Dairy Queen company initiates new drug-free program to benefit community members
LUFKIN - The local Dairy Queen restaurants are doing their part to protect Texas communities and their citizens. Murphy George of Motel Enterprises, which operates 53 Dairy Queen stores in East Texas, has implemented a new program that promotes a drug-free work environment. "In the company's view, the program will benefit entire communities such as Woodville, especially parents and children. The program, which began for drug testing of the stores' management staff and personnel, has been an instant success both for Motel Enterprises Dairy Queens and its customers. According to Mark Liepman, vice president of operations, mandatory drug testing for all applicants and employees has eliminated many internal problems. He said the atmosphere at its Dairy Queen restaurants has become more pleasant, with improved attitudes and a stronger work ethic among employees. In addition, he reports that management effectiveness has been maintained and that new employees are easier to train. "We (Dairy Queen) want to attract quality people for employment," Liepman said. "We have been very pleased with the response, both from our employees and the communities we serve."
George, who is making a substantial investment in the program, but has been working closely with local chambers of commerce, said the company believes the positive results will more than compensate for any expenses. "We want families to understand that Dairy Queen is a safe place for our children to work and visit," he said.

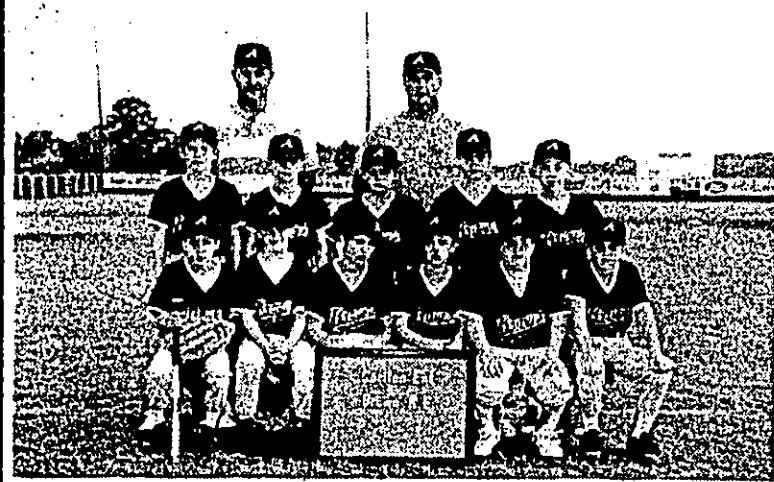

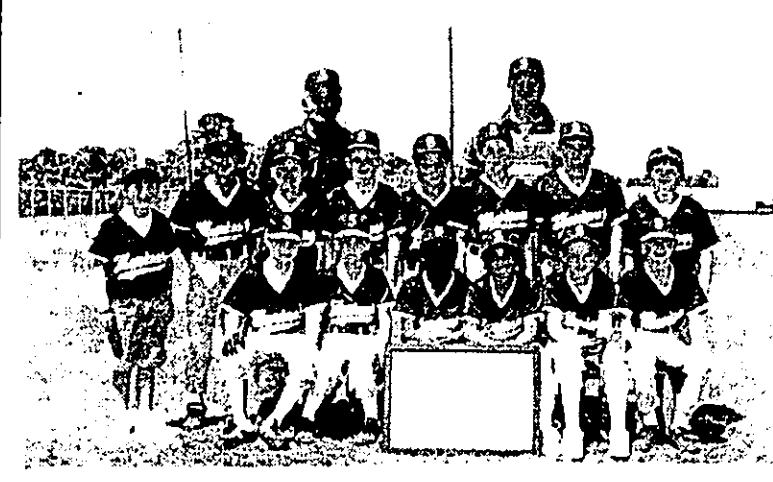
