resources and Services Administration by the San Augustine County/City Hospital District for a demonstration project to improve the elder health status in a poor, medically underserved rural area where 35 percent of the population is over 54 years of age.

A grant for \$73,000 will be sought by Nacogdoches County for a program for delinquent and at-risk youth. The project will offer academics and/or GED preparation for those who have been expelled from schools for disciplinary reasons and for those who have stopped attending any type of educational program. The application is being submitted to the Criminal Justice Division of the Governor's office.

Councilman Ken Weaver was the only "no" vote. Councilman Tom Knapp was absent from the meeting.

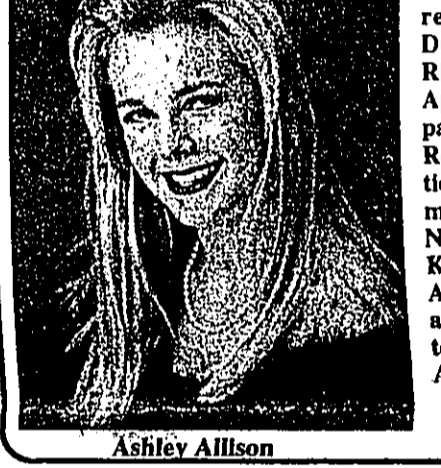

LUFKIN—In an effort to shatter the stigma associated with mental illness, the Burke Center, formerly Deep East Texas Regional MHHM, is observing Mental Health Month during May.

"When people think of mental illness, they conjure up the image of a person tortured by the demons only he sees or the voices no one else hears," said Susan Rushing, chief executive officer. "This, of course, is the stereotype of mental illnesses that people have developed from movies and literature."

According to Rushing, the fears surrounding mental illness can be eliminated if people are more informed. "One of our major goals is to help people understand a little bit more about mental illness," she said. "It is an issue for all of us."

The National Institute of Mental Health estimates that one out of three Americans will suffer from some form of mental illness in any six-month period.

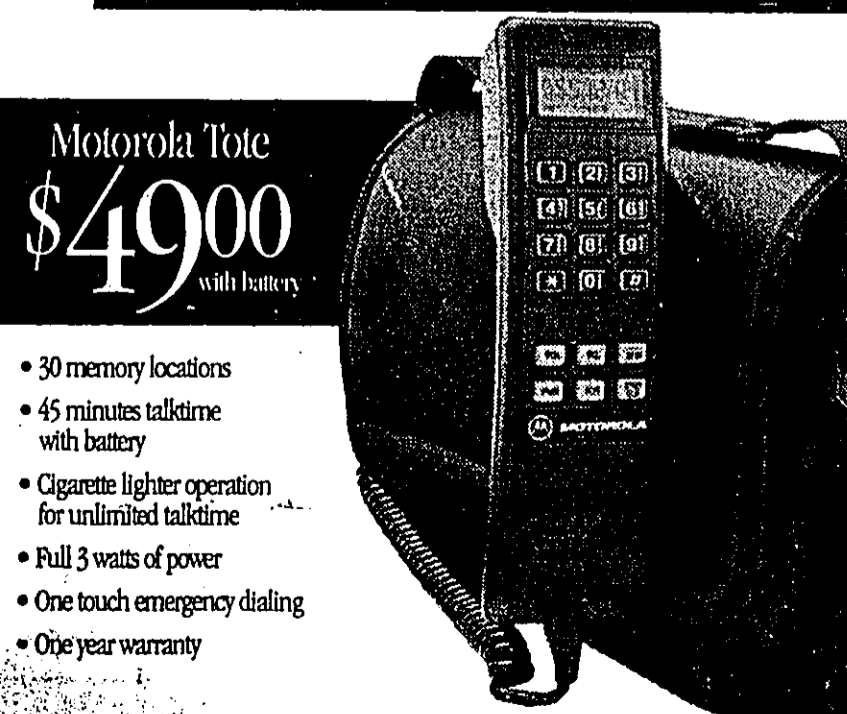
"Mental illnesses affect people of all ages, from infants to the elderly. They occur in all income groups, in urban and rural areas and in all religions," she said.

With appropriate treatment, the vast majority of mental illnesses are effectively cured or controlled. "Treatment, which often combines medication and psychotherapy, can effectively stop acute symptoms in 80 percent of those suffering from major illnesses."

"People suffering from mental illness often quietly bear its pain without ever acting the part so many people expect to see," said Rushing. "The greater tragedy is that only one in five of those suffering from a mental disorder actually seek treatment."

Children feel guilt during parents' divorce

HOUSTON — "It's all my fault."
Divorced parents often hear those
words from their children. A family
psychologist at Baylor College of
Medicine in Houston says parents can
take away the guilt.
"Children tend to blame themselves
for their parents' divorce," said Dr.
James Bray, an associate professor of
family medicine at Baylor. "Many par-
ents don't want to discuss the changes
that divorce brings because they're
afraid of hurting the children."
Most children will have a lot of ques-
tions. Both parents should sit down
with them and discuss the divorce,
according to Bray.
"Share information with your chil-
dren about the divorce, but don't get
into specifics," Bray said. "Tell them
even though you can't live together as
husband and wife, you still care for
them."
Bray says the older the child, the
more important it is for parents to
explain their situation.
"Kids ages six to 11 often blame
themselves. But older children can
discern what's going on," he said.
"Four and five year olds need lots of
reassurance since they can't under-
stand the details."
In some cases, the stress of divorce
causes some younger children to re-
vert back to infancy, Bray says.
"It's not uncommon for an older
toddler who's been potty trained for
months to suddenly wet the bed," he
said.
Although many children eventually
endure the stress of divorce, Bray says
parents should not expect their chil-
dren to "come around" overnight.
"It takes one to two years for chil-
dren to adjust to divorce," he said.
"Family transition is the problem for
children and not the divorce."
Bray offers the following advice for
divorced parents:
• Strive for stability in your child's
schools or moving to another city.
Allow the non-residential parent to
stay active in the child's life. The
fewer changes, the better. Younger
children gain strength from main-
taining the predictability of their old sched-
ules.
• Avoid arguing in front of your
child. Try writing notes to each other.
Do not use your child to communicate
with each other.
• Be expected to repeat information
about the divorce. Younger children
tend to ask the same questions.
• Let your child know that divorce is
an adult problem. Be sensitive to your
child's anger. Children do not want to
see their parents separate.
• Divorce can affect a child's perfor-
mance in school and friendships. If
the child's grades and conduct score
drop significantly, seek professional
counseling.
"Parents and children fare better
when they get support," Bray said.
"Go to other family members or get
involved in a support group at church
or other community group."
