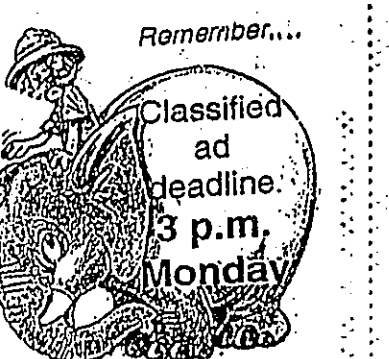

**Reluctantly Council accepts Woodville Housing Director's resignation**

The Woodville City Council Monday accepted the resignation of Billie Polk as Woodville Housing Authority Executive Director. She offered her resignation while holding back her tears saying, "It's time for me to move on to something else. But, I want you to know I love the job and I love Woodville."

She has served as Director of the Housing project since June 1978. She leaves office with many credits which now benefit the city as a whole and the Housing Project specifically including: over 5 million in construction and remodeling grants during her tenure; no "financial findings" in her 17 years in office; and, has been considered a "High Performance Project" by the Department of Housing and Urban Development.

Alice Lewis, who has worked with Director Polk for some 5 years, will assume the position, "Having all the necessary certifications," Polk said. Polk stated that one reason she considered leaving at this time was the recent difficulty in getting the new 30-unit Housing Project open.

"I want to thank the City Council and every City Council since I became the Director for all their encouragement and backing over the years. And, I want to thank the both City Managers Walt Davis and Don Shaw for their assistance. And, Police Chief Yosko," she said, "for keeping things safe."

Woodville City Mayor Billy Rose said, "I want to thank you for your many years of dedicated service and just tell you that I have never seen a cleaner housing project in any city. We wish you well in whatever you do and are sorry to see you go."

In other city business at the regular monthly meeting the council... got a good report from the City Auditor Crowell, Pipes and Associates, of Nacogoches, represented by Monte Pipes. Pipes told the council that the city was doing well and had a "healthy balance sheet" but needed to install some internal office controls; awarded high bids for two vehicles the council sold including a bid of \$1,010 to John M. Lade, for a 1989 Ford Crown Victoria Police Car; and to Christy's Car, \$370 for a 1989 Ford Escort seized in a drug arrest. Heard an appeal from Patricia Humphries requesting a variance which would allow her to put another mobile home on her .44 acres piece of property. Council said she was already in violation with two mobile homes and suggested she subdivide her property to see if it can be worked out; sold for \$50 and fees a 700 sq. ft. piece of land sought off Cherry Street by city resident James Neal which he said would be used as a driveway; voted to raise Dog Pound fees to \$5. for boarding; and \$10 for adoption plus rabies shot as a requirement; appointed a budget committee made up of Mayor Rose and Councilmen Tom Knapp, Ken Weaver and City Secretary Don Shaw.

Austin -- More than 18,000 new inmates will enter Texas state prisons in June and July as completion of Texas' \$1.5 billion prison expansion program is full stride.

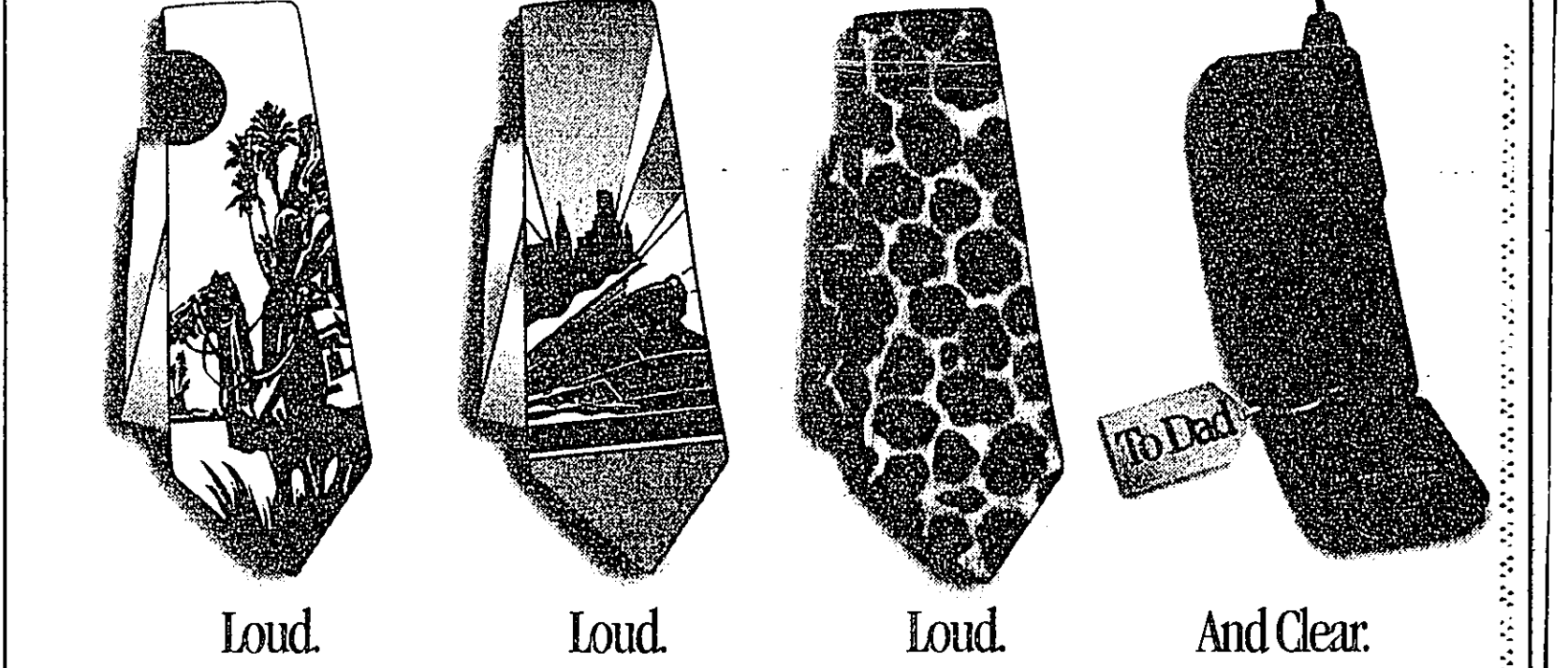

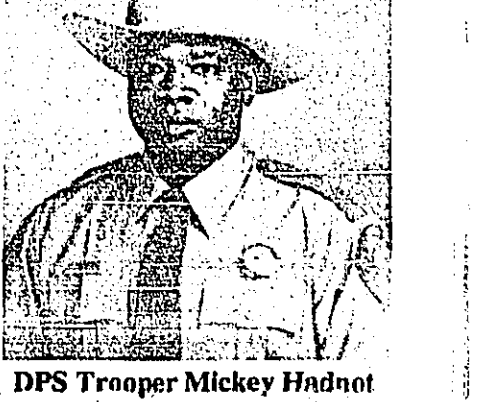
**Woodville High School TAAS review update**

Management is the key to deer numbers... NACOGDOCHES - "What happened to all our deer?" seemed to be the most asked question following the 1994-95 hunting season. 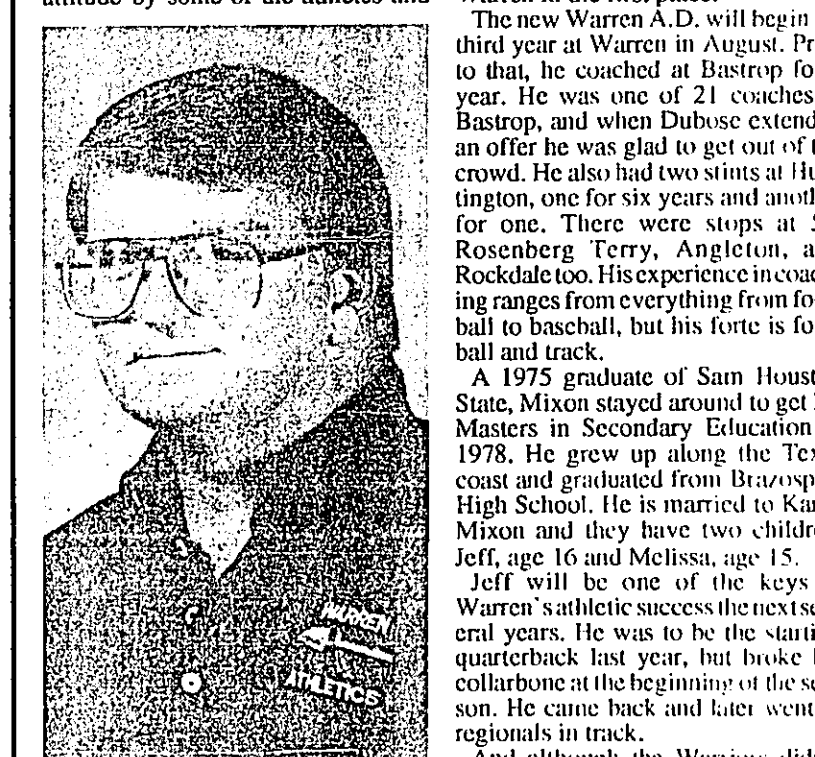
Nine year old all-stars open play Saturday

"letting young bucks walk." These are not secrets he had kept to himself, but "You have to do more than pay lip service to deer management," says Kroll, "every person on the lease has to be in agreement and committed to the program." Do these things really work? Roy Gilcrease, president of the Fountain Creek Hunting Club in Temple-Inland biologists during the last three years; Roy and his fellow hunters have seen a dramatic increase in angler quality and body size and it keeps getting better every year! Their total harvest has increased at the same time statewide harvests have dropped. The average buck reported from all the clubs cooperating with the Institute is a 2.5 year old with six points, and 11 inch spread and a main beam of 13 inches. 

### Right call to 9-1-1 helps EMS save lives

AUSTIN - As part of Texas Department of Health's (TDH) observance of National and Texas EMS Week, May 14-20, health officials reminded Texans that making the right call for emergency services can mean the difference between life and death.

According to Dr. David R. Smith, Texas Commissioner of Health, "When someone faints or collapses, has persistent chest pain or difficulty breathing, or is badly injured, a phone call to 9-1-1 or your local emergency number will connect you with a team of emergency medical personnel."

Dr. Smith added, however, "Calling EMS in non-emergencies can unnecessarily tie up the response system and make it harder for EMS personnel to do their job - responding to serious emergencies. But if you think it's an emergency, don't hesitate to call EMS."

Health officials stress that learning what to say when calling 9-1-1 also is important. Clear information given to the emergency dispatch operator can help EMS responders to save lives.

Dr. Smith advised, "Stay calm, speak clearly, and stay on the phone until the emergency operator tells you to hang up."

He said that callers should be ready to give the exact location of the emergency, including any landmarks - nearby intersections, bridges or building numbers.

When they are nearing the time of release, residents may apply for SSI benefits and obtain a decision on future eligibility. If found eligible, benefits can begin promptly when they are released. The staff of an institution can help by contacting their local Social Security office and making a pre-release agreement.

### SSI for beneficiaries temporarily in an institution

Social Security has substantially increased the amount of time in which Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients may take action to continue receiving benefits while they are temporarily in an institution. Social Security must be informed within 90 days after the admission or by the day of discharge, whichever occurs first. Previously, the deadline was within 10 days after the close of the month in which the person entered the institution.

The continuation of benefits provision allows SSI recipients to maintain a living arrangement to which they can return after a short time in an institution. In some cases, it may help to prevent homelessness.

Full SSI payment may continue for up to three months if (1) the individual is in a public medical institution or a public or private medical facility where Medicaid is paying more than half the cost of the care; (2) a physician certifies that the stay is expected to be 90 days or less; and (3) it is demonstrated that the SSI payment is needed to maintain and pay expenses associated with the living arrangement to which the individual may return.

The SSI recipient does not have to personally notify Social Security. A relative, doctor, social worker, representative payee, or other interested party can provide the information.

Another SSI program plays an important part in assisting with the transition from an institution back home. Screening is available for individuals who are currently ineligible for SSI because they are in an institution. When they are nearing the time of release, residents may apply for SSI benefits and obtain a decision on future eligibility. If found eligible, benefits can begin promptly when they are released. The staff of an institution can help by contacting their local Social Security office and making a pre-release agreement.

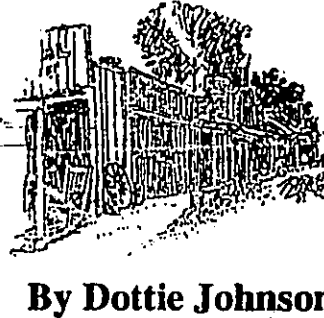

## At the Village

None of us knew who the gentleman who came into the Hattie House during our Heritage Society Board meeting last Thursday and sat down in the back. Then I overheard one of our members introduce himself and the visitor reply "Westley Sheffield."

I quickly excused myself, explaining that I was expecting Mr. Sheffield, who had driven up from Nederland to bring us information on two Sheffield doctors for our exhibit of early Tyler County medicine. Dr. John and Dr. Ariel Sheffield, both of whom were ardent and practiced medicine in the Spurger area around the turn of the century.

Some things take a little longer. We left our place for a moment with apologies for taking so long to get this exhibit in place. It all started with the personal and medical collection of Dr. Richard E. Dickens, donated to the

Village by his granddaughter Jane Waldrop of Humsville. Joella Knapp and Iris Wiedenfeld have assembled these items, ranging from surgical tools to wedding silver and quilts and a gallery of pictures, into a truly outstanding display. It's the rest of our doctors, so many we've lost count, whose early Tyler County practices we have been trying to gather and present in a suitable manner. Some doctors and items have been added to our original list, others slow to come in, but once completed, this exhibit will be in place throughout June and July and hopefully into August. There's just too much good Tyler County history here to not give it its due.

The Sheffield in Tyler County meanwhile, back to Mr. Sheffield. I have long wondered about the various branches of the Sheffield family or families. In Spurger I was always told, to be sure not related to the Sheffield at Harmony. Well, yes you are, distantly, but you're not, you are all descended from Westley Sheffield, one of the several sons of John and Elizabeth Grady Sheffield of North Carolina, who married in 1779. Westley's four sons (Isam, Arthur, Samuel and John C.) and two daughters (Rebecca, who married Jim Hooks) and Nancy (who married William R. Swearingen), migrated to Texas from southwest Georgia.

In the early 1860's, Westley C. Sheffield of Nederland, a great grandson of Arthur Sheffield (1828-1900) and Julia Ann Hooks (1829-1913), who came to Texas in the late 1850's, began his research into the Sheffield family history. After many years of digging, calls to family members, trips to family home-sites and graveyards, West called on the expertise of his distant cousin David Sheffield of Victoria to assemble all the information on his computer.

That's exactly what David has been doing the past few years, and the results are just now coming home to Heritage Village.

David, who is a family genealogy buff in his own right, is the great great grand son of Isam E. Sheffield, Sr., Westley's oldest son by Susanah Clark. It was Isam's grandson and David's great grandfather, Marcus Dickerson Lafayette Sheffield, who married a Swearingen from Harmony and took the Sheffield name to the other side of the county.

As we said, David has been working long and hard to get these individual Sheffield family histories into publishable form. And just last week, while here for the Kirby High School reunions, he presented to the Village

and the Whitmeyer Library the first two Sheffield books. One is "The Ancestors and Descendants of Arthur Sheffield, prepared for the special use of the Whitmeyer Genealogical Library, Heritage Village Museum, Woodville, Texas," the other a Village copy of a similar history prepared for Wilroy F. Mann on the ancestors and descendants of John C. Sheffield (1821-1897) and Susan Hooks (1824-1892). We are told Isam and Samuel's lines are not far behind.

What a proud addition to our soon to be completed genealogy library. The walls are paneled, new lighting has been ordered and the first of our new shelving built especially for us by Stuart Roberts has been delivered. And our Library Committee - Carol Phillips, Joyce Wilson and Sandy Boettcher - are working on the finishing touches.

Genealogy for beginners

Meanwhile, plans are underway to present a Workshop on Genealogy for Beginners. This workshop, which will be offered free of charge, will consist of four two hour sessions at the Village. Before scheduling, the Library Committee needs to know how many would be interested in such a workshop. If you are interested or would like additional information, they ask that you please call Joyce Wilson at 283-2614.

Back to our doctors

Back to our present day Westley Sheffield (his family has alternate Arthurs and Westleys, his father being an Arthur, his grandfather a Westley) he brought us three pictures and information on two of our early doctors, "Dr. John" Sheffield, who was born in Fred and later practiced in Spurger, and "Dr. A" (Ariel J. Sheffield), who was known as a fine doctor as well as the toughest man in town.

Dr. John H. Sheffield, grandson of Arthur and son of Westley and Mary Frances Cowart Sheffield, was born March 23, 1875. He taught school, then attended Memphis Hospital Medical College in Tennessee (where a number of our other early doctors received their training). He graduated in 1905 and passed the State Board of Medical Examiners' on July 16, 1906.

Dr. John married Miss Emma Gregory on July 3, 1907, at the Kirby Lumber Co. Camp in Fred, Rev. C. C. Swearingen officiating. Their marriage was very quiet, according to Ariel in the Kirby County newspaper, and only a few friends and relatives were present.

Dr. Sheffield is a man of sterling worth," the story read, "a very successful physician and a man who is highly appreciated by his friends.

## Early screening offered

The Texas Department of Health is dedicated to providing health for all Texans in a cost-effective manner for taxpayers. The Early and Periodic Screening, Diagnostic, and Treatment (EPSDT) Program helps do just that. It is a preventive and primary care program that seeks to identify medical problems early, before they become expensive to treat. Also, in encouraging clients to utilize the program, our goal is to reduce the incidence of expensive emergency room care.

An EPSDT screening will include a complete medical history, a complete physical exam, assessment of nutritional, developmental and mental health needs, laboratory tests (including lead screenings), immunizations as needed, vision and hearing tests, health education, and referrals to other health care providers (including dentists) as needed.

If health problems are found during an EPSDT screening, follow-up visits with medical specialists and dentists will be provided. EPSDT clients can also receive routine dental checkups and treatment for problems. If needed, hearing aids and eyeglasses are also provided.

All Medicaid recipients under age 21 are entitled to the EPSDT program, but not everyone uses it. In Tyler County only a small percent of participants eligible for EPSDT screenings actually have had them done. The Texas Department of Health seeks to increase these numbers through education and promotion of the program, as well as case management of eligible clients.

Persons having questions about the EPSDT program, needing a list of EPSDT providers in their area, or needing medical transportation may call the Texas Department of Health at (409) 283-2929 or (409) 283-2915. They may also call these numbers to schedule a presentation for an agency or organization.

All EPSDT services are free to the client and are offered without regard to sex, race, color, disability, national origin or religion. All EPSDT services are confidential and voluntary. Any EPSDT client who feels he or she has been treated unfairly has the right to file a complaint or ask for a hearing.

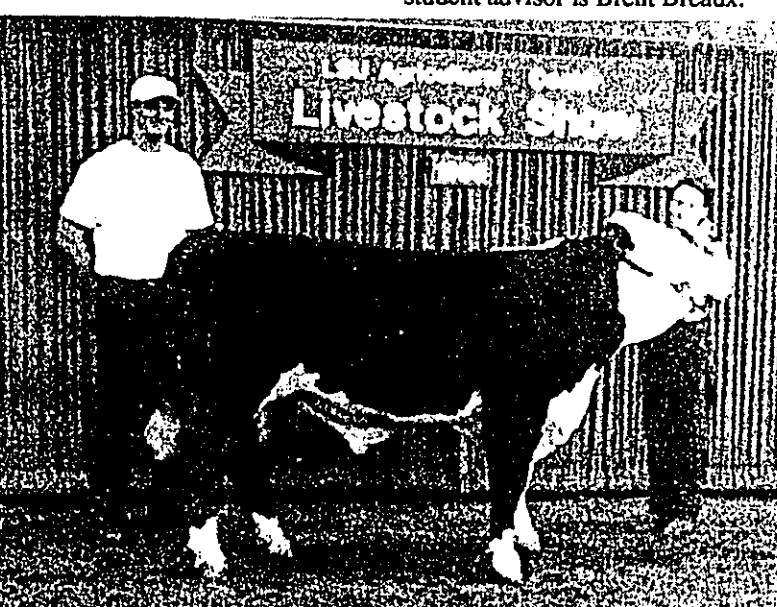

### Management is the key to deer numbers

NACOGDOCHES — "What happened to our deer?" seemed to be the most asked question following the 1994-95 hunting season. Indeed, some things seemed to have happened not only in East Texas, but statewide and even nationwide. Recently released Texas Parks & Wildlife Department figures indicated white-tailed deer harvest in Texas was down for the third consecutive year with an 11.2 percent decline in the Pineywoods alone.

"Many theories have been advanced for the poor hunting season including hot weather, too much rain, a trickle rut, shooting too many does and even a die off in some areas," reports Dr. James C. Kroll, Director of the Institute for White-tailed Deer Management and Research at Stephen F. Austin State University. "But none of these explain why one area had a poor season and virtually their next door neighbors had a banner year."

As part of a cooperative research program with Texas Inland, Inc., researchers at the Institute are collecting

## New Warren A.D. Mixon searching for right formula

WARREN — When Mickey Mixon was named as the new athletic director at Warren in February he accepted the challenge with a smile and determination.

While the smile comes natural, his determination to hopefully change things to a more positive attitude at school and the community is part of his coaching style that he has worked on for almost 20 years.

"What I really would like to do is to try to develop a little better attitude about us being in 3A," says Mixon. "I think we can be more positive and I don't see we can improve."

Mixon felt that the negativity crept in over a year ago when Warren found out that they were to move up to class 3A.

"You could just see the change in attitude by some of the athletes and some of the people in the community," noted the Warren coach.

The switch from 2A to 3A definitely had its problems for Warren, especially in the boys program. Warren did not win a game in football. In basketball they were 3-24. It was the same story in baseball with a 1-17 record and the district championship in tennis, but neither does much anymore.

The girls program held its own, finishing second in volleyball and fourth in basketball.

Mixon replaced Stephen Dubose who left Warren and left behind the athletic director and head football coach at S&S Consolidated in Sulder, Texas, a school near Sherman. Ironically, it was Dubose who brought Mixon to Warren in the first place.

The new Warren A.D. will begin his third year at Warren in August. Prior to that, he coached at Bopston for a year. He was one of 21 coaches at Bopston, and when Dubose extended an offer he was glad to get out of the crowd. He also had two sons at Huntington, one for six years and another for one. There were stops at SA Rosenberg Terry, Angleton, and Rockdale too. His experience in coaching ranges from everything from football to basketball, but his forte is football and track.

A 1975 graduate of Sam Houston State, Mixon stayed around to get his Masters in Secondary Education in 1978. He grew up along the Texas coast and graduated from Brazosport High School. He is married to Karen Mixon and they have two children, Jeff, age 10 and Melissa, age 15.

Jeff will be one of the keys to Warren's athletic success the next several years. He was to be the starting quarterback last year, but broke his collarbone at the beginning of the season. He came back and later went to regional in track.

And although the Warriors didn't win a game in football last season, the prospects are brighter this year. Warren will return six offensive and six defensive starters, along with 17 lettermen from their seasons open September 8 against Lovelady.

Hopefully, Warren's football program will get off to a better start this season than it did last year.

Says Mixon, "We had a rash of injuries, and everything that could go wrong, did."

"letting young bucks walk." These are not secrets he had kept to himself, but "You have to do more than pay lip service to deer management" says Kroll, "every person on the land has to be in agreement and committed to the program."

Do these things really work? Roy Gilcrease, president of the Fountain Creek Hunting Club in Trinity County is a believer. With help from the Institute and Temple-Inland biologists during the last three years, Roy and his fellow hunters have seen a dramatic increase in kangaroo and body size and it keeps getting better every year. Their total harvest has increased at the same time statewide harvest has dropped by 2 percent of the area in supplemental food plots; using both a warm-season and a cool-season planting, a judicious doe harvest to control the population and maintain a balanced sex ratio, and controlling buck harvest by

## Right call to 9-1-1 helps EMS save lives

AUSTIN — As part of Texas Department of Health's (TDH) observance of National and Texas EMS Week, May 14-20, health officials reminded Texans that making the right call for emergency services can mean the difference between life and death. According to Dr. David R. Smith, Texas Commissioner of Health, "When someone faints or collapses, has persistent chest pain or difficulty breathing, or is badly injured, a phone call to 9-1-1 or your local emergency number will connect you with a team of emergency medical personnel." Dr. Smith added, however, "Calling EMS in non-emergencies can unnecessarily tie up the response system and make it harder for EMS personnel to do their job - responding to serious emergencies. But if you think it's an emergency, don't hesitate to call EMS." Health officials stress that learning Social Security has substantially increased the amount of time in which Supplemental Security Income (SSI) recipients may take action to continue receiving benefits while they are temporarily in an institution. Social Security must be informed within 90 days after the admission or by the day of discharge, whichever occurs first. Presently, the deadline was within 10 days after the close of the month in which the person entered the institution. The continuation of benefits provision allows SSI recipients to maintain a living arrangement to which they can return after a short time in an institution. In some cases, it may help to prevent homelessness.

## New gene cancer therapy study announced

TEMPLE, Tex. — Scott and White Memorial Hospital and Clinic has been selected as the only site in Texas and one of only two in the United States to study gene therapy for cancer by introducing a manufactured gene substance directly into cancer masses. This is a Phase I trial of Interleukin-2 for cancer patients with solid tumors or lymphoma by direct gene transfer. The long-term goal of the project is to determine if this process will produce immunity to cancer. "We are pleased to be working in conjunction with the Arizona Cancer Institute on this study. The purpose is to find if this treatment will cause the cells of an immune system to attack and kill a tumor," said Dr. John Rinehart, director of the Division of Hematology/Oncology at Scott and White and principal investigator for the study. "Patients eligible for this trial must have metastatic cancer and a tumor that is no longer responding to conventional treatment with surgery, radiation or approved drugs. Therefore, we have the opportunity to immediately impact patients in the Southwest United States through this experimental treatment which tries to stimulate the immune system to reject the tumor." Only 25 patients will be enrolled in the study nationwide. A gene (i.e. DNA or genetic message) for a substance that stimulates cancer killing cells (IL-2) is injected directly into the tumor. If the tumor cells then produce IL-2, cancer killing cells (T-lymphocytes) will be attracted to the tumor and activated to kill the tumor cells.
