

Property tax exemptions available for disabled vets

WOODVILLE — "Veterans with a service-connected disability may reduce their property taxes in 1995 by filling out a simple exemption form at the Tyler County Appraisal District office," Chief Appraiser Eddie Chalmers said.

"Any eligible person who has not received this exemption must apply by May 1," Chalmers said. "But, if you received the exemption in 1994, you do not have to re-apply in 1995."
An applicant may claim the ex-

A veteran's percentage of service-connected disability determines the size of the exemption. The exemption ranges from a \$1,500 to a \$3,000 deduction from the veteran's property value.

 • a disabled veteran;
 • a surviving spouse of a deceased disabled veteran, as long as the spouse remains unmarried;

 • a surviving spouse of a person killed while on active duty, whether the spouse has remarried or not at application time; and
 • a surviving minor child of a personkilled while on active duty, if the child is both under 18 and

"Night-time bedwetting is the most common," Roth said, "and there are a variety of ways to deal with the prob-Medications are one avenue used by physicians. They include DDAVP na-

sal spray and imipramine, both available only by prescription. The nasal spray concentrates the urine and decreases the amount of nocturnal urine, Roth said. It has proven very successful for many chil dren, working in as many as 70 percent of cases.

The other drug, an antidepressan called imipramine, appears to help by changing the child's sleep cycle and by exerting a slight effect on the blad der and the bladder sphincter. It is effective 40 percent of the time. Also used by physicians to control bedwetting is a device called the enuresis alarm, Roth said. It senses urine, letting the child know when an "accident" has occurred and prompting the child to get out of bed and head for the bathroom. "The device is basically a behavior

modification system," said Roth, who supervises the urology sections of two clinics at Texas Children's Hospital, also in Houston, "It 'conditions' the child to be more aware of when urination is about to occur so he or she can act before it is too late." Roth urges parents of bedwetters to be patient with their children. "Parents should remember that the problem is even more distressing for

The early milk or "foremilk' quenches thirst and provides calories, fat and important proteins and nutrients. The "hindmilk", released later, contains more fat, satisfies hunger and provides additional calories and nutrients necessary for growth. "Almost all babies adjust their intake so they get the nutrients they need regardless of the mother's milk fat

content," she said. "This is a marvelous way nature employs checks and balances. Babies consume more milk if the fat content is low. If milk fat content is high, they



WOODVILLE — "Veterans with a service-connected disability may reduce their property taxes in 1995 by filling out a simple exemption form at the Tyler County Appraisal District office," Chief Appraiser Eddie Chalmers said.

'A veteran's percentage of service-connected disability determines the size of the exemption. The exemption ranges from a \$1,500 to a \$3,000 deduction from the veteran's property value.

It is effective 40 percent of the time. Also used by physicians to control bedwetting is a device called the

enuresis alarm, Roth said. It senses

urine, letting the child know when an

"accident" has occurred and prompting the child to get out of bed and head for the bathroom, "The device is basically a behaviormodification system," said Roth, who supervises the urology sections of two clinics at Texas Children's Hospital, also in Houston, "It 'conditions' the child to be more aware of when urination is about to occur so he or she can act before it is too late.

Roth urges parents of bedwetters to be patient with their children. "Parents should remember that the problem is even more distressing for the child," he said, "If the child could stop wetting alone, he or she most certainly would. Children afflicted with enuresis deserve medical attention, and it is the parents' job to see that the help is made available.
