

Texas braces for heavy traffic as NAFTA Imports/Exports boom

(Austin) — "As the major trade gateway to Mexico, Texas' major border crossings are already among the busiest ports of entry in North America, and they are about to get even busier," State Comptroller John Sharp said. "And anybody who regularly travels on I-35, I-10 or US 59 has witnessed a dramatic increase in traffic in the last few years, particularly since the implementation of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). These three highways are the major trade routes through Texas," Sharp said. "The state is racing to meet demands for improved highways and border crossing facilities to accommodate the ballooning volume of truck and rail traffic hauling goods to and from Mexico." "In the next two years, Texas will spend roughly three-quarters of a billion dollars in state and federal funds to maintain and improve the three main highway corridors. In addition, almost \$80 million dollars in projects to improve access to international bridges are either scheduled or underway," Sharp said. "U.S. trade with Canada and Mexico both exports and imports reached record levels in 1994 jumping 17 percent to \$348 billion, according to the October issue of Fiscal Notes, a monthly publication of the Comptroller's Research Division. More importantly for Texas, U.S. Trade with Mexico exceeded \$100 billion for the first time ever, averaging almost \$2 billion per week during the first year of NAFTA. More than \$1 billion per week of that trade passed through Texas' five major border crossings: El Paso, Eagle Pass, Laredo, Hidalgo and Brownsville. In addition to long-haul shipments of goods, Texas' border traffic is boosted by numerous short-haul shipments to and from more than 600 maquiladora industrial plants located along the Texas-Mexico border. These plants receive unfinished products from the U.S., assemble them and ship them back to the U.S. Trucks carried 90 percent of the value of U.S. exports to Mexico and 83 percent of the value of goods imported from Mexico in 1994. The Texas Department of Public Safety has obtained federal funds to construct seven new truck-weighting stations and to upgrade two existing stations. DPS officials estimate that 15 percent of the Mexican trucks entering Texas exceed U.S. weight limits, and that only about 10 percent of those trucks have been inspected in the past. Several studies have shown that Texas Highways cannot withstand the weight of Mexican trucks. The weight limit for trucks on U.S. Highways is 80,000 pounds. The Mexican Transport Ministry estimates that overloaded five-axle trucks from Mexico often weigh as much as 108,000 pounds, and six-axle trucks may weigh up to 130,000 pounds. "This is a critical issue to Texas taxpayers, because one study shows that a truck weighing just 4,000 pounds above the U.S. limit accelerates pavement damage five-fold, meaning a highway designed to last 40 years would have to be replaced in only eight years," Sharp said. "Texas had asked the federal government for help in enforcing U.S. weight requirements on Mexican trucks as NAFTA expands their access to U.S. Highways. Currently, Mexican trucks are allowed to travel only along the border. They will be allowed to travel throughout Texas, New Mexico, Arizona and California beginning December 18. Mexican trucks will gain access to the entire United States in January 2000. In the future, technology may help monitor truck weights, as well as improve traffic flow and reduce accidents. In a San Antonio experiment, a computer analyzes data from sensors embedded in the roadway and cameras focused on traffic. The computer alerts emergency workers to problems, and overhead signs provide information to motorists. Similar programs are planned for Houston, Dallas-Fort Worth and El Paso. Technology may also make it possible to track trucks from their point of origin to their destination via a fiber-optic spine along the highway. Such a system would allow cargos to be pre-cleared by U.S. Customs, and would allow taxes, tolls and fees to be paid in advance. Border delays, inspections and weigh-ins would be reduced to a minimum. "By all accounts, Texas' border crossings are already operating at capacity, and traffic in Texas' three major corridors is expected to increase by 25-48 percent by 2011. The challenge facing transportation planners is to determine where scarce resources can be used most effectively, and where to link Texas' infrastructure development to trade flows and emerging opportunities," Sharp said.

Colmesneil High School receives 'Successful Schools' \$1,000 award

Colmesneil High School has received a monetary award in the amount of \$1,000. The Colmesneil Independent School District is part of the Texas Successful Schools Awards Program (TSSAS). Larry Simson, Superintendent of the Colmesneil Independent School District and Ben Stewart, High School Principal, announced today. The Colmesneil High School is being recognized for gains in student performance in indicators that are part of the Academic Excellence Indicator System (AEIS), more commonly known as the state school report card. The C H S is among 1,236 cash-winning schools state-wide receiving awards for exemplary or record-setting gains in their performance over last year. The awards are based on schools' Spring 1995 performance on the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) test, which measures performance in reading, writing, and mathematics. Schools also had to meet performance standards for drop-outs and attendance. Cash awards ranging from \$1,000 to \$10,000 per school were given. In the exemplary category, schools had at least 90 percent of all students and students in each student population group (White, African-American, Hispanic, and economically disadvantaged) passing each section of the TAAS, a 1993-94 attendance rate of 94% or greater. In the recognized category schools had at least 70% of all students and those in each student group passing each section of the TAAS, a drop-out rate of 3.5% or less for all students in each student group, and an attendance rate of at least 94%. The change in TAAS performance from 1994-95 also had to be high enough so that the passing rate for all students and those in each student group was at least 90%.

Deep East Texas Council of Governments gives support to six local grant applications
 The Deep East Council of Governments Board of directors gave its support to six grant applications from four agencies at its October board meeting held in Newton. The approval clears the way for the agencies to seek funding from the appropriate state or federal agencies. The Burke Center also known as the Peavy Switch Recovery Center in Angellina County, requested approval on three grants totaling almost \$1 million. The center serves the 12 counties in the Deep East Texas region. All of the grants are to the Texas Commission on Alcohol & Drug Abuse. The first grant is for detoxification treatment for both residents of the center and outpatient adults receiving treatment. The grant totals \$327,078. The second grant targets chemically dependent pregnant women and women with children. It totals \$317,185. The third Burke Center grant totals \$275,560. It is to support a proposed level II Residential Treatment program for adolescents. The three other agencies seeking grant approval were Angellina County Sheriff's office, seeking \$35,248 from the office of the Governor, Criminal Justice Division to continue a Drug Abuse Resistance Education (D.A.R.E.) program; the Woodville Independent School District seeking \$68,814 from the Governor's office for a similar program; and the Trinity County Sheriff's office seeking \$15,313 from the Governor's office for its D.A.R.E. program.

Marcus Gill pleads guilty
 U.S. Navy Seaman Marcus Gill, 22, of Woodville, pled guilty to rape of a 12-year-old schoolgirl to a Japanese Court Tuesday while two other military accomplices plead guilty to lesser charges. Accused along with Gill in the case is Marine Pfc Rodrico Harp, 21, of Griffin, Ga., and Pfc Kendrick M. Ledet, 20, of Metcalf, Ga. The attack on the girl occurred on Sept. 4 and the three men were arrested on Sept. 6 by U.S. Military Police who subsequently turned them in to Japanese authorities on Sept. 29 after being indicted. The three are charged with confinement and rape resulting in injury which carries a maximum life imprisonment.

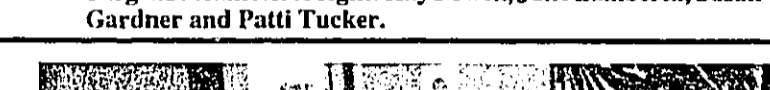

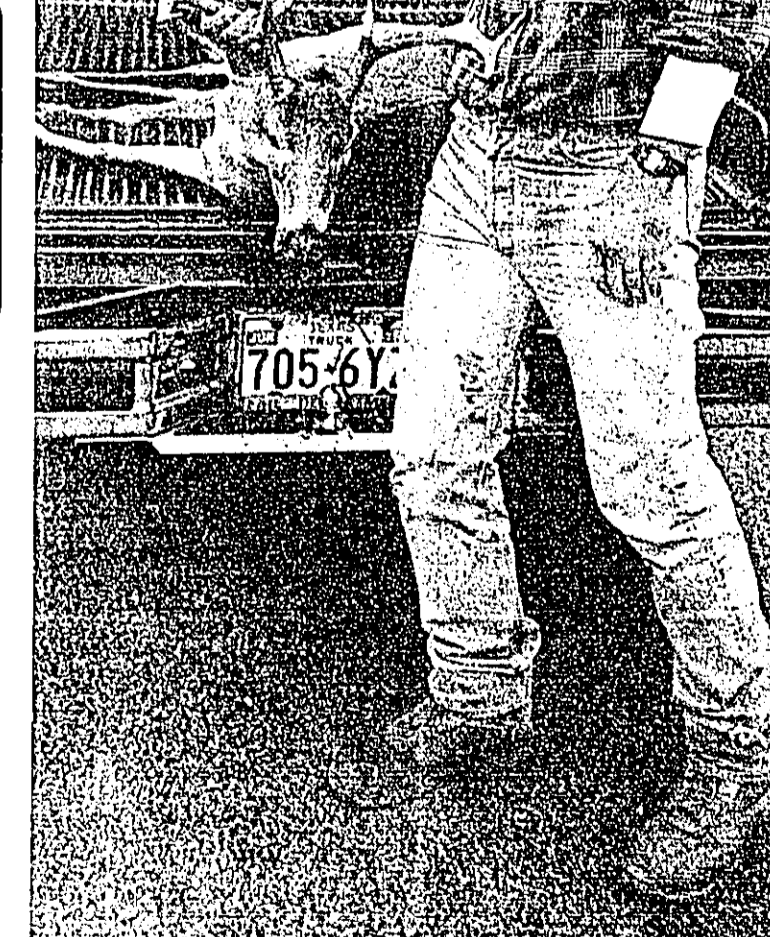

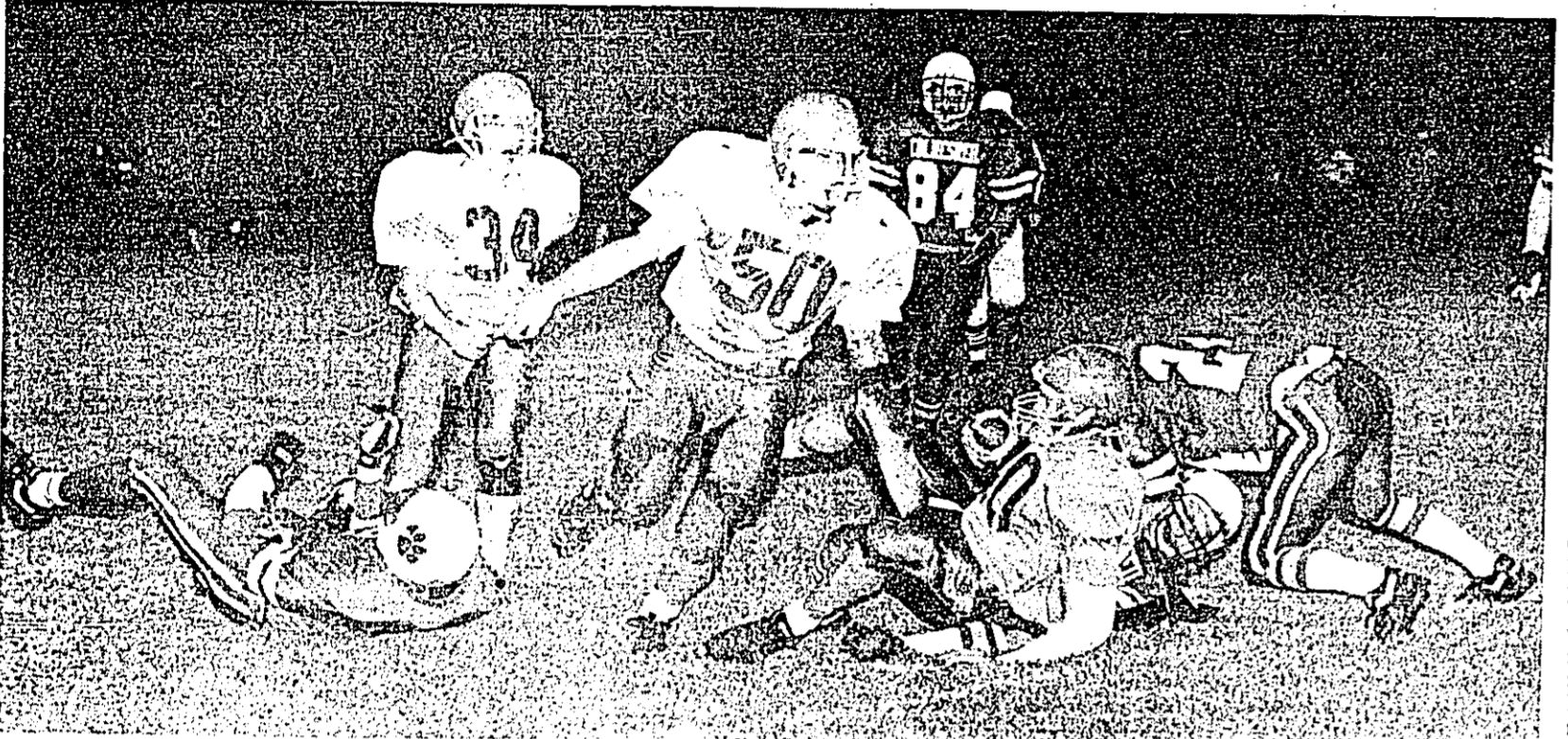

Agreement reached to oppose diversion of water from Sabine and Neches Rivers or their Basins

Galveston. Conservation districts of the Neches basin, which represent the 214 Texas Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCDs) agreed at their annual meeting in Galveston to oppose any further effort by the sponsors of the Trans-Texas Water Program's Southeast Area. The sponsor's report outlines a conceptual program in which surface water from both the Sabine and Neches rivers would be directed across the state to serve the needs of others. Phase 2 of the report calls for evaluation of alternative measures for the water-shed areas west of the Southeast Area by the same groups who are sponsoring the Phase I report.

Protection agency lists adoptable children on Internet

AUSTIN—Texas is first among the states to use the Internet to assist in the adoption of foster children, according to an adoption program director for the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services. "About 70 children are listed, and we're adding children regularly," said Ella Zamora, director of the Texas Adoption Resource Exchange, known as TARE. Zamora said the listing of adoptable children is a joint venture with the agency's public affairs division, which prepares photographs and brief descriptions of the children for publication. Zamora said the agency is exploring the distribution of files about adoptable children by electronic mail as a way to reduce printing and mailing costs and speed distribution.

Nixon alerts retired teachers to possible 'hand calculation' annuity increase

Senator Drew Nixon (R-Carthage) announced that retired teachers may not be receiving the appropriate amount of annuity, and they might be able to have their payments increased by requesting a hand calculated annuity. Apparently, due to a minor formula difference in the computer system, retired teachers may be receiving lower monthly payments than they could be if their annuities were calculated by hand. This is especially true in cases where the teacher retired prior to 1981. "Switching from a computer calculated annuity to a hand calculated annuity could result in higher monthly payments for some retired teachers, particularly those who retired prior to 1981," said Nixon.

Early Intervention Key to Success of Children with Down Syndrome

LUFKIN—Earlier this year, the 74th Texas Legislature formally recognized the month of October as Down Syndrome Month throughout the state. The Burke Center, in cooperation with the Interagency Council on Early Childhood Intervention and the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, is using the occasion to emphasize the importance of early intervention for infants and children who are diagnosed as having Down Syndrome.

Down Syndrome is a chromosomal disorder which usually causes delays in physical and intellectual development. It is the leading clinical cause of mental retardation in the world. The incidence of Down Syndrome in the United States is approximately one in every 800 to 1,100 live births. This translates to approximately 4,000 babies with Down Syndrome being born each year in the United States. According to Marsha Ford, director of operations for the Burke Center, early intervention is beneficial not only to the child who has Down Syndrome, but also to family members and others who touch the child's life.

Texas braces for heavy traffic as NAFTA Imports/Exports boom

(Austin) - "As the major trade gateway to Mexico, Texas' major border crossings are already among the busiest ports of entry in North America, and they are about to get even busier," State Comptroller John Sharp said. "And anybody who regularly travels on I-35, I-10 or US 59 has witnessed the dramatic increase in traffic in the last few years, particularly since the implementation of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA). These three highways are the major trade routes through Texas," Sharp said. "The state is racing to meet the demand for improved highways and border crossing facilities to accommodate the ballooning volume of truck and rail traffic hauling goods to and from Mexico. In the next two years, Texas will spend roughly three-quarters of a billion dollars in state and federal funds to maintain and improve the three main highway corridors. In addition,

almost \$80 million dollars in profits to improve access to international bridges are either scheduled or underway," Sharp said. U.S. trade with Canada and Mexico both exports and imports reached record levels in 1994 jumping 17 percent to \$348 billion, according to the October issue of Fiscal Notes, a monthly publication of the Comptroller's Research Division. More importantly for Texas, U.S. Trade with Mexico exceeded \$100 billion for the first time ever, averaging almost \$2 billion per week during the first year of NAFTA. More than \$1 billion per week of that trade passed through Texas' five major border crossings: El Paso, Eagle Pass, Laredo, Hidalgo and Brownsville. In addition to long-haul shipments of goods, Texas' border traffic is boosted by numerous short-haul shipments to and from more than 800 maquiladora industrial plants located along the

Texas-Mexico border. These plants receive unfinished products from the U.S., assemble them and ship them back to the U.S. Trucks carried 90 percent of the value of U.S. exports to Mexico and 83 percent of the value of goods imported from Mexico in 1994. The Texas Department of Public Safety has obtained federal funds to construct seven new truck-weighting stations and to upgrade two existing stations. DPS officials estimate that 15 percent of the Mexican trucks entering Texas exceed U.S. weight limits, and that only about 10 percent of those trucks have been inspected in the past. "Several studies have shown that Texas highways cannot withstand the weight of Mexican trucks. The weight limit for trucks on U.S. Highways is 80,000 pounds. The Mexican Transport Ministry estimates that overloaded five-axle trucks from Mexico often weigh as much as 108,000 pounds, and six-axle trucks may weigh up to 130,000 pounds. "This is a critical issue to Texas taxpayers, because one study shows that a truck weighing just 4,000 pounds above the U.S. limit accelerates pavement damage five-fold, meaning a vehicle designed to last 40 years would have to be replaced in only eight years," Sharp said. "Technology may also make it possible to track trucks from their point of origin to their destination via a fiberoptic spine along the highway. Such a system would allow cargos to be pre-cleared by U.S. Customs, and would allow taxes, tolls and fees to be paid in advance. Border delays, inspections and weigh-ins would be reduced to a minimum. "By all accounts, Texas' border crossings are already operating at capacity, and traffic in Texas' three major corridors is expected to increase by 25-38 percent by 2001. The challenge facing transportation planners is to determine where scarce resources can be used most effectively, and where to link Texas' infrastructure development to trade flows and emerging opportunities," Sharp said.

Students were also asked to help choose the mascot of the Right Choices program. A school-wide ballot was developed from homeroom suggestions for the mascot name. Pictured

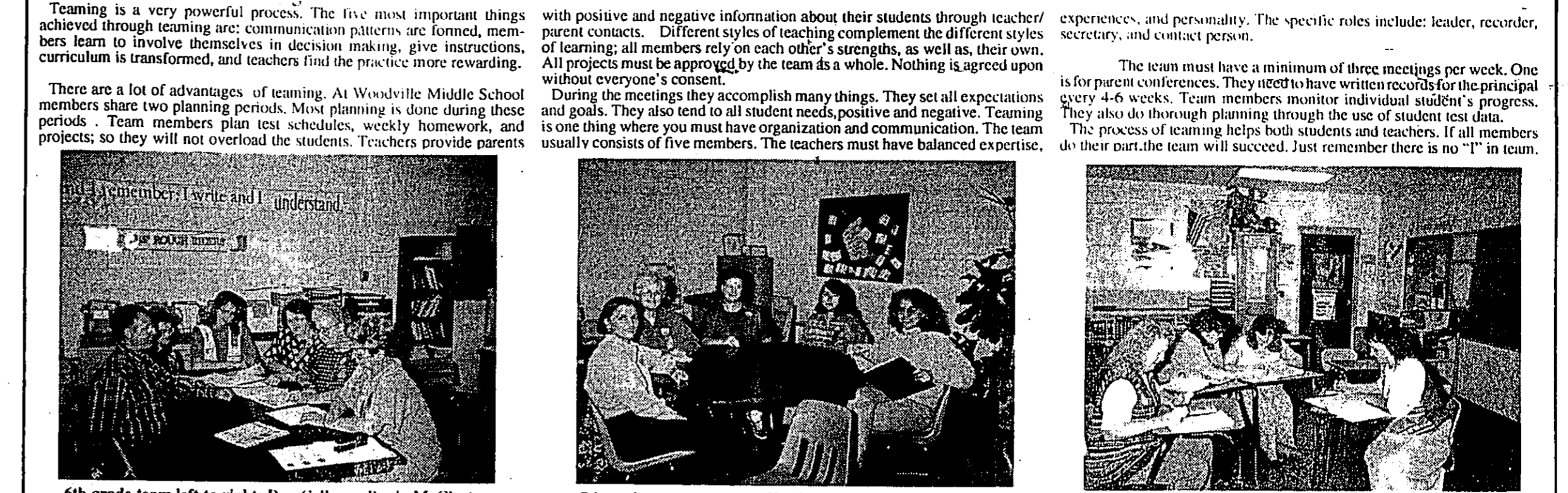

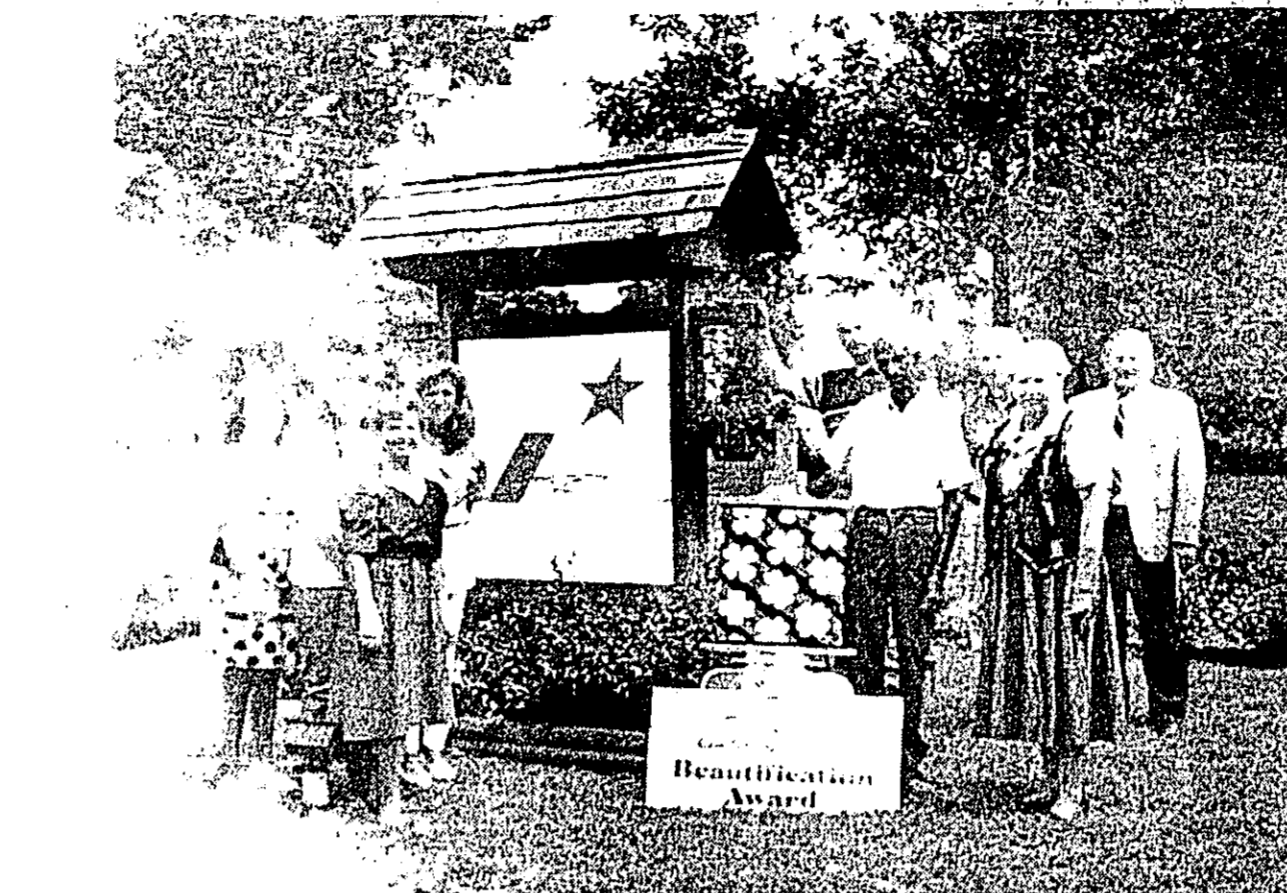

Agreement reached to oppose diversion of water from Sabine and Neches Rivers or their Basins

Galveston-Conservation district officials, which represent the 214 Texas Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD) agreed at their annual meeting in Galveston to oppose any future effort by the sponsors of the Trans-Texas Water Program's Southeast Area.

The sponsor's report outlines a conceptual program in which surface water from both the Sabine and Neches rivers would be directed across the state to serve the needs of others. Phase 2 of the report calls for evaluation of alternative measures for the water-short areas west of the Southeast Area by the same groups who are sponsoring the Phase I report.

"The sponsors of this program will realize an economic gain at the expense of our freshwater rights," said Merin Breaux, chairman of the Lower Neches SWCD. "It will also cause substantial changes to our environment, a reduction in freshwater availability for our area's future needs, an increase in salt water intrusion in our area, and a probable reduction in suitable waterfowl habitat." The lower Neches SWCD is headquartered in Kountze, Texas.

"The Association of Texas Soil and Water Conservation Districts will work with affected SWCD's to form a study group to monitor and thwart any efforts by any agency to bring this diversion program to fruition," Breaux added.

Approximately 1,000 soil and water conservation districts directors and other conservation leaders have attended the 55th annual meeting of the Association of Texas Soil and Water Conservation Districts which is being held in Galveston.

Protection agency lists adoptable children on Internet

AUSTIN — Texas is first among the states to use the Internet to encourage the adoption of foster children, according to an adoption program director for the Texas Department of Protective and Regulatory Services.

"About 70 children are listed, and we're adding children regularly," said Eila Zamora, director of the Texas Adoption Resource Exchange, known as TARE. Zamora said the listing of adoptable children is a joint venture with the agency's public affairs division, which prepares photographs and brief descriptions of the children for publication.

"We distribute more than 600 copies a month of the printed information sheets about children available for adoption," Zamora said. "The electronic version is available to millions of people who have access to the Internet. Since the information is being prepared for the printed version anyway, there is hardly any cost involved."

Zamora said the agency is exploring the distribution of files about adoptable children by electronic mail as a way to reduce printing and mailing costs and speed distribution.

Last year, the agency arranged the adoption of nearly 800 children who came into state custody due to abuse and neglect.

Apparently, due to a minor formula difference in the computer system, retired teachers may be receiving lower monthly payments than they could be if their annuities were calculated by hand. This is especially true in cases where the teacher retired prior to 1981.

"Our retired teachers have worked tirelessly on behalf of the children of our state, and it is important for them to check the accuracy of their benefits," said Nixon. "They have earned these benefits, and they certainly deserve it."

Early Intervention Key to Success of Children with Down Syndrome

LUFKIN — Earlier this year, the 74th Texas Legislature formally recognized the month of October as Down Syndrome Month throughout the state.

The Burke Center, in cooperation with the Interagency Council on Early Childhood Intervention and the Texas Department of Mental Health and Mental Retardation, is using the occasion to emphasize the importance of early intervention for infants and children who are diagnosed as having Down Syndrome.

Down Syndrome is a chromosomal disorder which usually causes delays in physical and intellectual development. It is the leading clinical cause of mental retardation in the world. The incidence of Down Syndrome in the United States is approximately one in every 800 to 1,100 live births. This translates to approximately 4,000 babies with Down Syndrome being born each year in the United States.

According to Marsha Ford, director of operations for the Burke Center, early intervention is beneficial not only to the child who has Down Syndrome, but also to family members and others who touch the child's life.

"With early intervention, children can receive the services they need at the earliest possible time," said Ms. Ford. "Early intervention is designed to help the child reach all the milestones in a child's life — anyone who can help the child be all he or she can be."

The Burke Center offers early childhood intervention services through the Cornerstone program. "Cornerstone is a family-centered program. It is a system of services provided to the child and family in their natural environment: home, neighborhood and community settings in which the family would include any of their children," said Ms. Ford.

Additional information about Early Childhood Intervention is available from Cornerstone by calling 1-800-321-1502. Cornerstone offers services free of charge to families in Angelina, Houston, Jasper, Nacogdoches, Newton, Polk, Sabine, San Jacinto, San Augustine, Shelby, Trinity and Tyler counties.

The biggest part of home-based businesses fall in the first two years after start-up because of poor planning and unrealistic expectations, according to an agricultural economist.

"The primary cause of failure is they don't start with enough operating capital reserves. They often have unrealistic expectations as to how soon their business will begin to realize a profit," said Greg Clary, agricultural economist and business expert with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Overton.

Historical evidence shows that most start-up businesses, whether they are home-based or otherwise, take one and often two years to become profitable, Clary said.

No one knows exactly how large the home-based business economy is in the United States. Conservative estimates indicate that 15 million U.S. workers — 12 percent of the total work force — are home-based.

Can't find enough cash lying around the house to live on during the two years it takes to become profitable? Don't feel lonely. Few people can, Clary said.

As an alternative, those starting up a home-based business can increase their chances for success in other ways. Clary offers five plans, the moonlighting plan, the part-time plan, the cushion plan, the spin-off plan, and the piggyback plan, as possible alternatives.

—Moonlighting plan: Keep your full-time job and develop your business as a sideline. Be sure to work at least eight hours per week on the sideline.

—Part-time plan: Work a part-time job to provide a base income while building your business. When the business income equals your base income, drop the part-time job.

—Cushion plan: Find a financial resource to support yourself while you start the business. Some examples of cushions, might be while you start the business. Some examples of cushions, might be a loan from a relative, a short-term note from a bank, or a short term partner. The cushion should cover a minimum of 12 months expenses.

—Spin-off plan: Turn your previous employer into a first major client. You may also take a major customer from your previous job with you when you start up your business.

—Piggyback plan: If you have a working spouse or partner, cut back on expense and live on one salary until the business begins to turn a profit.
