East Texans to ask EPA to protect streams from degradation

AUSTIN — On Friday, Aug. 18, a delegation of East Texans will meet with acting regional EPA director Stan Meiburg in Dallas (1445 Ross Avenue, Suite 1200) to urge EPA to disapprove the action taken by the State of Texas to lower water quality standards for more than half of the streams in East Texas.

"We're asking the EPA to hold the line on East Texas water quality," said Ruth Culver of Uncertain, Texas (near Caddo Lake) and organizer of the group meeting with EPA. "The state wants to allow polluters to downgrade the water quality of a number of the streams we drink from, swim and fish in, and depend on as communities. We're not asking for new regulations. We just want the current federal safeguards for our water quality to remain in place. If it ain't broke, don't break it," she said.

At issue is a June 19 decision by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) that all unclassified, year-round streams in East Texas will henceforth be presumed to support an "intermediate" quality aquatic habitat rather than the "high" quality aquatic habitat that had been presumed before. This decision ignored the data and recommendations from a 1992 study by TNRCC's own scientists, which found high quality aquatic habitat in East Texas streams.

By allowing streams to be presumed to support intermediate levels of water quality, TNRCC allows polluters to automatically pour more sewage and industrial waste into unclassified East Texas streams without conducting tests of water quality, East Texas

Tyler County Fair officials preparing Fair grounds for 'Biggest, best Fair yet'

"It's all for the kids," said Tyler County Fair President Don Shaw, Tuesday, as he discussed plans for the 48th Annual Tyler County Fair set to unfold from Oct. 5-7 at the 41/2 FFA Arena west of Woodville.

"Everything we do out here is done for the benefit of Tyler County youth. All the entries in the Fair Program are limited to those who belong to FFA or 4-H organizations. Except for some adult categories such as in canning, or selling or crafts the entire focus of the program targets kids with opportunities for scholarships and other advances."

Shaw said the various Fair committees will be working extra hard over the next two weeks in shaping up the fairgrounds in preparation for the event.

Shaw said all deadlines have past for entries in the fair competition. He said also the Fair rules committee has addressed all rule changes and adopted new procedures in areas concerning livestock exhibition. The new rules will be implemented at this year's Fair, Shaw emphasized.

Shaw said the Buyers Committee activity "has picked up, but there is still plenty of room for new buyer participation in the livestock sale. It's going to be hard to beat the record \$50,000 sale we had last year."

Shaw said there is no cost to come to the Fair... it's free to the public. "It's all for the kids."

Texas tax reform is DETDA topic

Tax reform in Texas will be the focus of the Deep East Texas Development Association's meeting on Friday, September 22, in Lufkin.

The speaker will be George Scott Christian of Austin, attorney for the Texas Association of Taxpayers, a business-funded Austin group which monitors tax legislation and developments.

The meeting will begin at 10 a.m. at Crown Colony Country Club in Lufkin.

Christian's remarks will focus on Governor George W. Bush's proposal to reform the Texas school property tax system in the 1997 session of the Texas Legislature.

Christian will explore several options at Bush's disposal, including a gross receipts tax, a value added tax, expansion of the franchise tax, sales tax changes, and a personal income tax.

A native of Austin, Christian holds undergraduate and law degrees with honors from the University of Texas. He was a legislative aide to State Senator Ray Farabee of Wichita Falls from 1983 to 1985 and has practiced law in New York and Texas.

He joined his father's Austin firm in 1990 after four years with Hughes and Luce and has been involved in state finance, tort reform, worker's compensation, healthcare, and public higher education, and various business-related issues.

Restrict fat, lower prostate cancer risk

HOUSTON — Men who restrict their fat in their diets may lower their risk for prostate cancer.

That's the indication of a six-month study to determine if limiting fat intake to 20 percent of total calories would reduce levels of prostate specific antigen (PSA), a blood marker used to indicate the risk for prostate cancer.

"In patients with really elevated PSA we had a 10 percent reduction," said Dr. Dov Kadmon, a urologist at Baylor College of Medicine in Houston. "We hoped this study would tell us if there was a downward trend in PSA levels associated with a lower fat diet. We wanted to know the feasibility of conducting a larger study with a larger reduction of fat intake, perhaps as low as 10 percent."

The average PSA reduction in study subjects was one point.

"That's not a huge amount," Kadmon said, "but it was a measurable drop, and perhaps such drops in PSA levels have a cumulative effect."

Prostate cancer, the major cancer killer in men 50 and older, occurs significantly more often in black men than in white men.

"I think that in prostate cancer it makes all the sense in the world to address prevention rather than treatment and cure," Kadmon said, "biological evidence that extraneous factors, most likely including diet, make a difference."

Kadmon also suggested that all men 50 and older be screened annually for prostate cancer using a PSA blood test and a digital examination.

Black men, and men with a family history of prostate cancer, should be screened annually beginning at age 40.

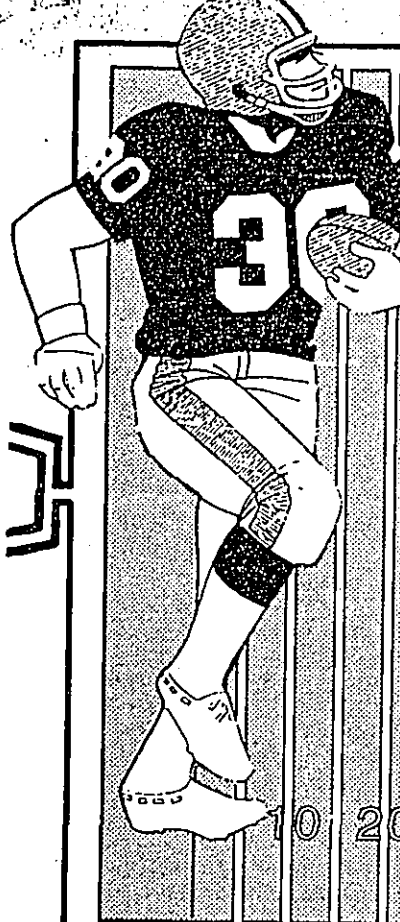

Seventeen (17) days after this publication, the County of Tyler, Texas intends to request the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA) to release Federal funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (P. L. 93-383) for Project No. 715801.

Environmental Assessment Activities
The City of Woodville will eliminate three (3) undersized and Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission noncompliant floodwalls along Little Turkey Creek (Beech Street, Pecan Street and Magnolia Street (U. S. Hwy. 69) by construction of 150 linear feet of 15 inch sewer interceptor line and 10 manholes.

Finding of No Significant Impact
It has been determined that such a request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the County of Tyler has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P. L. 91-190). The reason for such a decision is based upon the fact that all environmental concerns could either be minimized or mitigated.

An Environmental Review Record for the proposed project has been made by the County of Tyler which documents the environmental review of the project and more fully sets forth the reasons why such a statement is not required. The Environmental Review Record is on file at the County Judge's Office, and is available for public examination and copying upon request between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

Public Comments on Findings
All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the County of Tyler at the address set forth above. Such written comments must be received at the address specified within sixteen (16) days after this publication. All such comments received will be considered and the County will not request the release of funds or take administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the proceeding sentence.

Release of Funds
The County of Tyler will undertake the activities described above with Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I from its Program Year 1994 under grant number 715871 from the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The County of Tyler is certifying to TDHCA that it has satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. TDHCA will accept an objection to its approval only on one or more of the bases and the procedures described in 24 CFR Part 58.75. Objections are to be addressed to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, P. O. Box 13941, Austin, Texas 78713.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above, will not be considered by the TDHCA. No objections received later than thirty-three (33) days after this publication will be considered by TDHCA.

Under the Woodward Settlement, Fundal® is defined as chloridifolium or any chloridifolium-containing product, either manufactured, formulated, packaged, distributed or sold by or on behalf of NOR-AM Chemical Company ("NOR-AM") or its related parties, regardless of the trade name of the product or any metabolite of Fundal®, including the substances known as 4-GOT or 5-C-AT. Galecron® has the same meaning as it did in the Price v. Ciba-Geigy Corp., Civ. No. 82-1000-CB-S (S.D. Ala. 1995), Settlement ("Price Settlement"), and is thus defined as chloridifolium or any chloridifolium-containing product, either manufactured, formulated, packaged, distributed or sold by or on behalf of Ciba-Geigy Corporation or its related parties, regardless of the trade name of the product; or any metabolite of Galecron®, including the substances known as 4-GOT or 5-C-AT.

The Woodward Settlement Class is defined as:

(1) All persons who fall into one of the following categories and who reside in the United States as of the date of filing of the Class Action Complaint, who have been exposed to Fundal® or Galecron® or to any metabolite of Fundal® or Galecron® only ("NOR-AM Exposed Persons");

a. **Employees:** An individual (whether or not employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company) who in the course of his or her employment was exposed to Fundal® while at a plant or site which was involved in mixing, blending, packaging, handling or otherwise formulating pesticide which contained, in whole or in part, Fundal®.

b. **Applicants:** An individual (whether or not employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company) who in the course of his or her employment, was exposed to Fundal® while involved in the application of pesticides which contained, in whole or in part, Fundal®.

c. **Other Covered Workers:** (i) An individual employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company who, in the course of his or her employment, was exposed to Fundal®, (ii) an individual who worked at Empak, Inc., in Deer Park, Texas and/or Mero Chemical in Louisiana and who was exposed to Fundal® in the course of his or her employment; (iii) or an individual who worked in a testing or research laboratory and who was exposed to Fundal® in the course of his or her employment; (iv) or an individual who was a legal representative of the NOR-AM Exposed Persons described above.

(2) All members of the Price Settlement Class. The Price Settlement Class means all members of the settlement class certified by the court in Price v. Ciba-Geigy Corp., Civ. No. 82-1000-CB-S (S.D. Ala. 1995), excluding those persons determined by the court to be outside of that class. That settlement class includes persons residing in the United States who in the course of their employment were exposed to Galecron® or to Galecron® and Fundal® ("Ciba Exposed Persons") and the spouses, parents, children, other relatives, or legal representatives of the Ciba Exposed Persons described above.

As determined by the Court, the total attorney fee award to be requested will not exceed the benefits conferred upon the class. The benefits of the NOR-AM DCA Fund will continue as long as the NOR-AM MMT Fund continues, or until the NOR-AM DCA Fund is exhausted. If the NOR-AM DCA Fund is exhausted, NOR-AM will continue paying for compensable claims. If NOR-AM does not continue to pay for these compensable claims, Woodward Settlement Class Members will be able to opt-out of the NOR-AM DCA Fund and pursue any legal claims they may have, except for claims for medical monitoring, medical treatment, fear of illness or cancer, or increased risk of illness or cancer.

(3) **Other Conditions:** The Stipulation of Settlement presently provides for medical monitoring, treatment and compensation payments for certain medical conditions set forth in this Notice. In the event, however, that a Court-approved Epidemiology Panel determines to a reasonable medical certainty that any other medical condition is caused by Fundal® or Galecron® exposure, that condition will be deemed a compensable claim, and will be eligible for medical monitoring (if feasible), medical treatment, and cash payment.

(4) **Release:** Woodward Settlement Class Members who do not exclude themselves from the Woodward Settlement Class release all past, present and future claims (i) relating to the covered medical conditions listed above; and (ii) relating to a Woodward Settlement Class Member's exposure to Fundal® or Galecron®, including all claims alleging that any other exposure, personal injuries or risks caused by exposure to Fundal® or Galecron®.

IV. CLASS REPRESENTATIVES AND CLASS COUNSEL

The Court has designated the following Woodward Settlement Class Members, Jack Woodward, Alan Woodward, Tom Lofton, Cindy Lofton and Rita Snow, as class representatives to represent all Woodward Settlement Class Members. The Court has also designated as Class Counsel the following individuals: individually E. Eble, S.C. Middlebrooks III, and David R. Donahue.

V. RIGHTS AND OPTIONS OF WOODWARD SETTLEMENT CLASS MEMBERS

If you are a Woodward Settlement Class Member, you have the following options:

(1) You may do nothing and remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member. If you choose to take no action, your interests as a member of the Woodward Settlement Class will be represented by the Class Representatives and Class Counsel at no cost to you.

(2) You may remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member and either represent yourself or hire your own attorney to represent you at your own cost.

(3) You may remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member and object to the settlement.

(4) If you choose to remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member under options 1, 2 or 3 above, you may receive the benefits afforded by this settlement within six months of the Court's Order directing this Notice.

(5) You may request exclusion from this settlement.

DEADLINES FOR ABOVE OPTIONS. The deadline for filing an Affidavit of Appearance if you choose to represent yourself or retain an attorney for filing objections to this settlement, for filing a Notice of Intention to Appear at the fairness hearing, or for filing a request to be excluded from the Woodward Settlement Class is **DECEMBER 1, 1995. 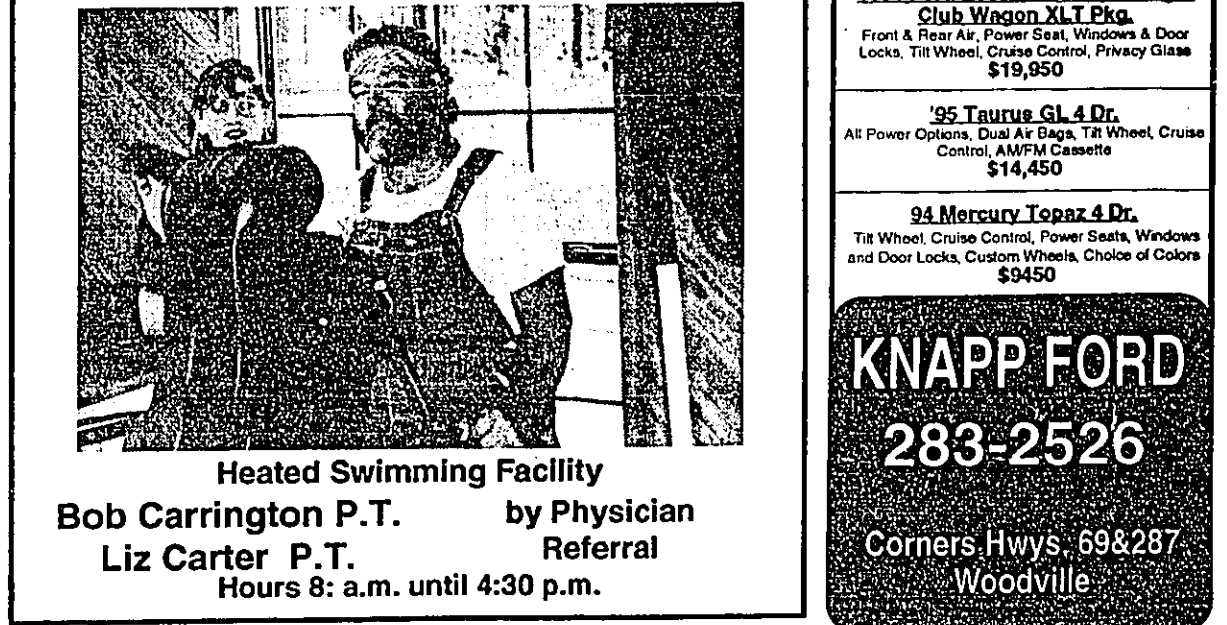

East Texans to ask EPA to protect streams from degradation

AUSTIN — On Friday, Aug. 18, at 2 p.m., a delegation of East Texans will meet with acting regional EPA director Stan Meiburg in Dallas (1445 Ross Avenue, Suite 1200) to urge EPA to disapprove the action taken by the State of Texas to lower water quality standards for more than half of the streams in East Texas.

"We're asking the EPA to hold the line on East Texas water quality," said Ruth Culver of Interstream, Texas (near Caddo Lake) and organizer of the group meeting with EPA. "The state wants to allow polluters to downgrade the water quality of a number of the streams we drink from, swim in and fish in, and depend on as communities. We're not asking for new regulations. We just want the current federal safeguards for our water quality to remain in place. If it ain't broke, don't break it," she said.

An issue is a June 19 decision by the Texas Natural Resource Conservation Commission (TNRCC) that all unclassified, year-round streams in East Texas will henceforth be presumed to support an "intermediate" quality aquatic habitat rather than the "high" quality aquatic habitat that had been presumed before. This decision ignored the data and recommendations of a 1992 study by TNRCC's own scientists, which found high quality aquatic habitat in East Texas streams. By allowing streams to be downgraded to support intermediate levels of water quality, TNRCC allows polluters to automatically pour more sewage and industrial waste into unclassified East Texas streams without conducting tests of water quality, East Texas

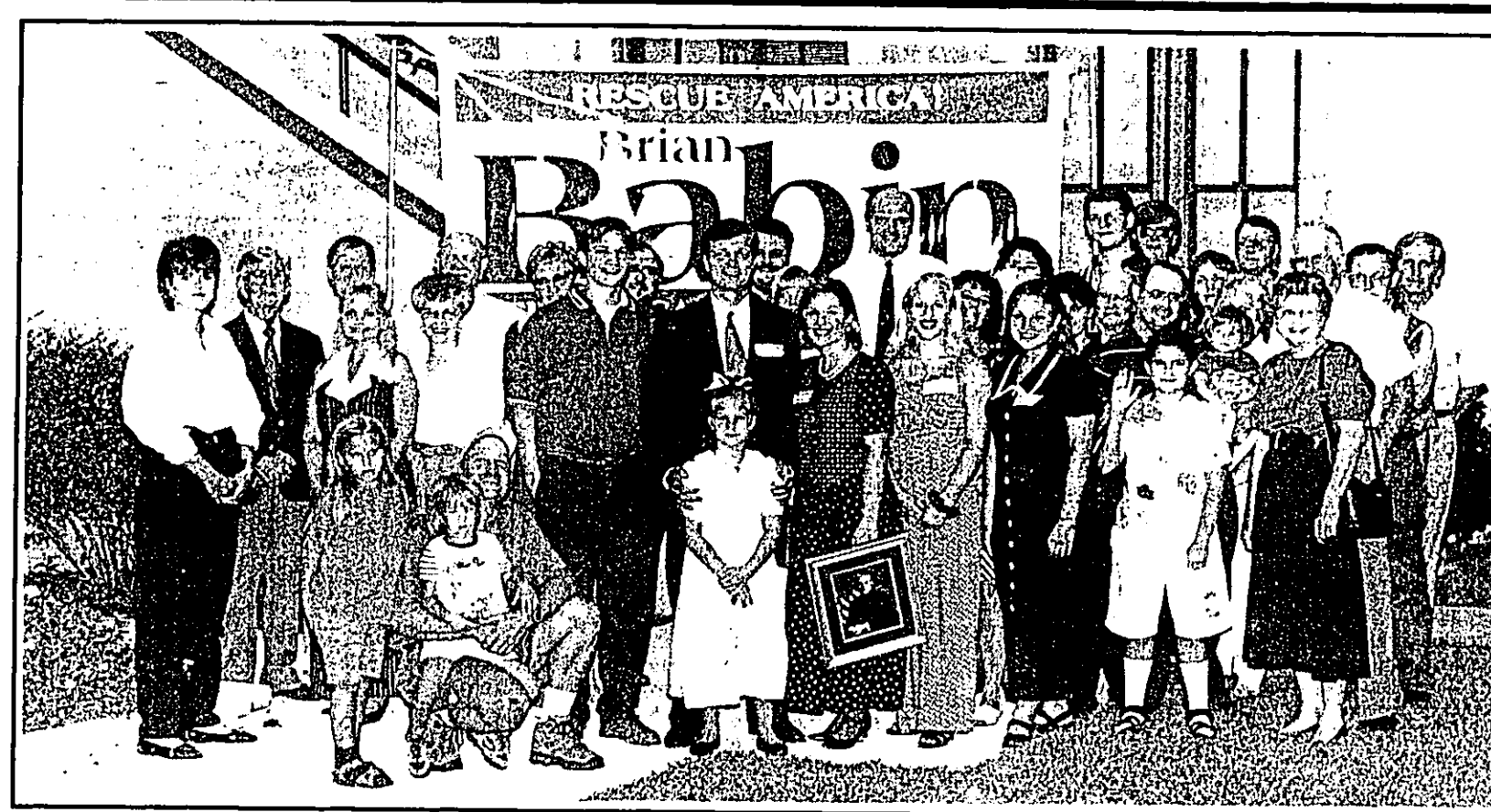

Eagles roll to second straight win

WOODVILLE—Dominate - To rule or control by superior power (Webster).

The Woodville Eagles were every bit that, plus more Friday night in an impressive 46-0 victory over the Hardin-Jefferson Hawks in their first showing before home fans at Eagle Stadium.

While the week before, the Eagle offense took center stage against Huntington, this time the Eagle defense shared the spotlight against Hardin-Jefferson.

The outcome could have been even more one sided had it not been for a couple of offensive miscues and an injury that sidelined one of the hottest running backs in the area. All of this coming against a team that a week prior had defeated a 14-7 team, 10-6.

"It was definitely a confidence builder," said first year head football coach Ty Quick following the victory. "The kids are starting to believe in themselves and in their coaches."

Some of the pieces are now fitting together in this puzzle. Quick added, "And while the Eagles were finding themselves, Hardin-Jefferson was having more than its share of problems containing Woodville's explosive offense, let alone trying to get something to happen against an impressive Eagle defense."

Offensively, the Eagles used its arsenal of running back for 370 yards rushing. After Juan Mitchell took to the bench with a "hip pointer" injury after rolling over 100 yards rushing in the first half, Allen Adams stepped to the rescue by galloping for over 150 in the second.

Speaking of Allen, said Quick, "It was good to see him step up. He did a great

job. He also did a good job on defense. And as far as Mitchell is concerned, the Woodville coaching staff is on a war and see time table for the running back.

"It won't get well real fast," added the Woodville coach.

While the hamstring injury halted Mitchell, the Hawks couldn't pick up where he left off last week, the senior running back hissed the H-J defense for 132 yards rushing and one touchdown in just under two quarters of play.

After Mitchell went down, Adams rode to the rescue with 154 more yards rushing and a pair of touchdowns.

And while the Eagle offense was having its way with the Hawks, the Eagle defense was just as impressive, limiting H-J to only three first downs in the first half and virtually giving up only three points in the game.

The Eagles started off the scoring spree on a 30 yard pass from Demarquo White to Byron Rigby on a corner route just under two minutes to go in the first quarter. Mitchell led the game with his injury from there, they did find that they could score more touchdowns against a team that a week prior had held class 4A Dayton State to a 14-7 game at the end of the first quarter.

The next time the Eagles got the ball they rode 70 yards on four plays to take the lead for good. And while Mitchell scored the touchdown on a five yard run, it was another White Rigby pass play that virtually broke the Hawks' back. White found Rigby for a 55 yard touchdown on a horse side line that gave the Eagles a first and goal at the five.

White combined with John Mark Lewis for the two point conversion to give the Eagles a 14-7 lead, and they never looked back.

The next time Woodville touched the ball it was another six points. James Ivy intercepted a Hawk pass at the Woodville 15 to start a 77 yard Eagle scoring drive. Mitchell paved the way with 25 yards on four carries before going out with his injury from there, it was Allen's turn. The senior running back picked up 24 yards on his first carry and after a tote for six more yards, capped the drive with a three yard touchdown.

Following halftime where the Eagles held a 20-7 lead, H-J put up its only offense drive of the night. Taking the second half kickoff off the Hawks moved downfield to the Woodville eight yard line on seven plays. But at the point where Eagle defense stiffened and the Hawks had to settle for a 25 yard field goal by McKeller.

Outside of H-J's final gasp against the Woodville defense in the waning moments of the game, the Hawks never got another first down or was able to get passed their own 36 yard line.

Woodville's fourth touchdown of the night, the second a 26 yarder behind superb blocking with 4:31 to go in the third.

Woodville extended the lead to 34-10 late in the period on a five yard pass from White to Gerrod Betts. The score came after the Eagles put together a seven play, 52 yard drive that was highlighted by a 25 yard pass from White to Betts.

Betts and White also got the two point conversion with a pass.

Quarterback Shawn White also scored a pair more, both set up by the Eagle defense.

Kevin Powell got both ends of the deal after intercepting a Hawk pass at the Woodville 48 and returning it to the Hawk 30. He then got the touchdown on a five yard scamper following a pair of runs totaling 25 yards by Allen.

Defensive end Adam Greenwood opened the door for Woodville's final score of the night when he recovered a fumble at the Hawk 22 yard line. Powell was more than happy to get the scoring honors on a one yard run with 2:30 to go in the game. Powell was the lone carrier on the five play drive, his best being a 10 yard scamper on the second play.

Said Quick after the one sided victory, "I was shocked as anybody about us scoring that much. Our offensive line dominated."

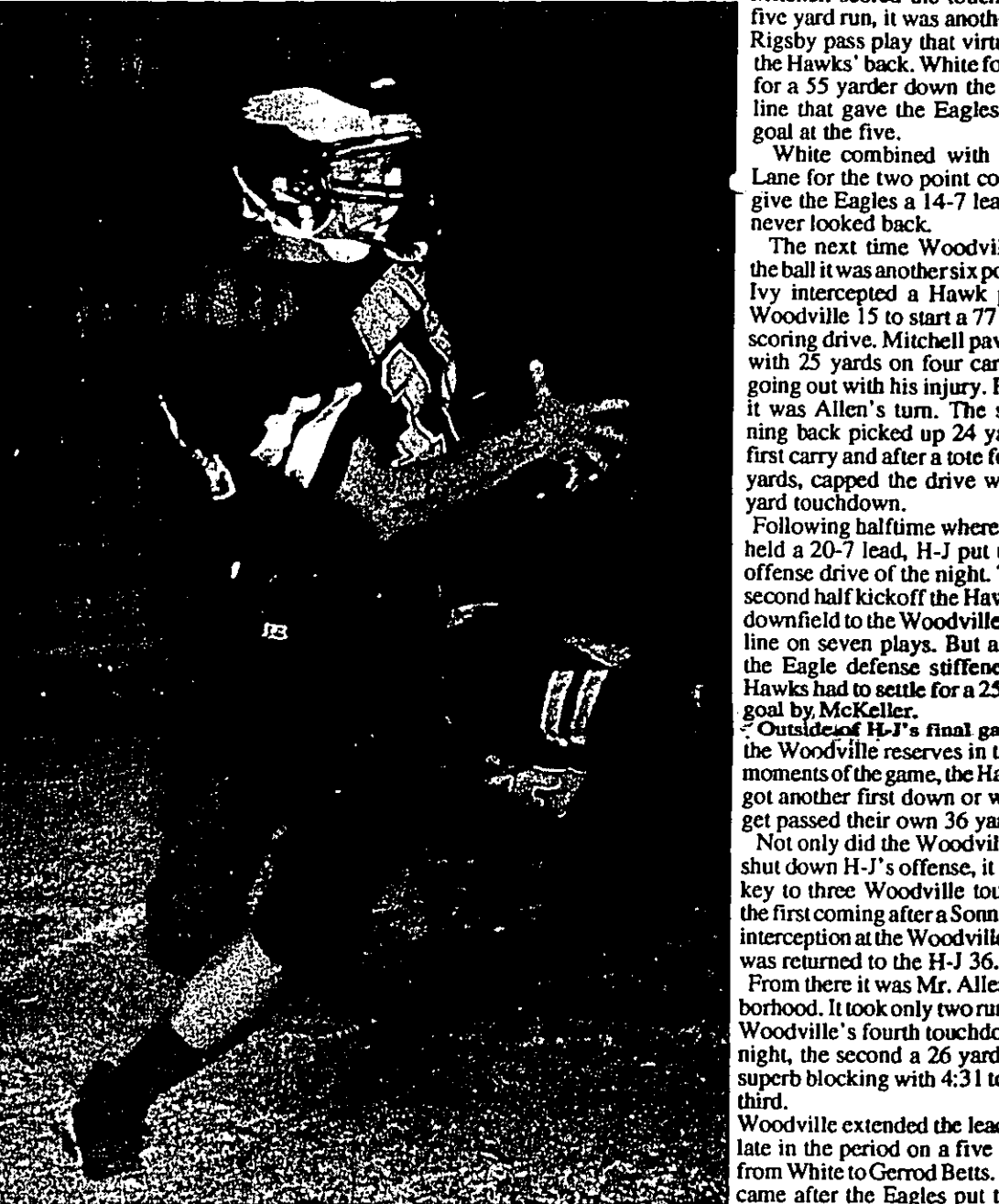
Quick added, "Hardin-Jefferson had been moving the ball real well (last week). A lot of people picked us to lose. Our kids played above and beyond what most people expected us to play. We were in better shape than they were."

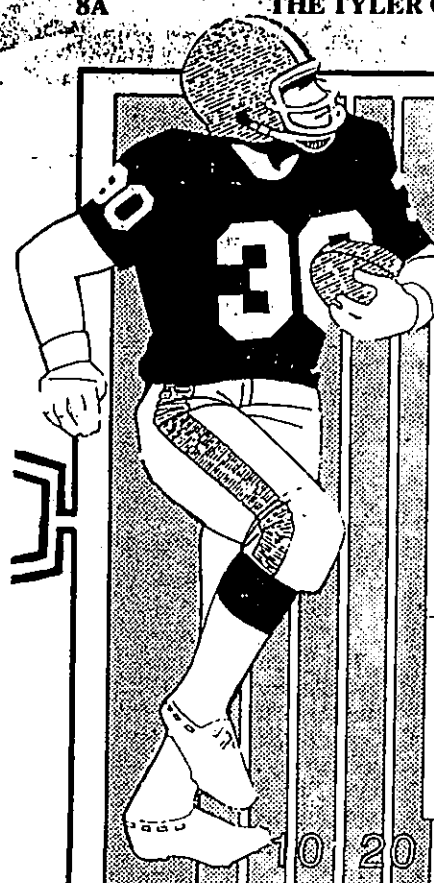

In order to correct the State Water Standards deficiencies, the County of Tyler and Cypress Creek Water Supply Corporation will construct a new water well, two pressure type filters for iron removal, two force draft aerators, 14,000 linear feet of 4 inch raw water line from new well to system's water plant. The County will utilize \$250,000 of TCRP grant funds and \$41,100 of Cypress Creek Water Supply Corporation funds to complete the project.

Finding of No Significant Impact
It has been determined that such a request for release of funds will not constitute an action significantly affecting the quality of the human environment and accordingly the County of Tyler has decided not to prepare an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (P.L. 91-190). The reason for such a decision is that a Statement is based upon the fact that all environmental concerns could either be minimized or mitigated.

An Environmental Review Record for the proposed project has been made by the City of Woodville which documents the environmental review of the project and the City sets forth the reasons why such a statement is not required. The Environmental Review Record is on file at the City Secretary's Office, Woodville City Hall, 113 N. Charlton, and is available for public examination and copying upon request between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., Monday thru Friday.

Public Comments on Findings
All interested agencies, groups and persons disagreeing with this decision are invited to submit written comments for consideration by the City of Woodville to the address set forth above. Such written comments must be received at the address specified within sixteen (16) days after this publication. All such comments so received will be considered and the City will not request the release of funds or take administrative action on the project prior to the date specified in the preceding sentence.

Release of Funds
The County of Tyler will undertake the activities described above with Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I from its Program Year 1994 under grant number 715801 from the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The County of Tyler is certifying to TDHCA that Jerome P. Owens, Jr. in his official capacity as County Judge consents to the release of funds of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to environmental reviews, decision making and action; and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The legal effect of the certification is that upon its approval, the County of Tyler may use the Block Grant funds and it will have satisfied its responsibilities under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969. TDHCA will accept an objection to its approval only on one or more of the bases and the procedures described in 24 CFR Part 58.75. Objections are to be addressed to the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs, P. O. Box 13941, Austin, Texas 78711.

Objections to the release of funds on bases other than those stated above will not be considered by the TDHCA. No objections received later than thirty-three (33) days after this publication will be considered by TDHCA.

The Court will determine if the proposed settlement is fair, reasonable and adequate. All proposed participation in this settlement is voluntary. All Woodward Settlement Class Members who do not timely exclude themselves from the lawsuit will be bound by the Woodward Settlement if it is approved.

I. DEFINITION OF CLASS

Under the Woodward Settlement, Fundal® is defined as chlordaneform or any chlordaneform-containing product, either manufactured, formulated, packaged, distributed or sold by or on behalf of NOR-AM Chemical Company ("NOR-AM") or related parties, regardless of the trade name of the product or any metabolite of Fundal®, including the substances known as COT or SCAT. Galecon® has the same meaning as it did in the Price v. Ciba-Geigy Corp., Civ. No. 94-0647-CB-S (S.D. Ala. 1995), Settlement ("Price Settlement"), and is thus defined as chlordaneform or any chlordaneform-containing product, either manufactured, formulated, packaged, distributed or sold by or on behalf of Ciba-Geigy Corporation or related parties, regardless of the trade name of the product or any metabolite of Galecon®, including the substances known as COT or SCAT.

The Woodward Settlement Class is defined as:

(1) All persons who fall into one of the following categories and who reside in the United States as of the date of filing of the Class Action Complaint, who have been exposed to Fundal® and Galecon® or to Fundal® and Galecon® or to Fundal® only, or to Galecon® only ("NOR-AM Exposed Persons");

a. Exposed Persons: An individual who or not employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company who in the course of his or her employment was exposed to Fundal® while at a plant or site which was involved in mixing, blending, packaging, handling or otherwise formulating pesticides which contained, in whole or in part, Fundal®;

b. Applicants: An individual who or not employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company who in the course of his or her employment, was exposed to Fundal® while involved in the application of pesticides which contained, in whole or in part, Fundal®, including, without limitation, aerial and land applications, bagging, mixing, blending, and other individuals who handled such pesticides prior to or during the application process;

c. Other Covered Workers: (i) An individual employed by NOR-AM Chemical Company who in the course of his or her employment, was exposed to Fundal® in Louisiana and who was exposed to Fundal® in the course of his or her employment; (ii) or an individual who worked in a testing or research laboratory and who was exposed to Fundal®;

(2) The spouses, parents, children, other relatives, or legal representatives of the NOR-AM Exposed Persons described above.

All members of the Price Settlement Class. The Price Settlement Class means all members of the settlement class certified by the court in Price v. Ciba-Geigy Corp., Civ. No. 94-0647-CB-S (S.D. Ala. 1995), excluding the persons determined by the court to be outside of that class. This settlement class thus includes persons residing in the United States who in the course of their employment were exposed to Galecon® or to Galecon® and Fundal® ("Ciba-Geigy Exposed Persons"), and the spouses, parents, children, other relatives and legal representatives of the Ciba-Geigy Exposed Persons described above.

(Collectively "Woodward Settlement Class Members" or "Class Exposed Persons") you are a Woodward Settlement Class Member whether or not you have been diagnosed with an illness. The total package of benefits potentially available to a NOR-AM Exposed Person is the same as the total package of benefits potentially available to a Ciba-Geigy Exposed Person. Thus, Woodward Settlement Class Members may be eligible for the same benefits whether they were occupationally exposed to Fundal® only, or to Fundal® and Galecon®, or to Galecon® only.

(1) **THE NOR-AM Medical Monitoring and Treatment Fund ("THE NOR-AM MMT Fund")**

The NOR-AM DCA Fund will make cash payments of up to \$250,500 on behalf of a NOR-AM Exposed Person who, after exposure to Fundal® only, has developed or in the future develops the form of bladder cancer alleged to be associated with Fundal®. V. RIGHTS AND OPTIONS OF WOODWARD SETTLEMENT CLASS MEMBERS

If you are a Woodward Settlement Class Member, you have the following options:

(1) You may do nothing and remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member. If you choose to take no action, your interests as a member of the Woodward Settlement Class will be represented by the Class Representatives and Class Counsel at no cost to you.

(2) You may remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member and either represent yourself or hire your own attorney to represent you at your own cost.

(3) You may remain a Woodward Settlement Class Member and object to the settlement.


