Involved and so complicated. Luckily for me, a lot of my relatives keep good records," Kitchings says. One of Kitchings relatives, Joyce Collier Clegier, supplied information on one branch of the family (Collier) back to the year 1455 with information on how the name came to be in the year 1175. Another relative, Jimmie Williams, loaned Kitchings 4 very large 3-ring binders filled with family history information.

Kitchings also has obtained information through the genealogical department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (the Mormon Church). The Mormon Church has one of the largest genealogical libraries in the world. Most of the church's records are on computer or on microfiche coming from census records, land records, social security files, different church records, and individuals, such as Kitchings, who donate their records to the church. The church does not charge the individual to access their computers but does charge to print information off their printers to cover paper costs.

Kitchings has been amazed by the things she has found out about her family. For instance, "Kitchings says, "I found out one of my ancestors, Benjamin Collier, was the founder and first citizen of Blakely, Georgia, passing away January 17, 1846, and that a first cousin of mine that I haven't seen in 20 to 25 years, Gene Ratcliff, owns a business not five miles from my front door." Kitchings appears to really be enjoying herself.

If you think you might be related to Kelly Ratcliff Kitchings, please write her at 2409 Sunnyvale Road, Grand Prairie, Texas 75050. Any relative that supplies information to benefit her is adding to the family tree will receive a copy once the tree is completed. Her goal is to have it finished by Christmas 1995. Kitchings also adds that since paper costs, computer costs, and postage costs are costing her a small fortune that only one copy will be given per individual family. While Kitchings is not charging anyone for a copy of the family tree, donations will be accepted to defray the costs of postage, paper, and other supplies.

Prison System ready to help counties rent empty jails to other states.

Austin: The Texas Department of Criminal Justice is looking into the possibility of serving as an official conduit to help Texas counties lease empty county jail space to other states. Such a move might immediately match Dallas County's empty beds to the needs of the state of Massachusetts, TDCJ officials said Friday.

"With the help of the Jail Standards Commission, TDCJ can bring the counties and the other states together for their mutual benefit and that's a service we should perform," said Allan B. Polunsky, chairman of the Texas Board of Criminal Justice.

Many Texas counties have found themselves paying mortgages on empty jail space since this summer when TDCJ's massive prison expansion program cleared the backlog of state prisoners out of the county jails.

At the same time, many other states, which have not had aggressive prison expansion found themselves confronted with prisoner backlogs and have decided they would rather rent expansion found themselves con-

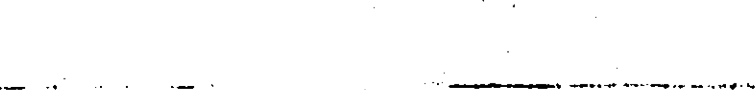

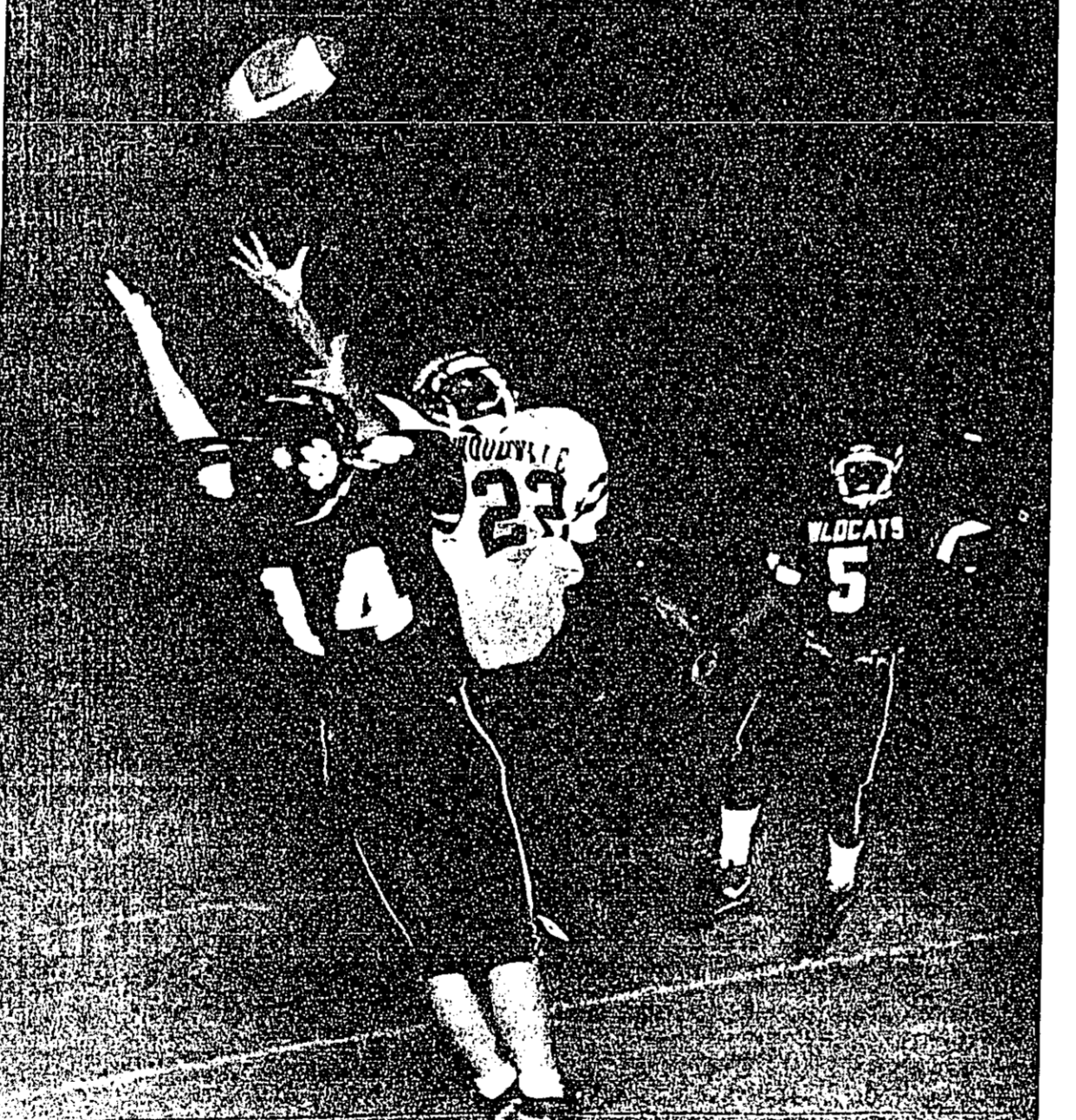
Woodville Eagles pound Kirbyville for third win

KIRBYVILLE—The Kirbyville Wildcats proved a point, but in the process lost a lot more Friday night. Using an eight man front most of the night the Wildcats were able to shut down Woodville's running game, a.k.a. Juan Mitchell and Craig Lewis, but in doing so they left the airways open to DeMarcus White and his band of fleet footed receivers.

When the final flag was finally thrown, the Eagles walked out of town with an impressive 41-12 victory, their third of the season. To way White was on target Friday night is skin to saying that Robin Hood did a pretty fair job with a bow and arrow. The Woodville sophomore connected for eight passes, four of which were to the endzone. White's receiving corps included Bryan Rigby, who caught three passes, including two for touchdowns, Juan Mitchell, who caught a touchdown pass and two other passes, and Gerrod Betts, who snagged a pair of passes, one for a touchdown. Mitchell opened the door for all of the fireworks the second time Woodville touched the ball. Working from the Wildcat 40 yard line on their second play from scrimmage, Mitchell set sail on a 46 yard touchdown romp, his longest gallop of the night. A Gerrod Betts kick, the first successful extra point kick by Woodville all season, gave Woodville 7-0 lead with 9:20 remaining in the first quarter. With Kirbyville set to stop Mitchell, White and his aerial circus then kicked into gear later in the period when he found Rigby on a 55 yard scoring strike with 3:30 left on the clock. It was a picture perfect performance by both White and Rigby. The Eagle speedster caressed the ball in full stride at the Kirbyville 25 and strode on into the endzone to give the Eagles a 13-0 lead. Betts' second attempt hit the

Woodville also dropped a two game match to Kirbyville in district play. The Lady Wildcats took the games, 15-7, 15-13.

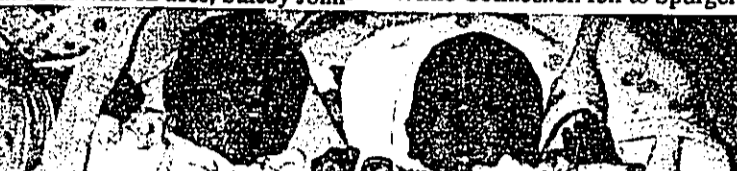
The Lady Eagles will next play Newton at home Friday and host Warren at home Tuesday.

district play, splitting a three game set 14-16, 15-10, 15-13, they did blank Burkeville in two games.

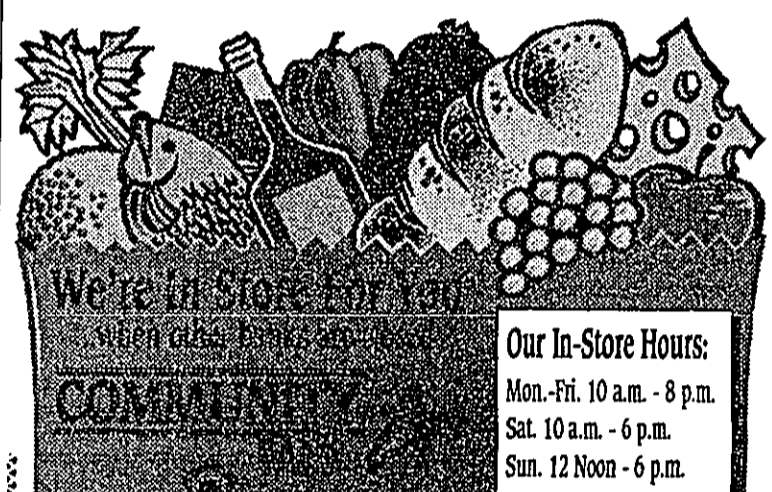
The victory moved their season record to 6-6.

Chester's Jake David hoping to win

Chester High school Junior Jake David, son of John and Nancy David,

of Chester, will be showing a registered Gurnsey dairy heifer this year. The name on the papers is "Lavonas Domineque Rub". "I was born in the heifer bought earlier this year at Texas only Guernsey Ranch near Plano, Texas. The purchase started by David winning at the Calf Scramble at the Houston Livestock Show earlier this year. David says "hopefully" he will show his dairy cow at several more shows this year, ending up at the National Guernsey Show in Memphis next year. He was invited by two different parties to show at the national show this year. Judges look for "dairy character" a large barrel, a large heart girth, thin not fat, according to David which requires care in feeding. "You have to monitor what they eat, using how big a frame the cow has. You gradually feed enough to where she can grow and have a little weight." David has shown animals in the Tyler County Fair since he was eight years old. He has grown rabbits, goats, chickens, guineas, quail, pigeons, pigs, horses, cows and of these he has raised goats, steers, breeding beef cattle, dairy cows and pigs for show. Jake David is the youngest of the three David children who have shown animals in the Tyler County Fair. Jake has been President of the Chester FFA, a President of the Chester 4-H for the last two years and is reporter of the Junior Class at Chester High School. He is one of my better students" says Chester Agriculture Teacher Havis. He has applied in the past for the FFA Star District Greenhand award and applied for the Star District Degree award." David has now applied for the Lone Star FFA chapter award. He is on the Chester Chapters' Parliamentary leadership and forestry Judging teams. He runs cross-country is on the track team, plays basketball and tennis at Chester. He plans to attend Texas A&M and become a veterinarian after high school. Chester Agriculture Teacher Havis describes Chester School District's agriculture program as "balanced." "We don't place as much emphasis on showing animals as do some other programs; we have a strong shop program and also emphasis on a number of activities."

"We will have leadership contests and will be involved in wildlife contest later in the fall. We will have dairy cows and livestock judging in the spring. There are 46 students in FFA and we try to keep active in area and district activities. Our chapter is small but we try to stay as busy and active as we can. "Our program "continues Havis" does emphasize agriculture mechanics as the students will get more benefit from that in the long run. A good balance to a program is needed but really good kids like a program good."

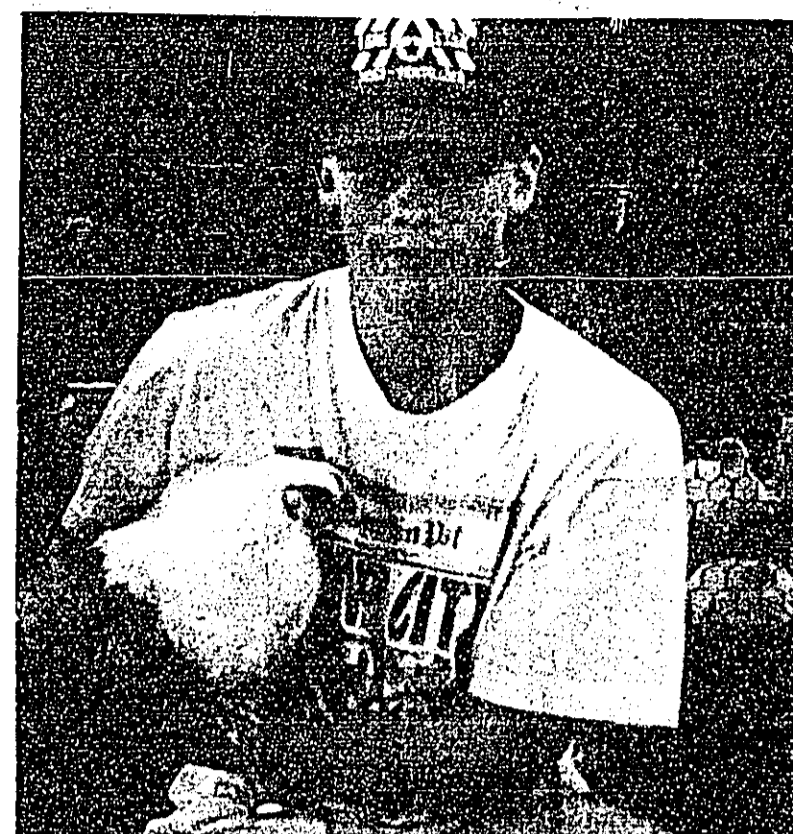

Warren's Davis shows steer, chickens and swine



DANIEL DAVIS, of Fred, is shown with one of his five chickens which will be shown at the Tyler County Fair this Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Oct. 5-7. He will also be entering a steer and a pig named "Buddy".

Daniel Davis son of Roger and Geraldine Davis, of Fred, will be showing animals for his fourth year at the Tyler County Fair. He will be showing chickens, a pig and a steer. He will pick the best five of the chickens he has raised for show. He says that the judges will look at the chicken and feel breast and thighs for quality of meat. He is proudest of the steer he has raised for show.

"If a student cannot find something in this program to catch their interest then they're just not interested in much." We have 8 or 9 different types of judging contests, then we have classes in all the scientific areas of agriculture. There is the metal work training, life skills training which includes preparing resumes, job interviewing, public speaking, and training in conducting meetings. There are also courses in ag mechanics and food technology. There is a wildlife course which teaches about different types of wildlife, gun safety, and hunting laws; a course in home maintenance which stresses repair and construction. Our main objective is to try to touch every kid in some way - there may be a good shop hand sort of student, and next to him one who never plans to get his hands dirty, there is something for them all."

When choosing a steer for purchase Daniel says, "I remember walking up on a group of steers. All you could see was black, but in the middle suddenly you could see this steer who had been standing in a hole, but after stepping up was half a head taller than the rest. The group kind of separated and this steer came over to me and I began petting it." He says the steer is now weighs 650 pounds. "It has been a lot of work but I'm glad I did it." Davis's pig is named "Buddy." Davis says the judges will look for muscle and a lean structure. He plans to auction if "Buddy" places or sell at the set fee if it doesn't.

As a member of Warren FFA Daniel was given the Star Greenhand Award. As a sophomore student in Warren he is a quarterback of the J-V Football team. "His career plans currently are to go to college and eventually become an agriculture teacher. "Because I really like working with animals," Daniel is currently raising seven head of cattle in the field behind his family's home.

Warren Agriculture Teacher Rex Currie says Davis is extremely involved for a sophomore student. His depth of involvement has changed. Currie said, and Davis has decided he wants to be an agriculture teacher. He is involved in the FFA chapter leadership training team, and training for the livestock. "Whenever we go somewhere, he goes with us."

Speaking of the Warren Program, Currie says that, "On October 14 we will go to the Beaumont Fair with a livestock judging team. You cannot go to the steer show from here that's only from Jefferson, Hardin, Orange and Chamber's counties." We will participate in a leadership training contest in November and will be training for that meeting before school in the morning. Many kids because of their class schedules may have to meet before school or say during lunch to be involved. "These kids have to be dedicated to put in the efforts they do."

Currie says the Warren Program includes some 160 students. "We must have a record membership this year as we have 63 freshman members" Currie describes his program as "Well

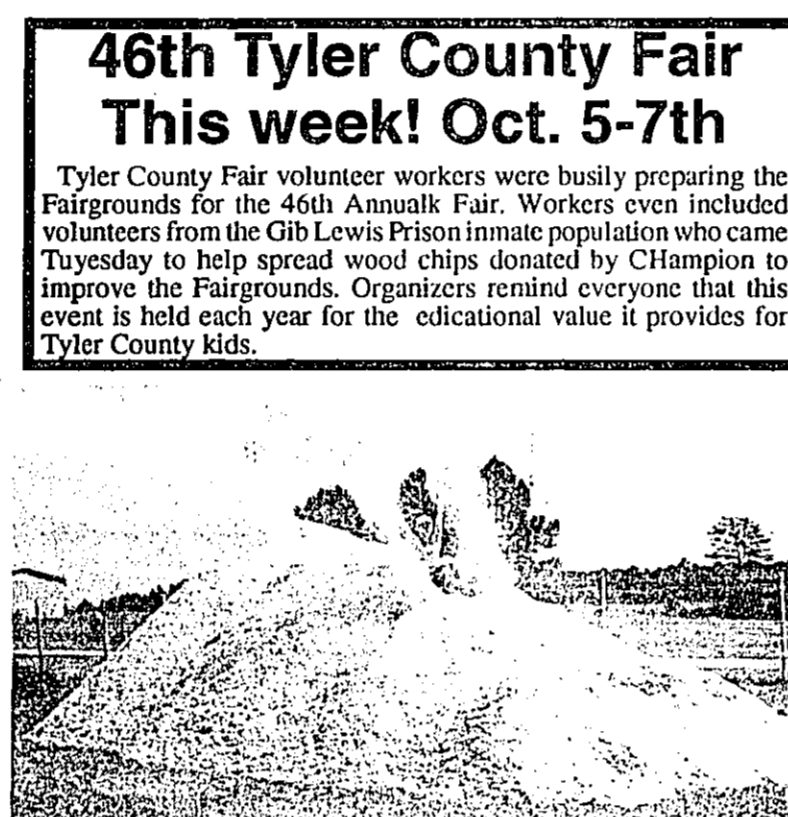

Spurger active 4-Her: Nicole Rebbe to enter lamb and pig

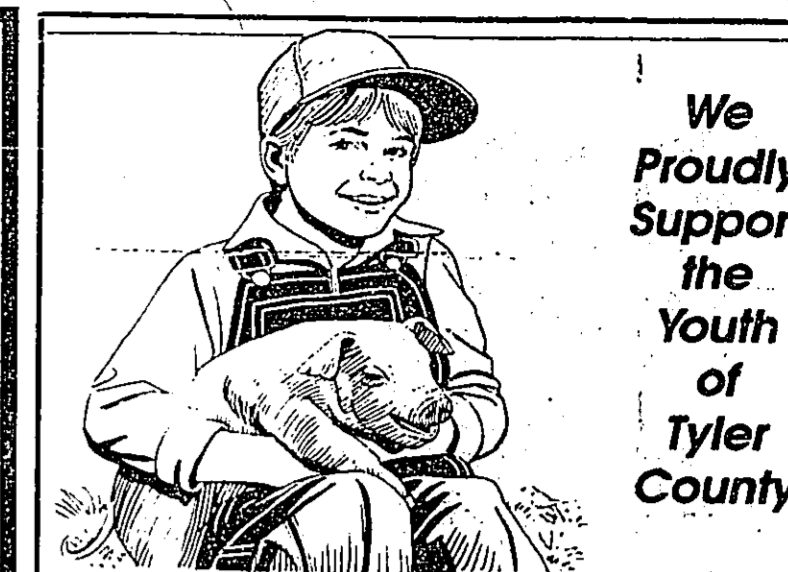

Brochtrup's younger sister Brooke and younger brother Clint also will show animals at the fair for the third year. Brochtrup plans to attend Texas A&M University after graduation for a career as a veterinarian.

Brochtrup's Agriculture teacher Sheffield at Woodville High School describes him as real capable and a real hard worker but real reserved. Brochtrup works part-time at a feed store and is the Woodville FFA Chapter's Treasurer.

Sheffield describes the Woodville District's program as a balance of training and productive application of that learning.

"We have a pretty mixture of productivity and science. Classes in Plant and soil science, forestry, wildlife technology.

"Introduction to agriculture mechanics," he says, this shop program is very productivity oriented. The program has a farm east of Woodville, "35 acres with cattle on it to be used productively."

"We have at least one fund-raiser running all the time" says Sheffield of his program which has 120 plus students enrolled, and, "We have built

and sold deer stands to teach carpentry; we are building four trailers along with hay rings, animal feeders and other items in shop courses. We will start up a turkey and ham sale for Thanksgiving and sell fruit for Christmas."

October is Wildlife contest and they are now competing at district in leadership contest. One young man will compete in the Houston Livestock

Rodeo Calf Scramble in Houston in February. Spring classes in soil and plant science will use the greenhouse to produce bedding plants. Sheffield says there will be some flowering plants but most of the bedding plants will be vegetable garden plants. "We start off in a hurry and our students get a lot more experience with their hands as well as book learning," concludes Sheffield.

Involved and so complicated. Luckily for me, a lot of my relatives keep good records," Kitchings says. One of Kitchings' relatives, Joyce Collier Gieger, supplied information on one branch of the family (Collier) back to the year 1433 with information on how the name came to be in the year 1175. Another relative, Linnie Williams, loaned Kitchings a very large 3-ring binder filled with family history information. Kitchings also has obtained information through the genealogical department of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints (the Mormon Church). The Mormon Church has one of the largest genealogical libraries in the world. Most of the church's records are on computer or on microfiche coming from census records, land records, social security files, different church records, and individuals, such as Kitchings, who donate their records to the church. The church does not charge the individual to access their computer but does charge to print information off their printers to cover paper costs.

Kitchings has been amazed by the things she has found out about her family. For instance, "Kitchings says, "I found out one of my ancestors, Benjamin Collier, was the founder and first citizen of Blakely, Georgia, passing away January 17, 1846, and that a first cousin of mine that I haven't seen in 20 to 25 years, Gene Ratcliff, owns a business not five miles from my front door." Kitchings appears to really be enjoying herself. If you think you might be related to Kally Ratcliff Kitchings, please write her at 2405 Sunnyvale Road, Grand Prairie, Texas 75050. Any relative who supplies information to benefit her in adding to the family tree will receive a copy once the tree is completed. Her goal is to have it finished by Christmas 1995. Kitchings also adds that since paper costs, computer costs, and postage costs are costing her a small fortune that only one copy will be given per individual family. While Kitchings is not charging anyone for a copy of the family tree, donations will be accepted to defray the cost of postage, paper, and other supplies.

Prison Sytem ready to help counties rent empty jails to other states.

Austin-The Texas Department of Criminal Justice is looking into the possibility of serving as an official conduit to help Texas counties lease empty county jail space to other states. Such a move might immediately match Dallas County's empty beds to the needs of the state of Massachusetts, TDCJ officials said Friday. "With the help of the Jail Standards Commission, TDCJ can bring the counties and the other states together to their mutual benefit and that's a service we should perform," said Allan B. Polunsky, chairman of the Texas Board of Criminal Justice. Many Texas counties have found themselves paying mortgages on empty jail space since this summer when TDCJ's massive prison expansion program cleared the backlog of state prisoners out of the county jails. At the same time, many other states which have not had aggressive prison expansion found themselves confronted with prisoner backlogs and have decided they would rather rent empty jail space to other states. 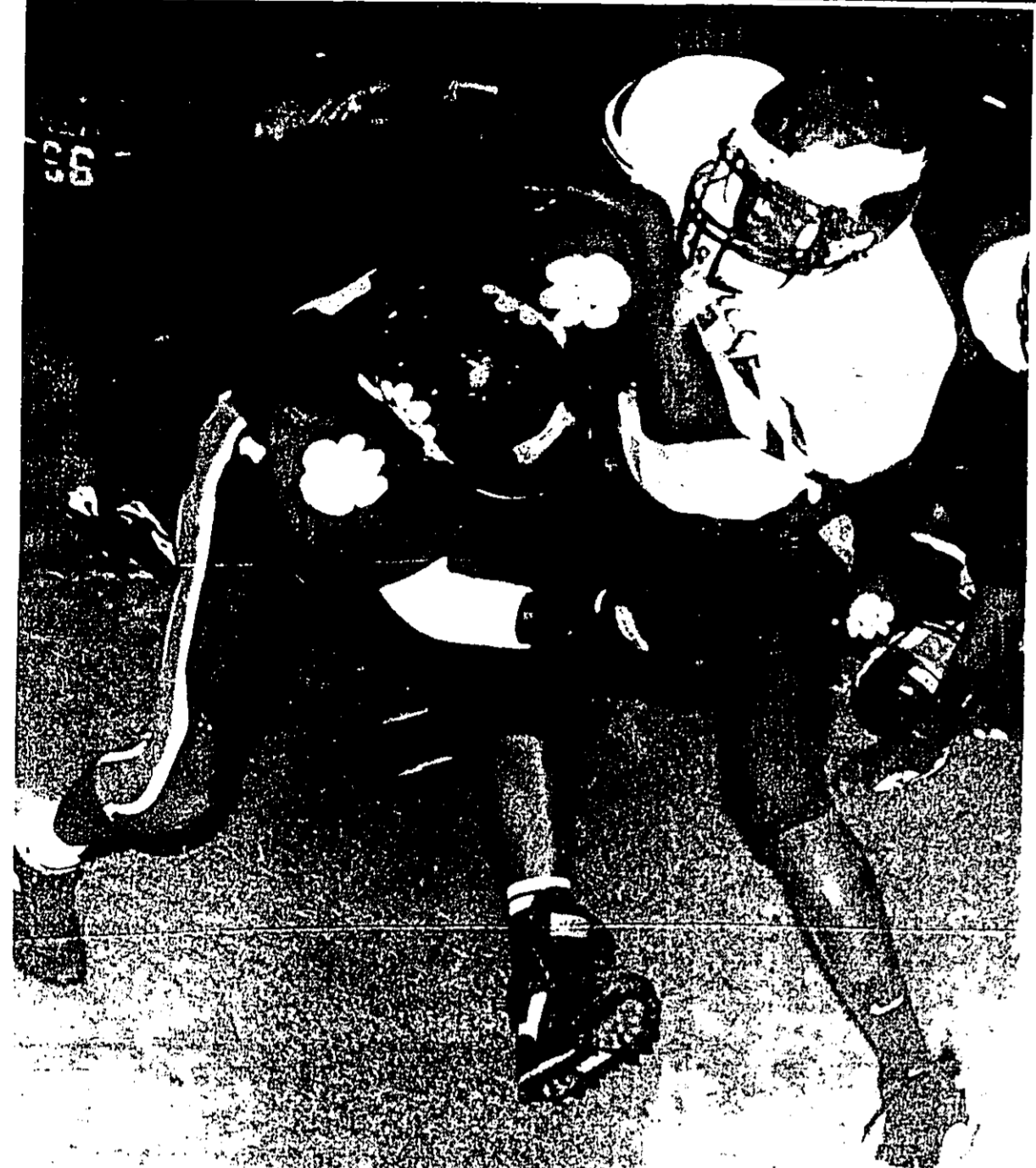

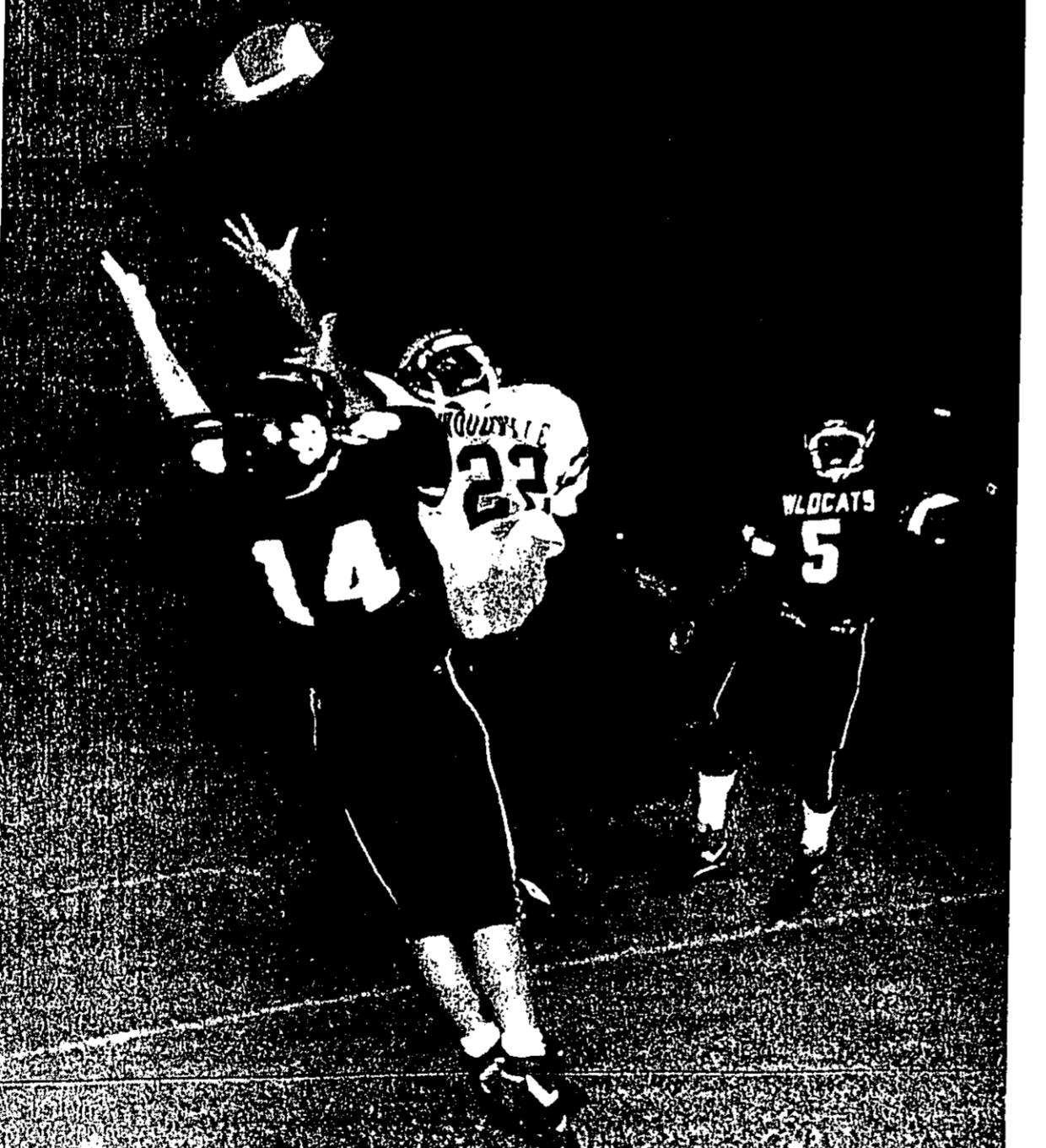

The split gives Warren a 3-3 mark in district play.

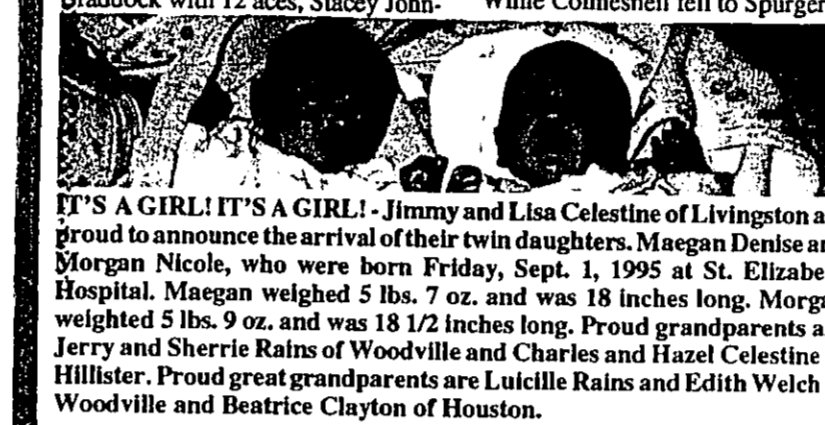
Meanwhile, the Warren junior varsity and freshmen teams captured first place at the Warren tournament Saturday.

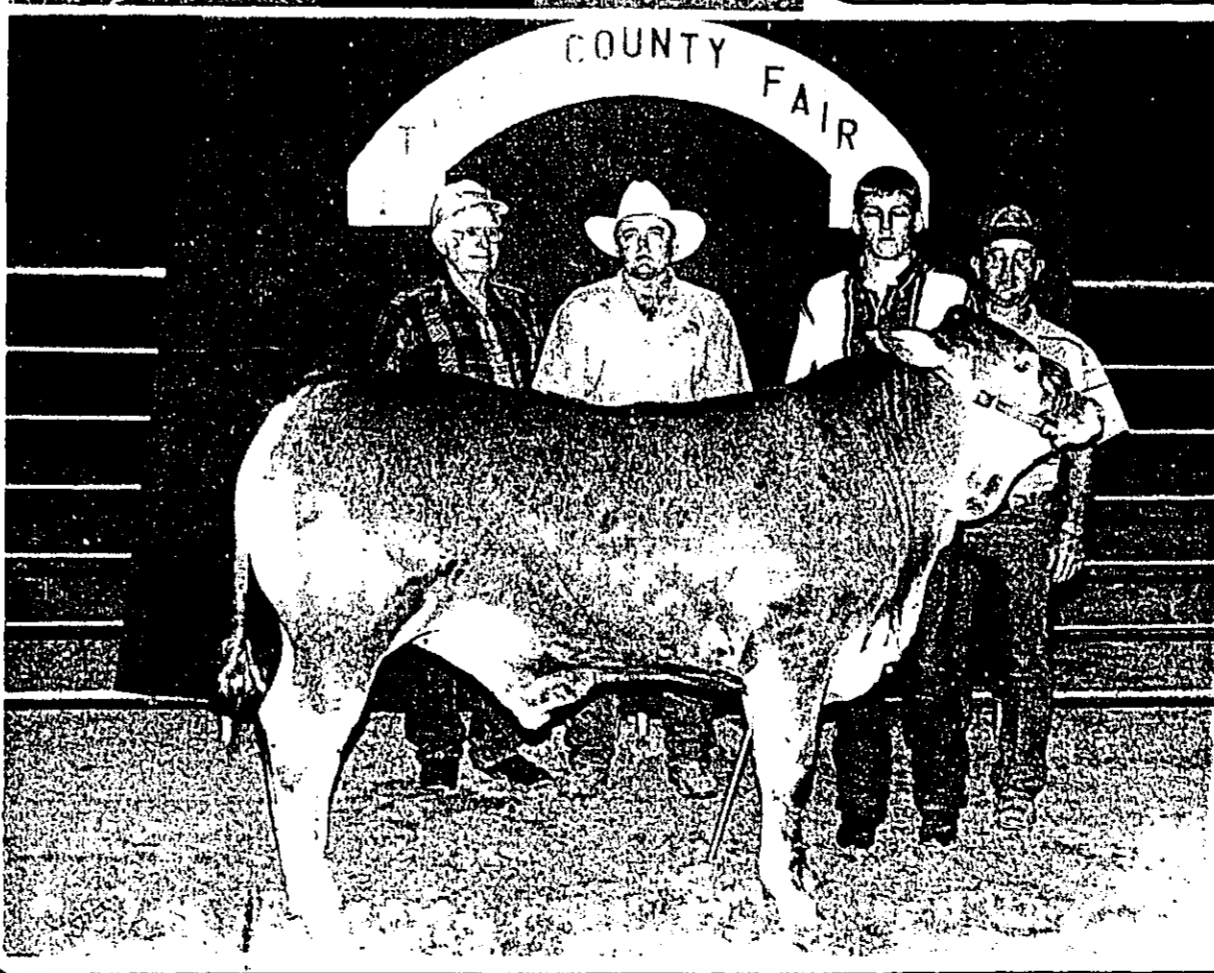
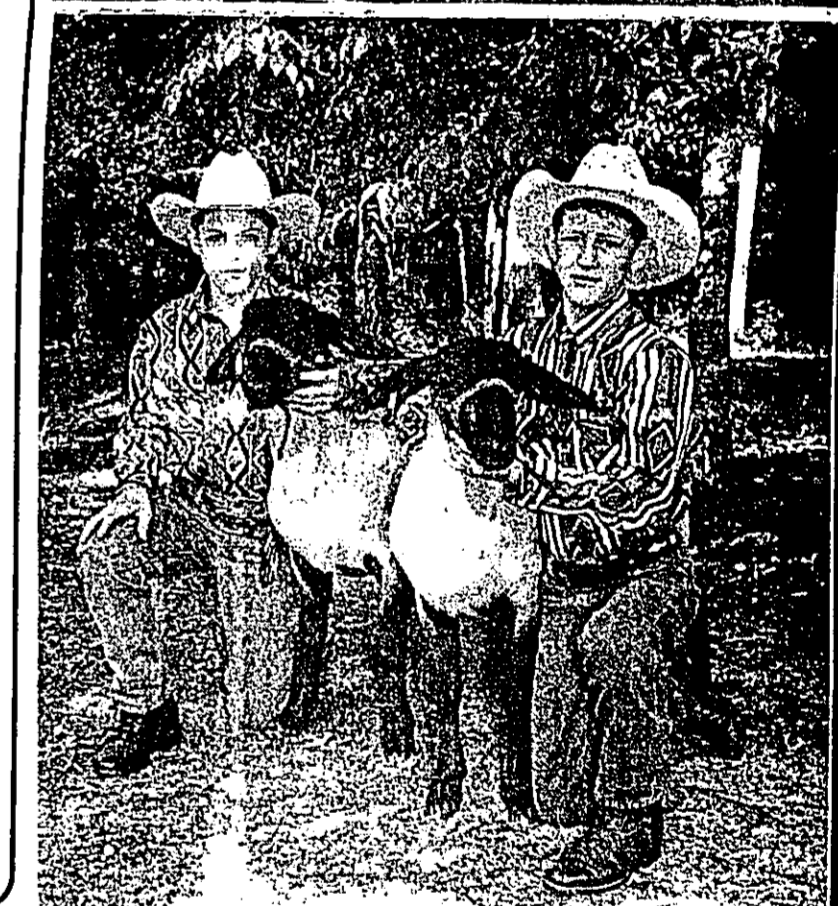

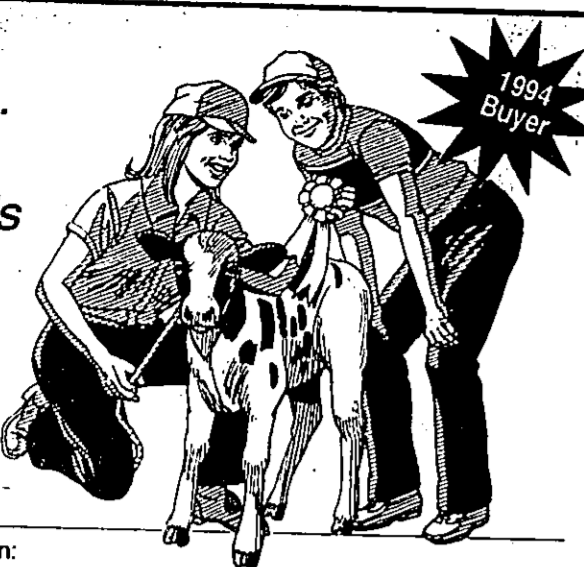

Chester's Jake David hoping to win

Chester High school Junior Jake David, son of John and Nancy David,

of Chester, will be showing a registered Gurnsey dairy heifer this year. "The name on the papers is 'Lavonas Domineque Rub,'" says David of the heifer bought earlier this year at Texas only Gurnsey Ranch near Plano, Texas. The purchase started by David winning at the Calf Scramble at the Houston Livestock Show earlier this year. David says "hopefully" he will show his dairy cow at several more shows this year, ending up at the National Gurnsey Show in Memphis next year. He was invited by two different parties to show at the national show this year. Judges look for "dairy character" a large barrel, a large heart girth, thin not fat, according to David which requires care in feeding. "You have to monitor what they eat, using how big a frame the cow has. You gradually feed enough to where she can grow and have a little weight." David has shown animals in the Tyler County Fair since he was eight years old. He has grown rabbits, goats, chickens, guinea, quail, pigeons, pigs, horses, cows and of these he has raised goats, steers, breeding beef cattle, dairy cows and pigs for show. Jake David is the youngest of the three David children who have shown animals in the Tyler County Fair. Jake has been President of the Chester FFA, a President of the Chester 4-H for the last two years and is reporter of the Junior Class at Chester High School. He is one of my better students," says Chester Agriculture Teacher Havis. "He has applied in the past for the FFA Star District Greenhand award and applied for the Star District Degree award." David has now applied

for the Lone Star FFA chapter award. He is on the Chester Chapters' Parliamentary leadership and forestry judging teams. He runs cross-country in the spring. There are 46 students in FFA and we try to keep active in area and district activities. Our chapter is small but we try to stay as busy and active as we can. "Our program" continues Havis "does emphasize agriculture mechanics as well as leadership and forestry. We don't place as much emphasis on showing animals as do some other programs; we have a strong shop program and also emphasis on a number of activities."

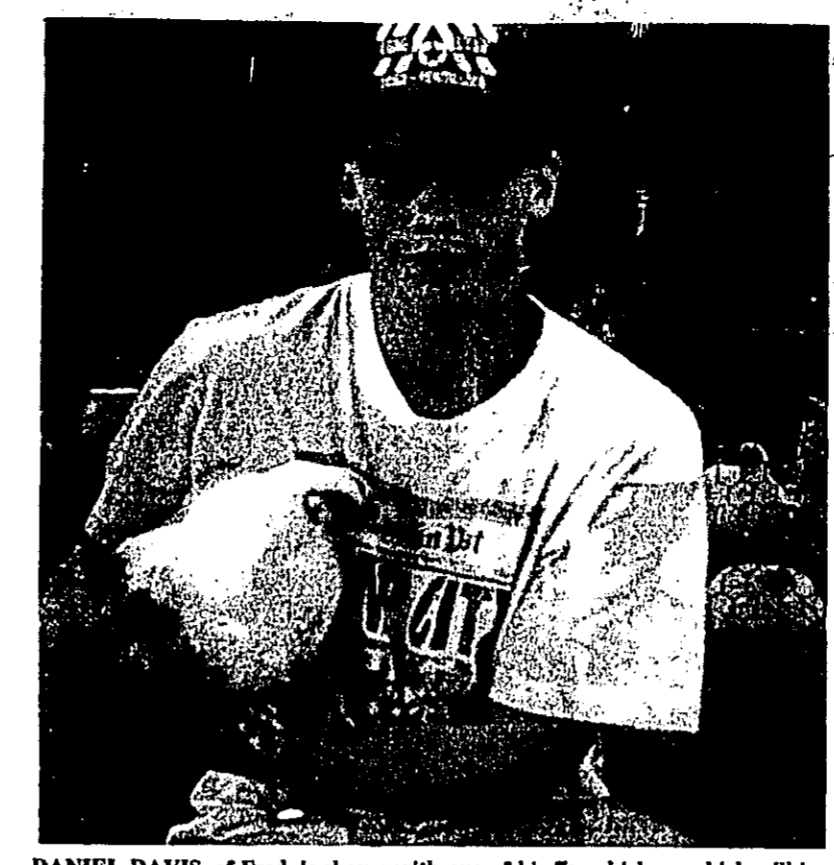

Warren's Davis shows steer, chickens and swine

Daniel Davis son of Roger and Geraldine Davis, of Fred, will be showing animals for his fourth year at the Tyler County Fair. He will be showing chickens, a pig and a steer. He will pick the best five of the chickens he has raised for show. He says that the judges will look at the chicken and feel breast and thighs for quality of meat. He is proudest of the steer he has raised for show. When choosing a steer for purchase Daniel says, "I remember walking up on a group of steers. All you could see was black, but in the middle suddenly you could see this steer who had been standing in a hole, but after stepping up was half a head taller than the rest. The group kind of separated and this steer came over to me and I began petting it." He says the steer is now weighs 650 pounds. "It has been a lot of work but I'm glad I did it." Davis's pig named "Buddy." Davis says the judges will look for muscle and a lean structure. He plans to auction if "Buddy" places or sell at the set fee if it does. As a member of Warren FFA Daniel was given the Star Greenhand Award. As a sophomore student at Warren he is a quarterback of the J-V football team. "His career plans currently are to go to college and eventually become an agriculture teacher. "Because I really like working with animals," Daniel is currently raising seven head of cattle in the field behind his family's home. Warren Agriculture Teacher Rex Currie says Davis is extremely involved for a sophomore student. His depth of involvement has changed, Currie said, and Davis has decided he wants to be an agriculture teacher. He is involved in the FFA chapter leadership training team, the poultry judging team, and training for the livestock. "Whenever we go somewhere, he goes with us." Speaking of the Warren Program, Currie says that, "On October 14 we will go to the Beaumont Fair with a livestock judging team. You cannot go to the steer show from here that's only from Jefferson, Hardin, Orange and Chamber's counties." We will participate in a leadership training contest in November and will be training for that meeting before school in the morning. Many kids because of their class schedules may have to meet before school or say during lunch to be involved. "These kids have to be dedicated to put in the efforts they do."

Currie says the Warren Program includes some 160 students. "We must have a record membership this year as we have 63 freshman members" Currie describes his program as "Well balanced". If a student cannot find something in this program to catch their interest then they're just not interested in much. "We have 8 or 9 different types of judging contests, then we have classes in all the scientific areas of agriculture. There is the metal work training, life skills training which includes preparing resumes, job interviewing, public speaking, and training in conducting meetings. There are also courses in ag mechanics and food technology. There is a wildlife course which teaches about different types of wildlife, gun safety, and hunting laws; a course in home maintenance which stresses repair and construction." Our main objective is to try to touch every kid in some way - there may be a good shop hand sort of student, and next to him one who never plans to get his hands dirty there is something for them all."

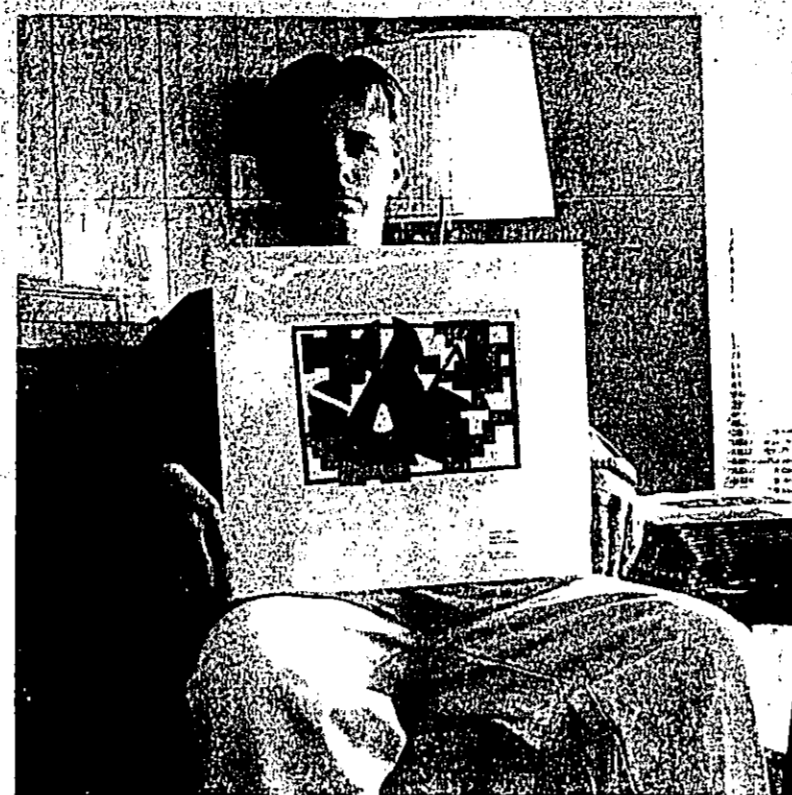

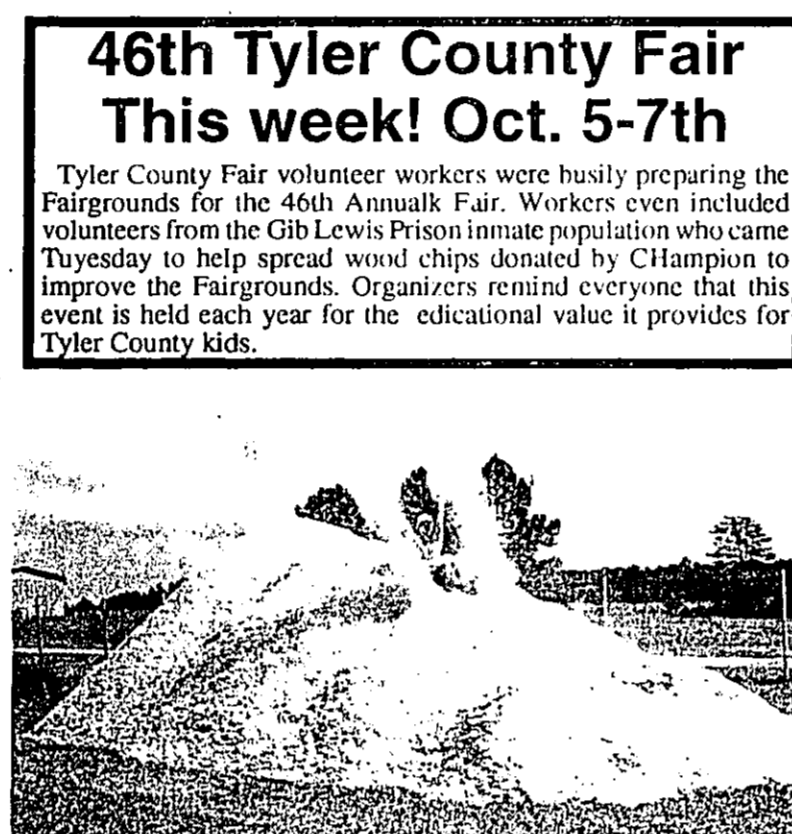

Seventeen year old Dane Brochtrup, a senior at Woodville High School, will show a dairy heifer and steer at this year's Tyler County Fair.

Brochtrup, son of Steve and Carol Havis, of Chester, has been showing animals at the Tyler County Fair for five years. It will be the third year for Dane's Brown Swiss dairy cow which won Grand Champion at last year's Tyler County Fair and won sixth in class at the Houston show last year.

Brochtrup used money won from the Houston Livestock show calf scramble three years ago to purchase his dairy cow. Brochtrup will also show a Beefmaster steer. He has shown steers the last three years also.

Brochtrup's younger sister Brooke and younger brother Clint also will show animals at the fair for the third year. Brochtrup plans to attend Texas A&M University after graduation for a career as a veterinarian.

Brochtrup's Agriculture teacher Sheffield at Woodville High School describes him as real capable and a real hard worker but real reserved. Brochtrup works part-time at a feed store and is the Woodville FFA Chapter's Treasurer.

Sheffield describes the Woodville District's program as a balance of training and productive application of that learning.

"We have a pretty mixture of productivity and science. Classes in Plant and soil science, forestry, wildlife technology.

"Introduction to agriculture mechanics," he says, this shop program is very productivity oriented. The program has a farm east of Woodville, "35 acres with cattle on it to be used productively."

"We have at least one fund-raiser running all the time," says Sheffield of his program which has 120 plus students enrolled, and, "We have built

and sold deer stands to teach carpentry; we are building four trailers along with hay rings, animal feeders and other items in shop courses. We will start up a turkey and ham sale for Thanksgiving and sell fruit for Christmas."

October is Wildlife contest and they are now competing at district in leadership contest. One young man will compete in the Houston Livestock

Rodeo Calf Scramble in Houston in February. Spring classes in soil and plant science will use the greenhouse to produce bedding plants. Sheffield says there will be some flowering plants but most of the bedding plants will be vegetable garden plants. "We start off in a hurry and our students get a lot more experience with their hands as well as book learning," concludes Sheffield.

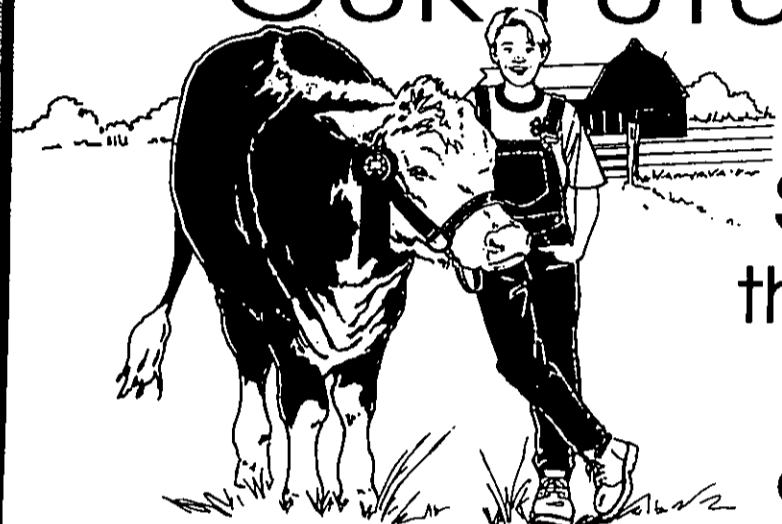

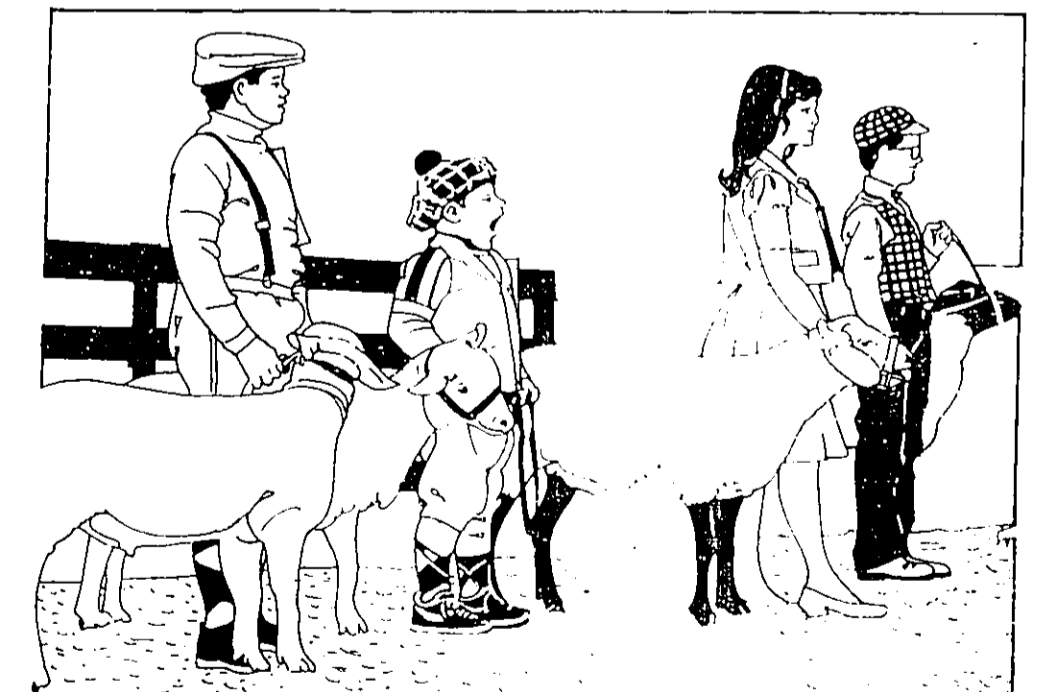

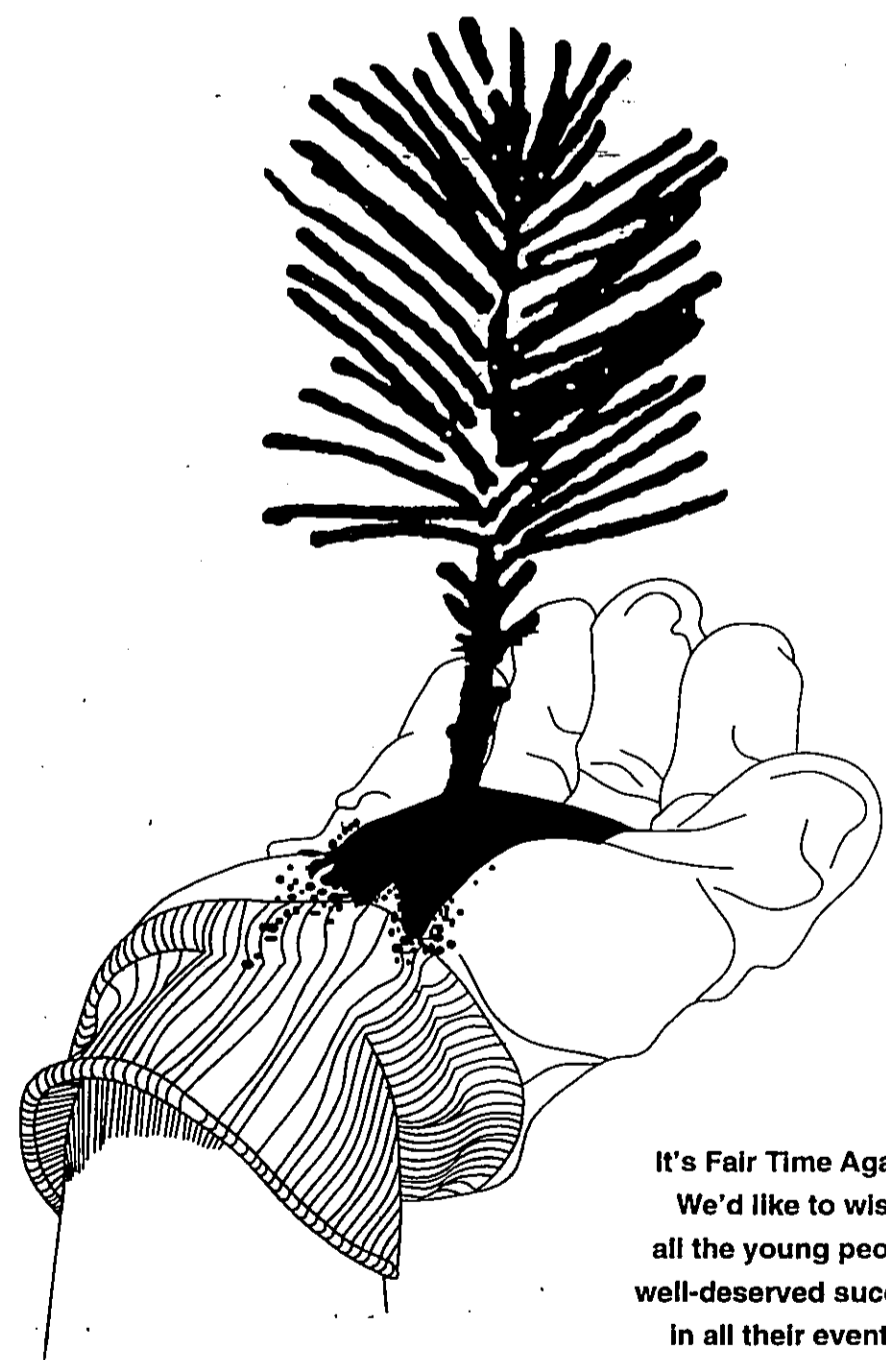

Colmesneil's Seamons Serious with Simmental's and swine

Colmesneil High School Junior Lance Seamons, Jr. will show a pig and three Simmentals heifers at this year's Tyler County Fair. One Simmental is red, one white, and one black. Seamons, son of Larry and Sammie Seamons, of Colmesneil, has been showing animals at the local county fair since he was eight years old. The pig he will be showing this year is a Impact Hamp-York cross bought on May 13, and currently weighing 235 pounds.

Tyler County native Seamons has been showing simmental heifers since his freshman year, and will show them in 15-20 shows this year "about once every two weeks since the Fourth of July." One of his Simmentals won Reserve Grand Champion at last year's Tyler County Fair. Seamons says the criteria for judging beef cattle has changed over the years with this year's fair judges "will be looking for beef that is muscular and lean with no fat and the judges seem to be favoring the black Simmentals."

FFA member Seamons career plans are to be a veterinarian and "to raise Simmental cattle" and in addition plays baseball for Colmesneil.

Colmesneil Agriculture Teacher Andy Gresham describes Seamons as one of the more active leaders in FFA holding the position of Vice-President of the Colmesneil chapter. "You can tell by the layout of their farm that they are real serious about this; it's a real pleasure to have someone like that as a leader in our program."

Gresham says the Colmesneil program is into showing heifers and barrows in major shows. This year that will include the Beaumont Fair, the Houston Livestock Show and the San Antonio Livestock Show. The program is active in leadership competition and other competitive team activities of FFA. "We get all kids involved in our program, we get them out and involved in just about everything they could be interested in. Gresham says one key to keeping involvement high has been the strong support of the school administration and parents in our program. "We have about 100 students involved in our program and for a school our size that is good. Our Program places emphasis on showing animals which teaches responsibility more than most people realize. Some of the students may never raise another steer or pig again but something learned out of that experience the student will keep and use again." "The support we have behind us from our community is important to the pride and self-esteem of our students. It is so good for them to know they have this community and school behind them," concludes Gresham.

Viruses, bacteria subjects of best seller books

Killer viruses and deadly bacteria have new-found stardom. They are the subjects of best-selling books, such as *The Hot Zone*. They are current book-office hits in movies, such as *Outbreak*. And they are featured on this season's top television shows, such as the highly acclaimed *ER* and *Chicago Hope*. But the real-life drama of these microbial villains unfolds daily at the Texas Department of Health Laboratory, under the bright lights of Hollywood, that real mysteries are solved and real lives are saved. Public health's new interest in microorganisms is not new. The first TDH laboratory was opened in 1912. Back then, the laboratory performed diagnostic tests for infectious diseases, such as diphtheria, typhoid fever, tuberculosis and malaria—helping to control the leading causes of death at that time. It also analyzed food and water for disease-causing bacteria. Today, the primary role of the laboratory remains unchanged to provide the highest quality analytical services for the protection and improvement of the health of all Texans. But now the laboratory is even more important to your health and mine. Rapid global transportation means that each of us is rarely more than 24 hours' travel time from exposure to deadly bacteria, viruses and other microorganisms—such as the Ebola virus now wreaking havoc in Zaire. New and reemerging diseases such as Legionnaires', filovirus infections, diphtheria, leprosy, plague, drug-resistant tuberculosis and invasive streptococcus A—the so-called flesh-eating bacterium—are being discovered with increasing frequency throughout the world. The laboratory's ability to respond to critical, life-threatening outbreaks of disease is what keeps cases from becoming outbreaks and outbreaks from becoming epidemics. As new disease threats arise, the laboratory serves as a backstop—to keep the dangers fenced out.

Right To Representation

Once a representative is decided upon, the appointment must be made in writing. A form for this purpose is available at any Social Security office. 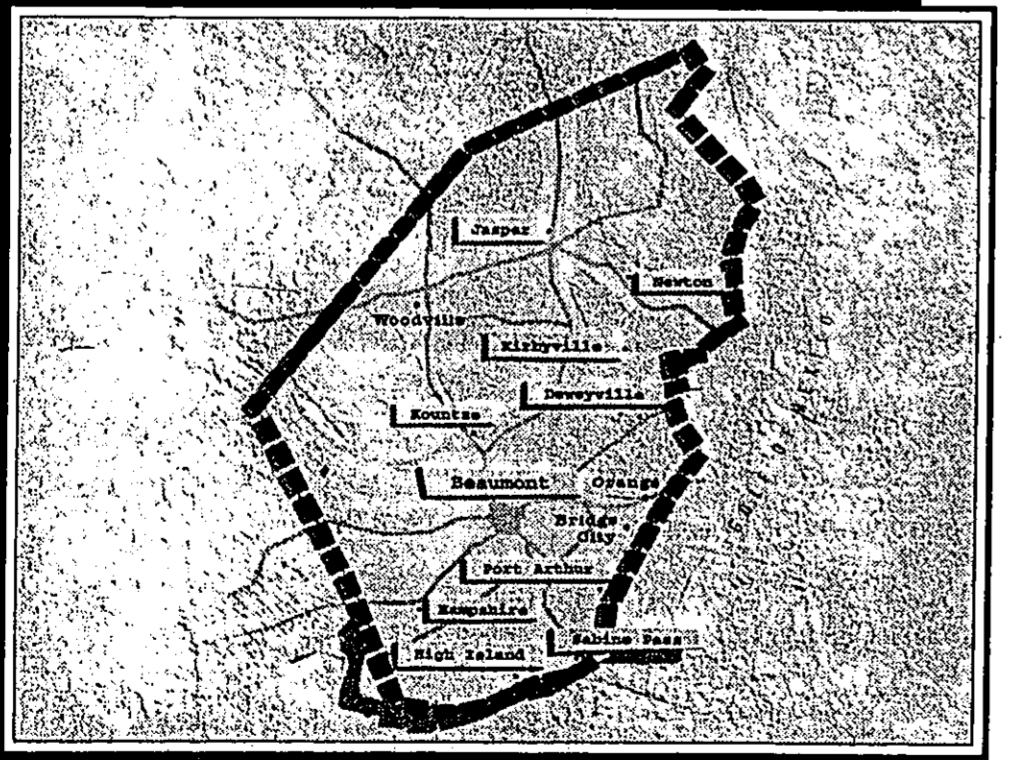
