Children may not be getting enough fiber

HOUSTON — Children may be getting enough dietary fiber, says a nutritionist at the USDA's Children's Nutrition Research Center. "The U.S. diet is highly refined, and overprocessing removes much of the natural fiber that children and adults need," said Janice Stuff, a research instructor at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. Fiber or roughage is an essential part of a healthy diet. It aids in digestion, may reduce cholesterol, and protect against colon cancer. Fiber can also correct constipation, a common medical complaint in children. Stuff says that a 40 pound child needs 10 grams of fiber daily, compared to 15-20 grams for teens and 25-35 grams for adults. "A child can get 10 grams of fiber each day by eating a sandwich using whole wheat bread, a medium apple, a pear, a 1/2 cup serving of vegetables and a 1/2 cup serving of beans or lentils," she said. Parents concerned that children are not getting enough fiber can make a few simple additions to their child's menu. Stuff provides the following suggestions: Add raisins or berries to whole-grain cereals. Use whole-wheat flour to pancake mix. Serve fresh fruit, such as pears or apples with the skin. Offer nutcases and bananas. Serve chili with beans. Make bean nachos using baked tortilla chips. Stir granola or berries into plain yogurt. Serve vegetables such as cooked corn, green beans, broccoli or carrots fiber rich. Add vegetables to pizza toppings and spaghetti sauces. Keep carrot sticks on hand for snacks. Offer popcorn as a snack food. Parents should increase amounts of dietary fiber slowly and encourage their child to drink plenty of water. "If the body does not get fiber, it can cause gas and stomach cramps at first," she said. Stuff urges parents not to become too zealous about fiber. "Remember, a child's requirement is only one-third as much as an adult, and fiber should be balanced with other nutritional sources. Too much fiber can cause children to feel 'full' before they get all the calories they need," she said. Stuff says there is evidence that too much fiber can prevent absorption of needed minerals, such as calcium, iron and zinc. "When children learn to balance their diet with high-fiber foods, they are beginning good habits that will offset healthy benefits over a lifetime," she said.

## Homemaker Hints

### Keep home-canned foods safe to eat

Taking certain food safety precautions is extremely important in keeping home-canned foods safe to eat. Unfortunately most cases of botulism, a serious food-borne illness that can cause death, come from home-canned foods. While preventing chances of food-borne illness is important, those who spend time and effort canning foods do not appreciate losing them to food spoilage.

Follow the recommended canning procedures to control the processes and micro-organisms that can cause spoilage and contamination.

The first step is to choose only fresh produce that is free of signs of deterioration like bruises, soft spots or other blemishes. Canning does not improve the quality of food. Produce should be canned as quickly after gathering as possible.

Proper equipment and procedures are essential. Only standard canning jars should be used. Jars should be clean and free of nicks or scratches. If a product is to be processed less than 10 minutes, the jars should be sterilized by boiling for 10 minutes. New lids are required for each jar to assure an adequate seal. Metal screw bands can be reused if they are free of dents or rust.

Use only researched and tested recommendations for time and temperature processing. The processing time and method depend on the type of food. A pressure canner is required for most vegetables and meats to reach the high temperatures required to kill harmful bacteria. Dial gauge pressure canners need to be tested for accuracy each year and the dial replaced if necessary. A boiling water bath can be used for foods such as fruits and tomatoes because of their high acid content. Other methods of canning such as in the oven or microwave are not safe.

Do not try to create your own recipe or alter ingredients in a tested recipe. Processing recommendations have been tested only for the specified ingredients and may be unsafe if altered.

The recommended head space in jars is important to allow for expansion of liquid or food in the jar and adequate heat penetration during processing. Too little head space can cause the food to bubble up and prevent a seal.

Jars of food that do not seal properly may be saved if discovered and corrected no more than 24 hours after processing. The food can be refrigerated and used within a few days, frozen or reprocessed. Freezing and reprocessing do, however, result in a softer texture and reduced nutritional value. To reprocess, remove the lid and check the sealing surface of the jar for nicks or scratches that may have prevented the seal. If necessary, place the food in a new jar. Add a lid treated according to manufacturer's instructions and screw band. Reprocess the full time given in directions.

Proper storage of canned products is important to prevent deterioration or spoilage. Foods should be stored in a clean, cool, dark, dry place. The best storage temperature is 50 degrees Fahrenheit to 70 F. Foods stored in a hot place will lose quality fast and may spoil. Keep canned goods dry to prevent corrosion of metal lids, broken seals and spoilage. For best storage, use within one year.

Signs that indicate spoilage include a broken seal, bulging lid, leaking jar, spurting liquid when jar is opened, off odor, mold, sliminess or improperly colored food. In these cases, the safest policy is "when in doubt, throw it out."

Recommendations for processing and proper use of canning equipment can be obtained from the Tyler County Extension Office.

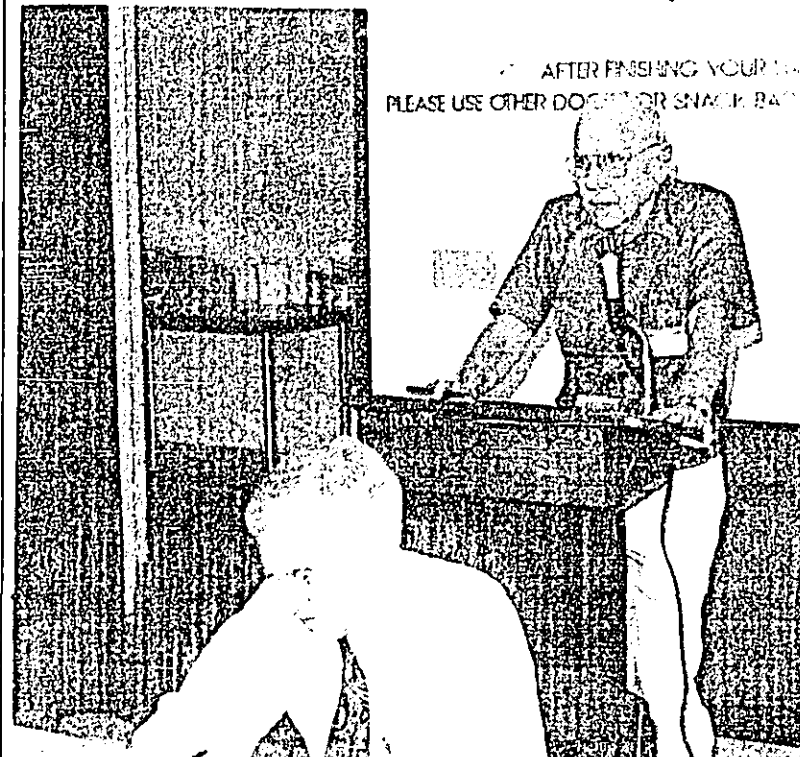

## Rockets=Team= Success

I sure hope the Houston Rockets win another NBA championship. I hope they win, not only because they are from Houston and they are the defending champions and all, but because the Rockets are the best example of any TEAM in the NBA.

To be honest, I am not a big pro basketball fan. In fact, throughout the season I don't even watch them. But I got hooked on the Rockets last year during the playoffs, and I have been with them ever since. Throughout this season Houston played somewhat better than average ball, but never played like they were defending world champions. So I waited until the playoffs to see what would happen. Sure enough they have done it again, defying all odds in the process.

How have they done it? Some folks will say they are lucky. Others will point to Hakeem Olajuwon or the trade for Clyde Drexler. But when their success is all boiled down, what is left is an underrated coach and a group of talented athletes that play as a TEAM. That's right... the Houston Rockets, a group of highly paid athletes have found the formula to winning is to play as a TEAM. And putting all of that mix together is a coach whose first name reminds us of another overachiever who played at Notre Dame and whose life was eventually made a movie.

Texas Monthly had a feature story on Rudy Tomjanovich after the Rockets won the world championship last year. It gave a splendid insight of how the Houston coach thinks. His high school coach told him that he wasn't good enough to play for the team, but he ended up being a star player anyway. Same thing in college. Same thing in the pros. He overcame what other people thought, regardless of the odds. Some way, maybe by example, he has taken that "I can" attitude and developed into a "we can" attitude for the Houston Rockets.

In this day of the Dennis Rodmans, the Charles Barkleys, and yes, even the infamous Shaquille O'Neal, it is more than refreshing to see a group of players like the Rockets who put the TEAM before themselves.

It is obvious that Rodman's whole concept to basketball is that the court is his stage and he is there to play it. In one sense he is good for the game in that he brings more attention to it. But in doing so he also destroys TEAM play and harmony.

Rodman reminds me of a circus performer. They are interesting to watch, but I wouldn't trust them as far as I could throw them. And what kind of example is he for kids? ... Dyeed hair that makes him look like Bozo the clown... Tattoos all over his body that tell you he is either drunk a lot or he doesn't like the way God made him. Put all of that together and add in that he has questions about his manhood, and a role model for kids is out of the question.

And while Barkley and O'Neal are more team oriented, they still have enough showmanship to get the spotlight on them instead of it focusing on the team for which they play.

Barkley says that he is not a role model, then goes out and gets almost \$10 million worth of endorsements because, that indeed, is what he is. And while on one hand he plays hurt and sets a positive example one way, he castigates his teammates and second guesses his coach and sets a bad example on the other.

Maybe I shouldn't have added O'Neal into the same category with Rodman and Barkley, but if he doesn't watch it, in another two years or so he will be like them... unless he shuts out what the media is trying to make him to be. But there are already hints that the big "Me" has taken hold. When the Rockets play the Magic during the playoffs, look at the tattoo on O'Neal's arm. It is a Superman seal. That is what he thinks he is. In fact he said it the other day. When Christopher Reeves, the actor who became famous with his Superman portrayal, went down with a broken neck, O'Neal said that he hoped that Superman would recover soon.

Then he added that he was Superman II.

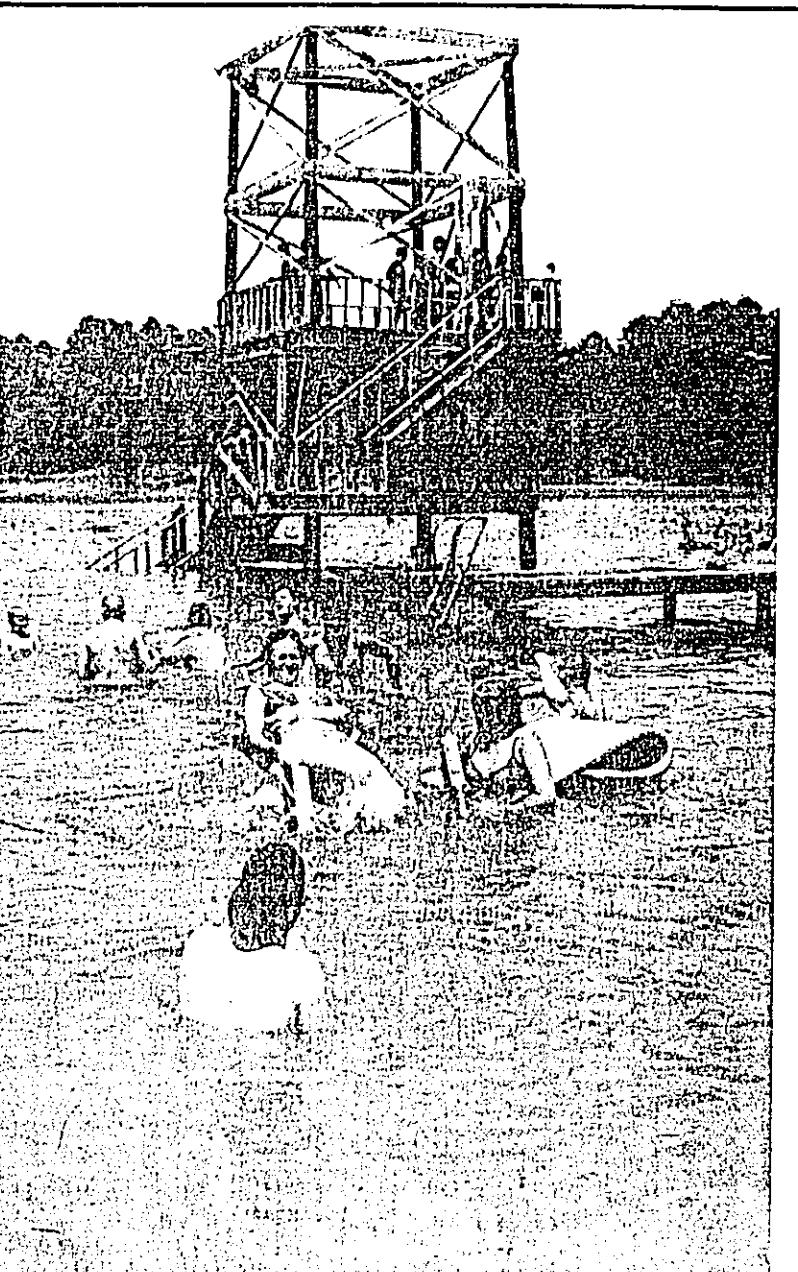
Does anyone hear that kind of talk from the Rockets? I don't think so. What is coming from the Rockets is that they play "hungry and humble." That stage setter is Olajuwon, who turned down a big endorsement contract with Nike to sign with Spaulding. Why? Because Spaulding would sell athletic shoes in the \$30-\$40 range for kids instead of the \$100 plus range that Nike does. Now THAT sounds like a role model.

And have you listened to the post game interview during the playoffs? I don't think anyone has heard any big "I"s. All the Rocket players give credit to the others. There is confidence that they can win regardless of the odds or circumstances.

I thought the halftime interview of the Rockets' Robert Horry during the Magic-Pacer game was interesting, not only by what he said, but how he was dressed. He could have worn a shirt or a ball cap with a message on it, but instead he wore a white shirt and tie. Classy. When asked about how HE was able to do all the things he has done, he put it in perspective by saying that one game he gets the job done and another game it is someone else. Again, the message that was given was that the Rockets play TEAM basketball.

Even though the Rockets won the NBA championship last year not many people across the nation have jumped on the band wagon. Why? Besides many people thinking there is nothing in Houston but mosquitoes and NASA, there is also a problem with their star players. Both Olajuwon and Drexler played college ball at the University of Houston. Olajuwon is Nigerian and speaks with an accent. Before coming to Houston, Drexler played in Portland. And in the fact that the Rockets do not promote themselves market wise like the Cowboys and you can see why they are ignored by a lot of people.

Not that I've got anything against the Magic, but here is hoping that the good guys win another one. They did it once when no one was watching. Those who watch them said it was a fluke. But if they do it this time, people should finally take notice. And what they will notice, hopefully, is that the Rockets did it because each player put the TEAM before themselves. In this day of pampered prima donnas, that is the message that needs to be sent our kids.

Children may not be getting enough fiber
HOUSTON — Children may not be getting enough dietary fiber, says a nutritionist at the USDA's Children's Nutrition Research Center.
The U.S. diet is highly refined, and overprocessing removes much of the natural fiber that children and adults need, said Janice Stull, a research instructor at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.
Fiber or roughage is an essential part of a healthy diet. It aids in digestion, may reduce cholesterol, and protect against colon cancer. Fiber can also control constipation, accumulation medical complaint in children.
Stull says a 40 pound child needs 10 grams of fiber daily, compared to 15-20 grams for teens and 25-35 grams for adults.
"A child can get 10 grams of fiber each day by eating a sandwich using whole wheat bread, a medium apple or pear, a 1/2 cup serving of vegetables and a 1/2 cup serving of beans or lentils," she said.
Parents concerned that children are not getting enough fiber can make a few simple additions to their child's menu. Stull provides the following suggestions:
• Add raisins or berries to whole-grain cereals
• Add whole-grain flour to pancake mix
• Use whole-wheat bread for toast or sandwiches
• Serve fresh fruit, such as pears or apples with the skin
• Offer nutmeats and bananas
• Serve chili with beans
• Make bean nachos using baked tortilla chips
• Stir granola or berries into plain yogurt
• Serve vegetables such as cooked corn, green beans, broccoli or carrots
• Add vegetables to pizza toppings and spaghetti sauces
• Keep carrot sticks on hand for snacks
• Offer popcorn as a snack food
Parents should increase amounts of dietary fiber slowly and encourage their child to drink plenty of water.
"If the body is not used to it, fiber can cause gas and stomach cramps at first," she said.
Stull urges parents not to become too zealous about fiber.
"Remember, a child's requirement is only one-third as much as an adult, and fiber should be balanced with other nutritional sources. Too much fiber can cause children to feel 'full' before they get all the calories they need," she said.
Stull says there is evidence that too much fiber can prevent absorption of needed minerals, such as calcium, iron and zinc.
"When children learn to balance their diet with high-fiber foods, they are beginning good habits that will offer health benefits over a lifetime," she said.

Coalition forms over Neches River issues

A group of distraught landowners from the Neches River valley organized into the Neches River Coalition because their land has been eroding away along the Neches River. Now they want to do something about it. Many of these landowners present believe that if the original plans of Congress and the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in the early 1940s, had been carried out as specified, the original plan design was to build the 23-mile long and 3-mile wide Rockland Lake and Dam Project, the group at the meeting wouldn't be facing the problems they have today.
Instead, the political influences of the 40's only authorized the San Rayburn Lake construction, and a regulating Dam "B". It was designed to control huge "slugs" of water that trundle toward the Gulf of Mexico from Rockland in inland pond the Tyler County landowners with flooding and erosion along the way. Many who were present Saturday challenged the functionality of the Dam and blamed it specifically for many of their problems especially immediately north and south of the structure which was just recently fitted with hydro-electric turbines. "Which may be flawed," said U.S. Army Corps representative Paul Rodman.
The meeting was hosted by officers from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers in Ft. Worth at the request of U.S. Congressman Charles Wilson, (D.) of Lufkin. Wilson was represented at the meeting by Shawn Davis, a political assistant.

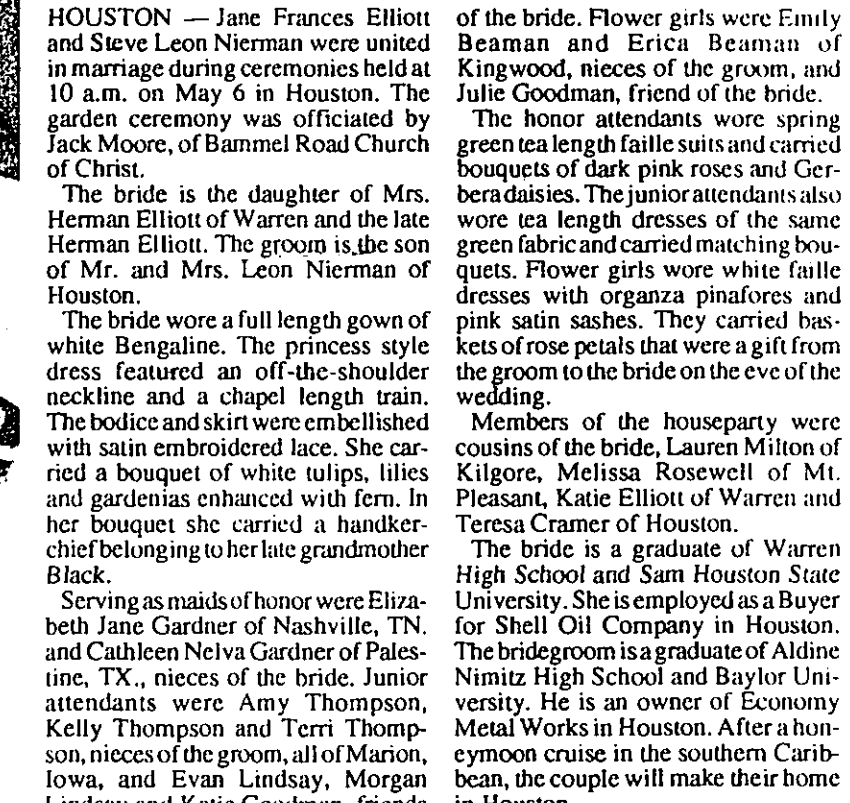

## Homemaker Hints

### Keep home-canned foods safe to eat

Taking certain food safety precautions is extremely important in keeping home canned foods safe to eat. Unfortunately most cases of botulism, a serious food-borne illness that causes death, come from home-canned foods. While preventing chances of food-borne illness is important, those who spend time and effort canning foods do not appreciate losing them to spoilage.

Follow the recommended canning procedures to control the processes and micro-organisms that can cause spoilage and contamination:

- The first step is to choose only fresh produce that is free of signs of deterioration like bruises, soft spots or other blemishes. Canning does not improve the quality of food. Produce should be canned as quickly after gathering as possible.
- Proper equipment and procedures are essential. Only standard canning jars should be used. Jars should be clean and free of nicks or scratches. If a product is to be processed less than 10 minutes, the jars need to be sterilized by boiling for 10 minutes. New lids are required for each jar to assure an adequate seal. Metal screw bands can be reused if they are free of dents or rust.
- Use only researched and tested recommendations for time and temperature processing. The processing time and method depend of the type of food. A pressure canner is required for most vegetables and meats to reach the high temperatures required to kill harmful bacteria. Dial gauge pressure canners need to be tested for accuracy each year and the dial replaced if necessary. A boiling water bath can be used for foods such as fruits and tomatoes because of their high acid content. Other methods of canning such as in the oven or microwave are not safe.
- Do not try to create your own recipe or alter ingredients in tested recipes. Processing recommendations have been tested only for the specified ingredients and may be unsafe if altered.
- The recommended head space in jars is important to allow for expansion of liquid or food in the jar and adequate heat penetration during processing. Too little head space can cause the food to bubble up and prevent a seal.
- Jars of food that do not seal properly may be saved if discovered and corrected no more than 24 hours after processing.

The food can be refrigerated and used within a few days, frozen or reprocessed. Freezing and reprocessing do, however, result in a softer texture and reduced nutritional value. To reprocess, remove the lid and check the sealing surface of the jar for nicks or scratches that may have sprung during the first processing. If necessary, place the food in a new jar. Add a lid treated according to manufacturer's instructions and screw band. Reprocess the full time given in directions.

Proper storage of canned products is important to prevent deterioration or spoilage. Foods should be stored in a clean, cool, dark, dry place. The best storage temperature is 50 degrees Fahrenheit to 70 F. Foods stored in a hot place will lose quality fast and may spoil. Keep canned goods dry to prevent corrosion of metal lids, broken seals and spoilage. For best storage, use within one year.

Signs that indicate spoilage include a broken seal, bulging lid, leaking jar, spurting liquid when jar is opened, off odor, mold, sliminess or improperly colored food. In these cases, the safest policy is "when in doubt, throw it out."

Recommendations for processing and proper use of canning equipment can be obtained from the Tyler County Extension Office.

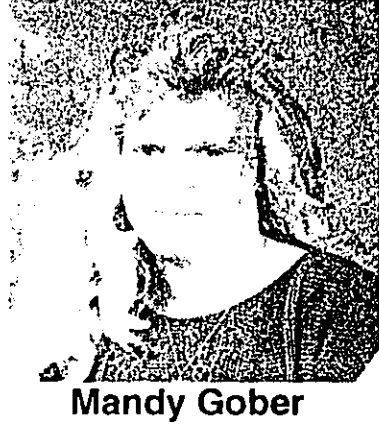
# Gober is USAA award winner

## Rockets=Team=Success

I sure hope the Houston Rockets win another NBA championship. I hope they win, not only because they are from Houston and they are the defending champions and all, but because the Rockets are the best example of any TEAM in the NBA.

To be honest, I am not a big pro basketball fan. In fact, throughout the season I don't even watch them. But I got hooked on the Rockets last year during the playoffs, and I have been with them ever since.

Throughout this season Houston played somewhat better than average ball, but never played like they were defending world champions. So I waited until the playoffs to see what would happen. Sure enough they have done it again, defying all odds in the process.

How have they done it? Some folks will say they are lucky. Others will point to Hakeem Olajuwon or the trade for Clyde Drexler. But when their success is all boiled down, what is left is an underrated coach and a group of talented athletes that play as a TEAM. That's right... the Houston Rockets, a group of highly paid athletes have found the formula to winning it is to play as a TEAM. And putting all of that mix together is a coach whose first name reminds us of another overachiever who played at Notre Dame and whose life was eventually made a movie.

Texas Monthly had a feature story on Rudy Tomjanovich after the Rockets won the world championship last year. It gave a splendid insight of how the Houston coach thinks. His high school coach told him that he wasn't good enough to play for the team, but he ended up being a star player anyway. Same thing in college. Same thing in the pros. He overcame what other people thought, regardless of the odds. Some way, maybe by example, he has taken that "I can" attitude and developed into a "we can" attitude for the Houston Rockets.

In this day of the Dennis Rodmans, the Charly Barkleys, and yes, even the infamous Shaquille O'Neal, it is more than refreshing to see a group of players like the Rockets who put the TEAM before themselves.

It is obvious that Rodman's whole concept to basketball is that the court is his stage and he is there to play it. In one sense he is good for the game in that he brings more attention to it. But in doing so he also destroys TEAM play and harmony.

Rodman reminds me of a circus performer. They are interesting to watch, but I wouldn't trust them as far as I could throw them. And what kind of example is he for kids? ... Dyed hair that makes him look like Bozo the clown... Tattoos all over his body that tell you he is either drunk a lot or he doesn't like the way God made him. But all of that together and add in that he has questions about his manhood, and a role model for kids is out of the question.

And while Barkley and O'Neal are more team oriented, they still have enough showmanship to get the spotlight on them instead of it focusing on the team for which they play.

Barkley says that he is not a role model, then goes out and gets almost \$10 million worth of endorsements because, that indeed, is what he is. And while on one hand he plays hard and sets a positive example one way, he castigates his teammates and second guesses his coach and sets a bad example on the other.

Maybe I shouldn't have added O'Neal into the same category with Rodman and Barkley, but if he doesn't watch it, in another two years or so he will be like them... unless he shuts out what the media is trying to make him to be. But there are already hints that the big "Mc" has taken hold. When the Rockets play the Magic during the playoffs, look at the tattoo on O'Neal's arm. It is a Superman seal. That is what he thinks he is. In fact he said it the other day. When Christopher Reeves, the actor who became famous with his Superman portrayal, went down with a broken neck, O'Neal said that he hoped that Superman would recover soon.

Then he added that he was Superman II.

Does anyone hear that kind of talk from the Rockets? I don't think so. What is coming from the Rockets is that they play "hungry and humble." That stage setter is Olajuwon, who turned down a big endorsement contract with Nike to sign with Spaulding. Why? Because Spaulding would sell athletic shoes in the \$30-\$40 range for kids instead of the \$100 plus range that Nike does. Now THAT sounds like a role model.

And have you listened to the post game interview during the playoffs? I don't think anyone has heard any big "I's". All the Rocket players give credit to the others. There is confidence that they can win regardless of the odds or circumstances.

I thought the halftime interview of the Rockets' Robert Horry during the Magic-Pacer game was interesting, not only by what he said, but how he was dressed. He could have worn a shirt or a ball cap with a message on it, but instead he wore a white shirt and tie. Classy. When asked about how HE was able to do all the things he has done, he put it in perspective by saying that one game he gets the job done and another game it is someone else. Again, the message that was given was that the Rockets play TEAM basketball.

Even though the Rockets won the NBA championship last year not many people across the nation have jumped on the band wagon. Why? Besides many people thinking there is nothing in Houston but mosquitoes and NASA, there is also a problem with their star players. Both Olajuwon and Drexler played college ball at the University of Houston. Olajuwon is Nigerian and speaks with an accent. Before coming to Houston, Drexler played in Portland. Add in the fact that the Rockets do not promote themselves market wise like the Cowboys and you can see why they are ignored by a lot of people.

Not that I've got anything against the Magic, but here is hoping that the good guys win another one. They did it once when no one was watching. Those who watch them said it was a fluke. But if they do it this time, people should finally take notice. And what they will notice, hopefully, is that the Rockets did it because each player put the TEAM before themselves. 
