

The reality for American families

LUFKIN — When President Franklin D. Roosevelt signed the Social Security Act on August 14, 1935, he stated, "We have tried to frame a law which will give some measure of protection to the average citizen and to his family..." On the 60th anniversary of the program, its impact on the "average citizen and his family" has largely followed Roosevelt's vision.

While Social Security is most often thought of as a program for the elderly, it has become even more a program that provides economic security for the American family. The expanded concept began early. In 1939, a year before the first benefits were paid, the law was changed to extend coverage to dependents of retired workers and established the survivors insurance program for survivors of deceased workers. These provisions had been under development when the first act was signed, and established the concept of family protection that was to become characteristic of the growth of the program over the years. In 1956, the disability insurance program was signed, recognizing the "forced retirement" of the disabled worker.

Today fully 40 percent of the almost 43 million people receiving Social Security benefits are not retired workers; they are the spouses and children of retired workers or are receiving disability benefits or survivors benefits as the spouses, children, widow(er)s or parents of retired, deceased, or disabled workers.

Benefits paid to the worker with a spouse and two or more children may replace as much as 90 percent of prior earnings for low income families. In 1994, the average family benefit paid to a widow(er) and two children was \$1,328; for a disabled worker and spouse with one or more children, \$1,088. The maximum benefit payable to a worker who became disabled at age 25 with one child is \$2,073.

Although to qualify for retirement benefits a worker needs to have worked at least 10 years under Social Security, he/she can qualify for survivors and disability benefits for his/her family with as little as a 1 1/2 years of work. The amount of work needed depends on the worker's age and increases to five out of the last 10 years for workers 31 and older.

Benefits are paid to spouses, children and even dependent parents in the case of deceased workers. The benefits are paid on the earnings record of either worker. Since two-worker families are becoming more and more common, most families now enjoy double protection.

Most Americans would agree that the Social Security program makes a difference in the lives of American families — the kind of difference envisioned by its makers 60 years ago.

Local officials were at a loss for words Tuesday as questions started being asked about the pending acquisition of the Texas Department of Health offices in Woodville which were recently surveyed and examined by University of Texas Medical Branch personnel for the scheduled take-over by the Galveston group of the local Health Department functions.

The local health office experiences and provides services to at least 5,000 contacts a year.

Tyler County Hospital Administrator Jim Gainey told the Hospital Board Tuesday that, "A deal was cut which some of the legislature didn't even know about. Everyone was caught off guard."

Gainey said their will be no measurable effect on the local hospital facility because the Health Department offices are for wellness patients. "We are an acute care facility."

Apparently the transfer goes into effect Oct. 1, unless The State Department of Health requests more time.

The Texas Department of Health was mandated to cut its budget some 54 percent, or \$1.5 billion in funding in overall services according to Dr. Maritta Crowder, of the Tyler Department of Health office.

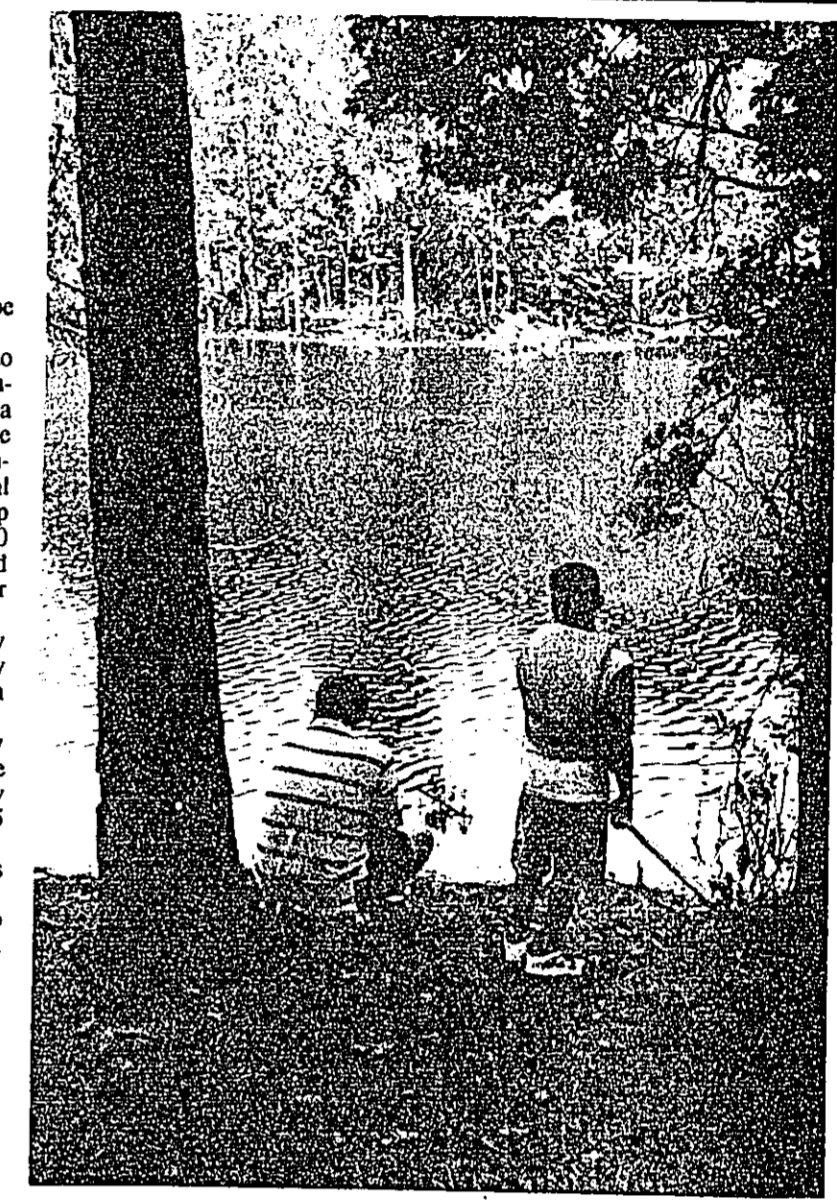

Ben Bius announces for US Congress

HUNTSVILLE — In a two-day press tour hitting 18 counties, Ben Bius, a longtime Huntsville businessman and civic leader, announced last week that he is running for Congress in the 2nd Congressional District of Texas.

Bius, seeking the GOP nomination, is running against Charlie Wilson, a 23 year Democrat incumbent.

"I know some say you can't beat Charlie Wilson, that he's an institution," Bius said. "The question is not 'Can Charlie Wilson be beat?', rather 'When will he be beat?' Twenty-four years is long enough."

"I believe in term limits, the balanced budget amendment and limiting our federal government to its constitutional role," Bius continues. "I offer you leadership qualities that can make these changes."

Citing the ever-increasing growth in federal government, Bius said, "In 1972, when Charlie Wilson took office, our national debt was approximately \$436 billion dollars. By 1994, the amount was \$4,500 billion dollars. To retire that debt, every man, woman and child in America would have to pay \$18,500."

"My successful business experience proves that I can balance a budget, create jobs and save for the future," Bius stated. "I will take these abilities to Congress."

Bius grew up in Liberty County and married Janet Kay Horton of Palestine, Janet and Ben, with their two sons, Daniel, age seven, and William, age six, reside in Huntsville.

He is a graduate of Sam Houston State University with a B.B.A. in Finance. He and his wife are the owners of a Real Estate Investment and Development company in Huntsville, which they founded in 1981.

Bius is a recognized leader in civic and community affairs. He is currently serving on the Board of Directors for the Huntsville/Walker County Economic Development Council. He has served as Executive Director of the Huntsville/Walker County Chamber of Commerce, the Board of Children's Prisons, Daniel, age seven, and Vice-President/Director of the Huntsville Board of Realtors.

He and his family attend Faith Lutheran Church in Huntsville. He has served as a Sunday School teacher, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and currently as Chairman of the Board of Finance.

He has been an active volunteer in GOP politics since 1981. He has served as precinct chairman and for the past 14 years has worked on campaigns at all levels. His work includes races for County Judge, Congress, Governor and the President. He actively works with the Realtors Association in the last session of the legislature, to end lawsuit abuse.

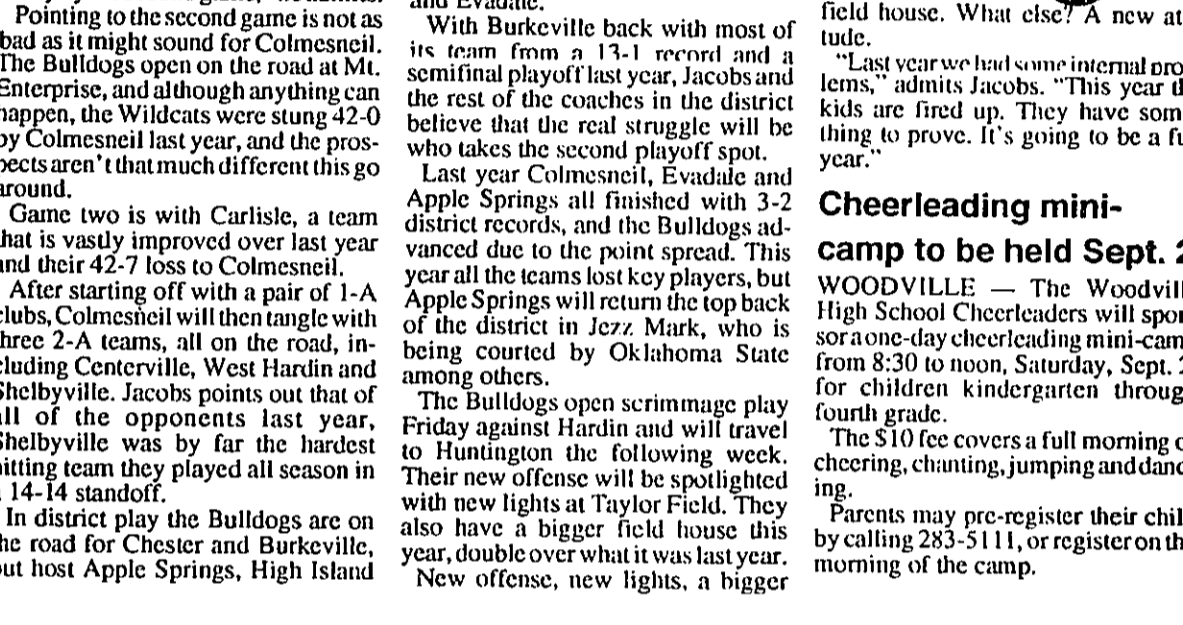

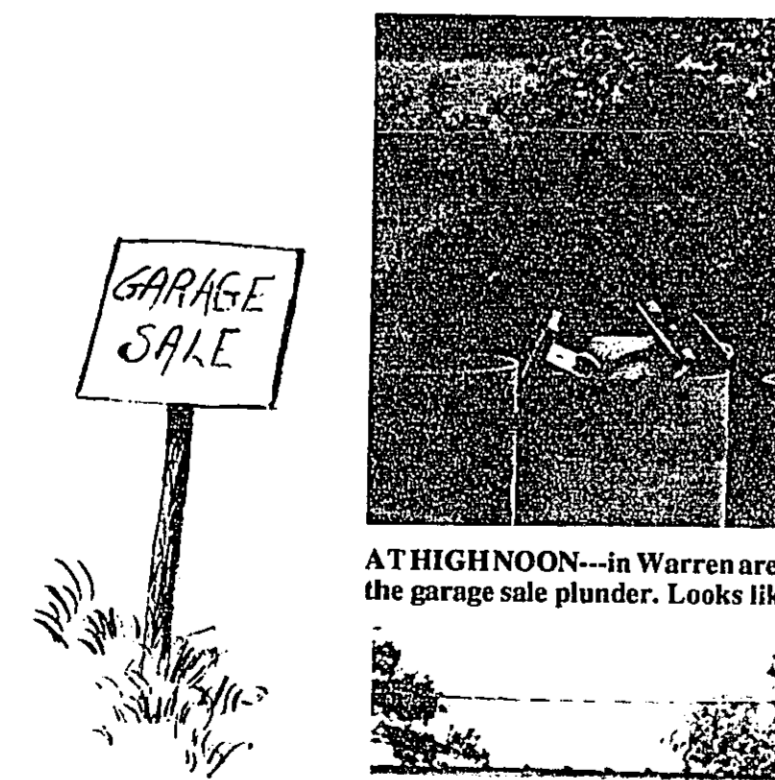

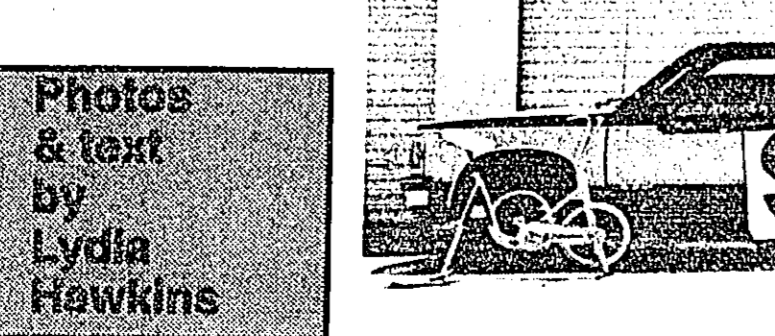

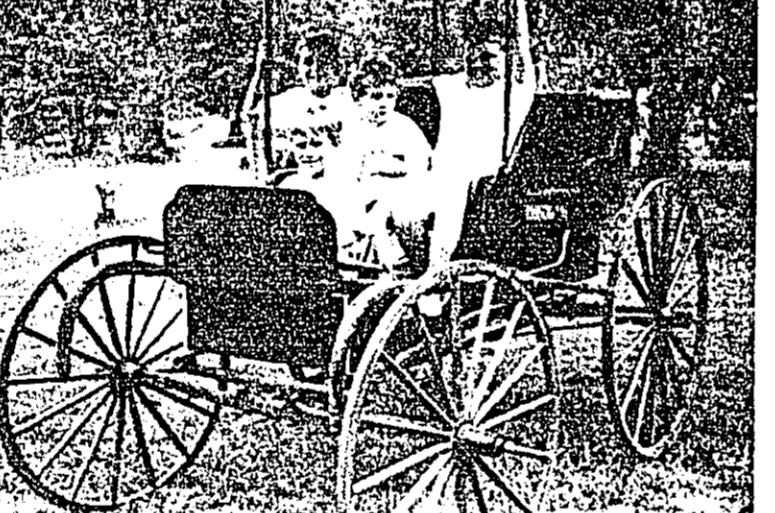

Sour Lake comprehensive history in Block's 'Mud Baths to Millionaires'

LIBERTY — The Atascosio Historical Society and the Sam Houston Regional Library & Research Center invite the public to attend an autograph session with W. T. Block, author of the history book, *Sour Lake, Texas: From Mud Baths to Millionaires, 1835-1909*. The autograph party will be held on Saturday, Aug. 26 from 1-3:30 p.m. at the Sam Houston Center, FM 1011, in Liberty. Copies of the book will be available for purchase at the event.

Sour Lake's role in Texas history and the history of the American Petroleum Industry has always been recognized, but the full story had never been told until W. T. Block wrote this book. A 20 year endeavor, it is the first documented, comprehensive history of Sour Lake. The saga begins with Stephen Jackson in 1841, follows the development of the Sour Lake Springs Hotel and the health spa industry from 1848 to 1909, and concludes with the discovery and development of the Sour Lake Oil Field.

Sour Lake's history is unique. Many other Texas places share a heritage of the oil boom town, but few share the array and excitement of the names of Stephen Jackson, General Sam Houston, Andrew Briscoe, Henry Millard, R. W. "Dick" Dowling, James and Ambrose Merchant, Walter and John Savage, Major P. G. T. Beauregard, A. M. Gentry, Joseph S. Cullinan, Texaco, Gulf, John Henry Kirby, John W. Gates, Charles Schreiner, Frank Herman Carpenter, the Hogg-Swayne Syndicate (Governor James S. Hogg and James W. Swayne), the Sharp Brothers (Walter, James and John), James F. Weed, Andrew Barrow Hamill, Wirt Davis, John Hamman, John Nathan Gilbert, Howard R. Hughes, Sr. and the Rio Bravo Oil Company in their past.

Block's Sour Lake includes the history of the pioneers, the early settlers, the Sour Lake Springs Hotel and health spa, the men who labored in the oil field, the unknown heroes such as Rufus Luckey and "Dr. Mud", and even the unpleasant stories of race riots, murder and destruction.

Asthma No. 1 cause of absenteeism

HOUSTON — Crowded school hallways might keep some students from getting to class on time, but a different type of obstructed passageway can prevent some kids from getting to school at all.

Asthma is the No. 1 cause of school absenteeism, according to Dr. Benjamin Interiano, an assistant professor of medicine at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. Recurring coughs, wheezing, and shortness of breath can result in missed school days.

Parents can prevent absenteeism by making sure their children use medication regularly before school starts, Interiano said. And they can use a peak-flow meter, an inexpensive plastic device that measures breath strength, to monitor how well the asthma is being controlled.

During the summer, most kids with asthma tend to have fewer attacks, so they slack off on taking their medication," he said. "When they start back

Middle school years can be tough

HOUSTON — The middle school years can be tough for even the best of students.

Not only are children going through adolescence and puberty, but they also are experiencing changes at school," said Dr. Lou Ann Teal-Mock, a psychologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston.

The nurturing environment of elementary school is a dramatic contrast to the middle school, or junior high, world of class changes, increased discipline, larger student bodies and fewer personal relationships with teachers.

All this change tends to intensify any existing behavior problems.

"Conduct problems may increase, and the larger school often makes it easier to slip class," Mock said. "Children who have been depressed or withdrawn may become more so."

Mock urges parents to be aware of the following events common to middle school:

- Peer groups begin to exert tremendous pull.
- Independence is shown in clothing and hairstyles.
- Grades may fluctuate at the start of school due to new class routines.
- Identity questions arise - who am I? what am I going to be?
- Substance abuse becomes more prevalent.
- Sexual identity and sexual activity become issues.

"This also is the time when children become terminally embarrassed by their parents," Mock said. "Wise parents understand that and do not take it too personally."

She suggests that parents help bridge the gap between elementary and middle school by being aware of and willing to talk about the additional stressors their child is facing.

High-tech mapping to make GSU more responsive to customers

BEAUMONT — Gulf States Utilities Co. is taking to the skies using the latest technology to help make electric service more reliable for its customers. The Entergy Corp. subsidiary has a comprehensive infrastructure improvement program underway that will boost the reliability and increase the company's responsiveness to customers over the long term.

Gulf States is using satellite signals and a low-flying helicopter to map transmission lines that carry electricity from power plants to substations. The helicopter has been in the Beaumont area for several days. The transmission mapping project will create an electronic database that will help reduce outage times and improve maintenance of the transmission system.

To gather the data for the project, a helicopter flies at 25 miles per hour about 20 feet above the steel or wooden structures that support the high-voltage cables. On board, a data collector uses two video cameras to record the equipment on each pole and the condition of the poles. At the same time, a receiver mounted on top of the helicopter uses satellite signals to plot the longitude and latitude of each pole. The process can only be done during certain hours of the day when the area to be mapped can receive clear signals from the orbiting satellites.

UTMB Medical to assume local Department of Health offices in cost cut measure

Local officials were at a loss for words Tuesday as questions started being asked about the pending acquisition of the Texas Department of Health offices in Woodville which were recently surveyed and examined by University of Texas Medical Branch personnel for the scheduled take-over by the Galveston group of the local Health Department functions.

The local health office experiences and provides services to at least 5,000 contacts a year. Tyler County Hospital Administrator Jim Ganey, told the Hospital Board Tuesday that, "A deal was cut which some of the legislature didn't even know about. Everyone was caught off guard."

Ganey said that there will be no measurable effect on the local hospital facility because the Health Department offices are for "wellness patients." We are an acute care facility.

Apparently the transfer goes into effect Oct. 1, unless The State Department of Health requests more time.

The Texas Department of Health was mandated to cut its budget some 54 percent, or \$1.5 billion in funding in overall services according to Dr. Marveta Crowder, of the Tyler Department of Health office.

"We were charged with finding another provider within a short time frame, it was a matter of salvaging what infrastructure had been developed over the past 20 years," she said, adding, "fortunately UTMB was co-located in the Region Five area and

they've agreed to pick up most of the staff except those who work in areas TB or in sexually transmitted diseases medicine, or in handling Chronically III Disabled Children.

According to County Judge Jerome Owens who indicated Tuesday he was frustrated that the terms of the agreement were completed on a state level and without informing county officials.

Owens said he felt, "The county may well benefit from the resources provided by UTMB, especially, "he said, "they might do more for us in the OB and Pre-natal areas area of medicine. Owens said that UTMB had professional doctors on staff who would be available to the clinic here. He said also the downside of the proposal was the possibility of having less staff and fewer open days a week.

"The change is not all good and not all bad. According to Dr. Crowder, of the DOH Tyler office, "There is simply less money to be had by the state for the categorical part in providing these services. In some instances, certain regions got cut more than others. All medicare patients will now be under managed care.

Crowder said the total expenditures for the Woodville, Tyler County office totaled \$260,510 including salaries, contracts, rent and programs. As

the transition occurs there may be reductions in staff.

A meeting held in Diboll Monday to answer questions from local government officials was followed Thursday by Commissioners Court workshop to be held at the Moody Garden Convention Center, at 9:30 a.m., in the Floral Room, in Galveston. The workshop will be "Concerning Senate Bill 10 and the development of a managed care healthcare delivery system under the State Medicaid Program.

Reportedly UTMB officials will lay out what they see as their role in the transfer. Galveston will propose how to view the plan for the Region 5 "catchment" area.

"We're going to take a look", Owens said. Officials say they expect a scenario to develop in 1997 where the state will invite requests for proposals for local providers to apply for the services.

According to County Hospital Administrator Ganey, "We already have a current existing contract agreement with UTMB Galveston that doesn't relate to the Health Department question, and we are satisfied with that contract."

Local DOH staff services currently provide: Family Planning, Adult Health Services, Child Health, Early Periodic Screening Diagnosis and Treatment, Immunizations, and aid to Chronically III and Disabled Children; and WIC services.

From Huntsville Ben Bius announces for US Congress

HUNTSVILLE — In a two-day press tour hitting 18 counties, Ben Bius, a longtime Huntsville businessman and civic leader, announced last week that he is running for Congress in the 2nd Congressional District of Texas.

Bius, seeking the GOP nomination, is running against Charlie Wilson, a 23 year Democrat incumbent.

He is a graduate of Sam Houston State University with a B.B.A. in Finance. He and his wife are the owners of a Real Estate Investment and Development company in Huntsville, which they founded in 1981.

Bius is a recognized leader in civic and community affairs. He is currently serving on the Board of Directors for the Huntsville/Walker County Economic Development Council. He has served as Executive Director of the Huntsville/Walker County Chamber of Commerce, the Board of Children's Protective Services, and Vice-President/Director of the Huntsville Board of Realtors.

He and his family attend Faith Lutheran Church in Huntsville. He has served as Sunday School teacher, Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and currently as Chairman of the Board of Finance.

He has been an active volunteer in GOP politics since 1981. He has served as a precinct chairman and for the past 14 years has worked on campaigns at all levels. His work includes races for County Judge, Congress, Governor and the President. He actively worked with the Realtors Association in the last session of the legislature, to end lawsuit abuse.
