How sweet it is, when your mail brings you information pertinent to Tyler County history, so concise you can practically quote it verbatim with little or no editing.

Ogden history heads to the printer, leaving a few more doctors in its wake

Sheffield of Victoria, who announced that the Ogden Family Book is completed and will soon be published with a copy set aside for the Whitmeyer Library at the Village.

This book, *The Ogden Family from England in 1640 to Tyler County*, features the Ogden Brothers, John and our RICHARD, as David describes him, but also has a listing of the Ogden ancestors in England and a profile of their Uncle John Ogden who preceded them to America and of their cousin David Ogden, who came soon after.

This is a prestigious work that OUR David has been working on for years, and all Ogden descendants in Tyler County and beyond will surely want a copy of their own. So here's the deal.

If 100 copies are reserved before the September 15 deadline, the book will be printed in hardback by a professional book printing company. If 100 reservations are not received, the book will be photocopied with a stiff cover and bound with a plastic binding comb.

How to choose a nursing home

You are about to make a very complex decision. It is probably one of the hardest decisions you will ever make. Here are some of the most common questions and a checklist of things to look for when you visit nursing homes.

Structure - meals, medication, social activities and other daily events are scheduled and give organization and structure to the day.
Supervision - helps ensure that medications are taken as prescribed, personal hygiene is attended to, meals are eaten and other daily needs are met.
Around the clock care - 24-hour nursing care as planned by a team of concerned professionals.
Safety and security - greatly reduces the chance of accidents such as falls or fires.

Medical history and a physical exam by a physician at or near the time of admission. While at the nursing home, the resident will have a physical exam at least once a year and at any other time the nursing home staff believes it is necessary. Because nursing homes are so extensively regulated - especially if you are relying on Medicare or Medicaid - you may run into some existing circumstances. Nursing homes are required to get many, many forms filled out by either the resident or a responsible party. In addition, Medicare and Medicaid have extensive requirements and may not cover your particular situation.

What about prescription medicine?
All nursing homes have arrangements with one or more pharmacies to meet resident prescription needs 24-hours a day. Residents may, however, designate their own pharmacy if it is willing to deliver prescriptions to the nursing home on a 24-hour a day basis.
What about a personal physician?
All nursing home residents must have a primary physician. The resident may designate his/her own physician, but many doctors will not treat nursing home residents because they are not set up to do nursing home rounds. Every nursing home has a Medical Director who is in the facility often and will usually assume the role of primary physician for those needing his or her care.

What is a Family Council?
Some facilities have a family council, which is a group of individuals who have friends or relatives in the facility. These councils serve as support groups for families, and suggest ideas, activities and changes for the facility to better serve its residents.
Will the nursing home require a physical exam for admission?
All residents must have a complete



services may be used. Tyler County Hospital has visiting cardiologists weekly in addition to a cardiologist on staff. With its capable Family Practice physicians and trained nursing staff, the hospital is fully equipped and accommodates five patients simultaneously. The department has a 24-hour in-house physician.

As part of the St. Elizabeth Heart Network, the department is capable of initiation of stabilization and treatment, including the use of thrombolytics. Following stabilization, patients are either admitted here or transferred. The on-site helicopter pad and St. Elizabeth's Med-Link or either of the two paramedic ambulance

Cardiology every Tuesday or Wednesday.
Laparoscopic conventional surgical services Monday and Wednesday.
Hearing Aid Center representative every second and fourth Friday.
Carotid Doppler, cardiac echo, and peripheral vascular studies are accomplished on a weekly basis every Friday.
Physical Therapy services are provided by a non-hospital owned operation that provides both inpatient and outpatient services.
Tyler County Hospital has its own home health/visiting nurse service.
Gynecologist here every third week on Tuesday mornings for surgery, treatment and consultations.

The hospital's Cardiorespiratory Department offers a wide range of services. It is fully staffed and, like all other departments, is available 24 hours a day. The department does EKG, ABGs, pulmonary function tests, nebulizers and chest x-rays as well as other services.

Tyler County Hospital has much to offer

Tyler County Hospital is operated by Tyler County Hospital District and is responsible for providing medical and hospital care. The hospital is a licensed 49 bed acute care facility. Its recently remodeled Emergency Department is fully equipped and accommodates five patients simultaneously. The department has 24-hour in-house physician.

As part of the St. Elizabeth Heart Network, the department is capable of initiation of stabilization and treatment, including the use of thrombolytics. Following stabilization, patients are either admitted here or transferred. The on-site helicopter pad and St. Elizabeth's Med-Link or either of the two paramedic ambulance services may be used. Tyler County Hospital has visiting cardiologists weekly in addition to a cardiologist on staff. 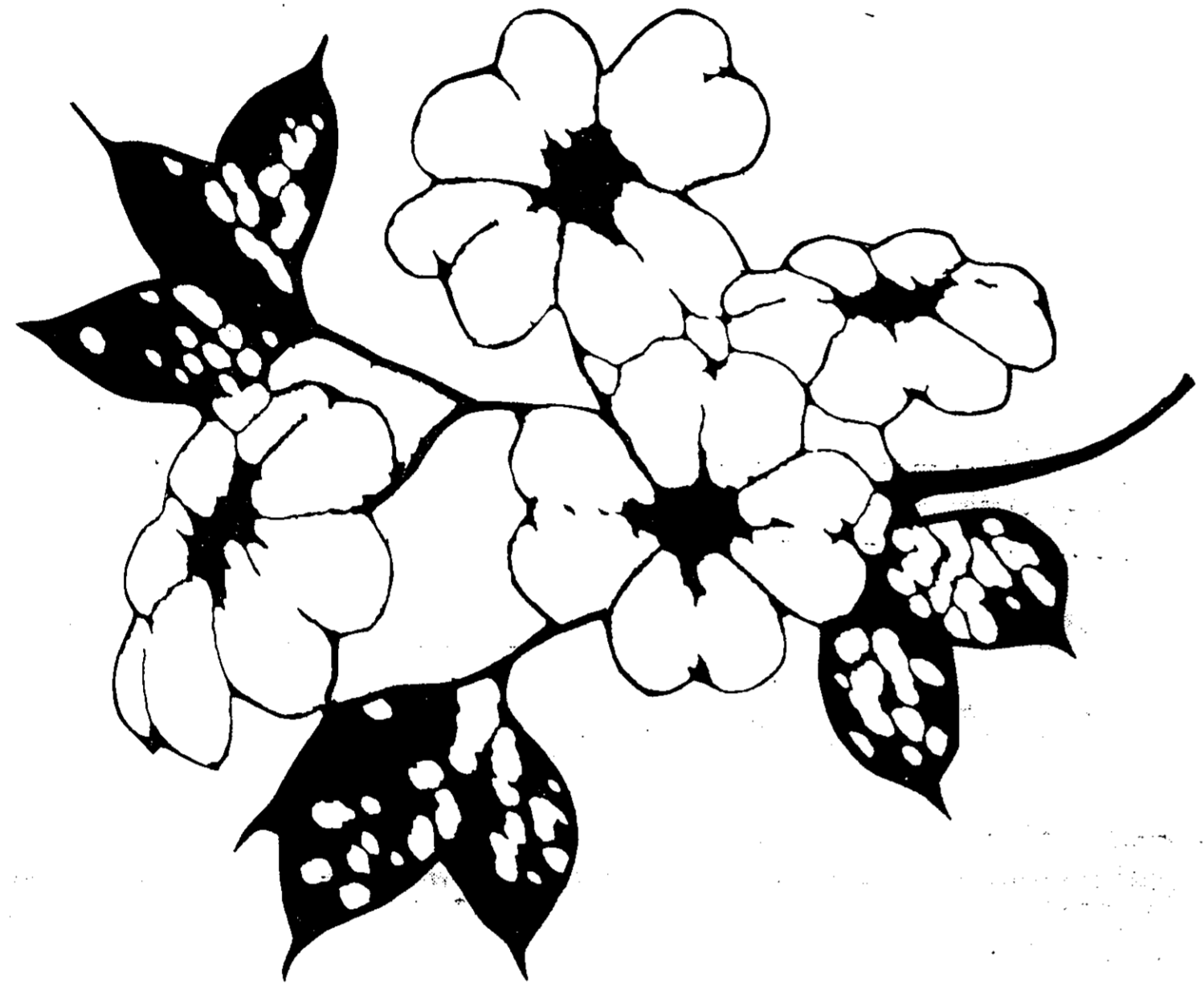
