It has been my opinion that the mena far greater danger than the physical dangers that occur. This does not mean there is no physical dangers, as there are, but marijuana is not as toxic as some of the other recreationally used drugs. It can be just as addictive

Lungs: The most obvious physical effect and danger lies in the area of pot's damage to the lungs. Any drug consumed via smoking whether it is the nicotine found in tobacco, THC found in Marijuana, crack cocaine, heroin or ice (smokable methamphet-amines) it is going to have an adverse effect on the lungs. The lungs are not designed to be coated with tars full of poison molecules. They are tender tissues and over time we can see the result through biopsies in tobacco smokers. There is no reason to think that smoking marijuana cocaine heroin or methamphetamines is not doing similar things in the lungs. Quite the opposite, marijuana is packed with untested chemicals and it is deeply inhaled and held for longer periods of time. Pot probably is harder on the lungs than tobacco, but more research is needed here. Meantime, lets not be naive about the dangers here. They

It can be just as addictive Lungs: The most obvious physical effect and danger lies in the area of pot's damage to the lungs. Any drug consumed via smoking whether it is

the nicotine found in tobacco, THC found in Marijuana, crack cocaine, heroin or ice (smokable methamphetamines) it is going to have an adverse effect on the lungs. The lungs are not designed to be coated with tars full of poison molecules. They are tender tissues and over time we can see the result through biopsies in tobacco smokers. There is no reason to think that smoking marijuana cocaine, heroin or methamphetamines is not doing similar things in the lungs. Quite the opposite, marijuana is packed with untested chemicals and it is deeply nhaled and held for longer periods of time. Pot probably is harder on the lungs than tobacco, but more research is needed here. Meantime, lets not be naive about the dangers here. They


