Wayne Scott named new Director of Texas Criminal Justice Agency

AUSTIN—Wayne Scott, a 23-year officer who has risen through the ranks in the Texas prison system, has been named executive director of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.
 Scott, 44, was chosen by the Texas Board of Criminal Justice to head the nation's largest adult criminal justice agency with its 42,000 employees and a \$2.3 billion annual budget to supervise nearly 700,000 offenders in prison or on parole or probation.
 Scott, currently director of the state prison system, succeeds James A. (Andy) Collins, who is resigning to pursue private business interests.
 "Texas can be proud that the senior management corps of TDCJ has produced another gifted administrator to lead the system," said Allan B. Polunsky of San Antonio, chairman of the Criminal Justice Board.
 Polunsky said the nine-member board "was universal in their support and respect for Wayne Scott" after interviewing seven candidates for the \$120,000 a year job of managing more than 100 prison units and state jails, 70 parole offices and \$220 million a year in aid to local probation departments.
 "Wayne's extensive experience has paralleled the unprecedented growth of the criminal justice system in Texas and as a senior manager he has contributed significantly to the development of the agency," Polunsky said. "Yet, at 44 years of age, he has the youth, the energy and the vision to lead the agency to even greater service to Texas in the future."

I sometimes get wistful yearnings to have lived in a earlier time than this. One reason is my fascination with steam engines. Oh yes - the Iron Horse locomotives; the splendid stern-wheel steamboats, the marvelous Stanley Steamers that would spin wheels on dry pavement back in the 20's. A few columns back I mentioned having crossed the Mississippi on a paddle-wheel steamboat. It was 1929. I was almost five. The Vicksburg bridge was building but not finished. Work was stopped, because the river was in flood. We had to board the ferry at the improved landing just inside the levee. To my young eyes the expanse of turbulent water was simply awesome. You could barely see the other side of the river. Under way, I wondered at the "islands" we passed, with nothing but treetops showing above the water. But even then, my attention soon focused on the awesome driving machinery. One of the irresistible appeals of steam engines was the openness of their mechanism. Practically all the moving parts were right in there in front of God and everybody. More-over, steamboat engines were slow. Every action was in slow motion, where you could watch it happening. The big paddlewheel - thirty feet high - only turned about fifteen rpm wide open.

Power came from a double-acting steam engine on each side, phased 90 degrees apart so there would be no drop center of dead spots. The huge Pitman arms must have been at least thirty feet long. In my innocence I was more impressed with the trashing, foaming action of the paddlewheel. But of course in those naive times we could roam most anywhere, and watch the show from close up. Who of my generation has not known the fascination of the steam locomotive? Its mystique runs wide and deep. In the century, past it transformed every level of our society. It didn't just change the face of our nation; it formed a lot of it. How many of us remember the "black and red" railroads? But it wasn't the economic factors so much as the sheer emotional appeal. That absolutely spine-chilling, eerie tonessome whistle in the night - the glad ringing of the bell coming into the station - all these and many more have left vivid and romantic memories with us who were there.

I was delighted when our Number One grandson, Peter Wood, showed an early infatuation with steam railroads. The British TV series featuring anthropomorphic locomotives has helped. I count this the most pleasant production among the miscellaneous few TV events worth their salt. And Peter, now pushing three, still spends much playtime with trains. No use doing like the Texans do, I've seen one or two in actual antique rallies, but in Woodville

I can go to see many harper and here her talk to her audience. I hope me hang got to talk with.
Son Billey wrote "I wish you was here to help me cut peaches. I feel my little pig every day on peaches, and then eat a good bite myself. Ma has made me a nice porridge hat. I have heard my A B G's."
In July Nancy wrote "I get to take the opportunity of writing you a few lines to let you know that me and the children is well hoping these lines may find you the same. Little Wiley can set alone and say pop pa. I wish you could be home to go to the field with me to gather watermelons. I got old man harper to go to the salt saline in Louisiana to get us some salt. It is to be ready the first of August. He gave 21-1/2 a bushel. Tomson sold one yoke of our oxen for 50 dollars. I am using the money for buying salt."
In August she wrote "it has been 11 weeks this morning since we embraced each other with a sweet kiss. I am afraid it will be a great deal longer than it has been. Keep your mule as long as you can so if you can get to come home you will have something to feed."
And finally, on September 24, 1862, a letter from Major C.R. Beaty, 13th Texas Regiment Cavalry. "It becomes my painful duty to inform you that William died of a hemorrhage of the bowels. He was buried in the same enclosure as Nancy's brother John in Little Rock as no transportation was available to ship the bodies home."
A lot of simple history in these words, words that have been repeated by families separated by war throughout the ages and remembered in our exhibit at the Village.
Just a brief look at the kind of family records that families have kept and shared with the Heritage Society to help us keep track of our varied pasts. A reminder that our family records are also important to our history. We look forward to the opportunity to copy them that others may find helping tracing their roots.





Warren - Woodville, Colmesneil - Evadale top games in county

COUNTY - There is a game that will feature county bragging rights and another "payback" written all over it this week as football begins to wind down in the county this week.

In Woodville the Warren Warriors come to town to meet the Eagle in a game that has no bearing as far as the playoffs are concerned, but does have special meaning to both clubs in other ways.

In Colmesneil it is a different story. The Bulldogs have their sights set on the playoffs and the only thing standing in their way is the Evadale Rebels.

The other county game features winless Chester playing ranked Burkeville in mismatch.

Woodville - Warren

On paper, this shouldn't be a game. Warren is more than having its share of problems, last week losing its 18th consecutive game. Woodville, on the other hand, is still one of the better teams in the district despite its loss to Stephen F. Austin last week.

Woodville coach Ty Quick will no doubt experiment with a lot of his players, giving ample playing time to any reserves. This will be a welcome break to Mickey Nixon's Warriors who have been hampered by injuries throughout the season and who will have only 18 varsity players in the lineup.

After losing to both Newton and SFA the Eagles are out of the district race and will be trying to bolster their season record.

Says Quick, "We've got to go 7-3. What we are doing now is playing for pride."

The Eagles have several injured players that will most likely get rested during against Warren. Quarterback Demarcus White will see more action than he has in the past several weeks after injuring a knee in the Kountze game.

Mixon admits that Woodville is in the same ball park as both Newton and SFA, stating "They'll be tough for us."

Warren has had its troubles offensively, scoring only 20 points this season, including being blanked five district games.

Die hard Warren fans don't expect any miracles in this one, but Woodville's defense has given up more total points than any district team outside Warren. The Eagles have given up 217 points in eight games this season, an average of over 27 points per game.

Last year Woodville blanked Warren 48-0.

Colmesneil - Evadale

The only "hot" team in the county right now is the Colmesneil Bulldogs, a team who has "playback" on its mind when they host the Evadale Rebels Friday night.

Although the Bulldogs reached the playoffs last year, they were upset by Evadale 29-28 along the way and feel they have a score to settle this go round.

"It's a real rivalry game for us last year," says Colmesneil coach Mike Jacob. "The loss to them started a three game losing streak for us. We will definitely remember what happened last year."

Even though Colmesneil has more than one incentive to win the game, the other includes clinching a playoff berth. Jacobs says that he expects a tight

game.

The Bulldogs roll into the game after blasting High Island, 52-0, while Evadale comes in off a 62-0 win over Chester.

Colmesneil has six victories locked up this season, losing only to class 2A Centerville and Shelbyville.

Evadale has a 3-5 mark, including losses to Burkeville, Apple Springs, and West Hardin.

The Bulldogs have their wishbone offense at full speed, averaging over 400 yards per game rushing in their last three outings. This spells bad news for Evadale whose coach, Robert Deans, admits is not strong on defense.

Last year we got lucky and stopped up on them," says Deans. "This year they will be ready."

Deans also admits that for Evadale to win games they must out score their opponents. Their victories include Deweyville (33-37), Luthern Concordia (32-0), Beaumont Christian (40-20), and Tomball Northland (30-10).

Chester - Burkeville

Bad news gets even worse for the Chester yellowjackets this week. Chester, which has yet to win a game this season after posting only one victory last year, finds itself meeting the state ranked Mustangs at home.

If that isn't bad enough, Burkeville has a tendency of rolling up the points to gain attention in the state polls. Last year they blew out Chester, 72-0.

Chester, another county team that has been beset with injuries, has scored only 25 points in seven games this year. Burkeville, finding no one to play, has scored 197 in five outings while holding their opponents to 13.

Colmesneil climbs over High Island, 52-0

COLMESNEIL - The Colmesneil Bulldogs won their third district game and warmed up for a playoff showdown with an impressive, 52-0, drubbing of High Island Friday night.

The win gave the Bulldogs a perfect, 3-0, district mark and set the stage for a showdown with Evadale this week that would clinch a playoff spot with a victory.

With the win over High Island the Bulldogs moved their season record to 6-2, losing only to class 2A Centerville and Shelbyville.

Against the Cardinals the Bulldogs rolled to 537 yards on the ground and threw only one pass, picking up 25 first downs in the process.

Three Colmesneil running backs hit the century mark, including Ray Dobbins with 122 yards in 12 carries, Ronnie Douglas with 106 yards on eight carries, and J.R. Pittman with 102 yards on seven carries.

Three other Bulldog backs averaged over five yards a carry. Josh Maddox had 85 yards on 10 tries, while David Dickerson had 65 yards on six carries and Daryl Douglas had 60 on five attempts.

"Our kids were pretty intense," noted Colmesneil coach Mike Jacobs. "They

all played real well."

While Colmesneil's offense did what it wanted and punted only twice during the game, the Bulldog defense was equally effective. High Island was able to muster only 47 yards of offense, including 17 on the ground with 22 tries. The Cardinals had only five first downs, and three of these came on penalties.

The Bulldogs built a 20-0 first quarter lead and held a 39-0 advantage at halftime.

Jacobs noted that due to the Colmesneil junior varsity playing Thursday he had only 20 varsity players that he could put into the game.

Colmesneil started the rut the first time they touched the ball. Ronnie Douglas took the second play from scrimmage and rambled 55 yards to pay dirt. Daryl Douglas came on to kick the point after, and Colmesneil held a 7-0 lead with 15 seconds gone in the first quarter.

The Bulldogs padded their lead to 13-0 with just over three minutes to go in the quarter when J.R. Pittman stroled into the endzone from 14 yards out. The touchdown capped a four play, 61 yard drive.

With under a minute to go in the

quarter, Pittman was off to the races again, this time on a 67 yard dash to put Colmesneil up 20-0 after a Daryl Douglas kick.

Ray Dobbins, the leading ground gainer of the night, got into the scoring net minutes later when he blew past High Island defenders on a 60 yard romp. The score gave Colmesneil a 27-0 advantage after another Daryl Douglas kick.

David Dickerson rolled in with another Bulldog touchdown with a 25 yard burst two minutes later. The touchdown capped a four play, 67 yard drive.

Colmesneil finished out its first half scoring with just over three minutes to go in the second quarter when Ray Dobbins scored his second touchdown of the night, this time from 18 yards out. The tally came on the heels of an eight play, 57 yard drive.

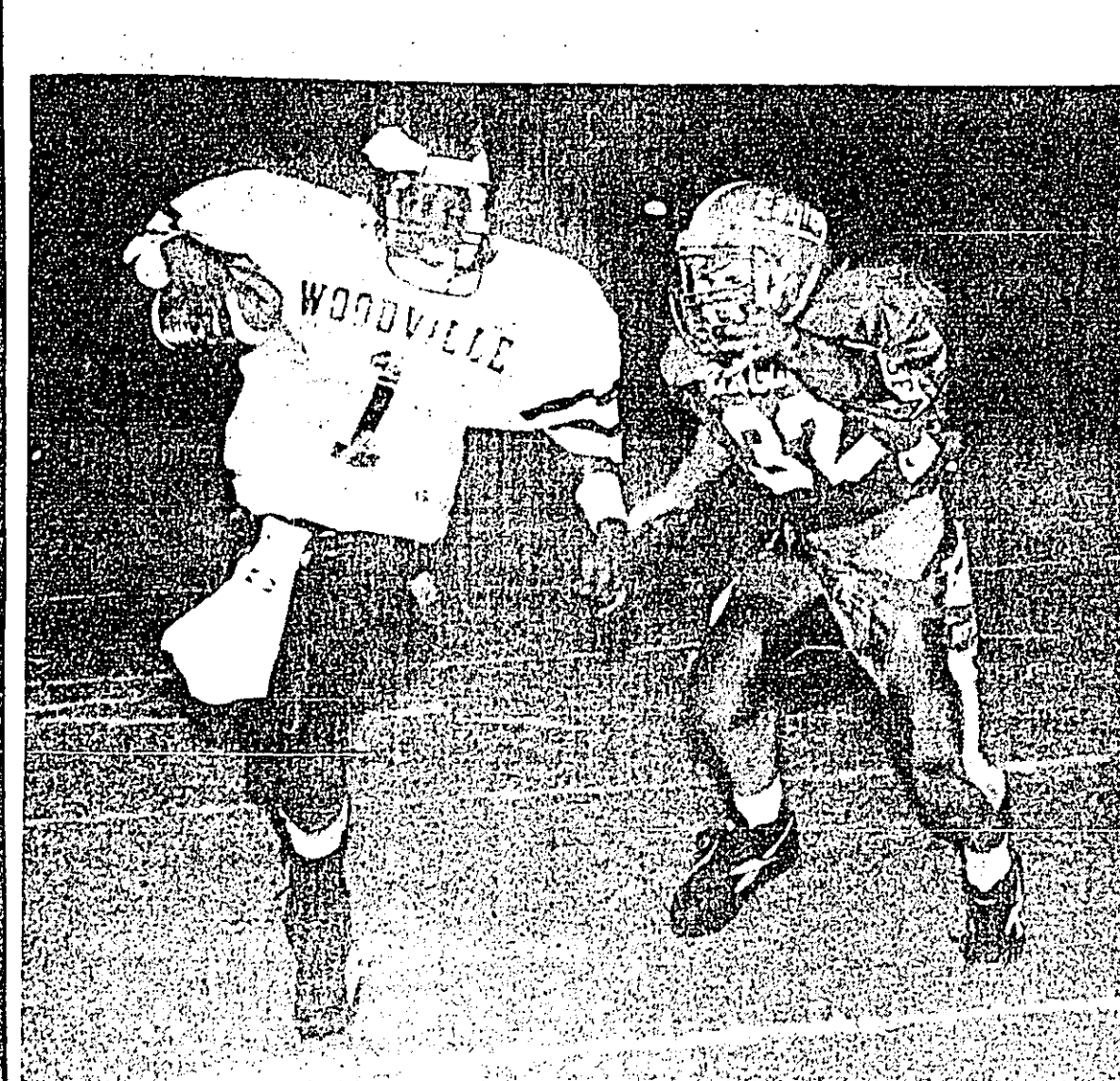

SFA tops Woodville for playoff spot

PT. ARTHUR - The Stephen F. Austin Eagles took advantage of two key Woodville mistakes to break a tight game wide open and rolled on to a 48-16 win Friday night.

With the victory, SFA assured themselves a post season playoff spot while Woodville was eliminated from the playoffs.

"It's a huge disappointment," said Woodville coach Ty Quick after the loss. "It's hard to swallow. This is the first time in eight years that I haven't had a team in the playoffs."

SFA, who has grabbed the district title for the past two years, must be certain that they would get a third shot at the title by capitalizing on two costly Woodville mistakes midway in the second period.

With SFA holding a 13-9 lead, Woodville was forced to punt from its own 38. The snap was bobbled, then dropped, and later kicked by an SFA defender that gave SFA a first and goal inside the Woodville 10 yard line. Quarterback Nick Nixon got the first call for five yards, and D.J. Richard took the second shot to give Pt. Arthur to give the Pt. Arthur Eagles a 20-9 lead.

On Woodville's next possession SFA's Tobias Deans picked out a stray Woodville pass at the SFA 45 and swept his way 55 yards to pay dirt. With the point after kick by Corey Wooten, which was blocked, SFA actually led the game with a 27-9 lead.

Up until that time Woodville matched SFA offensively.

Pt. Arthur opened the game with a seven play, 60 yard drive for a touchdown following the opening kickoff. Richard, who finished the night with 14 yards on 13 carries, actually led the first two touchdowns when he rambled in from 12 yards out. Woodville retaliated with a time consuming 14 play, 79 yard drive to tie the game.

Using a no huddle offense for the first several plays, the Eagles moved from their own 20 to the SFA 28 in five plays. Two of the plays included a pair of pass completions from Charlie McCullough to Gerrad Betts for 15 and 28 yards respectively.

The Eagle also gambled on a fourth and two at the SFA 20 that was taken care of by Brad King on a four yard burst.

After a pair of penalties pushed Woodville back to their own 20, and facing a second and goal, McCullough found Betts for a seven yard pass. From there, Mitchell broke two tackles, one at the 10 and another at the five to get into the endzone. A Bet's kick tied the game at seven.

SFA stormed back with the help of three out of bound kicks by Woodville on the following kickoff. Operating from their own 40, SFA used seven plays to go back ahead. The last came on a 33 yard pass from Nixon to Deans when a Woodville defensive back slipped down on the play.

On the point after try, Woodville brought the crowd to its feet when Allen Adams intercepted a SFA pass and raced 100 yards for two points. The score narrowed the gap to 13-9.

After Woodville's mistakes led to two SFA touchdowns and gave Pt. Arthur a 27-9 halftime to lead, the Tyler County Eagles gave one last push to get back into the game.

Taking the second half kickoff Woodville marched 67 yards on 14 plays to narrow the gap to 27-16 on a three yard touchdown by Adams.

The touchdown drive had its moments, including a fourth and seven play at the SFA 10 yard line. McCullough hit Betts over the middle, and the big tight end broke two tackles to give the Eagles a first and goal at the 10. On the next play Allen went over for the score.

Any thoughts of a Woodville comeback were quickly dispelled when Richard set sail on a 55 yard jaunt to the Woodville goal on SFA's next play from scrimmage. The Tyler County Eagles got a break with a SFA clip at the 10 yard line, but Woodville was also cited for unsportsman like conduct.

On the next play Nixon zipped across from 10 yards out to pass SFA to 34-16. Another Woodville mistake, this time a fumble at their own 26 yard line, opened the door for another SFA touchdown.

Nixon threw once for 25 yards and Deans carried twice more for 11 yards, including an eight yard touchdown.

SFA was also called for holding in the three play drive.

Holding a 40-16 lead, SFA closed out the scoring parade with a eight play, 90 yard drive that ended with just under 11 minutes to go in the game. Richard finished the night with five yard touchdown, and Wootenschel kicked the point after.

"They just pounded us down in the second half," admitted Quick. "It was a physical game and our kids had to go both ways. They just physically whipped us down."

Woodville came close to matching SFA in total offense with 341 yards to

372. Mitchell rushed for 91 yards on 17 carries.

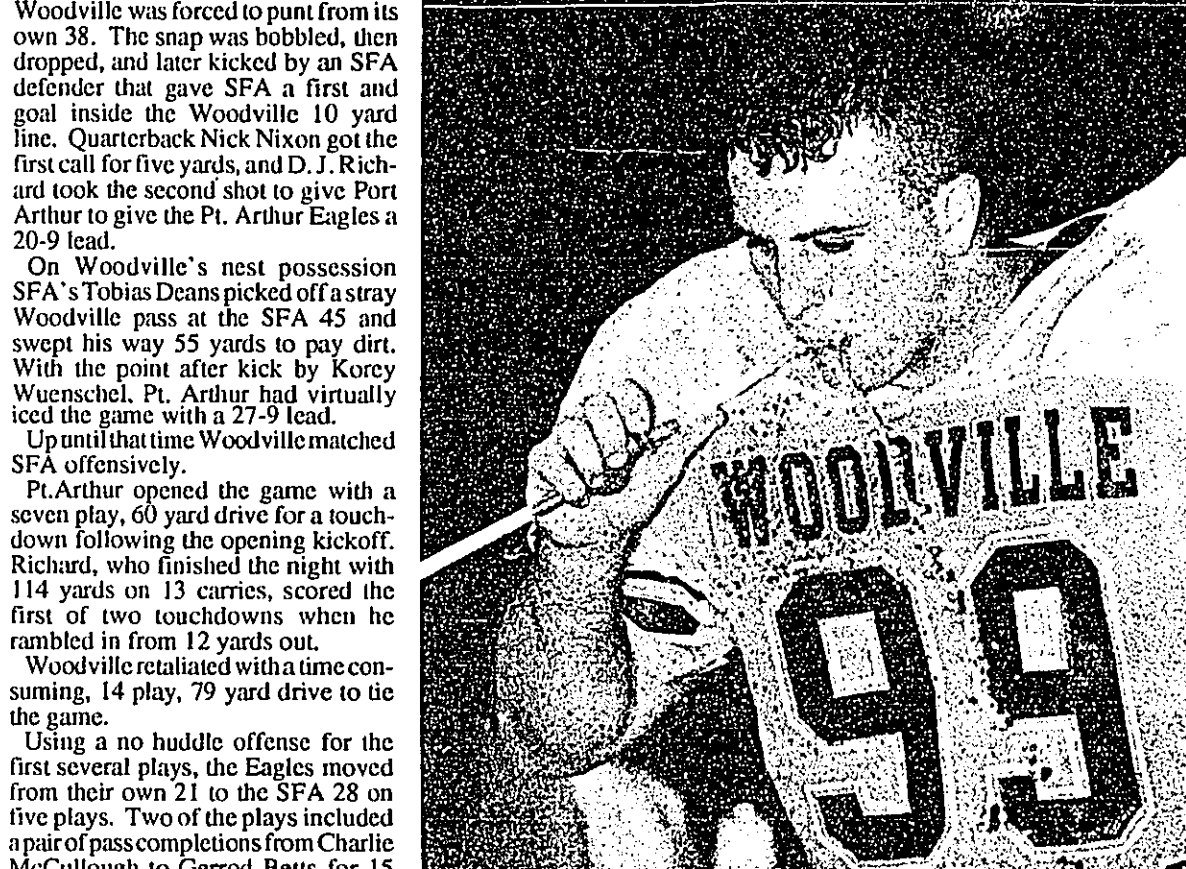
McCullough hit on eight of 13 passes for 100 yards and one touchdown. He did not throw an interception.

Woodville now goes on to play Warren Friday in their last home game, while SFA travels to Kirbyville.

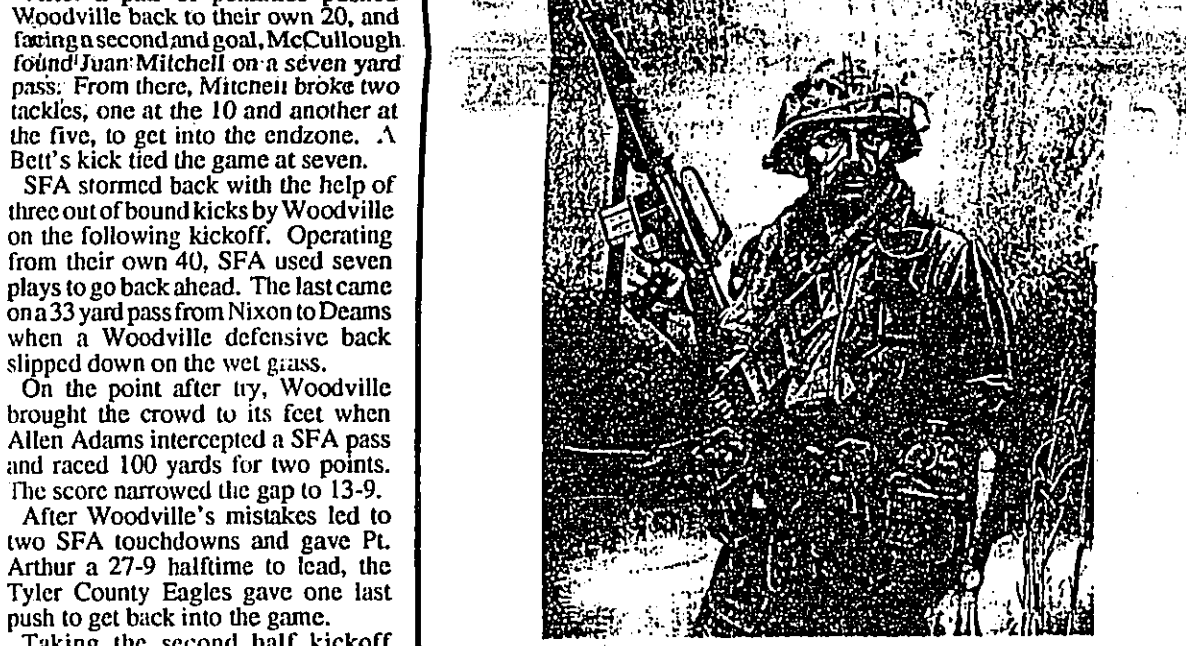
The district title will come down to the Newton-SFA game on November 11 in Pt. Arthur.

"Newton and SFA should go to playoffs," Quick added. "There are better than anyone that we played."





Wayne Scott named new Director of Texas Criminal Justice Agency

AUSTIN-Wayne Scott, a 23-year employee who has risen through the ranks in the Texas prison system, has been named executive director of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice.

Scott, 44, was chosen by the Texas Board of Criminal Justice to head the nation's largest adult criminal justice agency with its 42,000 employees and a \$2.3 billion annual budget to supervise nearly 700,000 offenders in prison or on parole or probation.

Scott, currently director of the state prison system, succeeds James A. (Andy) Collins who is resigning to pursue private business interests.

"Texans can be proud that the senior management corps of TDJC has produced another gifted administrator to lead the system," said Allan B. Polunsky of San Antonio, chairman of the Criminal Justice Board.

Polunsky said the nine-member board "was universal in their support and respect for Wayne Scott."

Scott said he was "humbled and challenged by the appointment."

He said "the greatest challenges facing adult criminal justice in Texas are the hardening of the prisons as violent offenders are incarcerated for longer and longer time and the importance of closer monitoring of offenders released back in society."

"Protection of the public is job one for a seamless system of prisons, parole and probation alike," Scott said. "Only when this state and the system is secure can we place the proper high priority on rehabilitation and reduction of recidivism."
