Rocky Mountain spotted fever also can be a serious disease. The first symptoms are also flu-like, and there often is sudden onset of high fever, headache and muscle aches. A rash that spreads rapidly over the entire body, even the palms of the hands and the soles of the feet, often appears a few days later. Prompt medical attention is extremely important because RMSF can be fatal if treatment is delayed. Since 1980, at least 441 cases of RMSF have been confirmed in

Human chriichiosis is similar to RMSF, but is a newly recognized disease. The first case was reported from Arkansas in 1987. Since then, the disease has been reported from at least 30 states, including Texas. Symptoms include fever and headache and a rash seen in approximately 30 percent of patients. About two to five percent of HE patients die.
